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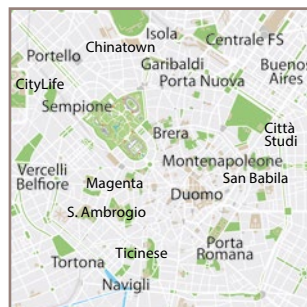
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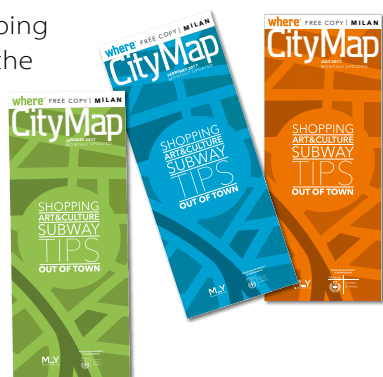

**INSIDE THE WORK OF CARAVAGGIO**

After the historic exhibition in 1951 that was dedicated to the famous Lombard artist in 1951, **Palazzo Reale** is once again showcasing **20 of Caravaggio's masterpieces**. 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# Sound and the City

There's the glorious La Scala Opera House, the San Siro concert venue, the headquarters of Italy's record industry, numerous radio stations and several top-notch schools. In addition to fashion and design, Milan is also 'the city of music'. And, starting from November this year, Milan is set to host Music Week.

In November, music takes centre stage in Milan. The excitement leading up to the annual La Scala season premiere on 7 December attracts opera fans from around the world, but the Milan music scene is more than just opera; with concerts spanning genres such as classical, rock, pop and Indie music, there is something for all musical tastes. This year, however, there is a new event that will further enhance Milan's musical landscape: **Milano Music Week**, taking place from 20 to

26 November, will be dedicated to pop and rock music with events featured at different locations across the city.

#### MUST-ATTEND EVENTS

**Teatro alla Scala**, one of the most famous opera houses in the world, is getting ready to host its traditional 'premiere' on 7 December. As one of the city's most eagerly-awaited events, it's the highlight of Milan's social and musical calendar. This year's opening night will be a performance

of **"Andrea Chénier"** conducted by Riccardo Chailly and directed by Mario Martone. Umberto Giordano's opera, which tells the story of the life of poet Chenier at the time of the French Revolution, will open the theatre's action-packed season with 15 operas, seven ballets, eight symphony concerts and seven song recitals, plus special evening events, performances by international guests and children's concerts (for the full events calendar visit [www.teatroallascala.org](http://www.teatroallascala.org), but to get tickets, ask your concierge).

**Classical music** lovers visiting Milan will be overwhelmed with choices. The Auditorium di Milano in Largo Mahler and the Conservatory of Milan, as well as smaller venues like theatres, churches and cloisters scattered around the city, offer concerts performed by top-level orchestras and musicians on a daily basis.

November is also a great month for rock and pop concerts. Over the next few weeks, the city will

welcome big names like Bryan Adams, James Blunt, Gianna Nannini, the Kasabian, Jamiroquai, Nick Cave and Shakira (at Mediolanum Forum) but also Dee Dee Bridgewater, Carmen Souza and Dave Holland (at Blue Note, a cult destination for jazz enthusiasts) and the legendary Charles Aznavour (at Teatro degli Arcimboldi, recognized for its top-quality acoustics).

Another musical milestone coming up in November is a festival dedicated to **Salvatore Sciarrino**, winner of a Golden Lion Career Award at the Venice Music Biennale, sponsored by Milano Musica and Teatro alla Scala. His new opera "Ti vedo, ti sento, mi perdo," commissioned and co-produced by Teatro alla Scala and Berlin's Staatsoper Unter den Linden, will premiere on 14 November. To the delight of music lovers, the event will feature 21 symphony and chamber concerts, six seminars, seven world premieres and six Italian premieres, with five works commissioned by Milano Musica, including two new pieces by Salvatore Sciarrino. The festival focuses on contemporary music, which is considered to be an avant-garde genre for listeners who are open to more experimental music, highlighting the breadth and scope of the Milanese repertoire.

And then, as previously mentioned, **from 20 to 26 November**, the city will host the first edition of **Milano Music Week**, a new event on the Italian music scene, which aims to become a tradition.

**FASHION WEEK, DESIGN WEEK... AND NOW MUSIC WEEK**

This year, November is all about music! Milan is synonymous with fashion and design, but it's also a 'city of music', both in terms of art and industry. A quarter of Italy's music industries are located in the greater Milan area. In 2016, 142,000 performances took place, translating to 6 million tickets sold to 8 million spectators, which generated approximately 200 million euros in sales. Milan boasts an average of 300 events a month, with concert revenue generating approximately 8 million euros a month, 928 rapidly growing music-related businesses accounting for almost 10% of the national total and almost 7,000 people employed in the sector.

To really understand the dynamic changes that are taking place on the Milanese music scene, one only needs to read a survey conducted a few years ago by 'MeglioMilano'. In pre-Expo Milan Mozart was played 32 times a day, 29 festivals were staged annually and 240 venues – including institutional and non-



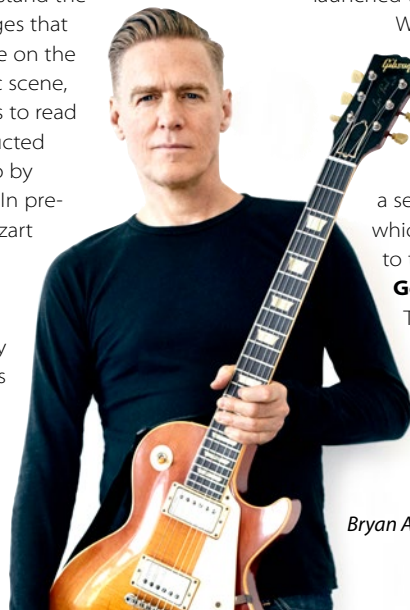
Musical staircase outsaid the metro stop (2010)

traditional sites – were used to host musical events. Thirty trade-related publications were headquartered in Milan and the city hosted a dozen radio stations.

Among other things, this is the city where Casa Ricordi, a label that made the history of music was founded. Milan is the city where several of the world's greatest musicians, most notably Giuseppe Verdi, composed their works and found success. And now (times change!), Milan is the city where popular international music TV shows are produced for Italian audiences, including 'X Factor' which is broadcast from the city's Teatro della Luna.

It therefore comes as no surprise that the City of Milan, in conjunction with a series of public and private partners (including Where®, one of its media partners) has launched the first edition of Milano Music Week whose aim, like the city's famous Fashion and Design Weeks, is to attract and engage the public and industry insiders alike.

This initiative offers music lovers a series of enjoyable events, several of which are free-of-charge. According to the event's director, **Luca De Gennaro**, Viacom's Vice President of Talent and Music for South America, the Middle East and Africa: "This will be a week dedicated to music as a complete experience. We want this to be a music festival that is not only devoted to

entertainment but also to creativity, narrative and hard work, as well as a platform to introduce the public to young artists and new productions."

**MUSIC ANY TIME, ANY WHERE**

November isn't the only month dedicated to music.

**October** was 'Duomo Music Month', a program featuring a series of concerts in the cathedral (for information about other concerts held in the Duomo during the year, visit [www.duomomilano.it](http://www.duomomilano.it)). In the breathtaking interior of Milan's Gothic Cathedral audiences can listen to the 15,000 pipe organ, often accompanied by the voices of the 'pueri cantores' of the Duomo's Musical Chapel, a choir celebrating more than six hundred years of tradition. Each year, **September**, is the month of MiTo, the music festival held between Milan and Turin which, this year, featured 140 world-class concerts dedicated to the theme of Nature.

Other summer highlights included the Summer Festival at the Idroscalo and the Milano Latin Festival at the Forum di Assago.

**May** is the month of Piano City, an initiative dearly loved by the Milanese which, in 2017 alone, enhanced the city's music scene with 458 events primarily associated with the piano including concerts performed in theatres, courtyards, private homes and on trams.

During the 'holiday season', the Blue Note, a renowned jazz hub, ushers in the Christmas spirit with a series of spectacular gospel concerts ([www.bluenotemilano.com](http://www.bluenotemilano.com)).

But Milan's commitment to Music goes far beyond staging events and performances. It is a craftsmanship par excellence that defines the **schools** that train musicians from all over the world (not only the renowned La Scala Academy and Conservatory of Milan, but also the CPM Music Institute, Naba for Sound Design and the Graduate School of Media Communications and the Performing Arts). And it encompasses places: there are numerous spots throughout the city that offer visitors insight into Milan's important musical heritage. On [www.turismo.milano.it](http://www.turismo.milano.it), the City of Milan, suggests an itinerary that starts at **Teatro alla Scala**, Milan's Temple of Opera which needs no introduction.

An insider tip: opera fans and theatre lovers can book a guided tour of the theatre ([www.teatroallascala.org](http://www.teatroallascala.org)). The tour includes a visit to the adjacent museum, home to a fascinating collection of costumes, musical instruments and memorabilia. You can also admire the auditorium from one of the boxes, unless a rehearsal or performance is taking place. You can continue with a visit to the Museum of Musical Instruments at **Castello Sforzesco**, home to several rare pieces. Another must-see is **Casa Verdi**, a retirement home for musicians and opera singers founded by the legendary composer himself, or the Casa Ricordi archives. These are just a few of the many activities available to anyone with a passion for music history. Otherwise, seize the moment and grab a ticket to one of the many concerts currently on offer in the city. Just like any other month of the year, it's music month in Milan!

**Pop music week**



The first edition of the Milano Music Week will be held **from 20 to 26 November**. The program is dedicated to pop music and international rock and features a program jam-packed with activities for the public; updates will be posted on the festival's official website [www.milanomusicweek.it](http://www.milanomusicweek.it) and on the web and social media channels of Where®Milan.

The events calendar features a series of workshops for industry members. The general headquarters will be located at Base Milano (in via Bergognone 34, M2 Porta Genova, in the heart of Milan's design district) which will host special events, meetings for industry insiders and concerts. The initiative is promoted and coordinated by the City of Milan in partnership with SIAE (the Italian Society of Authors and Editors), FIMI (the Federation of the Italian Music Industry), Assomusica (the Association of Live Music Shows, Organizers and Producers) and Nuovo Imaie (the New Cooperative Institute of Artists and Performers), and sponsored by the Ministry of Cultural Heritage, Activities and Tourism. In addition to MTV, the main sponsor of the happening, other important media partners, including Where®, are involved in the event. Milano Music Week also has the support of several leading trade associations who promote and protect workers in the sector, as well as leading music schools. 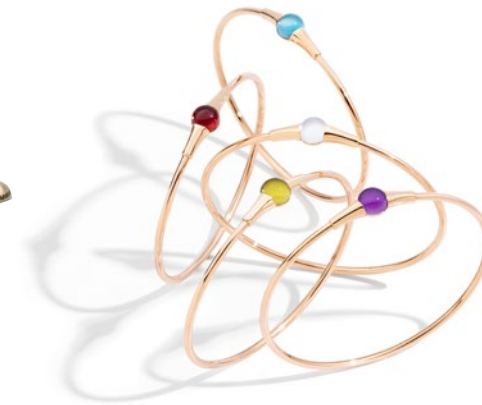

#### TAX-FREE SHOPPING

By law, **non-EU** residents are entitled to **reclaim the VAT** paid on **items purchased and exported from the EU**: before finalizing a purchase, they should ask the shop assistant whether they are eligible for a tax refund.

Shopping hours are generally from 10am to 7pm; less centrally located shops still take the traditional lunch break. Most shops are closed on Sundays (except those located in central Milan) and on Monday mornings. Ask your Concierge.

UnionPay is a global payment network originated from China, responsible for the inter-bank payment via UnionPay system worldwide. By March 2017, over 450,000 merchants in Italy accept UnionPay card for payment, among which 120,000 merchants are located in Milan. This allows hundred of thousands of affluent Chinese customers to shop with their favourite cards. UnionPay also actively work with famous retail groups, such as la Rinascente department stores, The Brian & Barry Building concept megastore, McArthurGlen Designer outlets, Value Retail outlets, SINA hotels, Airport dutyfree shops, to provide special discount or services for UnionPay cardholders.

#### ENTERTAINMENT

Several venues offering food are included in the Entertainment section, because they are considered as meeting places.

#### DINING

Reservations for most restaurants are strongly advised. In Italy, service is included in the price meaning that although tipping is not compulsory, it is obviously appreciated as a sign of satisfaction. Some menus include the word "coperto", a small surcharge corresponding to the cost of the service and bread. Although no dress code exists in Italy, semiformal clothing is usually considered de rigueur at restaurants. All restaurants and bars are non-smoking unless a separate smokers' area is specifically offered. Set meals: prices are per person and usually refer to a 3-course meal (beverages excluded).

### MAJOR SHOPPING DISTRICTS

#### Galleria Vittorio Emanuele II

Located in the heart of the city, and known by the locals as the 'Living Room of the Milanese', the Galleria is considered the oldest shopping arcade in the world. This stunning feat of architecture is lined with some of the world's most famous fashion and designer stores (including Prada, Gucci, Louis Vuitton and Versace), landmark restaurants and cafés. Other innovative additions include a hotel and the 'Highline Galleria', a new highline walkway giving access to the Galleria's rooftops. **Map F4**

#### Duomo

One of Milan's most well-trodden shopping routes starts at the Piazza del Duomo with the renowned department store Rinascente, offering wide range of fashion items under one roof, and continues onto Corso Vittorio Emanuele II, the pedestrian street lined with the most popular brand-name stores. **Map F4**

#### Quadrilatero della Moda

An exclusive destination for luxury shopping, the Quadrilatero is situated just a short distance on foot from the Duomo. This quaintly cobbled quadrangle of streets is bounded by via Montenapoleone, via della Spiga, via Gesù, via Borgospesso, via Santo Spirito, via Sant'Andrea and via Manzoni. The Quadrilatero is a reference point for the most prestigious Italian and international fashion stores, where all the big designer names and most luxurious stores in the world converge. **Map F4**

#### Brera

The heart of the Milanese 'movida', Brera is synonymous with the artistic heart of the city. One of the city's most picturesque areas, its streets are lined with studios, stores selling canvases and paints, antique shops, art galleries and window displays showcasing fashion items, accessories, jewelry and design objects. Today it is a hub of 'haute parfumerie', populated with big-name brand boutiques and artisanal manufacturers who create customized fragrances. **Map F3-F4**

#### Porta Nuova

Located around Stazione Garibaldi, Porta Nuova is Milan's trendiest, most avant-garde district. Its focal point is piazza Gae Aulenti a masterpiece of contemporary architecture and design. Stretching from piazza XXV Aprile and Corso Como to the Isola district, it offers an array of shops, locales and new openings. **Map F2**

#### Cordusio

Young, more affordable brands can be found in via Torino (**Map F5**), one of Milan's oldest streets which connects the Duomo to corso di Porta Ticinese and the Navigli (canals). Formerly home to the workshops of goldsmiths and artisans, it is now lined with numerous shop windows showcasing young, trendy clothing. The "5vie Art+Design" district, home to historic artisanal workshops, arty concept ateliers, showrooms and art galleries is within close proximity. Via Dante (**Map E4**), a pedestrian street lined with shops and bars where you can sample an aperitivo or eat lunch while sitting outside, runs between piazza Duomo and the Castello Sforzesco.

## Tax Free Refund Guide

- VAT (in Italian: IVA) is a **value added tax** on goods and services, and is part of the European Union's value added tax system.
- In some cases, travellers may be granted a **VAT refund**. This refund does not cover the services supplied by hotels, restaurants, taxis or agencies.
- You may be eligible for a VAT refund provided that:
  - you are a **non EU resident**;
  - the goods purchased are intended for **personal or family use** only and are carried in your luggage;
  - the overall value of the goods purchased exceeds **154,94 Euro** (VAT included);
  - the purchase is certified by an **invoice**. This invoice should include a description of the goods purchased, your personal information as well as the details of your passport or any other equivalent document;
  - the goods leave EU territory by the end of the **third month** after the month that you bought them;
  - several specific customs formalities are complied with;
  - the invoice is **returned to the Italian retailer** within four months after the purchase was made.
- The goods purchased and the relevant invoice must be **shown at the customs** exit point when leaving EU territory (if you intend to pack the purchased items into your check-in luggage, you must go to Customs **BEFORE** checking in).
- After leaving EU territory, the traveller must **return the original invoice**, regularly endorsed by the customs office, to the Italian retailer. Said invoice must be returned within four months from the date when the document was issued.
- The refund can be made **directly by the Italian retailer** (however, make sure that the shop you've chosen displays a "Tax Free Shopping" or "Euro Tax Free" sign in its window).
- Several **Tax-Free companies are able to offer immediate VAT cash refunds** when the goods leave either Italian or EU territory (thus exonerating the passenger from having to return the invoice to the retailer). However, this procedure only applies at major international airports or main border crossings. **Most major department stores have Tax Free Refund offices.**
- The services provided by Tax-Free companies imply the payment of a small administrative sum which is **directly deducted** from the amount of VAT refunded to the traveller.
- In the event of a traveller not receiving a VAT refund within a reasonable period of time, he or she should re-contact the Italian retailer or one of the aforementioned companies.
- However, please note, VAT cannot be refunded directly by customs offices.

Brera is synonymous with the artistic heart of the city. As you stroll along the streets of this ancient district, you cannot help but be enchanted by its almost surreal atmosphere boasting small artisans' workshops or quaint stores selling canvases and paints.

**EDITOR'S TIP** Additionally, Brera is home to the impressive **Accademia di Belle Arti**, where visitors can admire Milan's famous painting collection at the **Pinacoteca** (the Brera Picture Gallery), the historic **Biblioteca Nazionale Braidense** (Braidense National Library), the **Museo Astronomico** (The Astronomical Museum), the oldest scientific research institute in the city and the **Giardino Botanico** (Botanical Gardens).

**ART, SHOPPING AND ENTERTAINMENT**  
To start your sightseeing tour on the right foot, we suggest stopping for a cup of coffee at **Princi**, not just an ordinary bakery, but a meeting point where, amidst the heady

scents of "brioche" and "cappuccino", you'll have a chance to begin your day on a high note. A reference point for antique lovers, Brera boasts numerous antique shops and art galleries. Among these, **Pettinaroli**, just relocated from its historic headquarters near the Duomo to no. 4 via Brera, offers a wide selection of maps and antique prints. As an aside, those interested in bargains or bric à brac should definitely make time to visit the **Mercatino di antiquariato e brocantage**, held on the third Sunday of each month. The array of boutiques continues with the elegant artisan footwear sold by **Iliprandi** or the tailor-made, Italian-style shoes by **Alfonso Garlando**. ## Galleria Campari: Red Passion!

An icon of Italian taste and style, the Campari brand needs no introduction. However, few people know that behind its famous red logo there lies a long history of art and design. By **Elena Peverata**

Campari's longstanding relationship with art spans one and a half centuries. The brand's spectacular historic archives and museum of art and design tell the story of the evolution of the famous red aperitivo's advertising campaigns. Galleria Campari, currently the headquarters of the Campari Group, is located in a beautiful Art Decò building. Originally the site of the brand's first production plant, the building was renovated by renowned architect Mario Botta in 2010. The first floor of the museum showcases advertising materials and commercials. Here, visitors can watch videos of Campari campaigns including the famous commercial by Federico Fellini, plus recent videos of Campari Calendars. The walls are covered with an assortment of

images and posters from the brand's vast graphic archives, including works by artists such as Marcello Dudovich, Bruno Munari and futurists Fortunato Depero and Nicolaj Diulgheroff. The second floor is entirely devoted to the evolution of the product: an inspiring journey into the world of Campari shapes and colours including shakers, glasses, menus, ashtrays, dating back to the 60s and 70s. Other highlights featured include advertising signs, memorabilia and design objects that have marked the history of communication. Red, the hallmark colour of the Campari soda bottle designed by Depero in 1932 dominates throughout.

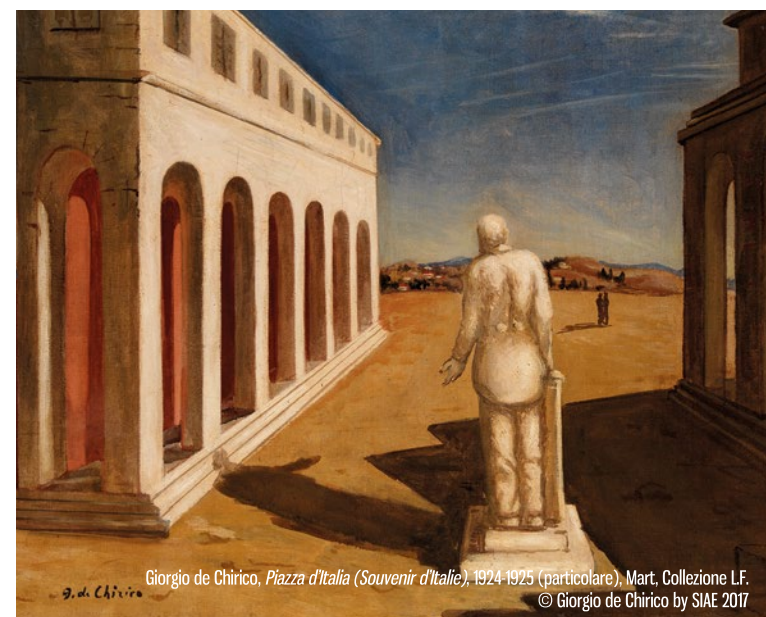

## Visiting Italian beauties

Three destinations to enjoy a day of fun and relaxation with the whole family! From Monza with its magnificent treasures and shopping streets to the lakes of Lombardy and Venice, one of the world's most romantic cities. By **Stefania Vida**

### MONZA

The beauty of its 14th century Torre dell'Arengario, its **glam shopping streets** and its Gothic-style Duomo, featuring marvellous frescoes depicting the life of Queen Theodelinda, make the centre of Monza (20 km from Milan) well worth a visit. However, Monza's **real jewel** in the crown is its famous **Villa Reale**, a magnificent 18th century dwelling designed by Francesco Piermarini, the architect who also designed the La Scala Opera House in Milan. Don't miss Italy's annual **Formula 1 Grand Prix** held in September at the racetrack lying behind its park. [www.villarealedimonza.it](http://www.villarealedimonza.it)

### LAKES OF LOMBARDY

Each year the lakes of Lombardy attract millions of visitors thanks to their mild climate, breathtaking scenery, natural beauties and

historic and artistic treasures. The shores of **Lake Maggiore** (90 km from Milan) wash up on the banks of Piedmont and Lombardy, while its northern basin lies in the mountainous region of Switzerland. The most famous island is Isola Bella, anchored like a fantastic ship-garden and dominated by the majestic **Palazzo Borromeo** ([www.isoleborromeo.it](http://www.isoleborromeo.it)). **Lake Como** must-visits include the Gothic Duomo, the Romanesque basilicas of San Fedele and Sant'Abbondio, the neoclassical Villa Olmo and, in Cernobbio, the deluxe Villa d'Este and Villa Erba (75 km from Milan). Other fabulous lake destinations near Milan include **Lake Orta**, **Lake Varese** and **Lake Lugano**.

### VENICE

The major attractions of Venice (275 km from Milan), such as the awe-inspiring **Basilica of**

**St. Mark**, the Bell Tower and Palazzo Ducale, are all situated just nearby **St. Mark's Square**. Just a few steps from the square, well worth a visit are the historic **Teatro della Fenice** and, burdened with legend, the Bridge of Sighs, one of Venice's most characteristic bridges together with the **Ponte Rialto**. In terms of uniqueness, Venice tops all other cities with its canals – which can be navigated aboard one of the city's famous gondolas – and **Murano**, **Torcello** and **Burano**, three charming, small islands rich in history and tradition.

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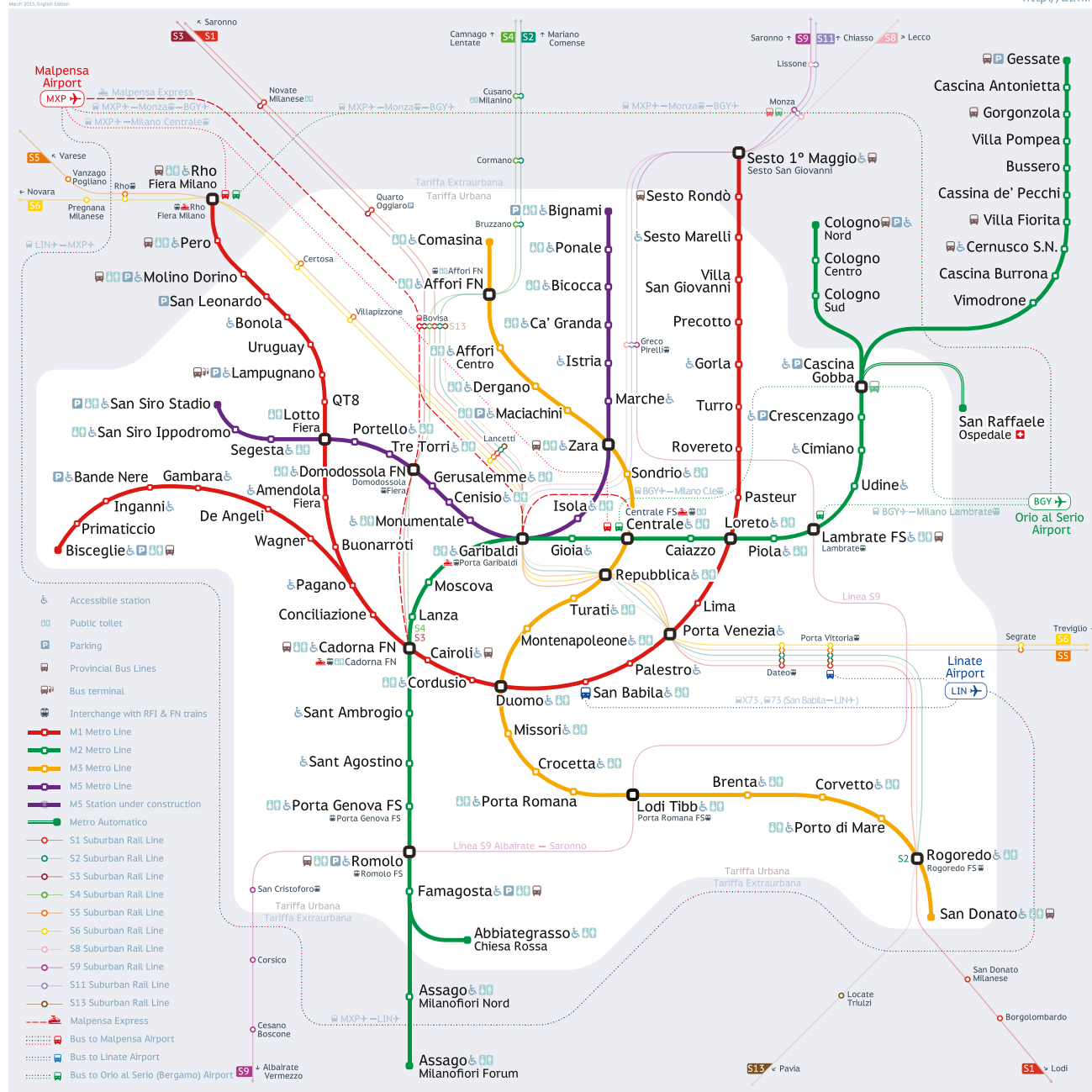

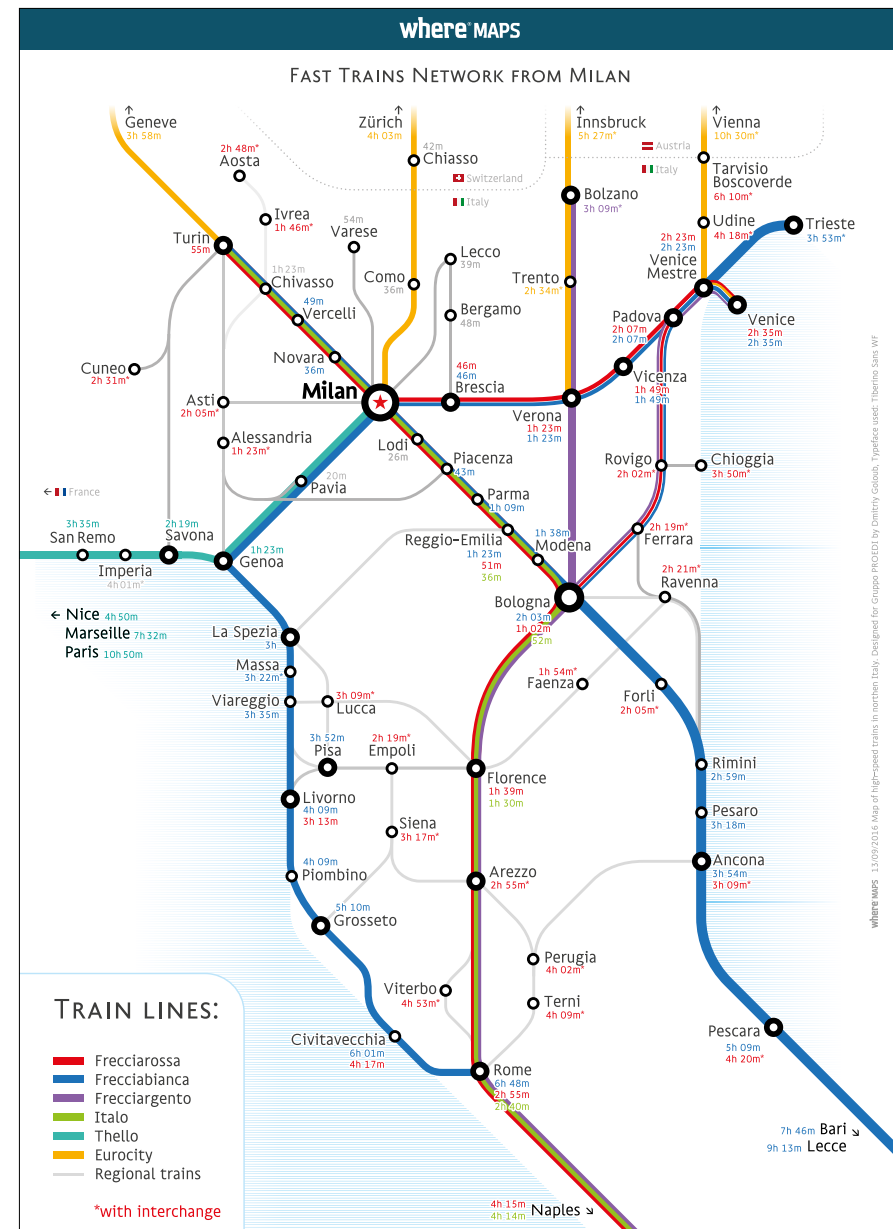

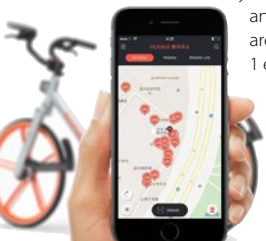
