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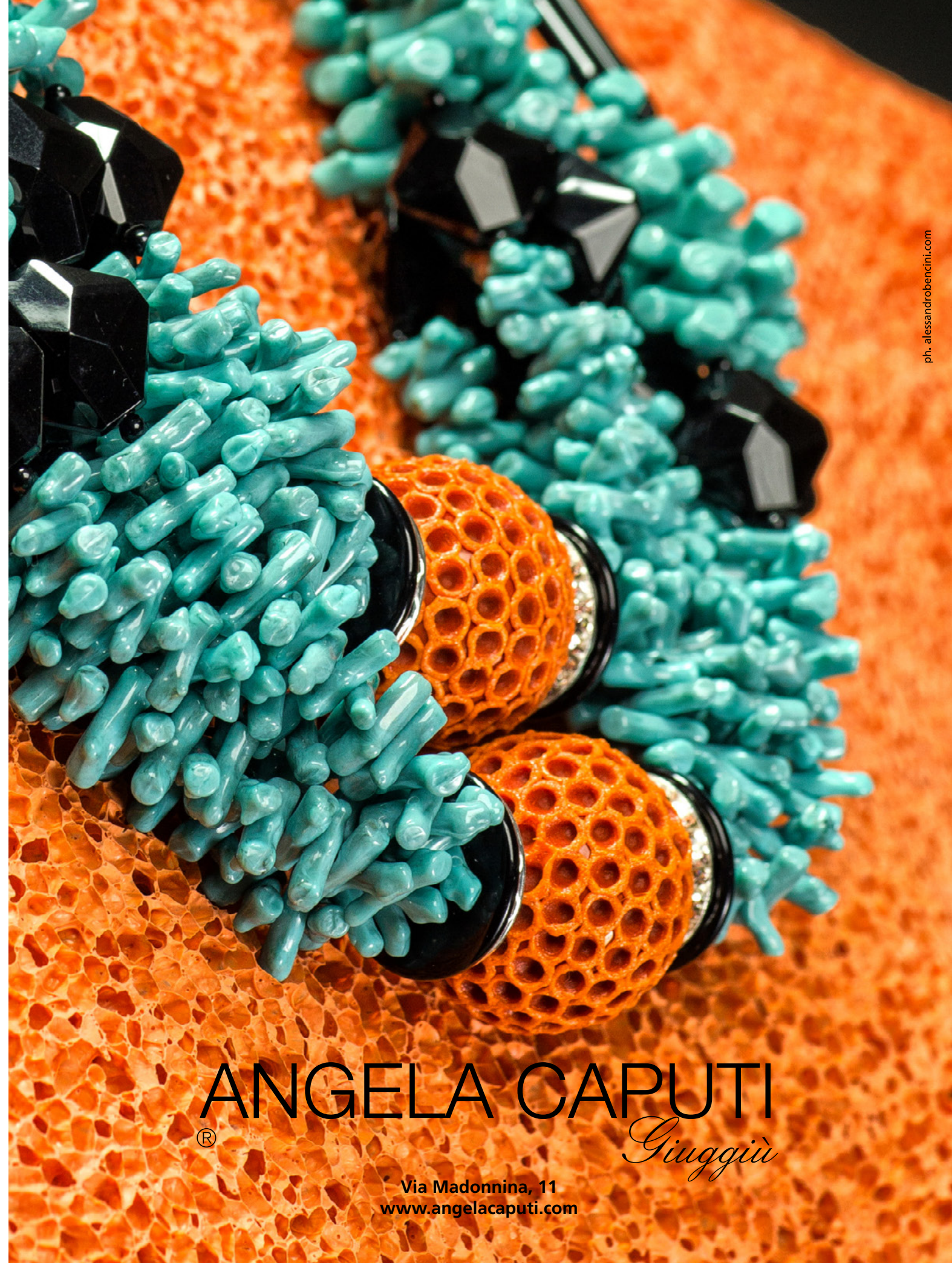
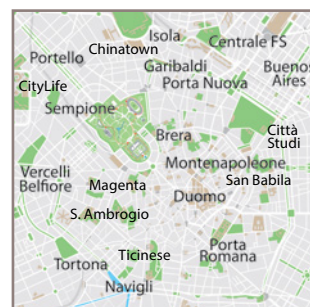

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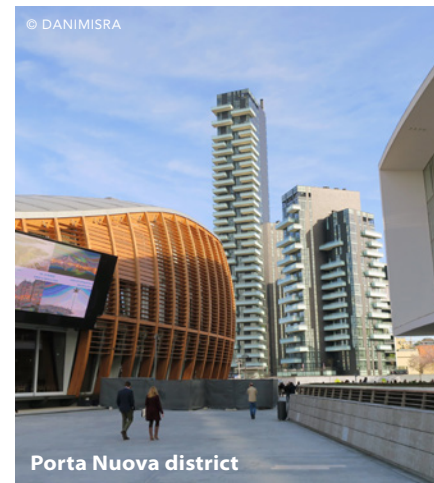

**PAINTER OR WRITER?**

This is the first-ever exhibition dedicated to the life of neo-pop American artist **Keith Haring**. The **110 pieces** on view include a number of monumental works never before seen in Italy. Haring's works are juxtaposed with those by artists from different periods, who inspired him and whom he reinterpreted in his own unique and unmistakable style. He thus created a synthetic narrative of

archetypes from the classical tradition, of tribal and ethnographic art, Gothic imagery and the cartoonist tradition. As the weather gets warmer, everyone wants to be outdoors: blooming gardens, gorgeous patios and, above all, terraces are the perfect locations to indulge in a pleasant moment's relaxation with a view over the city!

**Y**ou'll be spoilt for choice if you want to lunch (or dine) al fresco. Whether you're looking for a secluded spot or a prime street-side locale for people watching, Milan offers numerous locations renowned for their style, taste and beautiful views.

## EXCLUSIVE SPACES

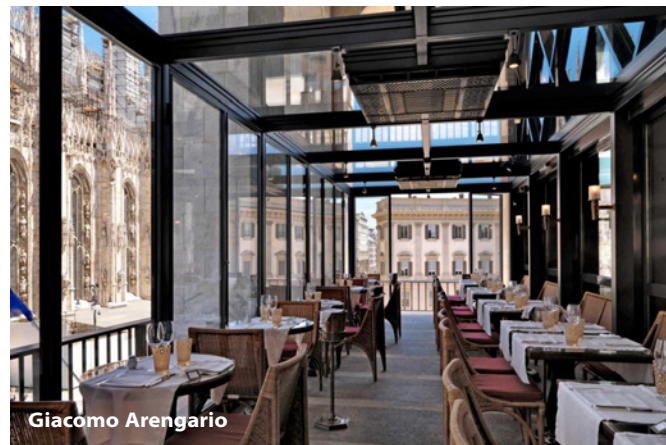
In addition to being stylish, several of Milan's top restaurants are located in highly prestigious settings, including **Osteria con Vista**. Housed in the Triennale di Milano, this design-oriented, gourmet eatery offers diners a lovely view over the green spaces of Parco Sempione. The restaurant features top-quality cuisine in a warm, friendly environment and is the ideal spot for an informal meeting with friends even late at night (via Alemagna 6, [www.terrazzatriennale.org](http://www.terrazzatriennale.org)). And while we're talking of 'greenery', another great spot for al fresco dining is **La Terrazza di via Palestro**. Overlooking the Indro Montanelli Gardens in Porta Venezia, from the fourth floor of the Centro Svizzero building, it offers authentic Italian cuisine and a breathtaking perspective of the city. Highlights at this must-visit restaurant include its striking interior design and stunning outdoor terrace with a lounge area that is the perfect spot for a pre-dinner aperitivo. Its cuisine will satisfy even the most demanding palates when dining with friends or attending a corporate event. Its menu varies according to the seasonal products on offer. Guests can take their pick from the restaurant's extensive wine list boasting several of Italy's finest wines, champagne and French wines (via Palestro 2, [www.laterrazadiviapalestro.com](http://www.laterrazadiviapalestro.com)). We now move to corso Como, one of Milan's trendiest districts, where, just a short distance from the eye-catching glass pyramid (the new headquarters of the Giangiacomo Feltrinelli Foundation), we find **Ceresio 7**. The former Enel building, now the headquarters of haute fashion brand Dsquared2, is a unique location with its restaurant, lounge bar, spectacular terrace and two swimming pools (via Ceresio 7, [www.ceresio7.com](http://www.ceresio7.com)). Finally, if you don't suffer from vertigo, you can travel up to the 20th floor of the WJC Tower (Portello area) where the property's fabulous **Unico Milano** restaurant raises the bar with a spectacular view of Milan's skyline. Renowned for its contemporary 'vibe' and scenic open-view kitchen, this panoramic location is a go-to address for connoisseurs of fine dining (via Achille Papa 30, [www.unicorestaurant.it](http://www.unicorestaurant.it)).

**OVERLOOKING THE DUOMO**

A compulsory stopover for visitors to Milan, la Rinascente is a perfect synthesis of shopping, design and taste! Boasting a magnificent view over the spires of the Duomo, the **Food Hall on the 7th floor** of the city's famous department store is the ideal location for a romantic dinner, a business lunch, a meeting with friends or a coffee break. Its magnificent terrace is the ideal setting for all occasions. Every day until midnight, you have a wide choice of dining options including a sushi bar, a wine bar, a Champagnerie, a steak house, a mozzarella bar, a sandwich bar, an international restaurant, and a juice bar. A cosmopolitan floor where no detail has been left to chance! ([www.rinascente.it](http://www.rinascente.it)). Our itinerary takes us to San Babila, where, on the top floor of The Brian&Barry Bulding, **Terrazza 12** dominates the beating heart of Milan with a stunning view over the Madonnina and the new skyline. At this sophisticated lounge bar, inspired by a 1950s atmosphere, you can also, in addition to classic drinks, sample an array of innovative cocktails, created especially for Terrazza 12 by professional mixologists, accompanied by an assortment of delectable, high-quality snacks (The Brian&Barry Building, via Durini 28, [www.terrazza12.it](http://www.terrazza12.it)). An offshoot of the classic Tuscan restaurant Da Giacomo, **Giacomo Arengario** is the restaurant at the Museo del Novecento, the sensational museum of 20th-century art set in a converted palazzo. Located next to Palazzo Reale, it pays tribute to the Art Déco movement with its evocative steel and glass patio overlooking piazza Duomo. Its menu, dedicated to the 20th century, offers traditional Milanese dishes to discover the flavours of a bygone era. (Via Guglielmo

Marconi 1, [www.giacomoarengario.com](http://www.giacomoarengario.com)). Only steps away, almost directly opposite the Museo del Novecento, **Duomo 21**, with its terrace, restaurant and lounge bar, is one of the newest additions to the city's culinary scene. Its menu includes everything from casual pub fare to fine dining entrees, and a great selection of high-quality cocktails, global wines and beers. Its comfortable lounges and floor-to-ceiling windows overlooking piazza Duomo are the perfect spot to relax, while sipping one of its signature martinis or cocktails (via Silvio Pellico 2, [www.duomo21.it](http://www.duomo21.it)). An absolute 'must' for pizza aficionados is the **I Dodici Gatti, Grill & Pizza**, the first restaurant and pizzeria located on the roofs of the Galleria Vittorio Emanuele II ([www.duomo21.it](http://www.duomo21.it)).

**HOT HOTEL BARS WITH A VIEW**

If you want to experience the luxury of the city's most exclusive hotels, then we suggest that you try an aperitivo on the panoramic terrace at the **Excelsior Hotel Gallia**. After a multimillion-dollar revamp, this historic reference point of Milanese hospitality has just reopened its doors to the public, and its design is unapologetically space-age luxe. The hotel entrusted its food sector to the longstanding experience of the Cerea brothers who boast 3 stars in the Michelin firmament (piazza Duca d'Aosta 9, [www.terrazzagallia.com](http://www.terrazzagallia.com)). Lying next to Teatro alla Scala, in the picturesque Brera district, we find the **Sky Terrace & Bar** of the Hotel Milano Scala, the first green, zero-emission hotel in the city. On arrival at the eighth floor, you will find a delightful surprise: an urban vegetable garden where herbs, vegetables and edible flowers are grown and then used to enhance



Urban vegetable garden, Milano Scala

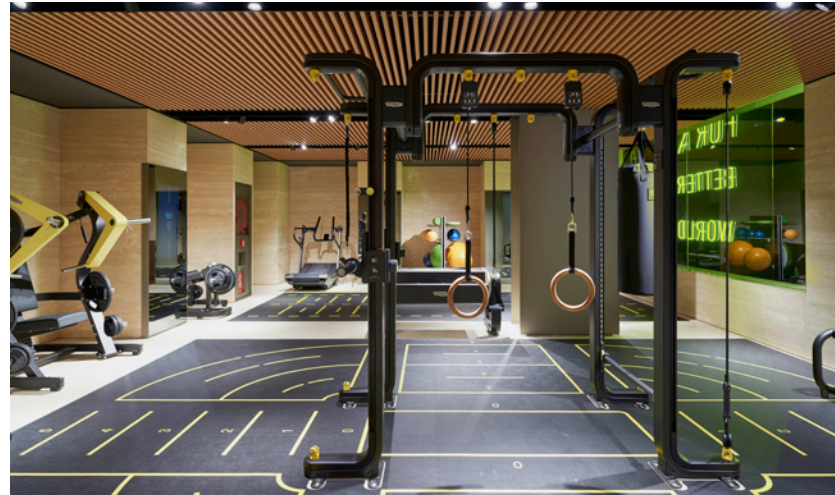
the culinary offerings prepared by its executive chef (via dell'Orso 7, [www.hotelmilanoscala.it](http://www.hotelmilanoscala.it)). With its **Terrazza Dama** boasting a splendid view over the Duomo, the Boscolo Hotel in corso Matteotti exudes Italian-style panache. Located on the 8th floor of the hotel, the Terrazza Dama lounge is the ideal spot for an aperitivo, a gourmet meal or a relaxing after-dinner drink ([milano.boscolohotels.com](http://milano.boscolohotels.com)). We now find ourselves in the Missori neighbourhood. The venue in question is **Arya** and it's the restaurant at the Hotel Dei Cavalieri: a bright, friendly location with a wonderful view over the ruins of the church of San Giovanni in Conca. The restaurant offers a menu of traditional Italian recipes with a contemporary twist. It only uses locally sourced, authentic ingredients. During summer the restaurant on the 10th floor of the hotel is open for alfresco dining with a beautiful view over the city! (Piazza Giuseppe Missori 1, [www.deicavaliericollezione.com](http://www.deicavaliericollezione.com)).

**Highline Galleria: exploring the rooftops of Milan**

One of Milan's newest attractions, the Highline Galleria was opened to coincide with the launch of Expo Milano 2015. A hot favourite with locals and tourists alike, it offers visitors a unique perspective of the centre of Milan. Extending over the rooftops of Galleria Vittorio Emanuele II, this **unique walkway** offers visitors stunning roof-line views of the arcade's dome and the skyline as well as a **360-degree view of Milan** and its surrounding Alps. 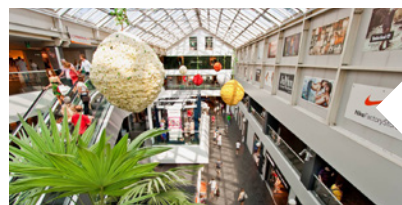

## The art of printing since 1881

For four generations, the Pettinaroli family has contributed to writing the history of Milan with a shop that sells antique maps and globes, period prints, luxury stationery, ex libris and other sought-after items. By **Elena Binda**

If you're a fan of antique objects and old-world establishments, there's a shop in the city that you shouldn't miss. However, if this isn't your first visit to Milan, then you probably already know it. Since 1881, Pettinaroli has been the city's go-to address for prints, antique maps and high-class stationery items. It would be a misnomer to simply call it a 'stationer's'. The shop offers typography services, collaborations with artisans for the production of exclusive items, premium quality paper and an increasingly prestigious collection of prints and frames. Today the business is run by **Francesco Pettinaroli** (see photo). Named after his grandfather, who founded the establishment, Francesco specializes in **antique prints**, a passion that has made him one of the world's leading experts on the subject. His personal favourites are the prints of mountains.

If you've visited this historic 'bottega' in past years, you'll remember that it was located just steps from the Duomo. In April, 2017, the shop, which still retains its original charm, has relocated to **Brera**, the artistic heart of the city. The décor, including the shop's original antique furniture and lamps, has been enhanced with **a few contemporary touches**. On entering the establishment, customers will find an assortment of exclusive Italian handcrafted leather and paper items. The jewel in the crown of the new location in via Brera is the magnificent collection of prints lining the wall at the back of the shop. Aficionados from all over the world visit this unique shop daily. A not-to-be-missed experience!

Shopping hours are generally from 10am to 7pm; less centrally located shops still take the traditional lunch break. Most shops are closed on Sundays (except those located in central Milan) and on Monday mornings. Ask your Concierge.

UnionPay is a global payment network originated from China, responsible for the inter-bank payment via UnionPay system worldwide. Several venues offering food are included in the Entertainment section, because they are considered as meeting places.

Reservations for most restaurants are strongly advised. In Italy, service is included in the price meaning that although tipping is not compulsory, it is obviously appreciated as a sign of satisfaction. Some menus include the word "coperto", a small surcharge corresponding to the cost of the service and bread. Although no dress code exists in Italy, semiformal clothing is usually considered de rigueur at restaurants. All restaurants and bars are non-smoking unless a separate smokers' area is specifically offered. Set meals: prices are per person and usually refer to a 3-course meal (beverages excluded).

## Tax Free Refund Guide

- VAT (in Italian: IVA) is a **value added tax** on goods and services, and is part of the European Union's value added tax system.
- In some cases, travellers may be granted a **VAT refund**. This refund does not cover the services supplied by hotels, restaurants, taxis or agencies.
- You may be eligible for a VAT refund provided that:
  - you are a **non EU resident**;
  - the goods purchased are intended for **personal or family use** only and are carried in your luggage;
  - the overall value of the goods purchased exceeds **154,94 Euro** (VAT included);
  - the purchase is certified by an **invoice**. This invoice should include a description of the goods purchased, your personal information as well as the details of your passport or any other equivalent document;
  - the goods leave EU territory by the end of the **third month** after the month that you bought them;
  - several specific customs formalities are complied with;
  - the invoice is **returned to the Italian retailer** within four months after the purchase was made.
- The goods purchased and the relevant invoice must be **shown at the customs** exit point when leaving EU territory (if you intend to pack the purchased items into your check-in luggage, you must go to Customs **BEFORE checking in**).
- After leaving EU territory, the traveller must **return the original invoice**, regularly endorsed by the customs office, to the Italian retailer. Said invoice must be returned within four months from the date when the document was issued.
- The refund can be made **directly by the Italian retailer** (however, make sure that the shop you've chosen displays a "Tax Free Shopping" or "Euro Tax Free" sign in its window).
- Several **Tax-Free companies are able to offer immediate VAT cash refunds** when the goods leave either Italian or EU territory (thus exonerating the passenger from having to return the invoice to the retailer). However, this procedure only applies at major international airports or main border crossings. **Most major department stores have Tax Free Refund offices.**
- The services provided by Tax-Free companies imply the payment of a small administrative sum which is **directly deducted** from the amount of VAT refunded to the traveller.
- In the event of a traveller not receiving a VAT refund within a reasonable period of time, he or she should re-contact the Italian retailer or one of the aforementioned companies.
- However, please note, VAT cannot be refunded directly by customs offices.

## More than a century of history

Donatella Brunazzi, Director of the Museo Teatrale alla Scala, tells us about this landmark of culture and its Milanese history. By **Stefania Vida**

Most people may not know that this historic museum, which celebrated its 100th anniversary in 2013, is **one of the leading museums in Europe**, and is visited by more than 250,000 people annually. It was established in the early 20th century thanks to the unflagging resolve of several major advocates of Milanese culture, and continues to pursue its initial objective, which was to be open to the city of Milan, in a bid to enhance one of Milan's unique legacies, that of Teatro della Scala.

In addition to its collection of precious historic relics, each of which has a story to tell, the Museum also hosts numerous exhibitions, including its most recent titled 'Arturo Toscanini. The Life and Myth of an Immortal Maestro'. This exhibition is dedicated to one of the most influential musical figures of the 20th century. "Teatro alla Scala and its Museum," explains

**Donatella Brunazzi**, "wanted to honour and pay tribute to this conductor who brought a new level of musical excellence to our theatre, and was faithful to the democratic ideals of Mazzini and Garibaldi. When mounting this exhibition, we wanted to use a dynamic, engaging language that we were able to achieve thanks to the use of interactive technology. For example, the presence of a **multimedia station** on Toscanini's empty podium allows visitors to use headphones to listen to the score of Verdi's 'Requiem', which is screened on a monitor, offering them a chance to experience the thrill of conducting the La Scala Orchestra in the famous 1946 re-adaptation of the concert. The unprecedented success of this exhibition, which was scheduled to close on 4 June, encouraged us to extend it **until 20 August**. Other projects in the pipeline include a

retrospective dedicated to the unforgettable **Maria Callas**. Scheduled to open on 15 September, this retrospective will mark the 40th anniversary of the diva's death." >> [www.museoscala.org](http://www.museoscala.org)

### Duomo

The cathedral is open daily 7am-7pm. The recently renovated Museo del Duomo (see listing at the MUSEUMS section) houses hundreds of works of art dating from the 15th century to

## Visiting Italian beauties

Three destinations to enjoy a day of fun and relaxation with the whole family! From Monza with its magnificent treasures and shopping streets to the lakes of Lombardy and Venice, one of the world's most romantic cities. By **Stefania Vida**

### MONZA

The beauty of its 14th century Torre dell'Arengario, its **glam shopping streets** and its Gothic-style Duomo, featuring marvellous frescoes depicting the life of Queen Theodelinda, make the centre of Monza (20 km from Milan) well worth a visit. However, Monza's **real jewel** in the crown is its famous **Villa Reale**, a magnificent 18th century dwelling designed by Francesco Piermarini, the architect who also designed the La Scala Opera House in Milan. Don't miss Italy's annual **Formula 1 Grand Prix** held in September at the racetrack lying behind its park. [www.villarealedimonza.it](http://www.villarealedimonza.it)

### LAKES OF LOMBARDY

Each year the lakes of Lombardy attract millions of visitors thanks to their mild climate, breathtaking scenery, natural beauties and

historic and artistic treasures. The shores of **Lake Maggiore** (90 km from Milan) wash up on the banks of Piedmont and Lombardy, while its northern basin lies in the mountainous region of Switzerland. The most famous island is Isola Bella, anchored like a fantastic ship-garden and dominated by the majestic **Palazzo Borromeo** ([www.isoleborromeo.it](http://www.isoleborromeo.it)). **Lake Como** must-visit include the Gothic Duomo, the Romanic basilicas of San Fedele and Sant'Abbondio, the neoclassical Villa Olmo and in Cernobbio its deluxe Villa d'Este and Villa Erba (75 km from Milan). Don't miss a visit to the other lakes near Milan: **Lake Orta**, **Lake Varese** and **Lake Lugano**.

### VENICE

The major attractions of Venice (275 km from Milan), such as the awe-inspiring **Basilica of**

**St. Mark**, the Bell Tower and Palazzo Ducale, are all situated just nearby **St. Mark's Square**. Just a few steps from the square, well worth a visit are the historic **Teatro della Fenice** and, burdened with legend, the Bridge of Sighs, one of Venice's most characteristic bridges together with the **Ponte Rialto**. In terms of uniqueness, Venice tops all other cities with its canals – which can be navigated aboard one of the city's famous gondolas – and **Murano**, **Torcello** and **Burano**, three charming, small islands rich in history and tradition.



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## A few steps from Milan...

Milan is a mixture of art, culture, shopping and lifestyle and its outlying areas are equally attractive. Discover our pick of these fabulous destinations for an unmissable out-of-town trip. By Simona P.K. Daviddi

Our tour begins on the outskirts of Milan at the 17th-century **Villa Arconati** 1 (www.villaarconati.it). Known also as 'the small Versailles of Lombardy', it is set within the vast green spaces of the Groane Park in Bollate. This is a splendid example of Lombardy Baroque architecture, and visitors are welcomed in its frescoed rooms, while summer evenings are jazzed up with a series of concerts and events in its magnificent gardens. We recommend a visit to the **Villa Visconti Borromeo Litta** 2 (www.villalittalinate.it) which is just a short distance away in Lainate. This neo-classical jewel of architecture is surrounded by a lovely park that earned the title of the 'Most Beautiful Historical Park in Italy' in 2016. The Villa is renowned for its Nyphaeum and spectacular water features. A mixture of sacred and profane – the Metropolitan City area is interspersed with numerous abbeys. In fact, there are so many that there is even a **Road of Abbeys** (www.stradadelleabbazie.it). Our route starts from the Abbey of **Chiaravalle** 3, dominated by an imposing, richly frescoed 14th-century bell tower, and continues onwards to the Abbey of **Viboldone** 4, one of the most beautiful medieval complexes in Lombardy, until we reach **Mirafiori** 5, a 13th-century monastery which, with its numerous moats, resembles a fortress. After travelling for a few more kilometers, in a southwesterly direction, we come to the Abbey of **Morimondo** 6, a former Cistercian monastery renovated in Gothic style.

### EN PLEIN AIR

The area housing the abbeys is also the heart of the large **Parco Agricolo Sud Milano** (www.parcoagricolosudmilano.it). The Park boasts a rich historic and agricultural heritage and comprises old farmsteads, waterways and important residential complexes, including **Gaggiano** 7, which, with its small, pastel-coloured houses nestling on both banks of the **Naviglio Grande**, is well worth a visit. This charming hamlet can be accessed from the city via a scenic bicycle track skirting the canal. The **Martesana Canal** also offers views of rare beauty as it flows towards the Adda river. Rural centres are interspersed with expanses of greenery (an absolute must is a visit to the Adda Park which can also be crossed by bike or on horseback) and charming urban centres, including **Crespi d'Adda** 8, a late 19th-century workers' village built up around a textiles factory and a UNESCO world heritage site. (www.villaggiocrespi.it). However, Milan is not only renowned for its canals. Lying on the outskirts of the city, just behind the airport of Linate, we find the **Idroscalo** 9, a large artificial lake set within green surroundings (www.idroscalo.info). The area offers all types of facilities including jogging, horseback riding and bicycle paths, boat, canoe and pedalò hire, recreational fishing and even rugby pitches.

### A DAY DEVOTED TO CULTURE

If the weather's gloomy, don't despair! This is a great opportunity to visit a museum! Perhaps a historic one like the **Alfa Romeo Museum** 10 (www.museoalfaromeo.com) in Arese, formerly home to the prestigious factory. This museum has six floors of models that have made motoring history, as well as prototypes and memorabilia. Another must-visit option is the **Galleria Campari** 11 (www.campari.com) in Sesto San Giovanni, a trip to discover the merchandise and cocktails that have made the brand famous. For lovers of design, the **Kartell Museo** 12 (www.kartell.com) in Noviglio is a must see. Located in one of

Lombardy's most notable examples of industrial architecture, it showcases more than 8,000 objets d'art and 5,000 drawings associated with the famous brand. Another noteworthy museum is **Mumac** 13 (www.mumac.it) in Binasco: a sleek, red-lacquered building, it houses a spectacular display of coffee-making machines.

### WHAT'S NEW

As with every 'city on the move', Milan is constantly enriched with new attractions. Three in particular deserve a special mention. The first is **Scalo Milano City Style** 14 (www.scalomilano.it) in Locate Triulzi. This new metropolitan district for fashionistas, where design, fashion and food are represented by international super stars and iconic brands, offers a 360-degree shopping experience. The second innovation is found in the area that hosted Expo in 2015 and which has now become **Experience Milano** 15 (www.experiencemilano.it), a four thousand square metre park (open from May to November) where visitors can attend performances, concerts and sporting events. Other highlights include the fabulous Tree of Life show and the exhibitions staged in the futuristic Palazzo Italia. The third innovation is Milan's latest attraction dedicated to skydiving. **Aero-Gravity** 16, the largest freefall simulator in the world, has just opened in Pero. This is a sophisticated contraption, designed to overcome the force of gravity and support flight, offering visitors the thrill of experiencing what it feels like to jump from an airplane at an altitude of 4,500 metres.



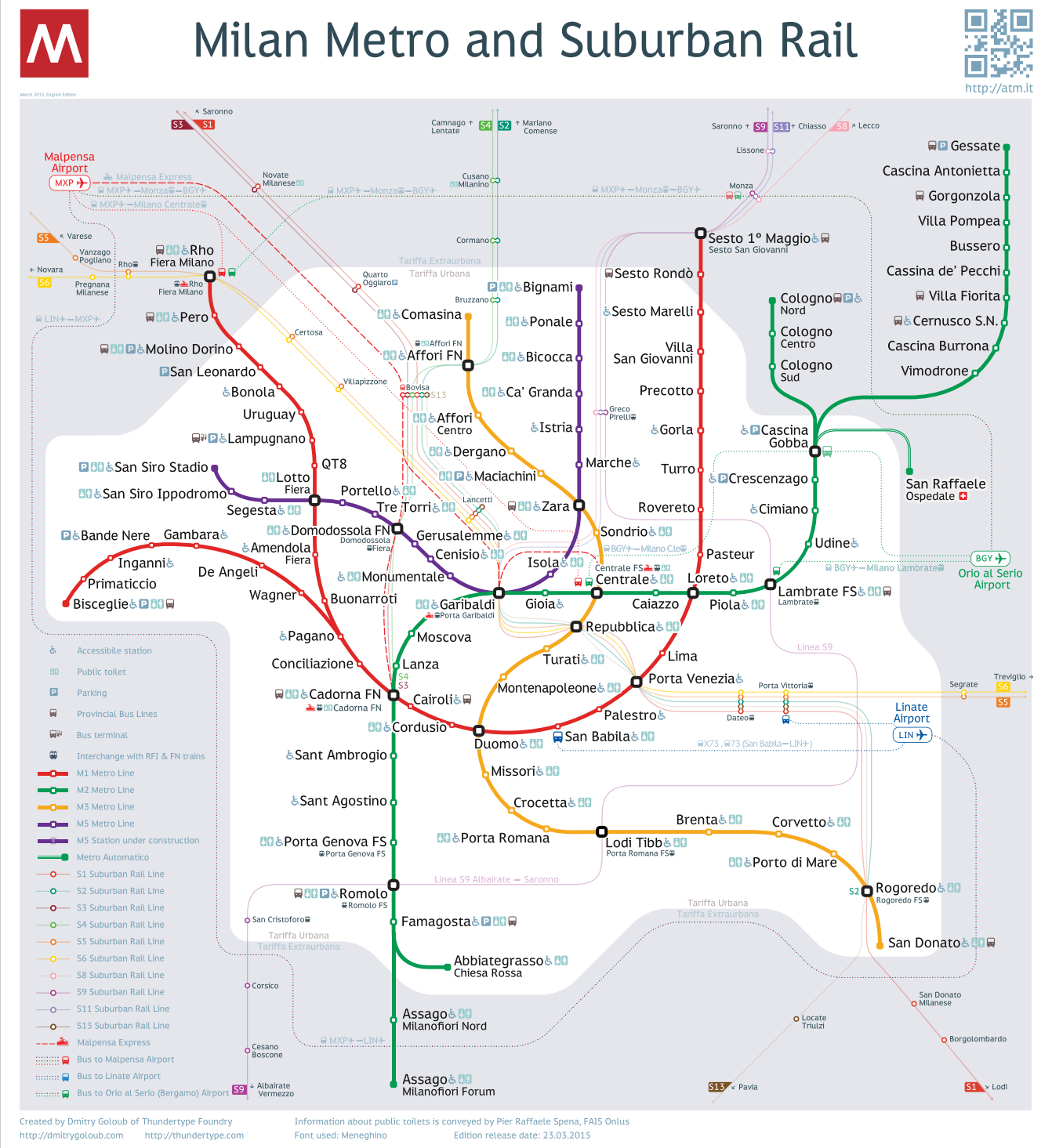

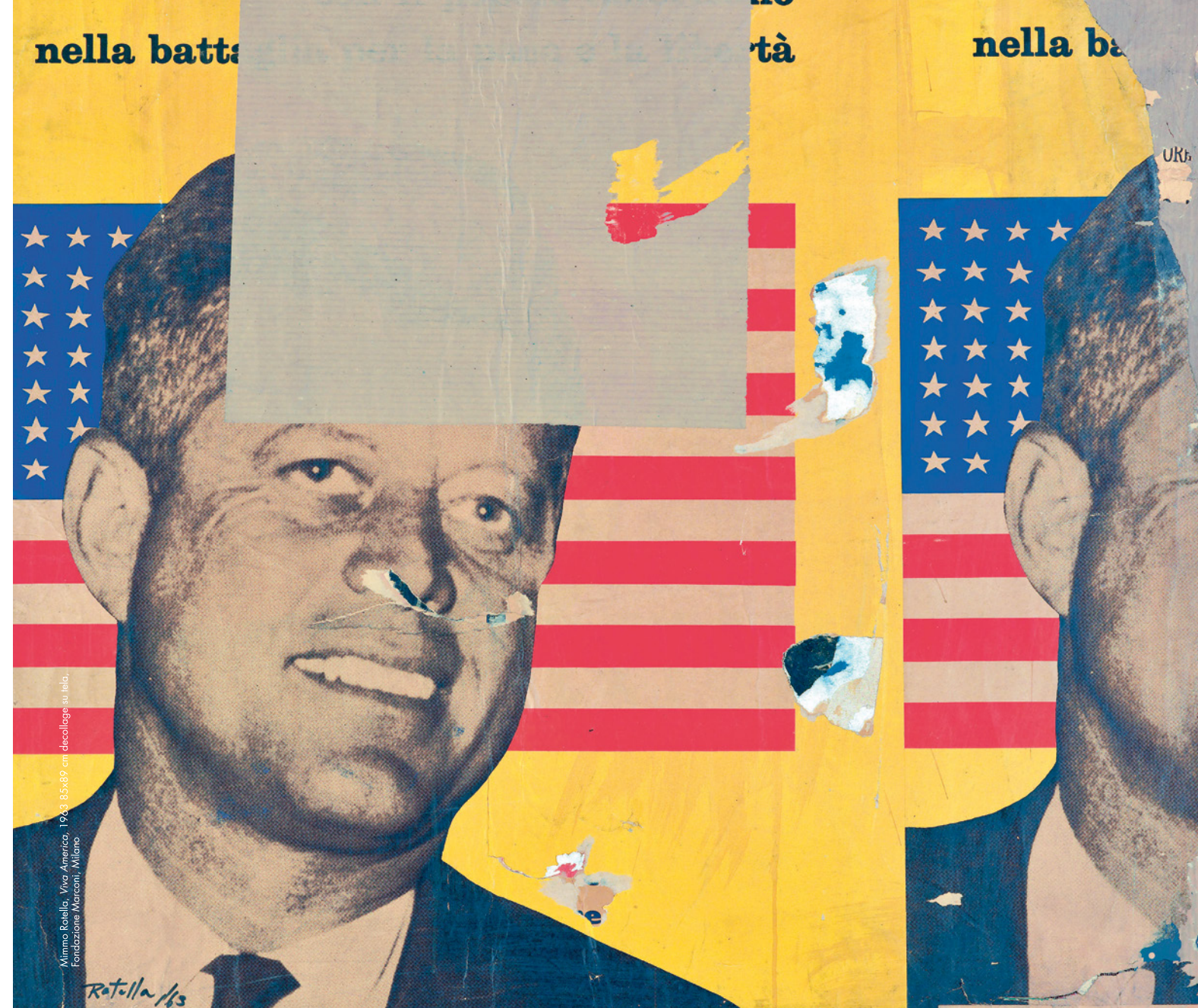
