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

#### **URBAN LANDSCAPES**





# Brera, the new perfume district

Considered one of Milan's quaintest districts, in addition to its picturesque artisanal workshops, Brera is slowly becoming populated with small yet delectable shops carrying only the most sought-after fragrances, transforming the area into a 'district of Artistic Perfumery'.

or both lovers of signature fragrances and for neophytes who are eager to delve deeper into this desirable universe, we suggest a short tour to experience the enchantment of 'Haute Parfumerie', beginning with the historic district of Brera and its countless boutiques.

#### **BETWEEN THE PAST AND THE PRESENT**

Mention Brera and you immediately think of the magnificent Pinacoteca which houses a multitude of rare artistic treasures. However, the district has a distinctive trait, namely the ability to evolve while remaining true to its traditions. Over the years, in addition to its small art galleries and shops selling canvases and paintbrushes, countless boutiques showcasing rare essences are springing up. We begin our tour in via Brera where we find **Campomarzio 70**. Founded in the roaring 1920s during the golden age of artistic perfumery, the establishment grew and flourished. Thanks to its ongoing search for the most exclusive fragrances and cosmetics, Campomarzio 70 has become a reference point for scent connoisseurs and perfumers alike. The plus points of this shop include customized consultations, a champagne corner and an olfactory workshop (by appointment only). www.campomarzio70.it At no. 5, we find the **Olfattorio Bar-à-Parfums**, dedicated to specialty perfumery. and boasting a truly unique range of artistic perfumes, niche cosmetics and luxury makeup. The space also has a corner dedicated to **Penhaligon's**, the luxury British perfume house established in 1870.

The **Olfattorio** is also present in Milan, at no. 23 via Brera, with the Dyptyque boutique, purveyors of the famous and uber trendy Dyptyque candles, the Artisan Parfumeur in via Bagutta 8, renowned for its pioneering spirit and contemporary fragrances for more than 40 years, and a space at la Rinascente in piazza Duomo (www.olfattorio.it). We end our tour of via Brera at **Profumo**. Located at no. 6, the store is housed in an elegant palazzo formerly inhabited by the illustrious Beccaria family. The palazzo's stately granite columns act as a backdrop to the creations of famous international 'noses'. taking customers on an olfactory journey that only the magic of perfume can offer (www.profumomilano.com). Just a little further one, at no. 2 via Solferino, we find the French fragrance of Fragonard.

The famous perfumer has opened its first foreign boutique, just steps from the Pinacoteca di Brera. In addition to a complete range of soaps, perfumes and cosmetics, it also carries a selection of 'Art de vivre' products including porcelain, kurte and pashminas for women and children inspired by the concept of a liberated, natural lifestyle, in keeping with the true Fragonard spirit! www.fragonard.com Our next port of call is via Fiori Chiari, where we find the beautiful window displays of Culti Milano. Over time, in addition to concentrating on home fragrances, this original innovator of the home diffuser has extended its range to encompass a series of body care products. Alessandro Agrati founded the brand in 1990. This eclectic interior designer drew inspiration from the artisanal working of rattan to create the first 'reed' home diffuser, designed to perfume living spaces with a fresh, sensual scent, using rattan bamboo reed sticks to diffuse the fragrances better. The brand also has a boutique at no. 53 corso Venezia (www.culti.com).

Just a little further on, we encounter the window displays of **Dr.Vranjes**. The 'nose' behind these fragrances is Dr. Paolo Vranjes (a pharmacist, chemist and cosmetologist) who

creates niche perfumes for people and living areas. The in-store experience is unique, and Vranjes is rightly proud of it. The store offers a dedicated olfactory décor consultancy, recommending the right fragrance for every ambience by evaluating spaces, volumes, lighting and furnishings (http://drvranjes.it). We continue onwards to the beautiful via Madonnina, where we find the Officina Profumo - Farmaceutica di Santa Maria **Novella**, once a humble pharmacy, Santa

Maria Novella has become the equivalent of Cartier for natural body care products and essences. Its recipes have remained the same since 1612 when it was founded in Florence (www.smnovella.com).

Just a little further one we find **Creed**, an historic brand, now run by the sixth generation of the founding family, which has been in business for more than 250 years... a trip back in time to discover the unique essences that originally sealed the success of the Londonbased establishment way back in 1760 (http://creed.cale.it).

We are now in piazza del Carmine, a good place to take a break and indulge in a refreshing aperitivo in the shadow of the imposing Church, before heading to Ponte Vetero to visit 9Nine, a sophisticated

perfumery that offers a selection of world-class products ranging from British toiletries to natural cosmetics, with the most prestigious names in the niche perfume industry, including Costume National Scents, Molton Brown, Ligne St. Barth and Bronnley (www.beautysanspa.com). Dulcis in fundo, anticipation builds for the opening (once again in Brera) of The Merchant of Venice, an historic perfumery epitomizing the art of Venetian perfume-making, and highlighting the city's role as the forerunner and inventor of perfume as we know it today. The Merchant of Venice offers a luxury line encompassing a wide range of exclusive perfumes for men and women, body-care products, home

If you're not yet tired, turn your attention to the famous Quadrilatero where, in addition to its glitzy, up-market boutiques, you will also discover several spaces dedicated exclusively to perfumes. We are talking about **Etro** in via Verri (www.etro.com), Acqua di Parma in via Gesù (www.acquadiparma.com) and Jo Malone in via Manzoni, which also has a branch in via Santa Maria alla Porta, located just steps from the historic Pasticceria Marchesi... for those of you who are unable to resist the temptation of indulging in a sweet treat! (www.jomalone.com). Move away from the Cadorna railway station, and when you are in corso Magenta

modern design and spacious interiors resemble those of an art gallery. Silvio Levi's luminous showroom showcases a careful selection of the world's most exclusive fragrances and is the ideal place to choose and 'sample' the fragrance pressed for time, don't worry. The historic best-suited to your personality (www.cale.it). In corso Magenta **Locherber Milano** has opened its first own-name fragrance boutique: stop shop you will find a vast assortment of a welcoming lounge-type space celebrating the olfactory universe of the Milanese brand, which has transformed home fragrance into a

# Fashion Outlets

Just a few kilometres from Milan, the nec plus ultra for the fashion addicted are the city's outlying fashion outlets. Don't miss a trip to these shopping meccas that offer discounts year-round.



#### **FIDENZA VILLAGE**

Fidenza Village is part of the collection of nine "Chic Outlet Shopping" villages in Europe.

- WHERE: halfway between Milan and Bologna. Take the A1 motorway and exit at Fidenza/ Salsomaggiore Terme. Daily shuttle service is available from Milan (see page 20).
- WHAT: over 100 boutiques featuring prestigious designer labels at reduced prices (up to 70% off), including Valentino, Paul Smith, Missoni and Michael Kors.

#### **FOXTOWN FACTORY STORES**

An outlet store on the Swiss border, FoxTown uses the popular US-style "Factory Stores" formula: practically all the best designer labels at factory prices (from 30% to 70% less). Exchange office and Tax-Free Shopping service available.

- **WHERE**: just 15 km from Lugano and 55 km from Milan. Take the Milano-Lugano motorway and exit at Mendrisio. Daily shuttle service is available from Milan (see page 20).







Scalo Milano, a district located approximately 20 minutes from the centre of Milan, dedicated to fashion, food, design and lots more besides, has just opened its doors to the public. By **Stefania Vida** 

ote down this address: via Milano 5 in **Locate Triulzi**. Built on the foundations of a late-industrial building, the location not only hosts the best design and fashion brands, but also good food... and a touch of art! Boasting approximately 130 stores extending over a surface area of 30,000 square metres on one level (with the exception of the Food Court which has been conceived as an arena located below street level), flanked by a park - a green, 130,000 square metre space, part of an urban renewal project that is slated to include cultural venues and civic spaces for people of all ages.

#### **STYLE & DESIGN**

Opened in a former industrial area, the design of the City Style District is inspired by that of

olden-day factories revitalized, however, by contemporary facades, new techniques and state-of-the art materials including glass (both transparent and coloured) and reflective steel surfaces that mirror the dynamic spirit of the city, playing with the reflections of natural light during the day and enhancing the luminosity of the window displays at night. Scalo Milano is directly accessible via an underground rail link, a train service or the motorway. In fact, in addition to taking the motorway, the venue can be quickly reached via the S13 rail link ('Locate Triulzi' stop) or via the Zani Viaggi shuttle (www.zaniviaggi.it, see also page 20).







If you access corso Vercelli starting from piazzale Baracca, at building number 1 you will find a **Montblanc** boutique, home to high quality beautifully fashioned timepieces and writing instruments. Always at number 8, there's also **Nadine**, an Italian chain of women's fashion clothing. If children are your target, make a small deviation into the parallel of via Rasori, where, at number 4, you'll find a delectable boutique, simply spilling over with surprises, **SophiePetit**. And while you're here, bear in mind that there's another gem, whose "tovs". in this case, are more likely to appeal to the ladies: Martino & Mazzolini, at number 8, is an intriguing goldsmith's workshop that creates bronze jewellery using an ancient technique that has almost disappeared. Finally, walking towards Sant'Ambrogio, don't miss a visit to the famed Belgian chocolate atelier Neuhaus Maître Chocolatier.





# Iconic Japan at Palazzo Reale

The exhibition represents one of the most significant cultural events celebrating the 150th anniversary of relationships between Japan and Italy. By **Elena Peverata** 

■ he age-old friendship between Italy and the 'Land of the Rising Sun' dates back to 25 August 1866 when the first Treaty of Friendship and Commerce, marking the beginning of diplomatic relations between the two countries, was signed. To commemorate the 150th anniversary of the treaty, different cities in both countries have organized a series of cultural events including art exhibitions, plays and modern and traditional dance performances, film screenings, events dedicated to design and architecture but also comics, sporting events and cuisine. For example, one of the events staged in Japan includes an important exhibition on Botticelli at the Tokyo Metropolitan Art Museum. The most significant event on the Milanese

events calendar is a major retrospective at Palazzo Reale dedicated to Ukiyoe masters Hokusai Hiroshige and Utamaro, featuring a selection of 200 xylographs and illustrated books including the famous *Great Wave and the Thirty Six views of Mount Fuji* by Hokusai (a part of the *Cushion Pine at Aoyama*, dated circa 1830-1832, pictured above) on loan from the Honolulu Museum of Art. On the other hand, Situations (30 September- 29 January 2017, www.hangarbicocca.org) is the first retrospective dedicated by a European institution to Kishio Suga, a key figure on the contemporary Japanese art scene.

Suga's installations (re-adapted by the artist

for the occasion) dating from 1969 to the

present in the 'Navate' space of Pirelli Hangar Bicocca. In parallel with the exhibitions, the public will have an opportunity to further their knowledge about Japan, thanks to the staging of several events of a scientific, artistic and cultural nature. The events program, dedicated to Japan, will culminate on 7 December with the premiere of Giacomo Puccini's Madama Butterfly at the La Scala Opera house.

#### Leonardo 3. Il Mondo di Leonardo



Massimiliano Lisa, Director of the Leonardo3-II Mondo di Leonardo exhibition talked to Where® Milan about this unique show, a combination of historic and scientific research featuring the reconstruction of physical and digital models. By Stefania Vida

#### What are the main attractions of this exhibition?

Our aim is to celebrate the genius of Leonardo and above all, to enlighten the public about his scientific and artistic achievements. To achieve this, we have employed several different types of media, including reproductions of his manuscripts, 3D models, interactive stations and physical models. However, our real accomplishment is that our exhibition features the first-ever reproductions of working models based on Leonardo's original blueprints. The Last Supper is also showcased in a number of different ways, including a reproduction on the wall featuring details that were lost in the original version, multi-media display stations that permit hands-on interaction and a screening in virtual reality.

# Does the museum have services that cater to the needs of international visitors?

All of our interactive stations are designed for use in both Italian and English. All that is required is a simple touch of the button on the screen (several of our stations also offer the options of different languages). Furthermore, an audio guide in other languages is also available to visitors.

When visiting the museum, what 'installations' should not be missed? It depends on individual tastes. I love

music and flight and, in both these areas, our museum boasts a number of unique installations. In particular, the *Codex of Flight* is a must-visit! Other highlights include musical machines, such as the *Clavi-Viola* (harp-viola) or the *Elastic Drum* and, naturally, his flying machines, including the *Mechanical Eagle* and the *Great Kite…* It's worth noting that several of Leonardo's projects and our models actually work!

## How long will the exhibition remain open in Milan?

The official date is 31 December 2016. However, we're hoping for a new extension or possibly, the transformation of the exhibition into a museum. In the latter case, it will be a dynamic, continuously evolving museum, because since 2013 to this date we have renewed many of its contents several times.

#### What are the next projects in the pipeline?

We're about to open a new exhibition in South Korea and we're working on several projects that may involve setting up permanent museums abroad. Furthermore, several new machines.

including a huge trumpet, that have never been viewed by the public, will soon be showcased at the exhibition in Milan.

# Visiting Italian beauties

Four destinations to enjoy a day of fun and relaxation with the whole family!

#### MONZA

The beauty of its 14th century **Torre** dell'Arengario, its glam shopping streets and its Gothic-style **Duomo**, featuring marvellous frescoes depicting the life of Queen Theodelinda, make the centre of Monza well worth a visit. However, Monza's real jewel in the crown is its famous Villa Reale, a magnificent 18th century dwelling designed by Francesco Piermarini, the architect who also designed the La Scala Opera House in Milan. Strolling through its Italianate gardens or its regal rooms is a feast for the eyes. Its rich calendar of events both inside and outside the villa includes exhibitions. Don't miss Italy's annual MANTUA Formula 1 Grand Prix held in September at the racetrack lying behind its park. www. villarealedimonza.it DISTANCE FROM MILAN: 50 min (25km)

#### LA VENARIA REALE

Lying behind the eponymous historical town, renowned for its delectable Piedmont fare and its picturesque yearly 'Palio', the Reggia di Venaria Reale is a true masterpiece of Baroque architecture and a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Originally built as a hunting lodge for the Savoys, it is now a soughtafter tourist destination where visitors can

admire its rooms, often used to host toplevel exhibitions. Other must-visit attractions include its gardens, accessible either on foot or aboard a small convenient train The House of Diana, the Fountain of the

**Stag** and the Royal Stables are just some of the marvels housed in the villa's park which is a part of the imposing Parco della Mandria, an oasis of peace for protected animal species. Don't miss the "Brueghel. Masterpieces of Flemish Art" exhibition until 19 February 2017 at the Sale delle Arti. www.lavenaria.it

DISTANCE FROM MILAN: 1 h 45 min (142km)

"A city shaped like a Palazzo": this delightful description given by academic and diplomat Baldassarre Castiglioni perfectly renders the idea of the charms and treasures offered by Mantua. Small and well designed, the city is, first and foremost, an original mixture of **history and art**. Originally an Etruscan settlement, it achieved its full splendour in Medieval times and, in particular, during the reign of the **Gonzaga family**, the Dukes of Mantua who conquered the city in 1328 and ruled benevolently until 1707. Important monuments including Palazzo Ducale, Palazzo del Podestà, Palazzo della Ragione





and the churches of San Lorenzo (the "Rotonda") and Santa Maria del Gradaro also date back to this period. The city was named Italian Capital of Culture 2016. www.mantova.com DISTANCE FROM MILAN: 2.10 hours (190km)

#### VENICE

The city's major attractions, such as the awe-inspiring Basilica of St. Mark, in pure Venetian Byzantine style, the Campanile (the bell tower) and Palazzo Ducale, the Palace of the Doges, are all situated just nearby St. Mark's Square

Just a few steps from the square, well worth a visit are the historic Teatro della Fenice and, burdened with legend, the Bridge of Sighs, one of Venice's most characteristic bridges together with the Ponte Rialto and Ponte delle Guglie. In terms of uniqueness, Venice tops all other cities with its canals - which can be navigated aboard one of the city's famous gondolas – and its two islands which can be easily accessed by means of a vaporetto: Murano, where for centuries glassblowers have performed oral gymnastics turning out fantastic glass pieces, and Burano, with its characteristic coloured houses and lace. DISTANCE FROM MILAN: 3 h (275 km)

InfoMilano, the tourist information and hospitality point originally conceived for Expo 2015, has been set up in Galleria Vittorio Emanuele II. By **Stefania Vida** 

nfoMilano is the city's first visiting card and the place from which everyone can get friendly, helpful, multilingual advice about everything that Milan has to offer. A modern facility designed to welcome and accompany tourists from their arrival in the city and for the entire duration of their stay, offering a **vast range of services**: from cultural activities to hotel accommodation right up to the various options available to discover the city and its attractions, including museums, restaurants, historic workshops and the most exclusive shopping. The choice of setting up InfoMilano inside the Urban Center stemmed from a need to provide tourists with a highly central, visible and attractive place positioned in one of the city's best-known destinations, namely the Galleria Vittorio Emanuele II, a connecting point between piazza del Duomo and Teatro alla Scala. Boasting 400 square metres spread out over

three floors (170 of which comprise the ground floor), the Urban Center was designed to accommodate a visitor influx estimated at around 90,000 people per day in anticipation of the Universal Exposition held in 2015.

The establishment of the InfoMilano space serves as an addition to the regular activities of the Urban Center which will continue to host debates, presentations and meetings open to the public. The spaces, its flooring, partitions and audio/video systems have been upgraded to guarantee improved efficiency and a more rational use of the space available, thus guaranteeing the complete autonomy of the two facilities.


