Piazza Duomo branches off into corso Vittorio Emanuele which leads to piazza San Babila and the nearby via Torino which stretches as far as porta Ticinese (from here you can access the Navigli and the recently revamped Darsena). On the other hand, lying in the opposite direction is Corso Buenos Aires, the

longest shopping street in the world. Packed on both sides with a flotilla of shops, its starts from trove of si

Louis Vuitton

Porta Venezia (don't miss the new, recently restructured piazza Oberdan and Spazio Oberdan for film aficionados) and ends in piazzale Loreto. If you need to take a breather after indulging in some frenetic shopping then why not head to the beautiful **Indro Montanelli Public Gardens** in porta Venezia? The gardens are also home to the Planetarium and the Civic Museum of Natural History.

#### **ARTISTIC SHOPPING**

Brera and the Navigli are two of the most picturesque districts in old Milan. If this is where you're headed, then make sure to wear 'flatties', their cobbled streets were not originally designed for heels!

Since time immemorial, Brera has been associated with the artistic heart of the city. In fact, as you walk through this historic district you will be struck by its almost surreal atmosphere, a treasure trove of small artists' workshops, quaint

shops selling canvases and paints, antique shops and the imposing **Academy of Fine Arts**. Highlights include the masterpieces at the Pinacoteca, the historic Biblioteca Nazionale Braidense, the Astronomical Museum, the oldest institute of scientific research in the city, and the Botanical Gardens, an evocative green oasis in the heart of the city.

#### **SHOPPING IN A QUIET AREA**

Corso Vercelli and via Vincenzo Monti are Milan's 'niche' shopping streets which though less busy and easier to shop in than the city centre, are, nevertheless, packed to overflowing with small shops just waiting to be discovered in a characteristic atmosphere, further enhanced by the passage of historic trams that give this street an almost retrò flavour. While strolling along corso Vercelli you will come across lots of trendy shops for all tastes: from clothing to footwear, from decorations for the home right up to taste locations, small gems of sought-after elegance that are bound to seduce you! What's more the area is also located just a stone's throw from one of Milan's most important attractions: **The Last Supper**, a masterpiece admired each year by millions of visitors. Also within easy walking distance are Parco Sempione, the Triennale di Milano and the Torre Bianca and, if you're feeling energetic, you can easily push onwards until you reach the Castello Sforzesco.

#### **INNOVATIVE SHOPPING**

We now find ourselves in one of Milan's most contemporary, fashionable districts, bursting with buzzing bars that cater to the traditional aperitivo ritual, a destination where hip youngsters are always in the spotlight. We are obviously talking about **corso Como** and **piazza Gae Aulenti**, a real jewel of architecture and design.

From food giant **Eataly Smeraldo** in piazza XXV Maggio to the sought-after shopping

and dining complex of **corso Como**, home to '10 Corso Como, an oasis of high style, combining an art gallery, a superb design bookshop, an idiosyncratic fashion boutique and a charming courtyard café, a truly 'viby' district!

Don't miss a visit to the Tortona district, where you can find a mix of artistic

boutiques and culture hubs with the MUDEC-Museo delle Culture and the Armani/Silos.

#### **VINTAGE SHOPPING**

We end our overview of shopping with a few tips for vintage enthusiasts. One of standouts in this sector is the iconic

**Cavalli e Nastri**, a great little vintage shop at number 2 via Brera (its two other branches are located respectively at number 3 and number 12 via Gian Giacomo Mora) where, in addition to clothing and accessories, you can find a number of interesting, carefully selected objets d'art.

On the other hand, if you happen to find yourself in Foro Bonaparte, at number 74 to be exact, make sure to pop into **Madame Pauline**, who has brought a corner of France to the heart of Milan with a selection of dresses, costume jewelry, bags and accessories of all kinds dating from the early 20th century to the present time. Lastly, Franco Jacassi's **Vintage Delirium**, filled with iconic pieces from the Callot Souers, Versace and Thierry Mugler, is one of the most fascinating vintage shops in Milan.



SALES TIP

If you've forfeited making important purchases while waiting for the sales to begin, then now is the time to indulge, but not before having obtained a few tips from the experts to guarantee bagging the best bargains. First and foremost, remember that discounts are only applied to collections already on sale at shops and not, unfortunately, to new in-store arrivals. Moreover, it's important to bear in mind that discounts are not fixed, but vary from 5% to 70% depending on the individual policy of each shop. Once you've chosen

the shop, the hard part begins: make sure that the garments selected are the right size and don't buy anything that you don't love because the sales policy does not allow for changes of mind, meaning that you will not be entitled to change any item purchased, unless it happens to be defective.

A suggestion, pay attention to labels so that you know exactly what you're getting and, if you want an insider tip, don't only limit yourself to the shopping streets in the centre... if you avoid following the crowds, you'll be able to take advantage of a much wider choice!





Shopping hours are generally from 10am to 7pm; less centrally located shops still take the traditional lunch break. Most shops are closed on Sundays (except those located in central Milan) and on Monday mornings.

UnionPay is a global payment network originated from China, responsible for the inter-bank payment via UnionPay system worldwide. By the end of 2015, over 200,000 merchants in Italy accept UnionPay card for payment, among which 60,000 merchants are located in Milan. This allows hundred of thousands of affluent Chinese customers to shop with their favourite cards. UnionPay also actively work with famous retail groups, such as la Rinascente department stores, McArthurGlen Designer outlets, Value Retail outlets, Airport dutyfree shops, to provide special discount or services for UnionPay cardholders.

#### **ENTERTAINMENT**

Several venues offering food are included in the Entertainment section, because they are considered as meeting places. Most major theatre productions are listed there. Since programme times are subject to change we suggest to doublecheck specific programme times.

Reservations for most restaurants are strongly advised. In Italy, service is included in the price meaning that although tipping is not compulsory, it is obviously appreciated as a sign of satisfaction. Some menus include the word "coperto", a small surcharge corresponding to the cost of the service and bread. Although no dress code exists in Italy, semiformal clothing is usually considered de rigeur at restaurants. All restaurants and bars are non-smoking unless a separate smokers' area is specifically offered. Set meals: prices are per person.

Further on, at number 14, you'll find yet another classic of Made-in-Italy, i.e. **Geox**, which doubles up just a little further on down the road at number 8, with its upmarket cousins **Fay, Hogan** and Tod's. If you thought that the Expo site was closed, then you were wrong! Discover how it has been reinvented as an exhibition space for the XXI Triennale International Exhibition of Milan. By **Stefania Vida** 

ntil 12 September, the XXI Triennale International Exhibition of Milan, 'Design After Design', will be held at more than 20 sites across the city (and not only) with exhibitions, festivals and themed conventions. From Palazzo della Triennale to the Fabbrica del Vapore, from Pirelli HangarBicocca to the Campuses of the Politecnico, right up to the Villa Reale in Monza. To mark the occasion you can visit any one of these locations including, last but not least, the former Expo 2015 site. Until 30 September, the Triennale's urbanthemed project 'City After the City', will debut in the **Expo-Experience area**. To mark the occasion, the organizers have set up two pavilions to host exhibitions as well as an outdoor Planetary Vegetable Garden.

The Expo Milano site has been reinvented as a multi-functional location to host exhibitions and events. The project will also include a large, well-equipped park/sports centre as well as spaces to host events and concerts.

Admission is free and the area will be open from Friday to Sunday from 2pm to 11pm.

As with Expo, access to the site is guaranteed by public transport; through Porta Triulza via the Rho-Fiera metro line and the Rho Railway Station. Alternately, both the eastern area (from the flyover near the Ospedale Sacco) and the western area (from via Grandi and via De Gasperi) can be accessed via convenient cycling and pedestrian paths.

## Dream lakes

Lying North of Milan and set in the Alpine Chain, each year the lakes of Lombardy attract millions of visitors thanks to their mild climate, breathtaking scenery, natural beauties and historic and artistic treasures. By **Stefania Vida**

he shores of Lago Maggiore wash up on the banks of Piedmont and Lombardy in Italy, while its more austere northern basin lies in the mountainous region of Switzerland. The most famous island, lying just off Stresa - a small, elegant town, rich in neoclassic and liberty buildings and a shopping mecca boasting a myriad of boutiques – is **Isola Bella**, anchored like a fantastic ship-garden and dominated by the majestic Palazzo Borromeo, built in the 17th century and rich in art treasures, including the private collection of Milan's most famous aristocratic family. The Borromeo clan also owned Rocca di

Angera, an imposing fortress (12th-17th century) boasting opulent ambiences, of which the most famous is the Sala di Giustizia. The "Rocca" also has a medieval garden (Visits daily from 9am-5.30pm. www.isoleborromee.it). The new "Lago Maggiore Express" now also offers daily excursions by train and boat from Milan

Manzoni drew inspiration for his masterpiece "I Promessi Sposi" ("The Betrothed") is the romantic and worldly older sister of Maggiore and Garda and takes its name from the city of Como. "Must-visit" sights include the Gothic Duomo, the Romanic basilicas of San Fedele and Sant'Abbondio and the neoclassic Villa Olmo. Lying just a stone's throw northwest of Como is Cernobbio, a small fashionable resort frequented by the wealthy of Europe because of its deluxe hotel Villa d'Este and Villa Erba where director Luchino Visconti spent his childhood (www.villaerba.it). Continuing North, we find **Isola Comacina** a jewel of art and nature, rich in Mediterranean

vegetation and one of the most important

archaeological sites of the dark ages in

Northern Italy (www.isola-comacina.it). In

nearby Tremezzo, don't miss a visit to the

Lake Como, on whose shores Alessandro

Baroque-style Villa Carlotta, featuring an Italian garden and sculptures by Canova. At the junction of the southern arm of the lake lies **Bellagio**, also referred to as the pearl of Como, set in a strategic position to soak up the panorama. Don't miss a visit to the other lakes that are

also easily accessible from Milan.

These include Lake Orta, with the old Island of San Giulio, traversed by the "Via del silenzio e della meditazione" ("Road of silence and meditation") and dominated by the Romanesque basilica, the Palazzo Vescovile and the monastery (by car from Milan: take the A26 autostrada and exit at either Borgomanero or Arona). Situated just moments from the lake, we find the UNESCO world heritage site of Sacro Monte di Varallo (16th century) with its magnificent basilica and reconstruction of the life of Christ in 45 chapels. As an alternative, we suggest a trip to Lake Varese and Lake Lugano.

## Tips around Milan

Five destinations to spend a day of fun and relaxation for the whole family!



#### MONZA

The beauty of its 14th century **Torre dell'Arengario**, its glam shopping streets and its Gothic-style **Duomo**, featuring marvellous frescoes depicting the life of Queen Theodelinda, make the centre of Monza well worth a visit. However, Monza's real jewel in the crown is its famous Villa Reale, a magnificent 18th century dwelling designed by Francesco Piermarini, the architect who also designed the La Scala Opera House in Milan. Strolling through its Italianate gardens or its regal rooms is a feast for the eyes. Its rich calendar of events both inside and outside the villa includes exhibitions (don't miss the 'Quattroruote Road to R-evolution' exhibition until Monday 12 September showing how transportation was imagined by last century's artists and designers) and Italy's annual Formula 1 Grand Prix held on 4 September 2016 at the racetrack lying behind its park. www.villarealedimonza.it DISTANCE FROM MILAN: 50 min (25km)

#### LA VENARIA REALE

Lying behind the eponymous historical town, renowned for its delectable Piedmont fare and its picturesque yearly 'Palio', the **Reggia di Venaria Reale** is a true masterpiece of Baroque architecture and a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Originally built as a hunting lodge for the Savoys, it is now a soughtafter tourist destination where visitors can

admire its rooms, often used to host toplevel exhibitions. Other must-visit attractions include its gardens, accessible either on foot or aboard a small convenient train. The

House of Diana, the Fountain of the Stag and the Royal Stables are just some of the marvels housed in the villa's park which is a part of the imposing Parco della Mandria, an oasis of peace for protected animal species. www.lavenaria.it

#### **MANTUA**

"A city shaped like a Palazzo": this delightful description given by academic and diplomat Baldassarre Castiglioni perfectly renders the idea of the charms and treasures offered by

Mantua. Small and well designed, the city is, first and foremost, an original mixture of **history and art**. Originally an Etruscan settlement, it achieved its full splendour in Medieval times and, in particular, during the reign of the **Gonzaga family**, the Dukes of Mantua who conquered the city in 1328 and ruled benevolently until 1707. Important monuments including Palazzo Ducale, Palazzo del Podestà, Palazzo della Ragione and the churches of San Lorenzo (the "Rotonda") and Santa Maria del Gradaro also date back to this period. #### **TRENTO**

Set within the heart of the Alps, during its thousand-year evolution Trento has known how to attract elements of different traditions, originating from Northern and Southern Europe, combining them in a truly unique mix which eventually resulted in the city being chosen as the seat of the Council of Counter-Reformation (1545-1563). Its landmark sights include the austere **Castello del Buonconsiglio**, the 16th century villafortress of Palazzo delle Albere and the brand new **MUSE-Museo delle Scienze**, designed by Renzo Piano (www.muse.it). www.discovertrento.it

#### VENICE

The city's major attractions, such as the awe-inspiring Basilica of St. Mark, in pure Venetian Byzantine style, the Campanile (the bell tower) and Palazzo Ducale, the Palace of the Doges, are all situated just nearby **St. Mark's Square**. Just a few steps from the square, well worth a visit are the historic **Teatro della Fenice** and, burdened with legend, the Bridge of Sighs, one of Venice's most characteristic bridges together with Ponte Rialto and Ponte delle Guglie. In terms of uniqueness, Venice tops all other cities with its canals - which can be navigated aboard one of the city's famous gondolas – and its two islands which can be easily accessed by means of a vaporetto: **Murano**, where for centuries glassblowers have performed oral gymnastics turning out fantastic glass pieces, and **Burano**, with its characteristic coloured houses and lace. A tip for an unforgettable experience: from the Campanile di San Giorgio maggiore visitors can admire the city from above.. without having to queue for hours. DISTANCE FROM MILAN: 3 h (275 km)



#### Duomo

The cathedral is open daily 7am-7pm. The recently renovated Museo del Duomo (see listing at the MUSEUMS section) houses hundreds of works of art dating from the 15th century to the present day. Where®Milan met Fiorenzo Galli, the Managing Director of the Museum of Science and Technology who told us about the latest innovations at this landmark site of Milanese culture. By Stefania Vida

#### What are the strong points of the Museum?

We boast a collection of approximately 17,000 historical items: a display that is important in terms of both its diversity and the number of artefacts exhibited. Other on-site facilities include a research centre (which also offers training courses for teachers), a centre devoted to the restoration of historical-scientific objects and 13 laboratories, without obviously forgetting the important work carried out by our 130 members of staff. We pay particular attention to our visitors by offering them different itineraries based on their specific interests and the time at their disposal. Our multi-lingual guides (9 languages spoken) are always on-hand to provide assistance and we also offer an App for Android.

#### What are the top 10 'must-sees' at the Museum?

It's difficult to choose, but I would definitely say the Enrico Toti submarine (which we acquired in 2005 and which has now become the symbol of the museum), the air and sea pavilion featuring the Conte Biancamano transatlantic liner (we're

talking about roughly 1,000 tons of steel), the Ebe schooner-brig (the largest vessel hosted in a museum in Italy) and Luna Rossa. I would also recommend the new Le Cavallerizze pavilion, the Leonardo da Vinci collection of models, the moonstone, the UA1 detector, the Regina Margherita thermoelectric power station, the Stassano furnace, our collection of locomotives and Enrico Forlanini's experimental helicopter. The Science Museum is a venue with a storied past projected towards the future.

#### What are your next challenges?

We can justifiably describe ourselves as an 'ongoing start up', we never stop and, what's more we have numerous projects in the pipeline. We have just opened the new, recently refurbished Cavallerizze area (currently hosting several exhibitions of Milan's XXI Triennale International Exhibition). Alternately, in July, we will be opening the new section dedicated to the history and discoveries made by Cern of Geneva. It will be a permanent exhibition, featuring objects and interactive systems that explore the evolutionary history of Cern. At the end of the year, we will also have a new area dedicated to steel, with particular reference to Dalmine, the historic, Bergamo-based company as well as a new green space covering a surface area of approximately 5,000 sq.m.



A modern facility designed to welcome and accompany tourists from their arrival in the city and for the entire duration of their stay, offering a **vast range of services**: from cultural activities to hotel accommodation right up to the various options available to discover the city and its attractions, including museums, restaurants, historic workshops and the most exclusive shopping. The choice of setting up InfoMilano inside the Urban Center stemmed from a need to provide tourists with a highly central, visible and attractive place positioned in one of the city's best-known destinations, namely the Galleria Vittorio Emanuele II, a connecting point between piazza del Duomo and Teatro alla Scala. Boasting 400 square metres spread out over

three floors (170 of which comprise the ground floor), the Urban Center was designed to accommodate a visitor influx estimated at around 90,000 people per day in anticipation of the Universal Exposition held in 2015.

The establishment of the InfoMilano space serves as an addition to the regular activities of the Urban Center which will continue to host debates, presentations and meetings open to the public. The spaces, its flooring, partitions and audio/video systems have been upgraded to guarantee improved efficiency and a more rational use of the space available, thus guaranteeing the complete autonomy of the two facilities.



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
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
