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





▲ This weekend is a great occasion to visit the new exhibition "Beauty Regained. Caravaggio, Rubens, Perugino, Lotto, and 140 other restored masterpieces" which has just opened at the Gallerie d'Italia-Piazza Scala. This is the 17th edition of 'Restituzioni', a program curated and promoted by Intesa Sanpaolo that since 1989 has focused on restoring works that are a part of Italy's historic-artistic heritage. Spanning a time frame of more than thirty centuries, the 145 restored works dating from ancient times to the early 20th century include paintings on wood and on canvas, frescoes, mosaics, works in marble, stone or bronze, textile artefacts, goldsmithery, archaeological finds and lots more. ▲ Overlooking the banks of the oldest canal in Milan, each month this huge outdoor flea market hosts more than 380 exhibitors, most of whom are antique dealers, with two streets, via Corsico and via Paoli, dedicated to high-quality vintage items. Furniture, watches, ceramics,

silverware, jewelry, dolls, toys, collectibles, books, eyewear, radios, bric-a-brac, walking sticks, bronze items, glassware, comics and prints are displayed on the last Sunday of every month along the almost two kilometers of the first stretch of the Naviglio Grande, from viale Gorizia to the bridge of via Valenza.





THE 'SALONE' AND 'FUORISALONE': MILAN, CAPITAL OF DESIGN

207, 000 square metres of exhibition space, 2,310 exhibitors, 300,000 industry members from 160 countries, with an expected visitor attendance of 30,000 people during the weekend: these are the staggering figures announced for the **55th Salone del Mobile** which will be held at Rho's futuristic fairgrounds (designed by renowned archistar, Massimiliano Fuksas). The main event will also include the

Salone Internazionale del Complemento d'Arredo, the SaloneSatellite – dedicated to young designers under the age of 35 - this year's event will feature 650 rising stars – the brand new xLux – where classical and design furniture sit cheek by jowl -, and the bi-annual EuroCucina – with its collateral event Ftk, Technology For the Kitchen – and the

Salone Internazionale del Bagno.

And, last but not least, the myriad

Fuorisalone events listing all of them is almost impossible that animate various locations across the city, from the ateliers of small artisans to the stores of big-name brands, by way of post-industrial venues and period buildings, with parties, exhibitions, installations, artistic performances and previews concentrated in eight main districts: Tortona, Brera, Lambrate, Porta Venezia, San Babila, le "5 vie", Sant'Ambrogio and San Gregorio.

TORTONA DESIGN: A GREAT CLASSIC

The vibrant Tortona neighbourhood, a blend of old-style Milanese 'palazzi' and former industrial spaces transformed into creative hubs and urban workshops, has now become synonymous with the 'Fuorisalone'. During the Design Week, the area is literally swamped by visitors who flock to admire the workshops of artisans and the fabulous exhibitions showcased by international brands. Milan's famous **Superstudio Più** hosts SuperDesign Show, ten thousand square metres of space featuring projects, museum installations, pavilions and independent and collective exhibitions. Alternately the nearby **Base**, housed in the former Ansaldo industrial spaces, will host a creative co-working area, while Mudec, the new Museum of Cultures designed by

Chipperfield, will dedicate an exhibition to **Joan Mirò**. Even the hotels in the area will embrace the concept of design, from the nhow Milano, which offers visitors a unique journey into the world of the most visionary, dream-like design, to the Magna Pars Suite Hotel, the first 'Hotel à Parfum' in the city.

DESIGN, PHILOSOPHY AND...

This year, Milan's famed design districts will see the addition of another 20 venues earmarked to host the events of the 21st International Exhibition of the Triennale di Milano. These will include **Pirelli HangarBicocca** which will host Architecture as Art, an exhibition reflecting the relationship between art and architecture; the **Triennale Design Museum**, with the exhibitions TDM 9. W. Women in Italian Design, which attempts to explore the role

played by women in Italian design from the 20th century to the present time, Brilliant! The future of Italian jewellery, and ROOMS. Other philosophies of living, featuring the work of 11 famous interior designers; the **Fabbrica del Vapore**, a platform for concerts, installations and the New Craft exhibition which celebrates the meeting between technological innovation and craft skills with demonstrations by artisans showcasing new digital manufacturing

techniques.
The 21st Triennale will also see the revival of the **Expo district**, located at the northwestern boundaries of the city between Milan and Rho. From the end of May, the cycle of exhibitions entitled **City after the city** (which includes five themes: Landscape Urbanism, Urban Orchard, Expanded Housing, People in Motion, Street Art), will be hosted in two pavilions overlooking the square which led from Cascina Merlata to

the Cardo and the surrounding area will be transformed into a 'global orchard'.

EAT URBAN AND DRINK FUTURISTIC

In addition to exhibitions and events there are also a flotilla of **restaurants and bars** dedicated to design in Milan. In particular, we recommend two totally unique, must-try addresses. The first is di **Eat Urban**, Design Week's Street Food Festival, a real open-air restaurant of the Fuorisalone: a selection of the best street food on wheels - including Ape cars and vintage vehicles – set up in the garden of DOUTDESign, formerly a convent and now the headquarters of the Sant'Ambrogio Design District, in via San Vittore 49 (http://zonasantambrogio.com/eat-urban). The second address is **Surfer's Den**, in piazza Caduti del Lavoro 5, in the Navigli district, a small yet ultra-sophisticated

See you at the Studio

Looking for an unfiltered snapshot of Italian contemporary art? IterArs, a group of curators organizes art exhibits in carefully selected art studios which can be visited individually, or as part of a tour. April's highlights include "La Linea Rossa" at Fabio Giampietro's atelier. His paintings of a dense, dark Milan are contrasted with Alan Maglio's photographs of some of its immigrants. Not to be missed is Mark Kalinka's studio and his "Le Parole Sono Importanti", a body of work in which images of famous authors emerge from thick, layered text. In his atelier, Giovanni Manzoni presents "Un Viaggio Lungo un Disegno": a collection of drawings dedicated to famous travelers

from Marco Polo to Jules Verne. In his studio, Giacomo Spazio presents "Favorite Things": new paintings from the artist inserted into a collective of works he selected from the pop,

underground and punk art scenes in Milan. Finally, Daniela Novello presents "Il Giorno Imperfetto" in her studio. A series of installations regarding Aldo Moro's kidnapping: one of Italy's darkest hours. For additional info on reservations go to www.wheremilan.com

cocktail bar that ended up on the pages of the 'New York Times' thanks to the passion of its barman, Yuri Gelmini, one of the key practitioners of 'futurist mixology'. In addition to rediscovering historic 'poly drinks' (the futurists didn't call them cocktails), Gelmini, one of the protagonists of the Zero Design Festival, held in the middle of March, has created several new poly-drinks, including his Ape Vigorosa (Busy Bee), whose ingredients include a piece of fresh honeycomb and 'Grandi Acque', a mixture of grappa, gin and Sambuca enhanced by a communion wafer stuffed with anchovies.

MIART: HIGH-QUALITY ART

Among the opening events of Milan's fabulous spring Design Week, Miart, the fair of modern and contemporary art, deserves a special mention, not only because of the wealth of works showcased (the fair is held from 8 to 10 April at Fieramilanocity, viale Scarampo, Gate 5), but also because of the number of off-site events organized, including the extraordinary - and often free - openings of important Milanese museums: the Museo del Novecento, PAC-Padiglione di Arte Contemporanea, Palazzo Reale and Fondazione Prada. www.miart.it

> BRERA DESIGN DISTRICT

During the last edition of the Fuorisalone, Brera, home to several of the city's most historic streets, but also the futuristic Porta Nuova-Gae Aulenti area, showcased some 138 events, attended by more than 200 thousand people. This year, it will once again be offering a high-profile events calendar, including the exhibition-event entitled Space & Interiors in The Mall area, inspired by the theme 'Design means Listening'.

> VENTURA LAMBRATE

A semi-peripheral and post-industrial area of the city, which has re-emerged over the past few years due the creative industry within the area. During Design Week, its old workshops and warehouses are transformed into glamorous showcases for innovative, countertrend designers.

> SAN GREGORIO DOCET

This is the latest addition to Milan's design districts and, as its name suggests, not only teaches but also sets trends (the Latin word 'Docet' means to teach); nicknamed the 'restricted district', it encompasses via San Gregorio in the multi-ethnic neighbourhood of Porta Venezia and is home to Leclettico, the interior design space founded by avantgarde designer, Claudio Loria.

EXHIBITIONS AT THE TRIENNALE

Think Pellini

The costume jewelry created by Donatella Pellini tell a fascinating story: tourmalines, aquamarines, white agates and topazes combined with multiform resins boasting an unmistakable sense of colour.

When was your business founded and how has it changed over the years?

It all began in 1947, with the first creations, in Murano glass, designed by my grandmother Emma. In 1964, my mother opened our first boutique in Milan, in via Morigi. In 1987, I began working with resins, experimenting with the inclusions that became our trademark.

Where does the inspiration for your resin jewelry come from?

It all began when Romeo Gigli asked me to enrich his collection with necklaces that looked as though they were made from amber and coral. I wasn't satisfied with the results obtained with synthetic materials, so I began experimenting with resins. The result was astonishing. Luckily, even today we can use this technique because we have an artisanal workshop.

What should we expect to find on visiting the Pellini boutique for the first time?

Unique pieces in resin, semi-precious stones, crystals, glass and metals. The look of our shop also changes regularly thanks to our continuing search for original bags and accessories that blend in seamlessly with the surrounding decor.

To tribute the 'Salone del Mobile 2016' at the Pellini showlab, via Morigi 9, renowned architect Michele de Lucchi will present a collection of unique pieces entitled 'I VASI SCOMPARSI'. From 6pm onwards.





To start your sightseeing tour on the right foot, we suggest stopping for a cup of coffee at **Princi**, not just an ordinary bakery, but a meeting point where, amidst the heady scents of "brioches" and "cappuccino",

you will have a chance to

begin your day on a high note. A reference point for antique lovers, Brera boasts a large number of antique shops and art galleries: don't miss a visit to **Lorenzo Vatalaro** in piazza San Simpliciano 7, focused on antique sculptures, paintings and artworks, where a few modern, contemporary items are also represented.

Maybe you've just seen **Leonardo's Last Supper** and are in need of a relaxing walk to ward off the possible onset of Stendhal's syndrome. Or, maybe you simply wish to take a stroll through one of Milan's less touristy areas. In all of these cases, the **Vercelli-Belfiore district**, it boasts as many as 500 sales points scattered midway between the Conciliazione and Wagner metro stops, is a perfect itinerary: this area, though mainly residential and frequented during the day, is capable of surprising visitors. One of the most characteristic and strategic tram routes in the city, this district is definitely worth a visit, shopping bag in hand. In fact, its carousel of shops has few rivals.

CORSO VERCELLI, SHOPPING BAG IN HAND

If you access corso Vercelli starting from piazzale Baracca, at building number 1 you will find a **Montblanc** boutique, home to high quality beautifully fashioned timepieces and writing instruments.



monobrand store right here on corso Vercelli. While in the area, should you decide to pick up a new pair of uber-glam sunglasses, at number 5 corso Vercelli, **Salmoiraghi e Viganò** awaits you. IN DISCOVERY OF **VIA BELFIORE'S BOUTIQUES**

On reaching piazza Wagner, you can make a small diversion in discovery of via Belfiore, even less touristy and, therefore, even more suggestive. And yet, even here, several of the most prestigious brands make an appearance, in quick succession. For a luxe pit-stop, at number 18, you'll find one of the most iconic **Nespresso** points in the city. Now that you're feeling a little more energized, you can return to the heart of Italian craftsmanship: in a singular "duel" two different artisanal shoe shops stand one next to the other, both boasting a storied past and the guarantee of Italian artisanal excellence. It's up to you to choose between one of the two, either Calzature Belfiore, handcrafted shoes since 1950, or Calzature Cardinale, a small family-run business since 1977. On the contrary, at number 6, you'll find Mortarotti, a cult destination of Milanese style carrying the creations of the best Italian fashion brands.

By retracing your footsteps, you'll find yourself back in corso Vercelli, where you can browse the other side. Starting from the other end, you'll find **Coin**, the upmarket department store stocking a good collection of most of what you have seen until now. Further on, at number 14, you'll find yet another classic of Made-in-Italy, i.e. **Geox**, which doubles up just a little further on down the road at number 8, with its upmarket cousins **Fay, Hogan** and Tod's. If children are your target, make a small deviation into the parallel of via Rasori, where, at number 4, you'll find a delectable boutique, simply spilling over with surprises, **SophiePetit**. And while you're here, bear in mind that there's another gem, whose "toys", in this case, are more likely to appeal to the ladies: Martino & Mazzolini, at number 8, is an intriguing goldsmith's workshop that creates bronze jewellery using an ancient technique that has almost disappeared. Finally, walking towards Sant'Ambrogio, don't miss a visit to the famed Belgian chocolate

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

To add a touch of innovation to your wardrobe or home, make sure to take a look at the clothing designed by Chris Cerf with jewelry by Elena Boffi on sale at **Sant'Ambrogio16**, at the same address. **INSIDER'S TIP** If you love clothing with a vintage allure, save a little time to visit **Atelier** Annarosa Ravà where you can find elegant, sophisticated 50s inspired dresses and women's suits, as well as pochettes, hats and jewelry (www.annarosarava.com; corso Magenta, 14). For style-savvy men, a stop at **Boggi** is the perfect place for a wardrobe update (www. boggi.it). Here fashion conscious gentlemen can purchase chic outerwear or shirts, perhaps paired later with an elegant, Made-in-Italy haute couture tie from **E.Marinella**, whose atelier can be found at number 5 via Santa Maria alla Porta (www.marinellanapoli.it). In this section of corso Magenta, and for a look exuding impeccable style, you will find the Fratelli Rossetti boutique, selling luxury footwear for men and women beckons with its selection of iconic models

Now cross the street and enter the universe of Locherber, the first monobrand boutique dedicated to the brand's fragrances. If, on the other hand, you're in search of a cologne, body cream or gift idea distinguished by unmistakable packaging, the **Jo Malone London** monobrand boutique is the place for you (www.jomalone.com). Finally, for a unique men's grooming experience, head to exclusive barber shop Barberino's, where you can enjoy a wet-shave reminiscent of those given at oldschool barber's shops or, on the other hand, you can find everything required for a professional 'do-it-yourself' shave when you combine the exquisite shaving creams produced by Creed with aftershave balms from Calé at Pérfume by Calé (www.cale.it).

Dream Lakes

Lying North of Milan and set in the Alpine Chain, each year the lakes of Lombardy attract millions of visitors thanks to their mild climate, breathtaking scenery, natural beauties and historic and artistic treasures. By **Diana Orlando**

he shores of Lago Maggiore wash up on the banks of Piedmont and Lombardy in Italy, while its more austere northern basin lies in the mountainous region of Switzerland. The most Betrothed") is the romantic and worldly famous island, lying just off **Stresa** – a small, elegant town, rich in neoclassic and liberty buildings and a shopping mecca boasting a myriad of boutiques – is Isola Bella, anchored like a fantastic ship-garden and dominated by the majestic Palazzo Borromeo, built in the 17th century and rich in art treasures, including the private collection of Milan's most famous aristocratic family. The Borromeo clan also owned Rocca di **Angera**, an imposing fortress (12th-17th century) boasting opulent ambiences, of which the most famous is the Sala di Giustizia. The "Rocca" also has a medieval garden (Visits daily from 9am-5.30 pm. www.borromeoturismo.it). The new "Lago Maggiore Express" now also offers daily excursions by train and boat from Milan

(www.trenord.it/it/free-time). **Lake Como**, on whose shores Alessandro Manzoni drew inspiration for his masterpiece "I Promessi Sposi" ("The older sister of Maggiore and Garda and takes its name from the city of Como. "Must-visit" sights include the Gothic Duomo, the Romanic basilicas of San Fedele and Sant'Abbondio and the neoclassic Villa Olmo. Lying just a stone's throw northwest of Como is Cernobbio, a small fashionable resort frequented by the wealthy of Europe because of its deluxe hotel Villa d'Este and Villa Erba where director Luchino Visconti spent his childhood (www.villaerba.it). Continuing north, we find Isola Comacina a jewel of art and nature, rich in Mediterranean vegetation and one of the most important archaeological sites of the dark ages in Northern Italy (www.isola-comacina.it). In nearby Tremezzo, don't miss a visit to the

Baroque-style Villa Carlotta, featuring an Italian garden and sculptures by Canova. At the junction of the southern arm of the lake lies Bellagio, also referred to as the pearl of Como, set in a strategic position to soak up the panorama.

Don't miss a visit to the other lakes that are also easily accessible from Milan. These include Lake Orta, with the old Island of San Giulio, traversed by the "Via del silenzio e della meditazione" ("Road of silence and meditation") and dominated by the Romanesque basilica, the Palazzo Vescovile and the monastery (by car from Milan: take the A26 autostrada and exit at either Borgomanero or Arona). Situated just moments from the lake, we find the UNESCO world heritage site of Sacro Monte di Varallo (16th century) with its magnificent basilica and reconstruction of the life of Christ in 45 chapels. As an alternative, we suggest a trip to Lake Varese and Lake Lugano.

a truly unique spot. Lastly, Isola dei **Pescatori** (also known as Isola Superiore) is the only island of the archipelago that is inhabited year-round. LA VENARIA REALE

Originally built as a hunting lodge for the Savoys, it is now a sought-after tourist destination where visitors can admire its rooms, often used to host top-level exhibitions. Other must-visit attractions include its gardens, accessible either on foot or aboard a small convenient train. The House of Diana, the Fountain of the Stag and the Royal Stables are just some of the marvels housed in the villa's park which is a part of the imposing Parco della Mandria, an oasis of peace for protected animal species. www.lavenaria.it DISTANCE FROM MILAN: 1 h 45 min (142km)

MANTUA

"A city shaped like a Palazzo": this delightful description given by academic and diplomat Baldassarre Castiglioni perfectly renders the idea of the charms and treasures offered by Mantua. Small and well designed, the city is, first and foremost, an original mixture of history and art. Originally an Etruscan settlement, it achieved its full splendour in Medieval times and, in particular, during the reign of the **Gonzaga family**, the Dukes of Mantua who conquered the city in 1328 and ruled benevolently until 1707. Important monuments including Palazzo Ducale, Palazzo del Podestà, Palazzo della Ragione and the churches of San Lorenzo (the "Rotonda") and Santa Maria del Gradaro also date back to this period. The city was named Italian Capital of Culture 2016. www.mantova.com

TRENTO

Set within the heart of the Alps, during its thousand-year evolution Trento has known how to attract elements of different traditions, originating from Northern and Southern Europe, combining them in a truly unique mix which eventually resulted in the city being chosen as the seat of the Council of Counter-Reformation (1545-1563). Its landmark sights include the austere Castello del Buonconsiglio, the 16th century villafortress of Palazzo delle Albere and the brand new Muse-Museo delle Scienze, designed by Renzo Piano. The exhibition 'Marzio Tamer. Nature', scheduled to preview at Milan's Salamon&C. Gallery (Porta Venezia District) from 1 to 10 April (see page 8), will then travel to this prestigious location where it will be held until 25 June. (www.salamongallery.com – www.muse.it)

Innovation at the museum

The Leonardo da Vinci National Museum of Science and Technology enlarges its spaces with a new section dedicated to exhibitions and installations: 'Le Cavallerizze'. By **Stefania Vida**

he largest museum of science and technology in Italy (one of the most important museums in Europe and in the world) has been revamped with 'Le Cavallerizze', the new building created as the result of an important project involving architectural renovation work and urban redevelopment curated by architect Luca Cipelletti. The opening of the new space (which will host exhibitions and installations) is scheduled to coincide with the launch of the 21st International Exhibition of the Triennale di Milano '21st Century. Design After Design', the event dedicated to design which will be held in the city from 2 April to 12 September. An event of key importance for Milan which will see the participation of the Museum alongside other leading cultural institutions. Several of the countries participating at the Triennale 2016 will

be hosted at the Cavallerizze. Highlights will include the opening of the temporary exhibition entitled 'Confluence' (which will interpret the key concept of 'Design after design') and, on weekends, 'Fai da tech', the educational program targeted at youngsters and families. The Science Museum is one of the city's landmark attractions, and is justifiably a part of the city's history. Housed in the old cloisters of the Olivetani, its transformation into a new cultural hub began in 1947 and was completed in 1953 when it was officially opened to the public. Today, its rooms host the most important testimonies of the history of science, technology and Italian industry dating from the 19th century to present times, with more than 16,000 historic artefacts, as well as the world's largest collection of models based on original drawings by Renaissance genius **Leonardo da Vinci**.

Museo del Duomo

Totally refurbished in 2013, the museum houses and highlights all the material not presently in use in the Duomo, linked to its history and construction. Worthy of particular note are the rooms of the Tesoro, Tintoretto's "Jesus Among the Doctors", the imposing wooden model of the cathedral built in 1519 and the tiles of the fifth door of the Duomo by Lucio Fontana and Luciano Minguzzi. SHOAH MEMORIAL OF MILAN

This is a symbolic place commemorating the deportation of Jews and other persecuted people to the concentration camps (Bergen Belsen), Italian deportation camps (Fossoli or Bolzano) or death camps (Auschwitz-Birkenau). The site of the Milan Memorial is unique among places of the Shoah in Europe in that it has remained substantially unchanged from its original form. It has been created in a hidden part of the Central Station, beneath the main track level. This is a place of commemoration, but also a space for building the future and promoting civil coexistence. A place of study, research and exchange, a memorial for those who were, for those who are, and especially for those who will come.

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

nfoMilano is the city's first visiting card and the place from which everyone can get friendly, helpful, multilingual advice about everything that Milan has to offer. A modern facility designed to welcome and accompany tourists from their arrival in the city and for the entire duration of their stay, offering a **vast range of services**: from cultural activities to hotel accommodation right up to the various options available to discover the city and its attractions, including museums, restaurants, historic workshops and the most exclusive shopping. The choice of setting up InfoMilano inside the **Urban Center** stemmed from a need to provide tourists with a highly central, visible and attractive place positioned in one of the city's best-known destinations, namely the Galleria Vittorio Emanuele II, a connecting point between piazza del Duomo and Teatro alla Scala. Boasting 400 square metres spread out over

three floors (170 of which comprise the ground floor), the Urban Center was designed to accommodate a visitor influx estimated at around 90,000 people per day in anticipation of the Universal Exposition held in 2015.

The establishment of the InfoMilano space serves as an addition to the regular activities of the Urban Center which will continue to host debates, presentations and meetings open to the public. The spaces, its flooring, partitions and audio/video systems have been upgraded to guarantee improved efficiency and a more rational use of the space available, thus guaranteeing the complete autonomy of the two facilities.


