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

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
SIXTY YEARS OF ITALIAN BEAUTY

Spanning almost 60 years of design, architecture, exhibition design and more, the **Triennale** pays tribute to Mario Bellini with a

retrospective, exactly thirty years after the show dedicated to him at the MoMA in New York. This famous Italian designer achieved great success with both small and large scale designs. The former included eight Golden Compass awards, objects and furnishings that became icons in homes and offices throughout the world, and the latter, conference centres, trade fair venues, the design of museums in Japan, the USA, Germany and Australia and, in 2012, the creation of an undulating semi-transparent golden roof for the Department of Islamic Arts at the Louvre in Paris.

What's the time? It's time to eat! Because as everyone knows, Milan is not only the undisputed capital of fashion and design... but thanks to the numerous restaurants and trendy venues that enhance the Milanese gastronomic scene, food also plays a key role.

fter Fashion Week and Design Week, it's time for Food Week. When? From 4 to 11 May with a truly rich events program. While waiting for this innovative extravaganza, we have decided to tantalize your senses with our pick of the best locations in the city where you can satisfy your taste buds at all times of the day: buon appetito - enjoy our article!

9AM: SWEET TREATS, A PASSION

What could be better than starting the day with a good breakfast? In Milan, the traditional breakfast ritual is a cappuccino and a brioche at a bar. However, those in a hurry (as everyone knows, the Milanese are busy people, living their fast-paced lives in a busy, fast-paced city), limit themselves to grabbing a quick cup of coffee. However, the city boasts numerous cafés and pastry shops where you can extend this ritual with other types of sweet treats. Let's begin with a respected Milanese institution offering highquality food. This means Peck, which recently opened Piccolo Peck, its new, in-house gastronomic café.

While on the subject of historic addresses, we must mention Pasticceria Marchesi, a real Milanese institution boasting a choice of three different venues in the city: the 'historic' location in via Santa Maria alla Porta, the 'ultra-glam' spot in via Montenapoleone and the 'brand new' venue in the Galleria Vittorio Emanuele. A point of reference its picturesque shop at number 5 via De in the Quadrilatero, more specifically in via Montenapoleone 8, Cova, established in 1817, atmosphere, for an authentic trip back in time. delights the palates of the Milanese with its specialties. It is impossible not to stop in front of its glittering window displays featuring the most unusual and tantalizing creations, created, ad hoc, for all occasions (the location is currently closed for renovations and will re-open in spring 2017). Just a little further on, in corso Matteotti, is another noteworthy example, Sant'Ambroeus, an iconic café that this year is celebrating its first 80 years in the industry. Another great option is **Taveggia** Milano 1909. Located in via Visconti di Modrone (San Babila area), it is the ideal spot to indulge in a wide selection of breakfast treats, in addition to other sweet and savoury specialties served throughout the day. Last but not least, in the trendy corso Como district, we find Zàini Milano where you can savour a wide selection of products at

Cristoforis. The venue boasts an elegant, retro

Though **Sunday brunch** is not really part of the Milanese tradition, it is an ideal solution for those who have had a late night and want to start the day on a quiet note. You can find a selection of excellent destinations at numerous venues and Milanese hotels across the city. If you have a particularly sweet tooth, then the 'Chocolate Room' at the Hotel Four Seasons Milano in via Gesù is your go-to destination. This place is dedicated entirely to this delicacy, where the finest cocoa powders are interpreted in the most surprising and original ways, decoratively expressed each year with a new and imaginative theme: a real paradise of fragrances and flavours that can be sampled on Sundays when, during the hotel's famed brunch, the room is replete

with chocolate-themed offerings, including single servings of desserts, chocolate cakes, Neapolitans, chocolate covered cocoa beans and much more (www.fourseasons.com).

1PM: TRADITION IS SERVED

When visiting Milan, it is impossible not to indulge in one of the specialties of Italian or Milanese gastronomic tradition including, first and foremost, the city's famous 'cotoletta' (the breaded veal cutlets served at the Al Garghet restaurant in via Selvanesco 36, are an absolute must! (www.algarghet. it). Other Milanese highlights include 'risotto allo zafferano' (and ossobuco, for traditionalists), 'mondeghili' more commonly known as 'polpette' (meatballs), 'cassoeula' (a typically winter dish), and the sweet treats prepared to mark various festivities: 'Chiacchiere' (at Carnival), 'Colomba' (at

Easter) and 'Panettone' (at Christmas). Here is our pick of some of the best places where you can try these specialties: Da Berti (via Francesco Algarotti 20, www.daberti.it), La Briciola (via Marsala 2 – corner of via Solferino, www.labriciola.com), Al Cellini (via Cellini 19), **Da Giacomo** (which has various locations, www.giacomoristorante.com), Antica Trattoria della Pesa (viale Pasubio 10, www.anticatrattoriadellapesa.com), Antico Ristorante Boeucc (Piazza Belgioioso 2, boeucc.it). Due to its particularly unusual location, **AI Fresco** is really worth a mention: an old, converted industrial warehouse that has been transformed into an oasis of greenery (via Savona 50, www.alfrescomilano.it). Another must-visit location is **Borgospesso 1**, the city's new 'Food Court'. Located in the heart of the Quadrilatero, it has gathered several locations under one roof, including Trattoria

Bagutta 1924, Drogheria Parini 1915 and Al Panino Bistrot (via Borgospesso 1, www.borgospesso1.com).

Pizza, a delight! If you prefer something a little less traditional, when choosing a pizza, visitors to Milan are spoilt for choice. Starting with the historic **Spontini** chain, where you can sample the tastiest sliced pizza in the city (there are many addresses - for a complete list visit www.pizzeriaspontini.it). In terms of taste and experience, it's hard to beat the classic Neapolitan pizza served at Starita in via Gherardini 1 (near corso Sempione, www.pizzeriastarita.it) or at Gino Sorbillo in Largo Corsia dei Servi 11, San Babila area (www.sorbillo.it).

Vegetarian dishes with a twist. For lovers of vegetarian and vegan cuisine, here is a selection of several of the city's most interesting vegetarian and vegan venues. From the Michelin-starred Joia -Alta Cucina Naturale in via Panfilo Castaldi 18 (www.ioia.it) to Mantra Raw Vegan (via Panfilo Castaldi 21, www.mantrarawvegan.com), **Ghea** (via Valenza 5), Ristorante Bioriso (via Vittorio Sciaiola 3), Flower Burger (viale Vittorio Veneto 10) and the brand new **Soulgreen** in piazzale Principessa Clotilde (www.soulgreen.com, see page 52).

4PM A SWEET OR SAVOURY BREAK?

It's hard to choose. Let's begin with some sweet offerings, such as the ice cream served at Ciacco. Gelato senz'altro in via Spadari, Venchi for its chocolate and ice cream (www. venchi.com), Grom (several locations in Milan,

www.grom.it) and **II Massimo del Gelato** in via Castelvetro (near corso Sempione). In Milan, the undisputed king of chocolate is the famous Ernst Knam, whose pastry shop is located in via Anfossi 10 (corso XX Marzo area), www.eknam.com. Neuhaus Maître **Chocolatier**, one of the most illustrious brands of the Belgian school of chocolates, is located in Milan at number 6, via San Vittore. The shop is a small treasure chest where pralines are displayed in glass cases like precious jewels (www.neuhaus-cioccolato.it).

If, on the other hand, you're looking for something more savoury, then head to Luini. Situated at number 16 via Santa Radegonda, near the Duomo, it's been baking stuffed savoury pastries, known as 'panzerotti', since 1888. You won't believe your eyes! www.luini.it For a different kind of break we also suggest **Noberasco** in via Spadari, where you can find a wide selection of dried fruit, as well as hundreds of other gastronomic delights. www.noberasco.it

6PM: APERITIVO TIME

Aperitivo time is one of Milan's most cherished rituals. From small bars to large chic venues, Milan offers numerous surefire addresses where you can indulge in a pleasurable moment of relaxation. Some suggestions? Let's start with the trendiest, more design-oriented venues such as Just Cavalli and Il Gattopardo Café in the Sempione district, and continue with those that are part of the history of Milan including the Camparino in Galleria or Bar Magenta, in corso Magenta. However, not many stand-alone bars can match the luxurious sophistication found in fancy hotel bars, glamorous mingling spots for well-heeled travelers and high-end locals. In addition to Milan's packed centre (we suggest several 'rooftop' destinations featuring a fabulous view over the city such as Terrazza12, at the Brian & Barry Building San Babila, Terrazza Martini, Terrazza Duomo 21 and the Terrazza in via Palestro), Milan boasts four main areas dedicated to nightlife entertainment. The Navigli District, one of the city's most picturesque areas, packed with venues offering live music; the Brera district, famous for its artistic charm and numerous quaint cafes (our picks include Fioraio Bianchi in via Montebello and N'Ombra de Vin in via San Marco): Parco Sempione.

the green heart of Milan, which acts as a backdrop to the Arco della Pace, a favourite Milanese meeting place packed with bars and pubs for all tastes, including **Living!** And, finally, the city's most avant-garde district, the futuristic **piazza Gae Aulenti** and



corso Como, two of Milan's most fashionable nightlife spots, featuring pizzerias, restaurants, pubs and discotheques, including **10 Corso Como**, a great place for 'VIP-watching', or the magnificent terrace of the **Ceresio 7** bar and restaurant: the former historic headquarters of Enel, now home to fashion brand Dsquared2 (via Ceresio 7).

9PM: AMIDST TASTE AND ENTERTAINMENT

Are you in search of exotic flavours? At **Re Salomone** in via Sardegna 45 (www.resalomone.eu) and **Denzel** (via Washington 9, www.denzel.it), you can sample real kosher Jewish cuisine. Or, for a taste of the Orient, head to the Giardino di Giada (via Palazzo Reale 5, www.giardinodigiada.it), Hana Restaurant (via P. Giovio 3, corner of corso Vercelli), Hong Kong (via G. Schiaparelli 5, www.ristorantehongkong.it), Hong Kong Crossover (via Ciovasso 5, www.hkcrossover.it) and sophisticated Japanese restaurant Nobu **Milan** in via Pisoni 1, just steps from the Quadrilatero (www.noburestaurants.com).

If you're in search of something a bit out of the ordinary, look no further. For starters, we suggest the Pavarotti Milano Restaurant Museum, a restaurant dedicated to the famous Italian tenor and a place where you enjoy excellent cuisine while listening to a live concert (pavarottimilano.com). If you're a jazz enthusiast, then the **Blue Note Jazz** Club & Restaurant (via Borsieri 37, www.bluenotemilano.com) is the place for you. On the other hand, the **Memo** Restaurant is an interesting venue with a varied menu from an aperitivo to a post-



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prandial drink. Set against the backdrop of a former cinema/theatre in via Monte Ortigara 24, this venue offers a great selection of live performances (www.memorestaurant.com). Lastly, the ultimate venue for Milan's fashionable elite is the Armani/Privé in via Pisoni 1, featuring a main bar and a lively lounge space that turns into a dance floor (armanirestaurants.com).

All in one

If after tasting the best flavours of traditional cuisine, you want to take a sample of Milanese cuisine home with you as a souvenir, we recommend several top locations where you can purchase an array of outstanding gastronomic products and international specialties! In particular, we suggest three mustvisit destinations: Peck in via Spadari (www.peck.it), la Rinascente Food Hall and Food Market in piazza Duomo (www.rinascente.it) and Eataly Milano Smeraldo in piazza XXV Aprile (www.eataly.net).

EDITOR'S TIP Additionally, Brera is home to the impressive Accademia di Belle Arti, where visitors can admire Milan's famous painting collection at the **Pinacoteca** (the Brera Picture Gallery), the historic Biblioteca Nazionale Braidense (Braidense National Library), the Museo Astronomico (The Astronomical Museum), the oldest scientific research institute in the city and the Giardino Botanico tailor-made, Italian-style shoes by Alfonso (Botanical Gardens).



The museum best-loved by foreigners

Napoleon's ambition was to make the Pinacoteca di Brera the 'Louvre of Italy'. Now, a Canadian director has fallen in love with it and wants to put it back into the heart and mind of his city. By Elena Peverata

utting the Brera Museum back into he hearts of the Milanese and the city. James Bradburne, the Director of the Pinacoteca di Brera and the Biblioteca Braidense, knows exactly how he wants to relaunch one of Italy's most important treasure troves, while simultaneously focusing on the 'Grande Brera' project, which aims to promote the entire complex, by creating a support network with other museums in the city. Housed in a magnificent neo-classical 'palazzo', the Pinacoteca is home to other important historical and cultural institutions, including the Biblioteca Braidense, the Astronomical Observatory, the Botanical Garden, the Istituto Lombardo Accademia di Scienze e Lettere and the Academy of Fine Arts. to highlight the meaning of Brera's most One of Italy's most important national museums, the Pinacoteca was opened to the public in 1809 at the bidding of Napoleon Bonaparte, who wanted to make it the 'Louvre of Italy'. This means that it has a very large

selection of masterpieces from throughout northern Italy, including priceless works by Mantegna, Bellini, Veronese, Tintoretto, Crivelli, Piero della Francesca, Bramante, Raphael and Caravaggio. For the past year, in order to increase the value of the collection, the Pinacoteca has been part of an in-depth process where the layout of the museum is being redesigned - a procedure that is happening in stages. The layouts of 20 of its 38 rooms have already been completed and re-organized based on new mounting and display criteria, accompanied during each stage by an exhibition. These exhibitions: a 'Dialogue' between a selection of in-house masterpieces and related works on loan, were developed significant works. After Raphael and Perugino, Mantegna and Caravaggio, in March, the spotlight will focus on famous 16th century portraits.

In addition to the re-designing of its rooms,

and the re-opening, after 113 years, of its main entrance door, the 'Door of Marvels', located in the middle of the Scalone d'Onore on the first floor, by 2018, the project also envisages some exciting renovations. These include the renovation of the via Fiori Oscuri entrance to the Botanical Garden (a small oasis of peace in the heart of Milan) and the Astronomical Observatory, the opening of a shop in the inner courtyard and an elegant café in the 'loggiato' and, lastly, the opening of the sumptuous Palazzo Citterio, lying adjacent to the Pinacoteca, chosen to host extraordinary collections of Italian modern art.



Palazzo Reale and Milan

MONZA

The beauty of its 14th century Torre dell'Arengario, its glam shopping streets and its Gothic-style **Duomo**, featuring marvellous frescoes depicting the life of Queen Theodelinda, make the centre of Monza well worth a visit. However, Monza's real jewel in the crown is its famous Villa Reale, a magnificent 18th century dwelling designed by Francesco Piermarini, the architect who also designed the La Scala Opera House in Milan. Originally built as a hunting lodge for the Savoys, it is now a soughtafter tourist destination where visitors can admire its rooms, often used to host toplevel exhibitions. Other must-visit attractions include its gardens, accessible either on foot or aboard a small convenient train.

The House of Diana, the Fountain of the **Stag** and the Royal Stables are just some of the marvels housed in the villa's park which is a part of the imposing Parco della Mandria, an oasis of peace for protected animal species. Originally an Etruscan settlement, it achieved its full splendour in Medieval times and, in particular, during the reign of the Gonzaga family, the Dukes of Mantua who conquered the city in 1328 and ruled benevolently until 1707. Important monuments including Palazzo Ducale, Palazzo del Podestà, Palazzo della Ragione and the churches of San Lorenzo (the "Rotonda") and Santa Maria del Gradaro


VENICE

The city's major attractions, such as the awe-inspiring Basilica of St. Mark, in pure Venetian Byzantine style, the Campanile (the bell tower) and Palazzo Ducale, the Palace of the Doges, are all situated just nearby St. Mark's Square.

Just a few steps from the square, well worth a visit are the historic Teatro della Fenice and, burdened with leaend, the Bridge of Sighs, one of Venice's most characteristic bridges together with the Ponte Rialto and Ponte delle Guglie. In terms of uniqueness, Venice tops all other cities with its canals which can be navigated aboard one of the city's famous gondolas - and its two islands which can be easily accessed by means of a

vaporetto: Murano, where for centuries glassblowers have performed oral gymnastics turning out fantastic glass pieces, and Burano, with its characteristic coloured houses and lace. DISTANCE FROM MILAN: 3 h (275 km)

nfoMilano is the city's first visiting card and the place from which everyone can get friendly, helpful, multilingual advice about everything that Milan has to offer. A modern facility designed to welcome and accompany tourists from their arrival in the city and for the entire duration of their stay, offering a **vast range of services**: from cultural activities to hotel accommodation right up to the various options available to discover the city and its attractions, including museums, restaurants, historic workshops and the most exclusive shopping. The choice of setting up InfoMilano inside the Urban Center stemmed from a need to provide tourists with a highly central, visible and attractive place positioned in one of the city's best-known destinations, namely the Galleria Vittorio Emanuele II, a connecting point between piazza del Duomo and Teatro alla Scala. Boasting 400 square metres spread out over

three floors (170 of which comprise the ground floor), the Urban Center was designed to accommodate a visitor influx estimated at around 90,000 people per day in anticipation of the Universal Exposition held in 2015. The establishment of the InfoMilano space serves as an addition to the regular activities of the Urban Center which will continue to host debates, presentations and meetings open to the public. The spaces, its flooring, partitions and audio/video systems have been upgraded to guarantee improved efficiency and a more rational use of the space available, thus guaranteeing the complete autonomy of the two facilities.
