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The capital of design

The events calendar of the International Furniture Fair and its glamorous counterpart, the Fuorisalone, is richer than ever. This year, in addition to the great classics, new design districts and never-before-seen locations, it will feature a week-long program of not-to-be-missed events.

For one week, the city's design extravaganza, or International Furniture Fair, in its 56th edition, transforms Milan into the world capital of design, attracting designers, architects and design aficionados from all over the world. As always, figures for the event are astounding: 2,000 square meters of exhibition space, more than 2,000 exhibitors and an expected visitor attendance of 30,000 visitors from 165 countries. While the exhibition, hosted in 24 pavilions at the Rho fairgrounds, is mainly attended by industry members, the Fuorisalone, boasting an untold series of events (last year, its official website listed as many as 1,151 events) organized *ad hoc* by brands, designers and artisans at numerous locations across the city, draws a fashionable, avant-garde crowd in search of the latest creative trends.

ONE 'SALONE', FIVE SHOWS

The futuristic fairgrounds designed by Massimiliano Fuksas on the outskirts of Milan will be enhanced by the **best of design** and **international furnishings**, divided into three stylistic categories, 'Classic', 'Design' and 'xLux' (dedicated to timeless luxury). The exhibition space will include the 'Salone Internazionale del Complemento d'Arredo', showcasing the objet d'art and up-to-the-minute accessories of 200 exhibitors, the 'SaloneSatellite', dedicated to designers under the age of 35, the bi-annual 'Euroluce', a benchmark for the lighting industry featuring the creations of 450 exhibitors, and 'Workplace 3.0', a think tank and an innovative exhibition area devoted to the evolution of design and technology in workspace planning.

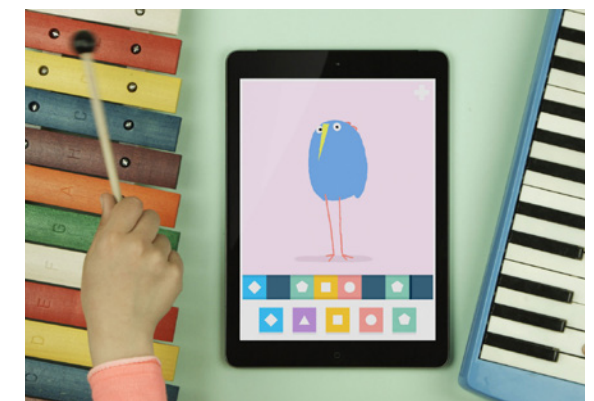

THE FUORISALONE: NOT-TO-BE-MISSED CLASSICS

Originally concentrated in the Tortona district, the Fuorisalone spread to Brera and Lambrate, and was subsequently enlarged to encompass the areas of Porta Venezia, San Babila, the '5 vie', Sant'Ambrogio and San Gregorio and, this year, the latest newcomer, the **Isola Design District**. During the Fuorisalone, these districts take centre stage with an abundance of events including DJ sets, exhibitions and performances hosted at various locations across the city, comprising former industrial spaces, ateliers, artisanal workshops, 'botteghe' and the showrooms of big-name brands. In 2017, the **Tortona Design District** plays its trump cards: Base Milano, a multifunctional venue, inaugurated one year ago at the former

industrial Ansaldo complex, will host exhibitions and projects dedicated to the theme of nomadic living, with portable, floating houses, user-friendly objects and itinerant structures. Colour, in the 'Time to Color' project, will be the theme of the Superdesign Show, Superstudio's project for Design Week, with projects and installations by big-name designers including Paticia Urquiola, Karim Rashid, Fabio Novembre and chef Davide Oldani. Additionally, two prominent hotels in the area, the Magna Pars and the Nhow, will be transformed into exhibition spaces. The former will host the emblematic works of the historic ceramic makers Ceramica Gatti 1928 atelier, while the latter will showcase a collective exhibition titled the 'Future is Nhow'. The theme of the **Brera Design District**,

dedicated to gamification design, is inspired by a quotation by Bruno Munari, 'Progettare è un gioco, giocare è un progetto' ('Designing is a game and playing is design'). This theme reminds visitors that playing is a serious business at all ages, and it is important to have fun when designing. In order to allow visitors to embrace the theme, the maps of the district will be set out like a game of Snakes and Ladders, with each square marked by one of the program's numerous events which numbered 168 last year. A similar theme will be showcased at the **Triennale Design Museum**, with an exhibition titled 'Giro Giro Tondo' ('Ring a Ring a Rosie'). Design for Children is scheduled to be held until 18 February 2018, and will focus on Italian design dedicated to the world of children.

INNOVATIONS...
Spaces that double and horizons that broaden. The post-industrial district of **Ventura Lambrate**, where creativity is less conventional and more surreal, will be split into two with the inauguration, this year, of a space located in the underground tunnels of the Central Railway Station (Ventura Centrale, 116). The works of the greats in international design will enliven this new space. Another of the centre's key districts, the **5 vie** will also extend its reach by transferring its hub from Garage Sanremo – which will host a stunning exhibition sponsored by Cartier – to piazza Gorani, the ideal crossroads of the district, where Foyer Gorani, an exhibition project featuring the latest works by important European designers, will be staged. Particularly worthy of note

White in the city

"White in the City", is the title of an itinerary, involving several of the city's most beautiful corners, and winding among the streets of Milan telling visitors – with the help of installations and projects – about white and its infinite chromatic and symbolic implications. The Accademia and the **Pinacoteca di Brera**, Palazzo Cusani, the former church of **San Carpoforo** and Class Editori Space are just some of the locations that have been chosen to host the works of young designers and international starred architects. These include Giulio Cappellini, who is also the artistic director of the initiative, Daniel Libeskind, Stefano Boeri, David Chipperfield, Marco Piva and Studio

Zaha Hadid. **Palazzo Cusani** will host 'White Icons', an exhibition of objects and materials that have become reference points and are characterized by the use of the colour white. Brera's Sala della Passione will be cloaked in white thanks to an installation titled 'White Luxury' by Marco Piva, a detailed discussion on the theme of luxury relating to the colour white, featuring a mixture of furnishings, fashion accessories, porcelain and ceramics. Finally, the courtyard of honour will host 'White Architecture', a mixture of 'chiariscuri', textures and different materials, designed to reveal the infinite nuances of white, capturing the imbalance between the tangible and intangible.

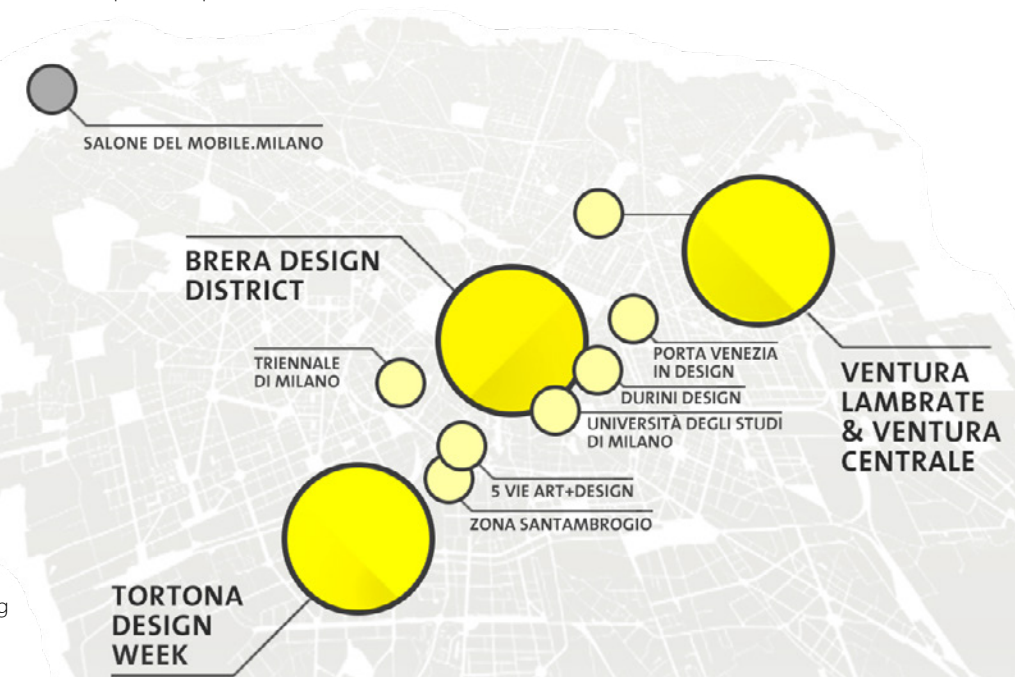
is the Ladies&Gentlemen exhibition at the mysterious 'casa dei demoni' ('house of demons'). And on the subject of historic 'palazzi', among the many chosen to stage events during Design Week, Milan's Baroque Palazzo Litta will host 'A Matter of Perception: Linking Minds', a major collective produced by Mosca Partners and Damn Magazine. To mark the event, its courtyard will be covered by a tensile structure designed by New York architectural firm Diller Scofidio + Renfro. Finally, on 5 April, another unmissable event is **'Design Pride'**, a parade featuring allegoric floats led by Seletti to give exposure to young emerging talent and international schools. The event will end with an open party in Piazza Affari.

district's landmarks, will stage an exhibition titled 'Obstacles and Solutions', a reflection on the challenges faced by designers when creating the blueprints for their products. Amongst the artisans and designers who will open their ateliers to the public, the photographer Gianni Rizzotti and furniture designer Pietro Algranti deserve mention. The former will host the young designers of the Milan Design Market and a robot that will print 3D objects for the entire duration of the Salone at his loft in via Pastrengo, while the latter, a designer renowned for creating impact-making furniture from recycled materials, including aluminium, copper, wood and iron, will open the doors of his futuristic studio in via Pepe to the public.

» **THE MAGIC OF THE FUORISALONE**
The districts hosting the exhibitions, events and installations of the **Fuorisalone**, the **ultra-glam extravaganza** that acts as a corollary to the **Salone del Mobile**, have continued to increase in number. **Young, up-and-coming designer and international starred architects exhibit their works side-by-side at several of the city's most iconic locations.**

...AND NEW ENTRIES

The **Isola Design District**, predicted to become one of the main catalysts of Design Week, is the latest addition to the Fuorisalone districts (www.isoladesigndistrict.com). Despite being a newcomer, this district is set to unveil an exciting, cosmopolitan program, with Japan, amongst others, being represented, by Kensaku Oshiro who, at his new studio in via della Pergola will exhibit the chair created for Nice's multi-award-winning restaurant Keisuke Matsushima. 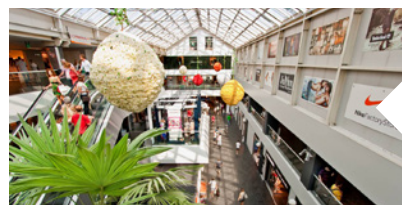

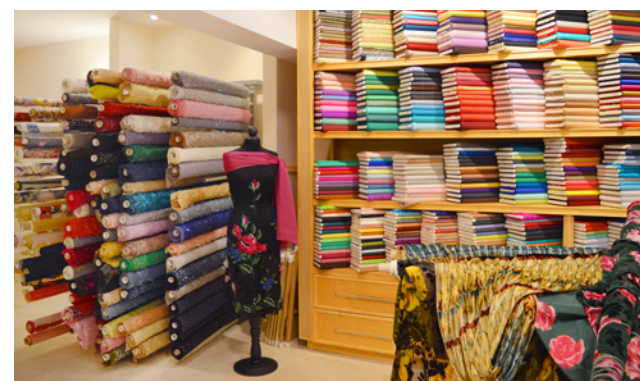

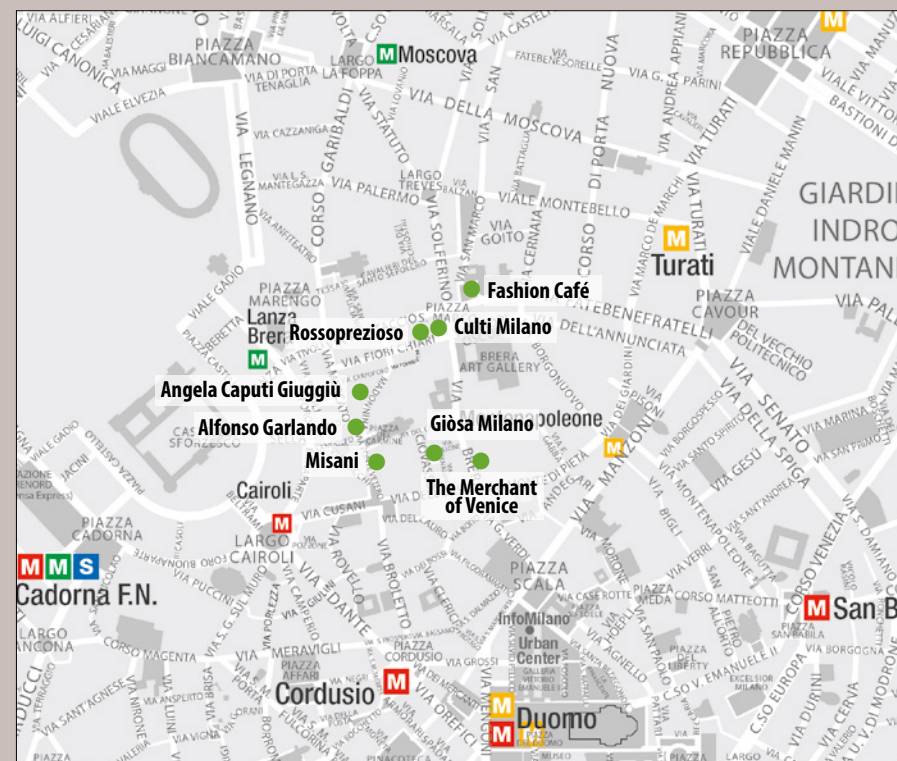

Brera is synonymous with the **artistic heart of the city**. In fact, as you stroll along the streets of this ancient district, you cannot help but be enchanted by its almost surreal atmosphere boasting small artisans' workshops or quaint stores selling canvases and paints.

EDITOR'S TIP Additionally, Brera is home to the impressive **Accademia di Belle Arti**, where visitors can admire Milan's famous painting collection at the **Pinacoteca** (the Brera Picture Gallery), the historic **Biblioteca Nazionale Braidense** (Braidense National Library), the **Museo Astronomico** (The Astronomical Museum), the oldest scientific research institute in the city and the **Giardino Botanico** (Botanical Gardens).

ART, SHOPPING AND ENTERTAINMENT

To start your sightseeing tour on the right foot, we suggest stopping for a cup of coffee at **Princi**, not just an ordinary bakery, but a meeting point where, amidst the heady scents of "brioche" and "cappuccino", you will have a chance to begin your day on a high note. A reference point for antique lovers, Brera

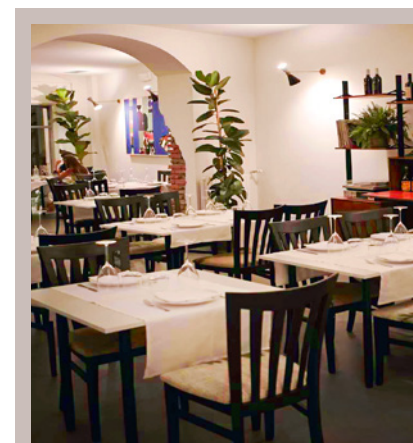

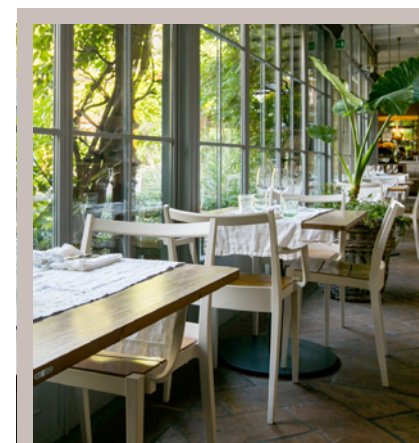

There's a museum in the city which is much more than a museum. Although it only opened in 2015, it has managed to become a vibrant cultural landmark, in just over two years. By **Elena Binda**

It's an important **architectural design** feat, originating from the inspirational, intrepid recovery of a former industrial area. It's a **display space** where multidisciplinary exhibitions, representing the complex ethno-anthropological heritage of mankind, i.e. culture, are hosted on a rotational basis. It is the seat of a permanent collection of rare and astonishing pieces, in keeping with the classic traditions of ethnographic museums. It is a **Design Store** where aficionados, locals or passersby often go to browse and purchase unusual objects including costume jewelry, accessories, toys and books. It's also an **innovative restaurant** that serves 'classic contemporary' food, a description coined by its two Michelin-starred chef Enrico Bartolini. It's a **bistro** where people can savour drinks and snacks throughout the day.

And, thanks to frequent initiatives for children, it's also a **meeting place for family** outings. It's MUDEC, Milan's Museum of Cultures! Located in the Tortona area, one of the city's most lively design districts, until 9 July it will host **'Kandinsky, the wandering knight. On his journey towards abstraction'**, a major exhibition, dedicated to the Russian master and founder of abstractionism. Curated by Silvia Burini and Ada Masoero, in addition to others, it features several works on exhibit for the **first time in Italy**. The exhibition explores the relationship between art and science and the metaphor of the journey as a cognitive adventure: important themes of the artist's research and a perfect expression of MUDEC's philosophy.

Castello Sforzesco

The ancient seat of the ruling Visconti, the Castello Sforzesco was later rebuilt by Francesco Sforza and is now simply known by the Milanese as "Il Castello". Duomo

Among one of the most important Gothic buildings in the world, the church, constructed on and off over a period of 450 years (begun 1386) is the symbol of Milan. The cathedral is open daily 7am-7pm. The recently renovated Museo del Duomo (see listing at the MUSEUMS section) houses hundreds of works of art dating from the 15th century to the present day.

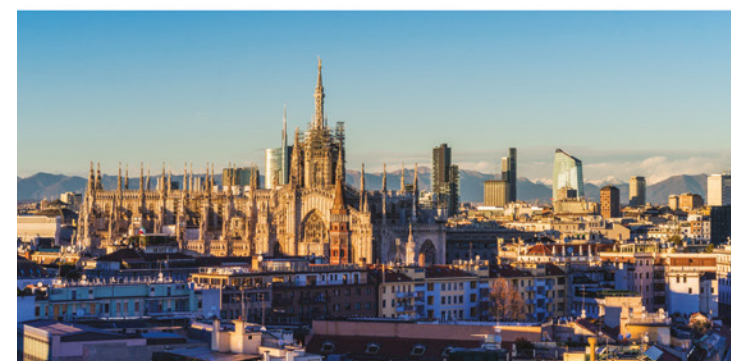

LA VENARIA REALE

Lying behind the eponymous historical town, renowned for its delectable Piedmont fare and its picturesque yearly 'Palio', the **Reggia di Venaria Reale** is a true masterpiece of Baroque architecture and a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Originally built as a hunting lodge for the Savoy, it is now a sought-after tourist destination where visitors can admire its rooms, often used to host top-

level exhibitions. Other must-visit attractions include its gardens, accessible either on foot or aboard a small convenient train. The **House of Diana**, the **Fountain of the Stag** and the Royal Stables are just some of the marvels housed in the villa's park which is a part of the imposing **Parco della Mandria**, an oasis of peace for protected animal species. MANTUA

"A city shaped like a Palazzo": this delightful description given by academic and diplomat Baldassarre Castiglioni perfectly renders the idea of the charms and treasures offered by Mantua. Small and well designed, the city is, first and foremost, an original mixture of **history and art**. Originally an Etruscan settlement, it achieved its full splendour in Medieval times and, in particular, during the reign of the **Gonzaga family**, the Dukes of Mantua who conquered the city in 1328 and ruled benevolently until 1707. Important monuments including Palazzo Ducale, Palazzo del Podestà, Palazzo della Ragione and the churches of San Lorenzo (the "Rotonda") and Santa Maria del Gradaro

VENICE

The city's major attractions, such as the awe-inspiring **Basilica of St. Mark**, in pure Venetian Byzantine style, the Campanile (the bell tower) and **Palazzo Ducale**, the Palace of the Doges, are all situated just nearby **St. Mark's Square**. Just a few steps from the square, well worth a visit are the historic **Teatro della Fenice** and, burdened with legend, the Bridge of Sighs, one of Venice's most characteristic bridges together with the **Ponte Rialto** and Ponte delle Guglie. In terms of uniqueness, Venice tops all other cities with its canals – which can be navigated aboard one of the city's famous gondolas – and its two islands which can be easily accessed by means of a vaporetto: **Murano**, where for centuries glassblowers have performed oral gymnastics turning out fantastic glass pieces, and **Burano**, with its characteristic coloured houses and lace.

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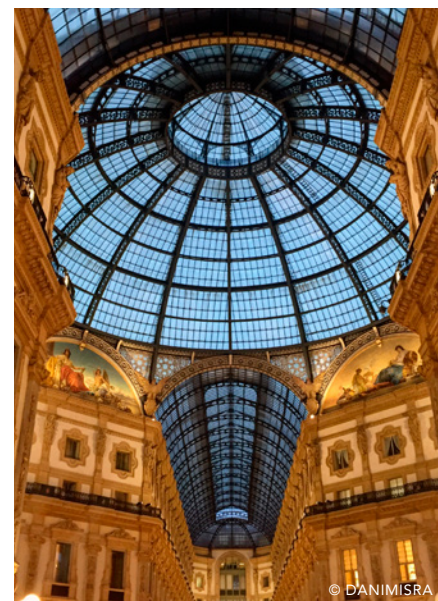

InfoMilano is the **city's first visiting card** and the place from which everyone can get friendly, helpful, multilingual advice about everything that Milan has to offer. A modern facility designed to welcome and accompany tourists from their arrival in the city and for the entire duration of their stay, offering a **vast range of services**: from cultural activities to hotel accommodation right up to the various options available to discover the city and its attractions, including museums, restaurants, historic workshops and the most exclusive shopping. The choice of setting up InfoMilano inside the **Urban Center** stemmed from a need to provide tourists with a **highly central, visible and attractive place** positioned in one of the city's best-known destinations, namely the Galleria Vittorio Emanuele II, a connecting point between piazza del Duomo and Teatro alla Scala. Boasting 400 square metres spread out over

three floors (170 of which comprise the ground floor), the Urban Center was designed to accommodate a visitor influx estimated at around 90,000 people per day in anticipation of the Universal Exposition held in 2015. The establishment of the InfoMilano space serves as an addition to the regular activities of the Urban Center which will continue to host debates, presentations and meetings open to the public. The spaces, its flooring, partitions and audio/video systems have been upgraded to guarantee improved efficiency and a more rational use of the space available, thus guaranteeing the complete autonomy of the two facilities.

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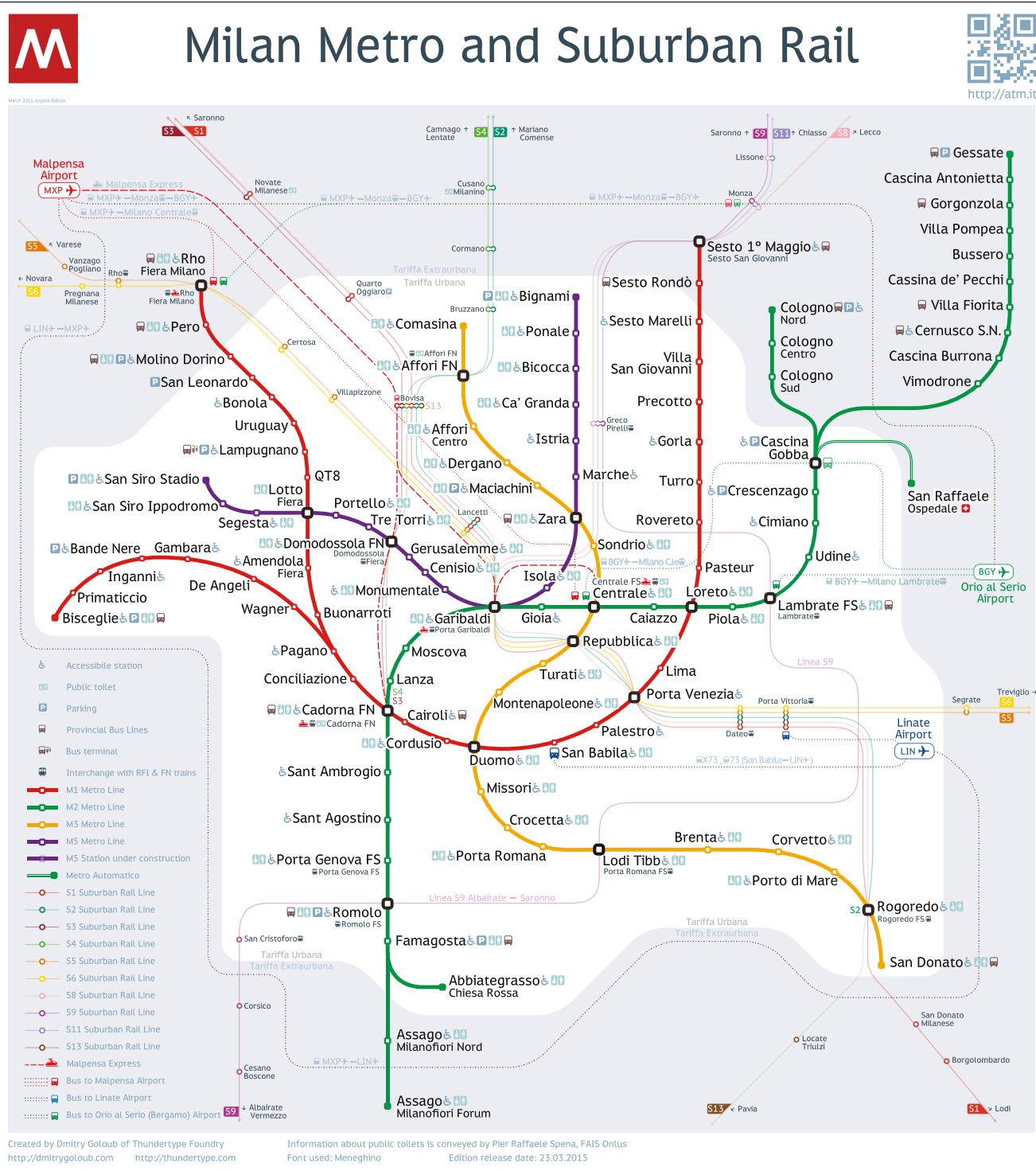
