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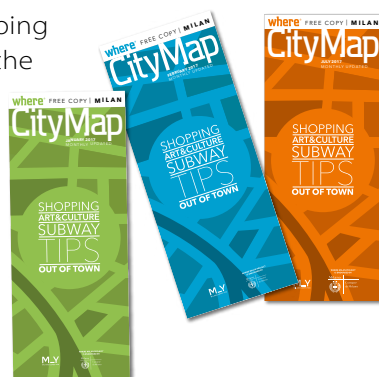

**CONCERT IN THE DARK**

▲ Based on an idea by internationally renowned Italian pianist **Cesare Picco**, the new musical initiative 'Blind Date - Concert in the Dark' was established in 2009. Since 2012, in accordance with **CBM Italia Onlus**, the Concert has been staged to arouse awareness about avoidable blindness. The formula is simple - 'light-darkness-light', and concertgoers find themselves in an atmosphere of semi-darkness. As the concert begins, the lights are gradually dimmed until the auditorium is shrouded in total darkness. Thirty minutes into the performance, the lights are slowly turned back on. 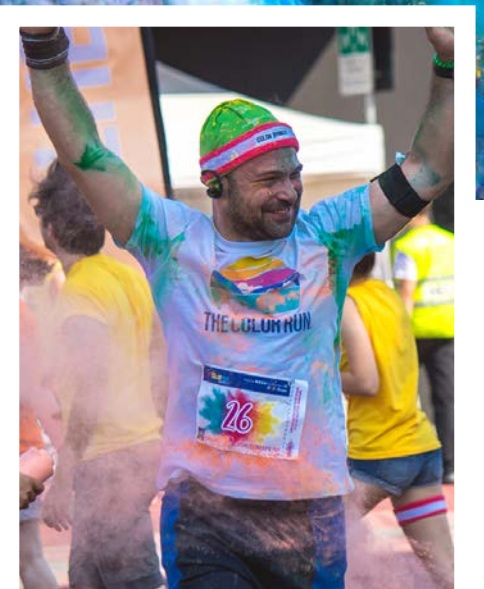

**T**hose who don't know Milan say that the city is just too chaotic: too much traffic, too much impatience and a lifestyle that, compared with other Italian cities, is too fast-paced. However, Milan has always been proud of its vibrant way of life, and has turned these shortcomings into advantages. By accommodating its fast paced lifestyle, Milan has become the **capital of running**. Supported by Expo 2015, well-known brand ambassadors and focused administrative choices, the city has enhanced its routes, re-invented crowd-pleasing events, and promoted a real **culture of fitness**. Over the past few years, the City of Milan has allocated and mapped out a series of suitable safe routes at several of the city's major parks including parco Sempione, giardini Montanelli, parco di Trenno, Forlanini, Lambro, Montagnetta di San Siro (Monte Stella) and Parco delle Cave. Today, according to statistics, Milan's outdoor running

population numbers around 60,000. This figure grows on a daily basis thanks to enthusiasts, who find themselves in Milan for business or leisure, and make sure to fit a reviving run into their daily schedule. The data show a growing trend relating to travelers who specifically choose Italy and Milan as a destination where they can indulge in **sporting activities**. Apart from its commitment to the sport of running, Milan is a **health-conscious city**. Although Milan still has a long way to go when it comes to pollution, traffic and air

quality, the city offers a number of increasingly accessible solutions for those in search of sustainable mobility or a healthy diet. Car and bike sharing options have increased significantly, with the introduction of 12,000 new bikes from September alone. And a growing number of health-related products are offered at supermarkets, themed shops and restaurants. Data shows that as far as obesity and life expectancy is concerned Milan is at the forefront of health-oriented cities.





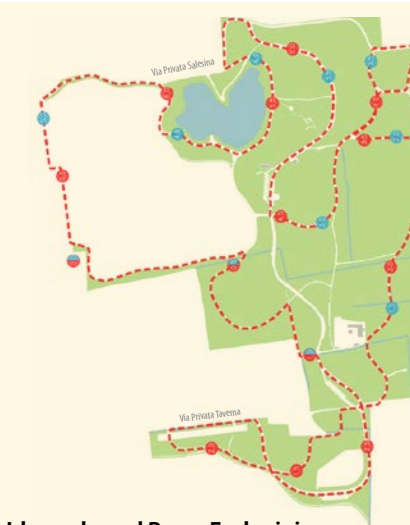

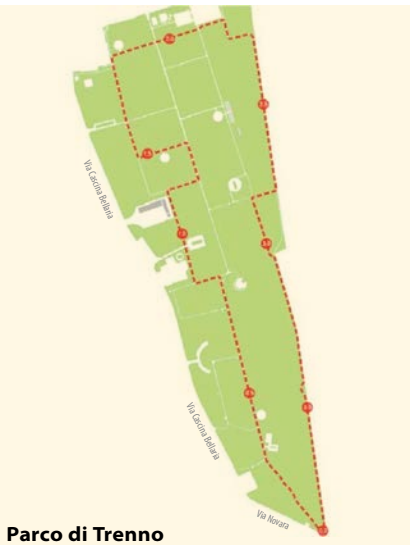

A HISTORICAL LEGACY

Milan's relationship with running dates back in time. The turning point for the world of athletics and Olympic disciplines associated with running came in 1807 with the construction of the **Arena Civica** on viale Byron (Parco Sempione). Several world records were broken here and to this day people continue to run on its tracks. However, the phenomenon of recreational running is more recent. The first non-competitive race involving a group of amateur runners was held in 1972, just two years after the first New York marathon. A creative entrepreneur named Renato Cepparo launched his 43km 'walk'. The initiative was a huge success and is repeated annually in spring. The distance covered is now shorter and the event is attended by thousands of participants. Over time, the number of different races and their runners have increased, and several competitions are held throughout the year. These include the **Milano Marathon** (currently sponsored by the Armani group), the **Color Run**, also known as the 'happiest 5k on the planet' during which participants, along the route, are doused from head-to-toe in different colours, reminiscent of the rainbow flag, the **Salomon City Trail**, one of the events that was featured on the Expo 2015 calendar and the nocturnal **Midnight Run**. In October, the city's race calendar is packed with events. Whether you want to participate in an official event (one of which is sponsored by our magazine, see next page), or simply enjoy a peaceful run on a safe, scenic route, Where® brings you the ultimate guide to running in and around the city.

WHERE TO GO RUNNING

Although heavily trafficked streets and areas should be avoided, Milan offers dedicated runners countless opportunities to enjoy their run. If you like the idea of using your daily training as an alternative means of touring the city, we suggest that you take the **urban route** tested during various editions of the city's **Stramilano** and related events. Leave from Piazza Duomo and turn left in San Babila onto Corso Venezia until you come to Porta Venezia, the city's old 'Eastern Gate'. Now turn right and follow the ring road that passes through Porta Romana and continues onwards to Piazza Ventiquattro maggio. Continue straight past the walls of the San Vittore prison as far as Porta Vercellina. From here, head straight along the upward bend that leads to the entrance of Parco Sempione. After crossing the park, you'll reach the Arena di Milano where the route ends. Distance: 10km. Time required: from 40 minutes -

one and a half hours, but you can also choose to cover only a portion of the route.

However, the highlight of our recommended routes are the **city's parks**. The City of Milan has mapped out marked, illuminated routes where you can run amidst green spaces, and in some cases, use the facilities provided, including locker rooms where you can shower and change your clothes. For information visit [www.fidalmilano.it](http://www.fidalmilano.it) or ask your concierge for advice.

The **Giardini Montanelli**, in Porta Venezia, is ideal for beginners: the route is only 2km, the gardens are beautiful and you can run in peace and quiet, as long as you're not bothered by the gravelly stretch at the end of the route.

**Parco Sempione** is centrally located and a truly convenient place to enjoy a run between one appointment and the next. It has a 3.5km track, which though sometimes crowded, is always well lit. While running, you can admire Castello Sforzesco, one of Milan's best-known landmarks. For more of an intense workout, you can exit the park, and continue, but be careful, Milan's sidewalks are not always easy to maneuver. Situated just a short distance from Linate Airport, the **Idroscalo** is one of the city's best-loved green spaces. Boasting a wide, well-lit 6.7km track, it offers countless recreational options. Parco Forlanini,

**Avon Running:** Sunday 15 October from Piazza Castello. The race starts at 9.30pm for the 10km route and at 10.15am for the 5km route. Although the race is dedicated to women, male participants are also welcome. Organized and sponsored by the famous cosmetics brand, all proceeds are donated to the Avon Foundation for the prevention and fight against breast cancer. **Trofeo Montestella:** Sunday 29 October at 8am. Starting point: via Natta 11 (Lampugnano area). Organized in collaboration with the City of Milan and the Italian Federation of Track and Field, this is a 10km run (also competitive) associated with the Montestella sporting association, the oldest in Milan. [www.trofeomontestella.it](http://www.trofeomontestella.it)





adjacent to the Idroscalo is a hot favourite with runners. It has three tracks covering a distance of respectively 4, 5 and 7 kilometers. Commonly known as the 'little mountain of San Siro', **Monte Stella** is probably Milan's most 'historic' park where you can often bump into champions out training. The park has an interesting history: its artificial hill was built on a pile of rubble from the bombings of the Second World War. Among other things, the park is home to the 'Garden of the Just', which pays tribute to all those who oppose cruelty and genocide. Covering a distance of 2.5km, its course challenges runners with slopes and dirt tracks. Other worthwhile options include parco di

**Trenno**, parco delle **Cave** (which covers a distance of around 4km and is located near the San Siro Stadium), and parco **Lambro**. Located on the outskirts of the city, its sprawling parks and paths, covering a distance of 3.7km, make for a nice loop that keeps you almost completely off the streets. Lastly, a popular alternative loved by the Milanese are the routes running along the **Navigli**,

including first and foremost the Martesana pedestrian path. The route stretches for about 7km from the bottom of via Melchiorre Gioia to via Padova and back. If you're feeling energetic, you can continue onwards to the outskirts of the city and then take the subway back. You'll be spoilt for choice! If you've forgotten your running kit, or want to recharge your batteries without giving up the benefits of your run, remember that you're in the right place. The well-known selection of Milanese shopping and Italian food also caters to fitness fanatics.

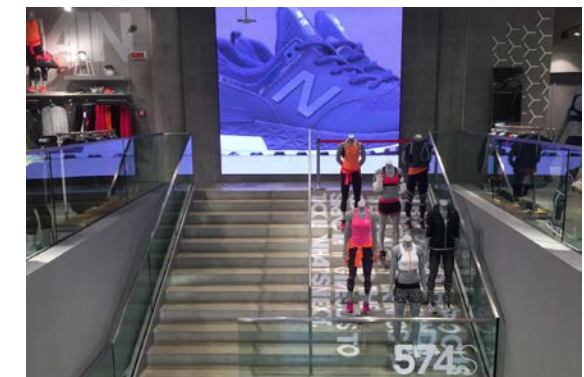
## New Balance

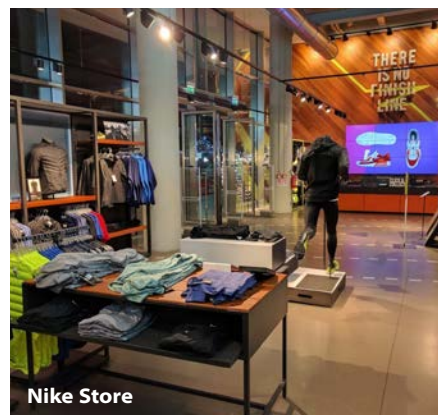

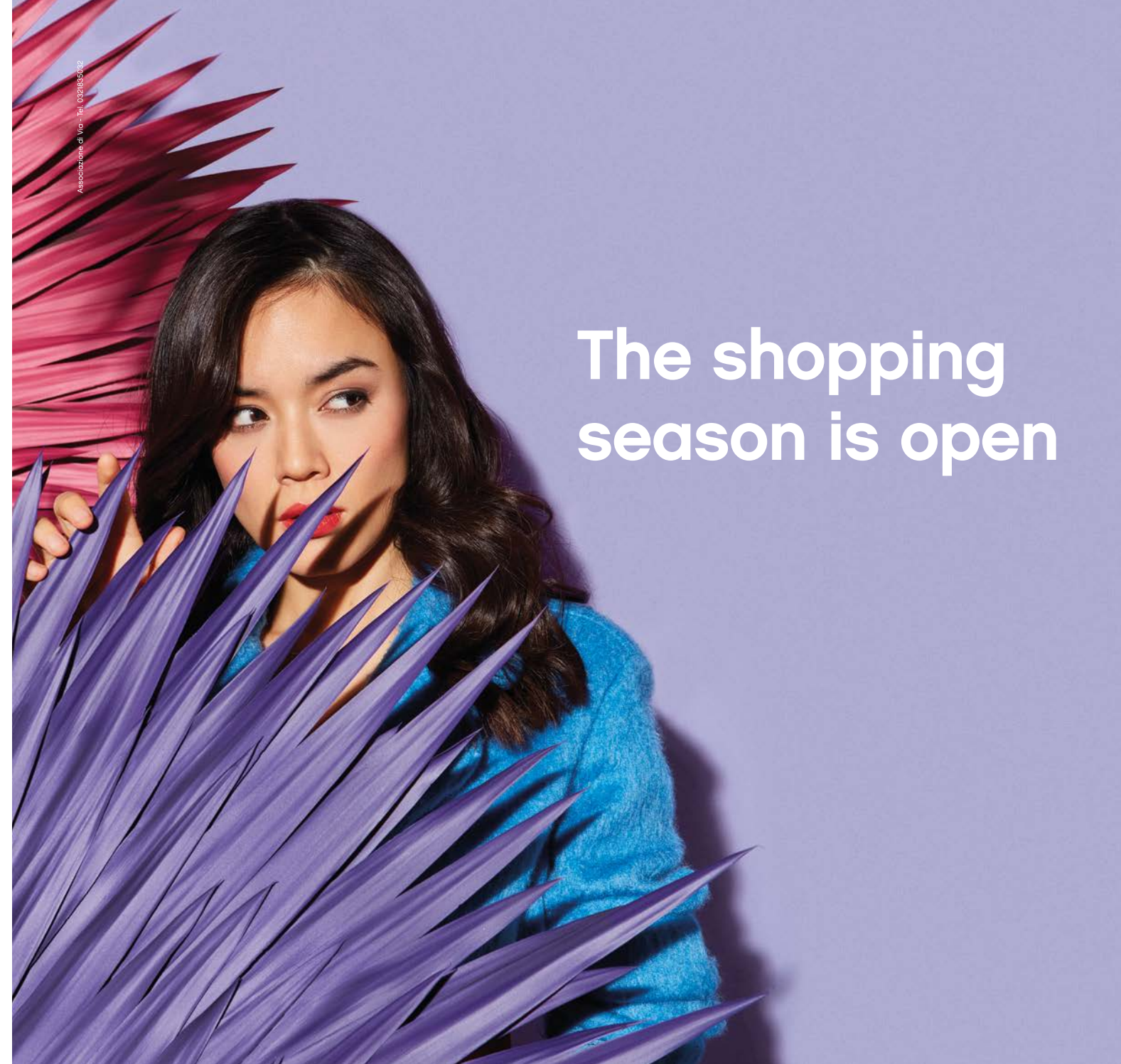

## Tax Free Refund Guide

- VAT (in Italian: IVA) is a **value added tax** on goods and services, and is part of the European Union's value added tax system.
- In some cases, travellers may be granted a **VAT refund**. This refund does not cover the services supplied by hotels, restaurants, taxis or agencies.
- You may be eligible for a VAT refund provided that:
  - you are a **non EU resident**;
  - the goods purchased are intended for **personal or family use** only and are carried in your luggage;
  - the overall value of the goods purchased exceeds **154,94 Euro** (VAT included);
  - the purchase is certified by an **invoice**. This invoice should include a description of the goods purchased, your personal information as well as the details of your passport or any other equivalent document;
  - the goods leave EU territory by the end of the **third month** after the month that you bought them;
  - several specific customs formalities are complied with;
  - the invoice is **returned to the Italian retailer** within four months after the purchase was made.
- The goods purchased and the relevant invoice must be **shown at the customs** exit point when leaving EU territory (if you intend to pack the purchased items into your check-in luggage, you must go to Customs **BEFORE checking in**).
- After leaving EU territory, the traveller must **return the original invoice**, regularly endorsed by the customs office, to the Italian retailer. Said invoice must be returned within four months from the date when the document was issued.
- The refund can be made **directly by the Italian retailer** (however, make sure that the shop you've chosen displays a "Tax Free Shopping" or "Euro Tax Free" sign in its window).
- Several **Tax-Free companies are able to offer immediate VAT cash refunds** when the goods leave either Italian or EU territory (thus exonerating the passenger from having to return the invoice to the retailer). However, this procedure only applies at major international airports or main border crossings. **Most major department stores have Tax Free Refund offices.**
- The services provided by Tax-Free companies imply the payment of a small administrative sum which is **directly deducted** from the amount of VAT refunded to the traveller.
- In the event of a traveller not receiving a VAT refund within a reasonable period of time, he or she should re-contact the Italian retailer or one of the aforementioned companies.
- However, please note, VAT cannot be refunded directly by customs offices.

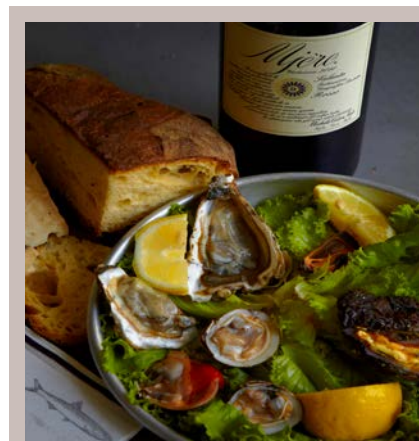
## What does 'ecrudo' mean?

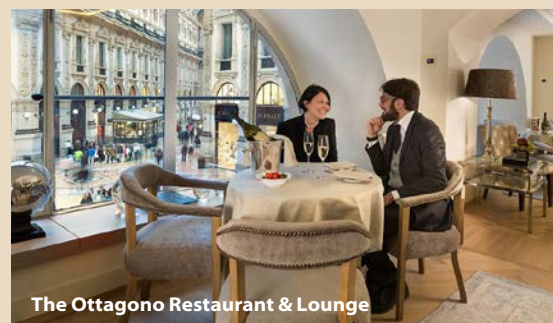

## Milan's history

## Visiting Italian beauties

Three destinations to enjoy a day of fun and relaxation with the whole family! From Monza with its magnificent treasures and shopping streets to the lakes of Lombardy and Venice, one of the world's most romantic cities. By **Stefania Vida**

### MONZA

The beauty of its 14th century Torre dell'Arengario, its **glam shopping streets** and its Gothic-style Duomo, featuring marvellous frescoes depicting the life of Queen Theodelinda, make the centre of Monza (20 km from Milan) well worth a visit. However, Monza's **real jewel** in the crown is its famous **Villa Reale**, a magnificent 18th century dwelling designed by Francesco Piermarini, the architect who also designed the La Scala Opera House in Milan. Don't miss Italy's annual **Formula 1 Grand Prix** held in September at the racetrack lying behind its park. [www.villarealedimonza.it](http://www.villarealedimonza.it)

### LAKES OF LOMBARDY

Each year the lakes of Lombardy attract millions of visitors thanks to their mild climate, breathtaking scenery, natural beauties and

historic and artistic treasures. The shores of **Lake Maggiore** (90 km from Milan) wash up on the banks of Piedmont and Lombardy, while its northern basin lies in the mountainous region of Switzerland. The most famous island is Isola Bella, anchored like a fantastic ship-garden and dominated by the majestic **Palazzo Borromeo** ([www.isoleborromeo.it](http://www.isoleborromeo.it)). **Lake Como** must-visits include the Gothic Duomo, the Romanesque basilicas of San Fedele and Sant'Abbondio, the neoclassical Villa Olmo and, in Cernobbio, the deluxe Villa d'Este and Villa Erba (75 km from Milan). Other fabulous lake destinations near Milan include **Lake Orta**, **Lake Varese** and **Lake Lugano**.

### VENICE

The major attractions of Venice (275 km from Milan), such as the awe-inspiring **Basilica of**

**St. Mark**, the Bell Tower and Palazzo Ducale, are all situated just nearby **St. Mark's Square**. Just a few steps from the square, well worth a visit are the historic **Teatro della Fenice** and, burdened with legend, the Bridge of Sighs, one of Venice's most characteristic bridges together with the **Ponte Rialto**. In terms of uniqueness, Venice tops all other cities with its canals – which can be navigated aboard one of the city's famous gondolas – and **Murano**, **Torcello** and **Burano**, three charming, small islands rich in history and tradition.



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## A few steps from Milan...

Milan is a mixture of art, culture, shopping and lifestyle and its outlying areas are equally attractive. Discover our pick of these fabulous destinations for an unmissable out-of-town trip. By Simona P.K. Daviddi

Our tour begins on the outskirts of Milan at the 17th-century **Villa Arconati 1** (www.villaarconati.it). Known also as 'the small Versailles of Lombardy', it is set within the vast green spaces of the Groane Park in Bollate. This is a splendid example of Lombardy Baroque architecture, and visitors are welcomed in its frescoed rooms, while summer evenings are jazzed up with a series of concerts and events in its magnificent gardens. We recommend a visit to the **Villa Visconti Borromeo Litta 2** (www.villalittalainate.it) which is just a short distance away in Lainate. This neo-classical jewel of architecture is surrounded by a lovely park that earned the title of the 'Most Beautiful Historical Park in Italy' in 2016. The Villa is renowned for its Nyphaeum and spectacular water features. A mixture of sacred and profane – the Metropolitan City area is interspersed with numerous abbeys. In fact, there are so many that there is even a **Road of Abbeys** (www.stradadelleabbazie.it). Our route starts from the Abbey of **Chiaravalle 3**, dominated by an imposing, richly frescoed 14th-century bell tower, and continues onwards to the Abbey of **Viboldone 4**, one of the most beautiful medieval complexes in Lombardy, until we reach **Mirafiori 5**, a 13th-century monastery which, with its numerous moats, resembles a fortress. After travelling for a few more kilometers, in a southwesterly direction, we come to the Abbey of **Morimondo 6**, a former Cistercian monastery renovated in Gothic style.

### EN PLEIN AIR

The area housing the abbeys is also the heart of the large **Parco Agricolo Sud Milano** (www.parcoagricolosudmilano.it). The Park boasts a rich historic and agricultural heritage and comprises old farmsteads, waterways and important residential complexes, including **Gaggiano 7**, which, with its small, pastel-coloured houses nestling on both banks of the **Naviglio Grande**, is well worth a visit. This charming hamlet can be accessed from the city via a scenic bicycle track skirting the canal. The **Martesana Canal** also offers views of rare beauty as it flows towards the Adda river. Rural centres are interspersed with expanses of greenery (an absolute must is a visit to the Adda Park which can also be crossed by bike or on horseback) and charming urban centres, including **Crespi d'Adda 8**, a late 19th-century workers' village built up around a textiles factory and a UNESCO world heritage site (www.villaggiocrespi.it). However, Milan is not only renowned for its canals. Lying on the outskirts of the city, just behind the airport of Linate, we find the **Idroscalo 9**, a large artificial lake set within green surroundings (www.idroscalo.info). The area offers all types of facilities including jogging, horseback riding and bicycle paths, boat, canoe and pedalò hire, recreational fishing and even rugby pitches.

### A DAY DEVOTED TO CULTURE

If the weather's gloomy, don't despair! This is a great opportunity to visit a museum! Perhaps a historic one like the **Alfa Romeo Museum 10** (www.museoalfaromeo.com) in Arese, formerly home to the prestigious factory. This museum has six floors of models that have made motoring history, as well as prototypes and memorabilia. Another must-visit option is the **Galleria Campari 11** (www.campari.com) in Sesto San Giovanni, a trip to discover the merchandise and cocktails that have made the brand famous. For lovers of design, the **Kartellmuseum 12** (www.kartell.com) in Noviglio is a must see.

Located in one of Lombardy's most notable examples of industrial architecture, it showcases more than 8,000 objets d'art and 5,000 drawings associated with the famous brand. Another noteworthy museum is **Mumac 13** (www.mumac.it) in Binasco: a sleek, red-lacquered building, it houses a spectacular display of coffee-making machines.

### WHAT'S NEW

As with every 'city on the move', Milan is constantly enriched with new attractions. Three in particular deserve a special mention. The first is **Scalo Milano City Style 14** (www.scalomilano.it) in Locate Triulzi. This new metropolitan district for fashionistas, where design, fashion and food are represented by international super stars and iconic brands, offers a 360-degree shopping experience. The second innovation is found in the area that hosted Expo in 2015 and which has now become **Experiance Milano 15** (www.experiancemilano.it), a four thousand square metre park (open from May to November) where visitors can attend performances, concerts and sporting events. The third innovation is Milan's latest attraction dedicated to skydiving. **Aero-Gravity 16**, the largest freefall simulator in the world, has just opened in Pero. This is a sophisticated contraption, designed to overcome the force of gravity and support flight, offering visitors the thrill of experiencing what it feels like to jump from an airplane at an altitude of 4,500 metres.

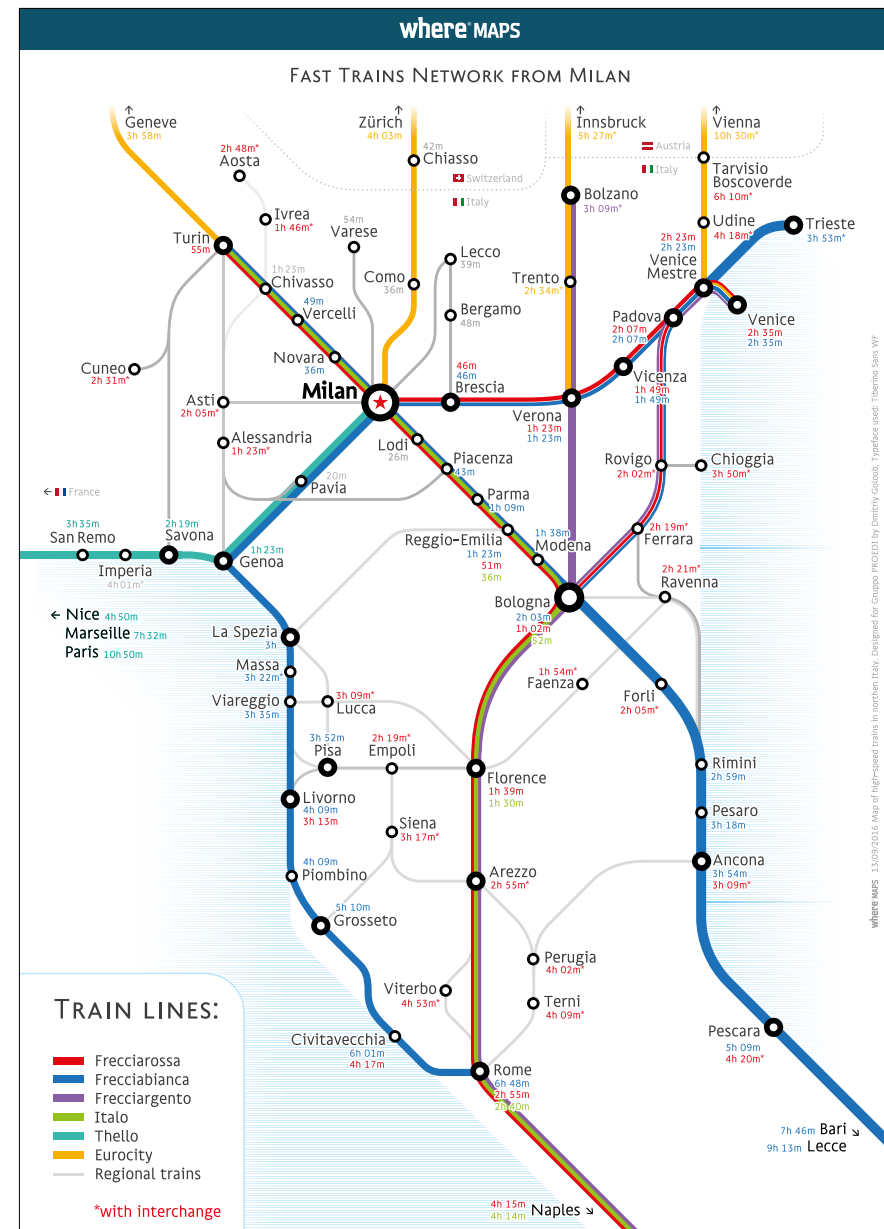
