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Welcome 'home'

It's called 'Di Casa in Casa', and is a new project that brings together Milan's four historic House Museums, with special itineraries. These have been planned so visitors can discover this magnificent heritage through several of its star players. These are nobleman Gian Giacomo Poldi Pezzoli, the aristocratic Bagatti Valsecchi brothers, Fausto and Giuseppe, the Boschi di Stefano husband and wife team, and the prestigious Necchi Campiglio family – renowned members of the Lombard industrial bourgeoisie.

"Real cities, cities that are alive have a body, a soul and a heart. The body is the plan of the streets, the squares and the buildings that time, history and men have chartered. The soul is what the city offers to

those who pass through it or inhabit its streets: the intrinsic identity of a place comprising its stones, atmosphere and people. The heart is what makes a city alive, allowing it to grow and change." These are the sentiments found on the Milanese House-Museum website (casemuseo.it); an ode to Milan and its treasures that are just waiting to be discovered!

FROM HOUSE TO HOUSE

If you're in search of the most historic, 'intimate' and authentic side of Milan, then the new 'Di Casa in Casa' (From House to House) project is exactly what you're looking for! A unique opportunity to discover the four magnificent Milanese House Museums located in the heart of the city: **Museo Bagatti Valsecchi**, **Casa Boschi Di Stefano**, **Villa Necchi Campiglio** and **Museo Poldi Pezzoli**. These are not just masterpieces of art, architecture and tradition, but also exemplify numerous anecdotes and historical facts about buildings, streets, gardens, 'botteghe' and crafts. Visitors can choose from among the various itineraries, based on interests and available time (from 1 to 3 hours). Distances cover a radius of no more than 3km.

A **special Card**, granting a single admission to all four houses, is on sale at the Bagatti Valsecchi Museum, Villa Necchi Campiglio, the Poldi Pezzoli Museum and on the Case Museo website (casemuseo.it). Full price ticket: €20, reduced price ticket: €10. This Card also allows users to receive a link allowing them to chat online with Ambra Alfieri, a **virtual guide** who will accompany visitors on a tour of the four museums to discover their histories and secrets. Any Smartphone equipped with Facebook Messenger will enable you to embark on this adventure!

A MUSEUM? NO, A HOUSE MUSEUM!

Particularly noteworthy amongst Milan's many treasures are its house museums. Formerly the residences of the haute bourgeoisie and still beautifully preserved, they have become authentic examples of Milanese taste and style during that era. Located just steps from Teatro alla Scala, the Poldi Pezzoli Museum (via Manzoni 12), hosts works of art donated to the City of Milan by Milanese collector **Gian Giacomo Poldi Pezzoli**, offering visitors a selection of the most amazing masterpieces of the Italian Renaissance. Gian Giacomo had the idea of transforming his apartments into a series of themed rooms based on great periods of art. Conceived to showcase paintings and furnishings, these rooms were specifically designed to resemble those of a modern art gallery rather than the rooms of a private home. Standouts include the **Arms Room**, the **Golden Room** and the **Clock Room** (www.museopoldipezzoli.it).

A beautiful haven of calm in the city centre (via Mozart 14), the Villa Necchi Campiglio is a wonderfully accomplished and luxurious example of 1930s Italian architecture designed by renowned architect **Piero Portaluppi**. It is stark, imposing and surrounded by a breathtaking garden,

complete with a tennis court and swimming pool, where visitors can rest and relax in the shade of the ground's large magnolia bushes. A journey to discover the exquisite furnishings that faithfully reproduce the elitist opulence of the era (www.fondoambiente.it). Located in the heart of the Quadrilatero della Moda, in via Gesù, the Bagatti Valsecchi Museum is a house museum (opened to visitors in 1994), hosting the late 19th century collections amassed by the **Valsecchi brothers**, Barons Fausto and Giuseppe Bagatti Valsecchi, who decided to renovate their family home in neo-Renaissance style and to decorate it with a rich collection of artworks and 15th-17th century artefacts (museobagattivalsecchi.org). Once inhabited by **Antonio Boschi** and his wife **Mariada Di Stefano**, the Boschi

Di Stefano house museum has been open to the public since February 2003. Located in via Giorgio Jan 15 (corso Buenos Aires district), the rooms display a collection of more than two thousand works which were donated to the City of Milan in 1974. The collection is an extraordinary testimony to 20th-century Italian art and includes paintings, sculptures and drawings dating from the first decade of the 20th century to the end of the 1960s (www.fondazioneboschidistefano.it).

ITINERARIES FOR ALL TASTES

Tours lasting one, two or three hours have been organized to allow visitors to discover each separate residence and nearby attractions in the most enjoyable way possible. The **shortest itineraries** include 'Walking around with children-An outdoor experience

in the heart of Milan'. Taking the road from the Giardini Pubblici (Public Gardens), the tour heads towards the centre of Milan. Possible destinations include the Bagatti Valsecchi Museum and the Poldi Pezzoli Museum with a stopover at Palazzo Dugnani, a location often used to host events organized by the Natural History Museum. If time is not an issue, you can choose one of the **2-hour itineraries**, 'From Manzoni to Verdi-Milanese literature and Music': the areas between piazza della Scala and Porta Nuova that are infused with memories of the 'greats' of **literature and music**, including, first and foremost, novelist Alessandro Manzoni and renowned composer Giuseppe Verdi. The itinerary 'Amidst Art Nouveau and 20th century masterpieces-The area surrounding the Montanelli gardens' starts from piazza Cavour, home to Palazzo dell'informazione, and continues in the opposite direction, towards Corso Venezia, where you'll find Palazzo Castiglioni, a masterpiece of Milanese Art Nouveau architecture. The area hosting Villa Necchi Campiglio abounds in private 20th century buildings. The itinerary 'Discovering 20th century Milanese Design-In the heart of style' starts from the Bagatti Valsecchi Museum, with stopovers at several interesting **art galleries** and **design showrooms**, including Nilufar, Fragile, Bisazza and De Vecchi, all located in the vicinity. 'Historical Palazzi-In the Neighbourhood of Via Montenapoleone' focuses on the district between Porta Nuova and Porta Orientale (or Porta Venezia), and is characterized by the presence of numerous **residences**, dating for the most part between the 18th and 20th centuries. The 'Learning with Kids-Visiting the centre of Milan' itinerary

features a wealth of surprises at the houses surrounding the **green spaces** of GAM (Milan's Gallery of Modern Art), including a depiction of swallows in flight on the façade of the Corrente Foundation. The 'Casa Boschi Di Stefano-Exploring Corso Buenos Aires' itinerary takes visitors from the Casa Boschi Di Stefano house museum to Milan's vibrant **corso Buenos Aires**, one of Milan's most **lively shopping districts**. The 'Villa Necchi Campiglio-Discovering the Gems of 20th century architecture' itinerary allows visitors to discover **corso Venezia**, the urban reference point of the neighbourhood in which the Villa is located, which is enhanced by numerous **historic 'palazzi'**, including Palazzo Rocca Saporiti and the imposing arch of Palazzo Società Buonarroti-Carpaccio-Giotto. The Poldi Pezzoli Museum-Galleries and theatres located

in the vicinity of the museum' itinerary starts from the museum and continues onwards towards the **La Scala Opera house**. From here visitors can take a stroll through **Brera** as far as the marvelous **Botanical Garden**, one of the Pinacoteca's hidden gems! If you're curious about Milanese architecture, and want to dedicate **3 hours** of your time to visiting the four house museums, that's excellent! Thanks to the 'Villas and Gardens-The Green Heart of Milan' itinerary, you'll have an opportunity to appreciate one of the most eye-catching attractions of the area that encompasses the house museums, namely the **green spaces** of its public and private gardens. Alternately, the 'The Historical Palaces of Corso Venezia-Urban Architecture from the 15th to 20th centuries' itinerary highlights the plethora of period palaces

located in the heart of the **Quadrilatero della moda!** The point of departure for this family-friendly itinerary titled 'Walking with Children-On a Tour of the City' is the attractive and well equipped landscaped area of the **Public Gardens** in via Palestro. This is an ideal location for children and families. Finally, those embarking on the 'Museo Bagatti Valsecchi-A Stroll through the Fashion Quad' itinerary will be captivated by the magnificent Bagatti Valsecchi House Museum. This unique venue is located in the heart of Milan's fashion district, home to several of the world's most coveted luxury brands. Whatever your choice, Milan has plenty to offer, including an abundance of priceless artistic treasures that are worth visiting and re-visiting, admiring and committing to memory!



An out-of-town house museum

Located in Varese (less than 1 hour from Milan), the splendid **Villa Menafoglio Litta Panza**, a 'gem' now under the ownership of FAI (Italy's National Trust), is well worth a visit. Set in spectacular grounds extending over 33,000 square metres, the Villa looks out over the **city of Varese** from the hill of Biumo Superiore. The estate was built in the mid-18th century on the site of a pre-existing mansion at the behest of Marquis Paolo Antonio Menafoglio, a man of the world and an able banker. The complex, which was opened to the public in September 2000 following major restoration work, also hosts **exhibitions** of international importance. **Until 15 November**, the rooms of the villa will host an exhibition by Robert Wilson titled '**Tales**', featuring works that are displayed in the interiors and grounds of this unique house museum. 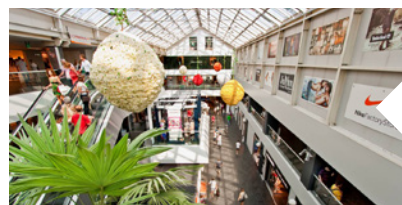

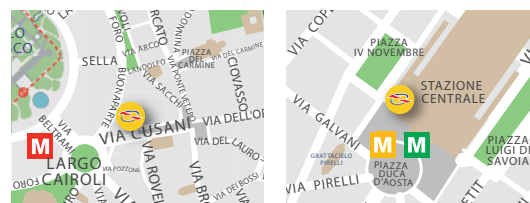

Tax Free Refund Guide

- VAT (in Italian: IVA) is a **value added tax** on goods and services, and is part of the European Union's value added tax system.
- In some cases, travellers may be granted a **VAT refund**. This refund does not cover the services supplied by hotels, restaurants, taxis or agencies.
- You may be eligible for a VAT refund provided that:
 - you are a **non EU resident**;
 - the goods purchased are intended for **personal or family use** only and are carried in your luggage;
 - the overall value of the goods purchased exceeds **154,94 Euro** (VAT included);
 - the purchase is certified by an **invoice**. This invoice should include a description of the goods purchased, your personal information as well as the details of your passport or any other equivalent document;
 - the goods leave EU territory by the end of the **third month** after the month that you bought them;
 - several specific customs formalities are complied with;
 - the invoice is **returned to the Italian retailer** within four months after the purchase was made.
- The goods purchased and the relevant invoice must be **shown at the customs** exit point when leaving EU territory (if you intend to pack the purchased items into your check-in luggage, you must go to Customs **BEFORE checking in**).
- After leaving EU territory, the traveller must **return the original invoice**, regularly endorsed by the customs office, to the Italian retailer. Said invoice must be returned within four months from the date when the document was issued.
- The refund can be made **directly by the Italian retailer** (however, make sure that the shop you've chosen displays a "Tax Free Shopping" or "Euro Tax Free" sign in its window).
- Several **Tax-Free companies are able to offer immediate VAT cash refunds** when the goods leave either Italian or EU territory (thus exonerating the passenger from having to return the invoice to the retailer). However, this procedure only applies at major international airports or main border crossings. **Most major department stores have Tax Free Refund offices.**
- The services provided by Tax-Free companies imply the payment of a small administrative sum which is **directly deducted** from the amount of VAT refunded to the traveller.
- In the event of a traveller not receiving a VAT refund within a reasonable period of time, he or she should re-contact the Italian retailer or one of the aforementioned companies.
- However, please note, VAT cannot be refunded directly by customs offices.

BRERA DISTRICT



Brera is synonymous with the artistic heart of the city. In fact, as you stroll along the streets of this ancient district, you cannot help but be enchanted by its almost surreal atmosphere boasting small artisans' workshops or quaint stores selling canvases and paints.

EDITOR'S TIP Additionally, Brera is home to the impressive Accademia di Belle Arti, where visitors can admire Milan's famous painting collection at the Pinacoteca (the Brera Picture Gallery), the historic Biblioteca Nazionale Braidense (Braidense National Library), the Museo Astronomico (The Astronomical Museum), the oldest scientific research institute in the city and the Giardino Botanico (Botanical Gardens).

ART, SHOPPING AND ENTERTAINMENT To start your sightseeing tour on the right foot, we suggest stopping for a cup of coffee

at Princi, not just an ordinary bakery, but a meeting point where, amidst the heady scents of "brioche" and "cappuccino", you will have a chance to begin your day on a high note. A reference point for antique lovers, Brera boasts a large number of antique shops and art galleries: don't miss a visit to Lorenzo Vatalaro in piazza San Simpliciano 7, focused on antique sculptures, paintings and artworks and Pettinaroli, just relocated in via Brera 4 from its historic headquarters near the Duomo, offering a wide selection of maps and antique prints. As an aside, those interested in bargains or bric à brac should definitely make time to visit the Mercatino di antiquariato e brocantage, held on the third Sunday of each month. 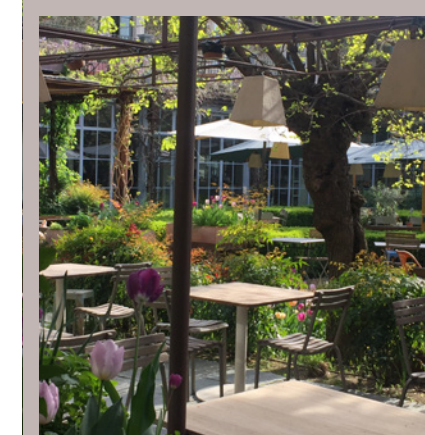

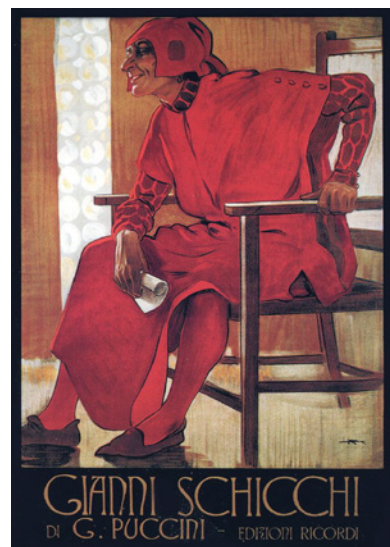
Enjoy an evening with laVerdi!

Not Verdi, but *laVerdi*, one of Europe's leading symphony orchestras. Its program for May includes Beethoven's Concert for Piano and Orchestra, 'Gianni Schicchi' by Puccini, Mozart's Symphony no. 25 and Respighi's Orchestral Transcriptions. By **Elena Binda**

Mozart, Beethoven and Mahler. And, in between, 'Gianni Schicchi', one of Puccini's lesser known works. In May, true to its calling, the Giuseppe Verdi Symphony Orchestra will treat audiences to a unique mixture of unforgettable pieces by famous Middle-European composers. As usual, the laVerdi orchestra will be led by several prestigious guests, including soloists and conductors of the caliber of Giuseppe Grazioli, Stanislav Kochanovsky, John Axelrod and Zhang Xian. For many years, laVerdi, whose honorary conductor is Riccardo Chailly, has received considerable and consistent critical acclaim both in Italy and abroad. Founded in 1993 by renowned Russian conductor Vladimir Delman and Luigi Corbani, over the years the orchestra has become one of the most prestigious symphonic institutions in Italy and throughout the world.

Its international vocation is confirmed by the virtuosos who lead it. These include Italian artistic director **Ruben Jais**, principal guest conductors **John Axelrod**, **Patrick Fournillier** and **Aziz Shokhakov** and conductor emeritus **Zhang Xian**, a Chinese-American celebrity of classical music and the first woman to hold this title role in Italy. laVerdi's 'home' is the **Auditorium di Milano**, an important cultural hub in the city. Considered the 'Louvre of Italy' by Napoleon, this spectacular museum is located in the centre (and heart) of the city's 'Quadrilatero della cultura'. By **Elena Peverata**

Putting the Brera Museum back into the hearts of the Milanese and the city; James Bradburne, the director of the Pinacoteca di Brera and the Biblioteca Braidense, is working tirelessly on the re-launch of one of Italy's most important treasure troves. This project includes the 'Grande Brera' project that aims to promote the entire complex by creating a support network with other museums in the city, which, in the so-called 'Quadrilatero della cultura', boasts the highest number of museums in any European city.

The Pinacoteca hosts a spectacular collection of masterpieces by Mantegna, Bellini, Veronese, Tintoretto, Crivelli, Piero della Francesca, Bramante, Raphael and Caravaggio. For the past year, the layout of the Pinacoteca museum has been in the process of being redesigned. This renovation is happening in stages and is scheduled to be completed by 2018. Each

of these stages has been accompanied by an exhibition; a 'Dialogue' between a selection of in-house masterpieces and related works on loan. After Raphael and Perugino, Mantegna and Caravaggio, the spotlight will now focus on **Lorenzo Lotto**. In addition to the four paintings by the Venetian artist housed in the Pinacoteca - thought to be amongst the finest masterpieces of Renaissance portraiture - another eight paintings in the Pinacoteca's collection are to be re-hung, together with a 'guest' work by Lotto titled 'Portrait of a Young Gentleman' (Cristoforo Rovero) on loan from the 'Accademia' in Venice. Among the numerous initiatives launched over the past few months, one in particular will delight you. The 'Rose of Brera', a special hybrid created especially for the occasion, will be presented officially at the **Orticola flower show** (5-7 May, Indro Montanelli Gardens) and then transplanted in Brera's Botanical Garden.

The history of Palazzo Reale is intertwined with that of Milan. From 1300 onwards the palace was inhabited by notables of the likes of Giotto and Leonardo da Vinci (who lived in an attic where he studied the flight of birds), Napoleon Bonaparte, Maria Teresa of Austria, the Kings of Italy, occupiers and liberators. Domenico Piraina, the Director of Milan's Hub of Exhibitions and Scientific Museums, talks to us about this important institution.

"We are extremely satisfied with the reception the scientific community, the public and the mass media gave last year's exhibition program. This result is in line with the feedback of the past few years, which has always ranked Palazzo Reale among Europe's top exhibition sites in terms of the **quality** and **continuity** of its cultural offer. 2016 will be remembered for the exhibitions dedicated to Escher and Japanese

masters Hokusai, Hiroshige and Utamaro, which attracted half a million visitors.

The biggest draws in 2017 includes the exhibition dedicated to **Manet** (until 2 July), while on **28 September Palazzo Reale** will open its doors to an exhibition featuring

20 masterpieces by Caravaggio. This recognition of the cultural value of Palazzo Reale's is not a once-off, because all of Milan's cultural institutions are in excellent health. In addition, there has always been an interactive relationship between these institutions and the city because, when the city functions well, then they also function well.

In Milan, there is a **strong demand for culture** that must be satisfied in order to live up to the high expectations of the public.

Milan's **international reputation** is also reflected in the partnerships that Palazzo Reale has with other museums across the world, allowing for the development of increasingly ambitious projects of enormous cultural importance."

Though bound by confidentiality, following their meeting with Domenico Piraina, Where's correspondents are able to let you know in advance that September holds myriad surprises in store, surprises that will literally make history buffs jump for joy. We can't tell you more but we suggest that you plan your visit to Milan now. You're sure to find the history at Palazzo Reale not only fascinating but entertaining!

» The "Life? or Theatre?" exhibition at Palazzo Reale (30 March-25 June) is an autobiographical masterpiece enriched by dialogues, soliloquies and musical references, which miraculously survived the hell of the Shoah. On display, about 270 gouaches by Charlotte Salomon, a young Berlin-born Jewess who died in Auschwitz in 1943 at the age of 26.

Visiting Italian beauties

Three destinations to enjoy a day of fun and relaxation with the whole family! From Monza with its the magnificent treasures and shopping streets to the lakes of Lombardy and the Venice landmarks and attractions. By **Stefania Vida**

MONZA

The beauty of its 14th century Torre dell'Arengario, its **glam shopping streets** and its Gothic-style Duomo, featuring marvellous frescoes depicting the life of Queen Theodelinda, make the centre of Monza (20 km from Milan) well worth a visit. However, Monza's **real jewel** in the crown is its famous **Villa Reale**, a magnificent 18th century dwelling designed by Francesco Piermarini, the architect who also designed the La Scala Opera House in Milan. Don't miss Italy's annual **Formula 1 Grand Prix** held in September at the racetrack lying behind its park. www.villarealedimonza.it

LAKES OF LOMBARDY

Each year the lakes of Lombardy attract millions of visitors thanks to their mild climate, breathtaking scenery, natural beauties and

historic and artistic treasures. The shores of **Lake Maggiore** (90 km from Milan) wash up on the banks of Piedmont and Lombardy, while its northern basin lies in the mountainous region of Switzerland. The most famous island is Isola Bella, anchored like a fantastic ship-garden and dominated by the majestic **Palazzo Borromeo** (www.isoleborromeo.it). **Lake Como** must-visit include the Gothic Duomo, the Romanic basilicas of San Fedele and Sant'Abbondio, the neoclassical Villa Olmo and in Cernobbio its deluxe Villa d'Este and Villa Erba (75 km from Milan). Don't miss a visit to the other lakes near Milan: **Lake Orta**, **Lake Varese** and **Lake Lugano**.

VENICE

The major attractions of Venice (275 km from Milan), such as the awe-inspiring **Basilica of**

St. Mark, the Bell Tower and Palazzo Ducale, are all situated just nearby **St. Mark's Square**. Just a few steps from the square, well worth a visit are the historic **Teatro della Fenice** and, burdened with legend, the Bridge of Sighs, one of Venice's most characteristic bridges together with the **Ponte Rialto**. In terms of uniqueness, Venice tops all other cities with its canals – which can be navigated aboard one of the city's famous gondolas – and **Murano**, **Torcello** and **Burano**, three charming, small islands rich in history and tradition.

The choice of setting up InfoMilano inside the **Urban Center** stemmed from a need to provide tourists with a **highly central, visible and attractive place** positioned in one of the city's best-known destinations, namely the Galleria Vittorio Emanuele II, a connecting point between piazza del Duomo and Teatro alla Scala. Boasting 400 square metres spread out over three

floors (170 of which comprise the ground floor), the Urban Center was designed to accommodate a visitor influx estimated at around 90,000 people per day in anticipation of the Universal Exposition held in 2015. The establishment of the InfoMilano space serves as an addition to the regular activities of the Urban Center which will continue to host debates, presentations and meetings open to the public. 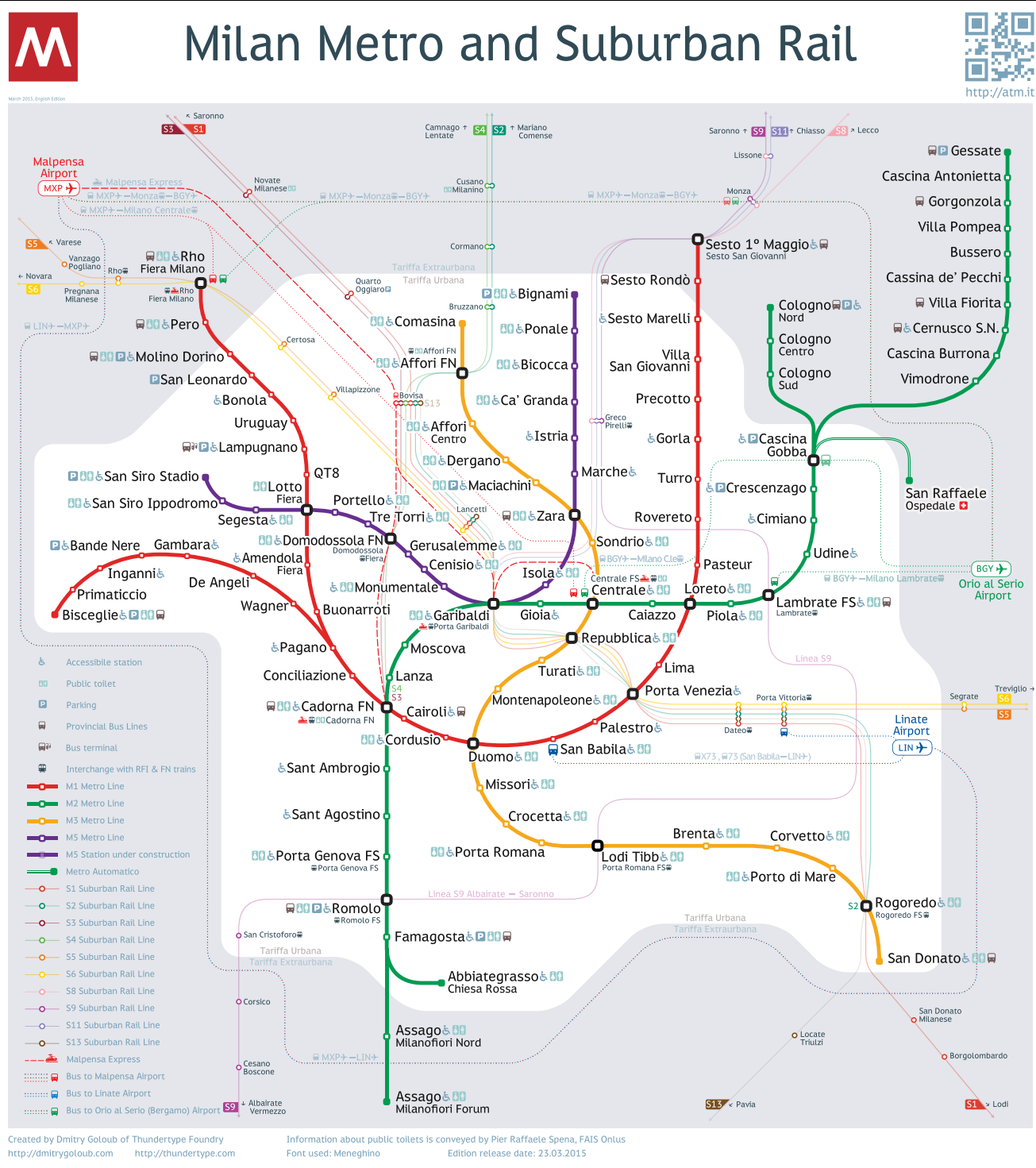

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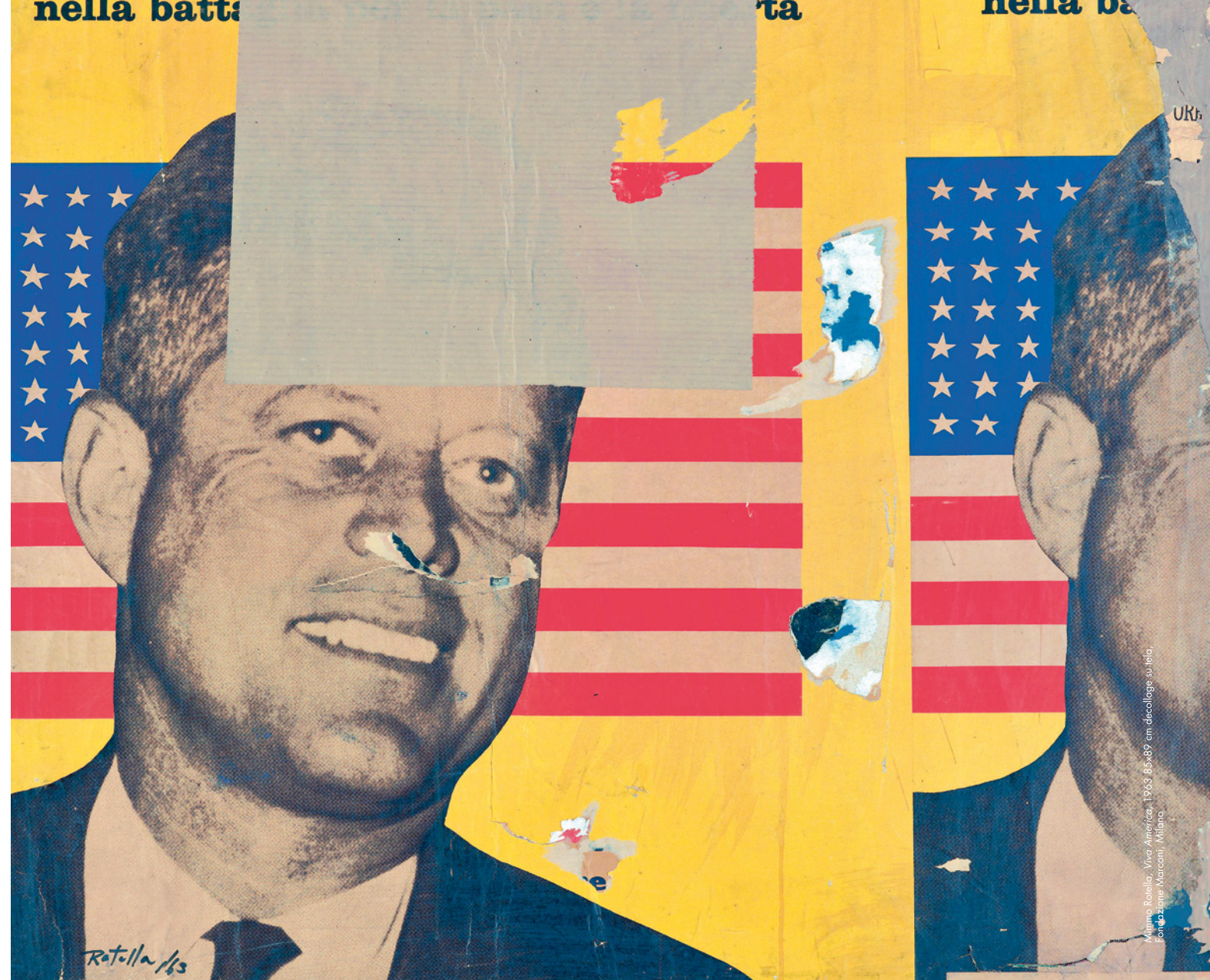
