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

TOURIST INFORMATION

Let's begin with some tourist information: firstly visit the InfoMilano official tourist information center. It's located in the Galleria Vittorio Emanuele, on the corner of Piazza della Scala or, for a more serviceoriented location, don't miss the Milan Visitor Center, situated just steps from the Castle, in Largo Cairoli. This is a hub for the numerous shuttles that provide transportation to shopping outlets, and sightseeing tours from the lakes to Venice.

MOVING AROUND

To tour the city buy **The Milan Pass**, your key to the city, (more on www.themilanpass.com - Infoline +3902867131). Transport and entertainment rolled into one. Included in The Milan Pass you'll find a ticket for the **CitySightseeing** red double decker buses, currently celebrating their 10th Anniversary: 3 lines and 40 stops allow you to crisscross Milan easily, and many tourist services are included. Finally, **Veloleo** is an eco-friendly opportunity to visit the city: a three-wheeled device with electric assist and room for two at the back with a driver at the pedals. www.veloleo.it



ARTISTIC GRAFFITI The new exhibition dedicated to visionary contemporary artist Jean-Michel Basquiat begins today at MUDEC-Museo delle

Culture. Like every artist maudit, Jean-Michel Basquiat, prior to his untimely death in 1988 (aged just 27), succeeded in weaving a legend around himself and his art in just a few years. Basquiat was a significant figure in American contemporary history, owing to his unique ability as an artist to combine the all-consuming energy of New York with his African origins, which were scarred by slavery and the diaspora. Twenty years after his first posthumous exhibition at the Whitney Museum of American Art (1992-1993) and ten years after his retrospective at the Brooklyn Museum of Art (2005), this exhibition highlights Basquiat's central role among his artistic peers, and the role his art played in bridging or connecting different cultures. A toast in Milan

In addition to its artistic and cultural treasures, Milan is an eclectic mix of venues, where you can taste the best vintages. Here are a few useful addresses where you can sip the finest wines and bubbly...cheers!

here's something for all tastes! Milan has lots to offer, which is well-known by the Milanese, who enjoy trying out new places weekly (there is certainly no lack of new venues!). They also visit old favorites at traditional locations, to indulge in the quintessential Milanese Aperitivo ritual. From the most iconic addresses to the latest hotspots, you can taste, purchase or gift others with the most sought-after labels. How could wine not be 'fashionable' in the undisputed capital of fashion, Milan? The city's hottest annual event dedicated to wine is the 'La Vendemmia 2016', scheduled this year to be held from 3 to 9 October. Where? In the city's most glamorous street: via Montenapoleone, where elegance, style and 'savoir faire' team up with several of the most famous wineries to offer guests an unforgettable experience. While eyeing the boutiques and admiring the new winter collections guests will also have a chance to

savour a glass of excellent wine: très chicl For one whole week, multiple events will be held at several of the centre's most prestigious
locations, including historic 'palazzi' and boutiques, as well as restaurants and hotels.

TRADITIONAL VINTAGES

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Our wine tour starts from the picturesque Brera district, home to **Enoteca Cotti** at No. 42 via Solferino (www.enotecacotti.it) and **Enoteca Moscatelli**, at No. 93 corso Garibaldi. These are two timeless reference points for upscale drinking in the city, patronized by savvy Milanese connoisseurs. The former is a well-stocked store for aficionados of high-quality sparkling wine, while the latter, located just a short distance from Moscova, the line 2 subway stop, is one of the favourite haunts of barflies (T: 02 6554602). Another go-to destination, Enoteca Ronchi (via S. Vincenzo 12, www. enotecaronchi.it), where you will find not only the vintages of the best-known wineries (for those who are pressed for time), but also discover the names of new up-and-coming ones (for more leisurely visitors). Gran Cru, the new wine bar of Enoteca Ronchi, where wine lovers and grape aficionados can sample new labels and purchase the products of renowned companies, is also worth a mention.

SAVE THE DATE

From 3 to 9 October 'La Vendemmia 2016', the glamorous annual event in via Montenapoleone dedicated to wine and luxury returns to the scintillating boutiques lining Milan's most famous shopping street.

Thanks to its wide range of wines by the glass, you can now customize your wine tasting experience, further enhancing it by pairing your wine of choice with dishes and nibbles created on the spot (via Carducci 11, www. grancrumilano.com). In addition countless Milanese restaurants are renowned for their great wine lists and well-stocked cellars. A perfect example is **Da Berti** (via Francesco Algarotti 20, www.daberti.it), an oasis of peace and elegance since 1866. The restaurant is set in green surroundings in the heart of the centre. La Cantina Piemontese, another noteworthy example, offers a perfect mixture of quality and history because, unknown to many, it stands on the site that formerly housed the so-called 'laghett de Milan', where the boats transporting the Candoglia marble used to build the Duomo, docked (via Laghetto 2, www.cantina-piemontese.it).

Finally, if you happen to find yourself in Milan's picturesque

'Chinatown' district and wish to indulge in a trademark Aperitivo in an informal setting, make sure to head to **Cantine Isola** (via Paolo Sarpi 30, T: 023315249).

GET TRENDY

What do you do if you're in Milan and want to blend in with the locals indulging in the ritualistic Aperitivo hour? This is not as easy as it seems, because practically all venues offer truly great settings. Two, go-to addresses, located in Milan's highly central piazza Duomo, where you can drink a fabulous glass of bubbly and feel like a real Milanese local, are the new restaurant Altezza Duomo and Signorvino. The former is a modern location with an old-world vibe where guests can pair more than 7,000 labels with the specialties prepared by starred chef Luca Marchini (entrance from Piazza Duomo 21,

2nd floor, www.altezzaduomo.com - www.townhousehotels.com), while the latter, located right behind the

Duomo, is a pleasant bistro cum wine bar that also has another branch in via Dante. Both of Signorvino's venues boast stylish, contemporary spaces where wine

takes centre stage, and where a 'wine manager', who deals with sales, is always on hand to offer connoisseurs or amateurs his expertise

and advice (www.signorvino.com). In Brera, for years, N'Ombra de Vin (via S. Marco 2, www.nombradevin.it) and the La Briciola restaurant (via Marsala 2 – corner of via Solferino, www.labriciola.com) have been the favourite haunts of A-listers and celebrities. VIP-watching is guaranteed at both places! For those in search of a more romantic spot, we suggest the Hotel Château Monfort (Corso Concordia 1, www.hotelchateaumonfort.com), which is famous for its 'Cella di Bacco' wine bar. This is not simply a cellar, but a place where you can indulge in a one-of-a-kind tasting experience thanks to its fabulous selection of Italian wines. Here, the undisputed star is Venissa, producing less than 4,000 bottles a year created for connoisseurs and collectors throughout the world. Their wine is produced in Venice's lagoon area from a rare white grape called Dorona, a varietal that was cultivated for centuries and then almost disappeared, until it was lovingly restored by the Bisol family in 2002. BRERA DISTRICT



Brera is synonymous with the **artistic heart** of the city. In fact, as you stroll along the streets of this ancient district, you cannot help but be enchanted by its almost surreal atmosphere boasting small artisans' workshops or quaint stores selling canvases and paints.

EDITOR'S TIP Additionally, Brera is home to the impressive Accademia di Belle Arti, where visitors can admire Milan's famous painting collection at the **Pinacoteca** (the Brera Picture Gallery), the historic **Biblioteca** Nazionale Braidense (Braidense National Library), the Museo Astronomico (The Astronomical Museum), the oldest scientific research institute in the city and the Giardino Botanico (Botanical Gardens).

ART, SHOPPING AND ENTERTAINMENT

To start your sightseeing tour on the right

foot, we suggest stopping for a

chance to begin your day on a high note. A reference point for antique lovers, Brera boasts a large number of antique shops and art galleries: don't miss a visit to **Lorenzo** Vatalaro in piazza San Simpliciano 7, focused on antique sculptures, paintings and artworks, where a few modern, contemporary items are also represented. As an aside, those interested in bargains or bric à brac should definitely make time to visit the Mercatino di antiguariato e brocantage, held on the third Sunday of each month. Not far from the elegant artisan footwear

sold by **Iliprandi** or the evocative location where jewellery collections are designed and handcrafted, ddm-daniela de marchi. The array of boutiques continues with the tailor-made, Italian-style shoes by

Alfonso Garlando. Other points of interest include historic luxury jewellers Manfredi, antique and modern creations in silver at the Argenteria Dabbene, the original accessories by Angela Caputi Giuggiù and unique leather accessories by Giòsa Milano in via Ciovasso. Conversely, for design aficionados, we suggest a visit to lose yourself amidst the thousands of furnishing ideas offered by Cargo&Hi-Tech.

TASTING SUGGESTIONS

Between visiting one shop and another, you might be surprised to suddenly discover that it's time for lunch. Try the typical Parmabased charcuterie specialities at Parma & Co, where you can also enjoy a Sunday brunch or the famed sandwiches sold by Panino Giusto. The afternoon is likely to pass by in a flash until you suddenly realize that it's aperitivo time: you are definitely likely to be seduced by the purely Art Décostyle atmosphere of **El Tombon de San** Marc or the trendier atmosphere of Fashion Café in via San Marco; other options are heady wine tasting sessions in the informal ambience of either N'Ombra de Vin or Moscatelli.

Conversely, the more fashion-oriented will find just what they're looking for in nearby corso Como, featuring Milan's renowned 10 Corso Como, a cafè, restaurant, concept store, bookshop and exhibition space. Choosing the right restaurant for dinner might pose quite some discussion. Here are some venues where you can savour authentic Italian cuisine: Maxelâ, for meat lovers, La Briciola, Il Consolare, and Giallo for real "VIP-watching", the Piedmontese flavours of Alla Cucina delle Langhe, the Tuscan ones of Osteria Brunello and, last but not least, the characteristic restaurants of old Milan including Rigolo, All'Isola, Trattoria Torre di Pisa and La Vecchia Lira. Not to be missed, the Carminio where the menu changes daily. Finally, make sure to visit Ristorante 13 Giugno, a triumph of Sicilian cuisine, and the adjacent Fattoria di Brera, a unique pret-à-manger renowned for its stylish ambience and its delightfully fresh fare and, for a different taste, the new

restaurant Hong Kong **Crossover** in via Ciovasso offers the sought-after flavours of the Orient.



VERCELLI-BELFIORE DISTRICT



Maybe you've just seen Leonardo's Last Supper and are in need of a relaxing walk to ward off the possible onset of Stendhal's syndrome. Or, maybe you simply wish to take a stroll through one of Milan's less touristy areas. In all of these cases, the Vercelli-Belfiore district, opticians in Italy, it boasts as many as 500 sales midway between the Conciliazione and Wagner metro stops, is a perfect itinerary: this area, though mainly residential and frequented during the day, is capable of surprising visitors. One of the most characteristic and strategic tram routes in the city, this district is definitely worth a visit, shopping bag in hand. In fact, its carousel of shops has few rivals.

CORSO VERCELLI, SHOPPING BAG IN HAND

If you access corso Vercelli starting from piazzale Baracca, at building number 1 you will find a **Montblanc** boutique, home to high quality beautifully fashioned timepieces and writing instruments.

At number 3, you will find Zadig & Voltaire, the French clothing brand that, in 2008, chose to open its first Geor

Italian monobrand store right here on corso Vercelli. While in the area, should you decide to pick up a new pair of uber-glam sunglasses, at number 5 corso Vercelli, Salmoiraghi e Viganò awaits you. One of the best-known points scattered across the country. Just a little further on, at number 7, your new sunglasses are likely to protect you from the glittering window displays of Luigi Verga Orologi, historic, high-class watchmakers offering a diverse selection of luxury brands including Rolex, Audemars Piguet and Pomellato. While on the subject of luxury, from number 11 onwards you will find a real mini-haven of elegance, mainly for men and mainly madeto-measure. The stores located here range from **De Molfetta**, the go-to shop for expertly handmade shirts and fashion-forward men's knitwear to Luca Calzature, a reference point since 1968 for artisanal footwear: all the beauty of Italian guality combined with the luxury of personalization and hundreds of models from among which to choose. At number 23 you can also find Brian & Barry (which, in spite of its name, is a 100% Italian brand, currently at the top of its form, as shown by its new, lavish megastore in San Babila) and Boggi Milano, a surefire choice for men's clothing where you

can take advantage of the discounts reserved

for you as a reader of Where®.

IN DISCOVERY OF VIA BELFIORE'S BOUTIQUES

On reaching piazza Wagner, you can make a small diversion in discovery of via Belfiore, even less touristy and, therefore, even more suggestive. And yet, even here, several of the most prestigious brands make an appearance, in quick succession. For a luxe pit-stop, at number 18, you'll find one of the most iconic **Nespresso** points in the city. Now that you're feeling a little more energized, you can return to the heart of Italian craftsmanship: in a singular "duel" two different artisanal shoe shops stand one next to the other, both boasting a storied past and the guarantee of Italian artisanal excellence. It's up to you to choose between one of the two, either Calzature Belfiore, handcrafted shoes since 1950, or Calzature Cardinale, a small family-run business since 1977. On the contrary, at number 6, you'll find Mortarotti, a cult destination of Milanese style carrying the creations of the best Italian fashion brands.

BACK IN CORSO VERCELLI AND VIA RASORI

By retracing your footsteps, you'll find yourself back in corso Vercelli, where you can browse the other side. Starting from the other end, you'll find **Coin**, the upmarket department store stocking a good collection of most of what you have seen until now. Further on, at number 14, you'll find yet another classic of Made-in-Italy, i.e. **Geox**, which doubles up just a little further on down the road at number 8, with its upmarket cousins Fay, Hogan and Tod's. Always at number 8, there's also Nadine, an Italian chain of women's fashion clothing. If children are your target, make a small deviation into the parallel of via Rasori, where, at number 4, you'll find a delectable boutique, simply spilling over with surprises, SophiePetit. And while you're here, bear in mind that there's another gem, whose "toys", in this case, are more likely to appeal to the ladies: Martino & Mazzolini, at number 8, is an intriguing goldsmith's workshop that creates bronze jewellery using an ancient technique that has almost disappeared. Finally, walking towards Sant'Ambrogio, don't miss a visit to the famed Belgian chocolate atelier Neuhaus Maître Chocolatier

MAGENTA DISTRICT



Mention corso Magenta and you immediately think of the chromatic contrasts of 'The Last Supper', the world-famed masterpiece by Leonardo da Vinci, lying adjacent to the Basilica of Santa Maria delle Grazie, one of the purest examples of Renaissance art in Milan. This street lies outside of the city's usual shopping precincts but nevertheless offers a subtle overview of typical old-world Milan, amidst places of culture, gourmet eateries and new shopping opportunities.

When you walk along corso Magenta from via Carducci towards the Duomo, you will find an array of picturesque shops

To add a touch of innovation to your wardrobe or home, make sure to take a look at the clothing designed by Chris Cerf with jewelry by Elena Boffi on sale at Sant'Ambrogio16, at the same address. **INSIDER'S TIP** If you love clothing with a vintage allure, save a little time to visit Atelier Annarosa Ravà where you can find elegant, sophisticated 50s inspired dresses and women's suits, as well as pochettes, hats and jewelry (www.annarosarava.com; corso Magenta, 14). For style-savvy men, a stop at **Boggi** is the perfect place for a wardrobe update (www. boggi.it). Here fashion conscious gentlemen can purchase chic outerwear or shirts, perhaps paired later with an elegant, Made-in-Italy haute couture tie from **E.Marinella**, whose atelier can be found at number 5 via Santa Maria alla Porta (www.marinellanapoli.it). In this section of corso Magenta, and for a look exuding impeccable style, you will find the Fratelli Rossetti

Arte & Scienza, (www.antik.it); then head

boutique, selling luxury footwear for men and women beckons with its selection of iconic models (www.fratellirossetti.com).

Now cross the street and enter the universe of Locherber, the first monobrand boutique dedicated to the brand's fragrances. If, on the

other hand, you're in search of



To complete your taste break, whet your appetite with the pralines or bite-sized pastries that have made Pasticceria Marchesi a favourite haunt of the Milanese for more than 200 years. This is also a reference point for traditional panettone (www.pasticceriamarchesi.it). Feel like something nice but naughty to take home with you? Taste the best Belgian chocolate signed by Neuhaus Maître Chocolatier, a must-visit gourmet boutique located just a short distance from the Museum of Science and Technology (www.neuhaus-cioccolato.it). If you're hankering

the delicious aroma wafting out of the Pâtisserie des Rêves? Even the most discerning connoisseurs will be pleasantly surprised by these



From the highly sophisticated **Les** Gitanes to the unique Bashara Milano which offers sushi menus and Italian pasticceria; from the creative **Angelo's** to the original Tagliabrodo: only soup, served in a cosy, minimalist atmosphere. And what if you want to party until dawn? There are lounge bars like the **Circle** but also pubs. A great watering hole for night owls is **Murphy's Law**, a lively Irish pub where you will never be the last to leave.

The human body: unique perspectives

Following its success in Lisbon, the 'International Expo of Human Anatomy', or 'Real Bodies, Discover the Human Body' debuts in Milan on 1 October. By Stefania Vida

eal Bodies', the largest itinerant exhibition featuring 40 bodies and 350 organs (preserved thanks to a special technique known as plastination) will open its doors to the public on 1 October. Extending over a surface area of 2,000 square metres, the exhibition will be hosted at the 'Ventura XV' space in the Lambrate neighbourhood.

Featuring 12 sections, each dedicated to a part of the human body, the highlight of the Milanese exhibition will be the plastinated body of a hermaphrodite, the latest addition to the section on human reproduction. Another rare exhibit is the plastinated body of a 100-year-old man, the only one of its

kind in the world, offering visitors a chance to gain insight on how body tissues change and deteriorate over time. The body, on exhibit for the first time ever, has been lent courtesy of an American university. An original specimen of immense anatomical and economic value. it took three years to make and involved an investment of approximately 450,000 euros. The exhibition serves as an educational tool for people of all ages and from all walks of life, including professionals, schools and families. Not only does it enable us to understand how the human body works but also teaches us an important lesson about healthy lifestyle choices, focusing, above all, on disease prevention and respect for its physiology.



Dream lakes

Lying North of Milan and set in the Alpine Chain, each year the lakes of Lombardy attract millions of visitors thanks to their mild climate, breathtaking scenery, natural beauties and historic and artistic treasures. By **Stefania Vida**

he shores of Lago Maggiore wash up on the banks of Piedmont and Lombardy in Italy, while its more austere northern basin lies in the mountainous region of Switzerland. The most famous island, lying just off Stresa - a small, elegant town, rich in neoclassic and liberty buildings and a shopping mecca boasting a myriad of boutiques – is **Isola Bella**, anchored like a fantastic ship-garden and dominated by the majestic Palazzo Borromeo, built in the 17th century and rich in art treasures, including the private collection of Milan's most famous aristocratic family. The Borromeo clan also owned Rocca di Angera, an imposing fortress (12th-17th century) boasting opulent ambiences, of which the most famous is the Sala di Giustizia. The "Rocca" also has a medieval garden (Visits daily from 9am-5.30pm. www.isoleborromee.it). The new "Lago Maggiore Express" now also offers daily excursions by train and boat from Milan

(www.trenord.it/it/free-time). Lake Como, on whose shores Alessandro Manzoni drew inspiration for his masterpiece "I Promessi Sposi" ("The Betrothed") is the romantic and worldly older sister of Maggiore and Garda and takes its name from the city of Como. "Must-visit" sights include the Gothic Duomo, the Romanic basilicas of San Fedele and Sant'Abbondio and the neoclassic Villa Olmo. Lying just a stone's throw northwest of Como is Cernobbio, a small fashionable resort frequented by the wealthy of Europe because of its deluxe hotel Villa d'Este and Villa Erba where director Luchino Visconti spent his childhood (www.villaerba.it). Continuing North, we find **Isola Comacina** a jewel of art and nature, rich in Mediterranean vegetation and one of the most important archaeological sites of the dark ages in Northern Italy (www.isola-comacina.it). In nearby Tremezzo, don't miss a visit to the

Baroque-style Villa Carlotta, featuring an Italian garden and sculptures by Canova. At the junction of the southern arm of the lake lies Bellagio, also referred to as the pearl of Como, set in a strategic position to soak up the panorama. Don't miss a visit to the other lakes that are also easily accessible from Milan. These include Lake Orta, with the old Island of San Giulio, traversed by the "Via del silenzio e della meditazione" ("Road of silence and meditation") and dominated by the Romanesque basilica, the Palazzo Vescovile and the monastery (by car from Milan: take the A26 autostrada and exit at either Borgomanero or Arona). Situated just moments from the lake, we find the UNESCO world heritage site of Sacro Monte di Varallo (16th century) with its magnificent basilica and reconstruction of the life of Christ in 45 chapels. As an alternative, we suggest a trip to Lake Varese and Lake Lugano.

Cernobbio Mon amour

Discover deep, sparkling waters, age-old parks nestling on the shores of the lake, sumptuous villas and a temperate climate almost all year round. Cernobbio is the embodiment of everything that visitors look for when visiting Europe, and which they are likely to find at Lake Como.

A graceful town, considered a perfect getaway since Roman times, Lake Como is justifiably considered an Italian paradise. For centuries, Lake Como has attracted VIPs and commoners alike. On visiting Como, the British poet Percye Bysshe Shelley remarked: "This lake exceeds anything I ever beheld in beauty." From Renaissance times, the shores of the Lake have been laced with a series of fine, **aristocratic villas**, both sumptuous and tranquil. Thickly wooded areas alternate with beautifully tended, majestic parks fronting the waters of the lake, with picturesque stairways and docking stations for boats. You can choose to admire all of this from the water, aboard a boat or ferry, or you can enjoy the view from the magnificent **panoramic road** that runs alongside the lake. The area is surrounded by many noteworthy coastal towns including Bellagio, Menaggio, Varenna and Laglio, whose housing prices have gone up thanks to the famous villa owned by George Clooney. However, among these, Cernobbio takes pride of place. Located in an enviable, sun-kissed position, Cernobbio has the honour of housing two of the lake's most beautiful hotels, Villa d'Este and Villa Erba which, with their magnificent gardens, are

two of Italy's most sought-after venues for high-profile events. In Spring, Cernobbio hosts one of the most important and exclusive international summits, attended by renowned politicians and economists. The villas have often been chosen for film sets, or as places of inspiration, famous individuals like Alfred Hitchcock, Luchino Visconti and Maria Callas were regular guests. In days gone by, the place was a holiday destination for aristocratic families and royalty. For example, the Renaissance Villa d'Este was acquired in the 19th century by Caroline of Brunswick, Princess of Wales, who was considered a sort of olden-day Princess Diana on account of her elegance and unhappy love affairs. The villa, frequented, over the years by sultans and tsarinas, politicians and Hollywood stars, was named the best resort in the world in 2010, and was the lucky retreat of 2006 World Cup winning team Italy. Those arriving from the lake will be met by a breathtaking view. If you decide to have a sundowner at Harry's Bar, enjoy celebrity spotting!

>> To reach Cernobbio from Milan: take the A9 motorway and exit at Como Nord (approximately one hour).





Italy's finest

Due to being an international tourist destination, Cernobbio offers several exclusively Made in Italy artifacts. One example is Millimetri, a particularly fascinating workshop created by three young artisans, each proficient in an ancient trade. Francesco Maglia Junior makes umbrellas (Maglia Francesco), Valentino Mazzoleni gloves (Mazzoleni) and Stefano Sarti Cipriani spectacles, but only wooden ones (FEB31st). Sharing a passion for beauty and attention to detail, these three young men have combined their experience and opened an atelier where **everything is** handmade, using selected materials and traditional working techniques.

Secret castle and park



The charm of the past Fondo Ambiente Italiano opens the doors of one of its most ancient properties: the Masino Castle, the perfect destination for a short out-of-town trip. By Giulia Minero

Nestling amidst the Canavese's hills, roughly half-an-hour's drive from Milan, the Masino Castle is a gem of architecture whose origins are steeped in 11th century Piedmontese history. Guided tours of the fortress, also available in English subject to advance booking (T: +39 0125 778100), also include its age-old grounds. A fabulous destination for open-air events, the park boasts an English-style garden abounding in luxuriant plants and shrubs and a path lined with linden trees that leads to the 18th century labyrinth of hornbeams, a vast and mysterious botanical enigma that appears in documents safeguarded in the castle's archives. Just a short distance from the property's main entrance, visitors can admire the 18th century stables and the **Coach Museum**, hosting 12 beautifully restored carriages, the majority of which date back to the 19th century. On entering the castle, guests will have a chance to admire its rooms decorated with stuccoes and frescoes which have now been restored to their former splendour thanks to the in-depth restoration work carried out by FAI (Fondo Ambiente Italiano), the National Trust for Italy. Rooms of particular note include the **Billiard** Room, a triumph of trompe l'œil frescoes,

hosting an array of period games and the spectacular circular Ballroom under whose coffered ceiling noblemen and ambassadors danced. Music lovers will be delighted to discover that the castle also houses a piano used by Rossini while composing the opera 'Tancredi'.

>> Don't miss the annual dates with:

"Paesi e Paesaggi del Gusto" (Saturday 1 and Sunday 2), a large open-air food market celebrating the best of Italian food and wine. On Sunday visitors will have a chance to partake in a collective lunch featuring the ancient recipes of the towns located in the vicinity of the castle.

"Due Giorni per l'Autunno" (from Friday 21 to Sunday 23), a one-of-a-kind horticultural show featuring rare plants and flowers, gardening tools and garden furniture. The event will see the gathering of as many as 150 green industry professionals from across Europe.

MONZA

The beauty of its 14th century Torre dell'Arengario, its glam shopping streets and its Gothic-style **Duomo**, featuring marvellous frescoes depicting the life of Queen Theodelinda, make the centre of Monza well worth a visit. However, Monza's real jewel in the crown is its famous Villa Reale, a magnificent 18th century dwelling designed by Francesco Piermarini, the architect who also designed the La Scala Opera House in Milan. Strolling through its Italianate gardens or its regal rooms is a feast for the eyes. Its rich calendar of events both inside and outside the villa includes exhibitions. LA VENARIA REALE

Lying behind the eponymous historical town, renowned for its delectable Piedmont fare and its picturesque yearly 'Palio', the **Reggia di Venaria Reale** is a true

masterpiece of Baroque architecture and a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Originally built as a hunting lodge for the Savoys, it is now a sought-after tourist destination where visitors can admire its rooms, often used to host top-level exhibitions. Other must-visit either on foot or aboard a small convenient

train. The House of Diana, the Fountain of the Stag and the Royal Stables are just some of the marvels housed in the villa's park which is a part of the imposing Parco della Mandria, an oasis of peace for protected animal species. MANTUA

"A city shaped like a Palazzo": this delightful description given by academic and diplomat Baldassarre Castiglioni perfectly renders the idea of the charms and treasures offered by Mantua. Small and well designed, the city



is, first and foremost, an original mixture of history and art. Originally an Etruscan settlement, it achieved its full splendour in Medieval times and, in particular, during the reign of the **Gonzaga family**, the Dukes of Mantua who conquered the city in 1328 and ruled benevolently until 1707. Important monuments including Palazzo Ducale, Palazzo del Podestà, Palazzo della Ragione and the churches of San Lorenzo (the "Rotonda") and Santa Maria del Gradaro also date back to this period. The city was named Italian Capital of Culture 2016. www.mantova.com

TRENTO

Set within the heart of the Alps, during its thousand-year evolution Trento has known how to attract elements of different traditions, originating from Northern and Southern Europe, combining them in a truly unique mix which eventually resulted in the city being chosen as the seat of the Council of Counter-Reformation (1545-1563). Its landmark sights include the austere Castello del Buonconsiglio, the 16th century villafortress of Palazzo delle Albere and the brand new MUSE-Museo delle Scienze, designed by Renzo Piano (www.muse.it). www.discovertrento.it DISTANCE FROM MILAN: 2.45 hours (235km)


VENICE

The city's major attractions, such as the awe-inspiring Basilica of St. Mark, in pure Venetian Byzantine style, the Campanile (the bell tower) and Palazzo Ducale, the Palace of the Doges, are all situated just nearby St. Mark's Square.

Just a few steps from the square, well worth a visit are the historic **Teatro della Fenice** and, burdened with legend, the Bridge of Sighs, one of Venice's most characteristic bridges together with **Ponte Rialto** and Ponte delle Guglie. In terms of uniqueness, Venice tops all other cities with its canals - which can be navigated aboard one of the city's famous gondolas – and its two islands which can be easily accessed by means of a vaporetto: Murano, where for centuries glassblowers have performed oral gymnastics turning out fantastic glass pieces, and Burano, with its characteristic coloured houses and lace.

A tip for an unforgettable experience: from the Campanile di San Giorgio maggiore visitors can admire the city from above... without having to queue for hours. DISTANCE FROM MILAN: 3 h (275 km)

Innovation at the Museum

Located just steps from Sant'Ambrogio, the Leonardo da Vinci Museum of Science and Technology, presents its latest innovation: the new permanent exhibition dedicated to those who investigate the smallest elements that constitute matter. By Stefania Vida

aise your hand if you've never heard of **CERN in Geneva**, the European Organization for Nuclear Research focusing on subatomic particle physics. There is nothing like seeing physics in action to excite and inspire and you don't have to travel to Switzerland to see what's going on at the forefront of physics. Milan is currently hosting a must-visit exhibition entitled 'Extreme. In search of particles', the new permanent exhibition (the first in Italy!) organized and developed by the Museo Nazionale della Scienza e della Tecnologia Leonardo da Vinci, in partnership with CERN and INFN (National Institute of Nuclear Physics): a unique experience for industry professionals, but also for those who are simply curious about learning more about those who investigate the smallest elements that constitute matter, highlighting the instruments used by physicists and

technicians with an installation that explores the daily routine of scientists.

A truly unique opportunity to discover, even just for a moment, what actually happens at the laboratories of two of the world's largest research institutes, which conduct experiments linked to particle physics.

This multi-media exhibit is also enhanced by numerous objects of incomparable historical value with an important sector dedicated to particle accelerators, essential tools that allow scientists to create new particles and study their behaviour to find out why the universe is made the way it is. 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SHOAH MEMORIAL OF MILAN

The site of the Milan Memorial is unique among places of the Shoah in Europe in that it has remained substantially unchanged from its original form. It has been created in a hidden part of the Central Station, beneath the main track level. This is a place of commemoration, but also a space for building the future and promoting civil coexistence. InfoMilano, the tourist information and hospitality point originally conceived for Expo 2015, has been set up in Galleria Vittorio Emanuele II. By Stefania Vida

nfoMilano is the city's first visiting card and the place from which everyone can get friendly, helpful, multilingual advice about everything that Milan has to offer. A modern facility designed to welcome and accompany tourists from their arrival in the city and for the entire duration of their stay, offering a **vast range of services**: from cultural activities to hotel accommodation right up to the various options available to discover the city and its attractions, including museums, restaurants, historic workshops and the most exclusive shopping. The choice of setting up InfoMilano inside the Urban Center stemmed from a need to provide tourists with a highly central, visible and attractive place positioned in one of the city's best-known destinations, namely the Galleria Vittorio Emanuele II, a connecting point between piazza del Duomo and Teatro alla Scala. Boasting 400 square metres spread out over

three floors (170 of which comprise the ground floor), the Urban Center was designed to accommodate a visitor influx estimated at around 90,000 people per day in anticipation of the Universal Exposition held in 2015. The establishment of the InfoMilano space serves as an addition to the regular activities of the Urban Center which will continue to host debates, presentations and meetings open to the public. The spaces, its flooring, partitions and audio/video systems have been upgraded to guarantee improved efficiency and a more rational use of the space available, thus guaranteeing the complete autonomy of the two facilities.




