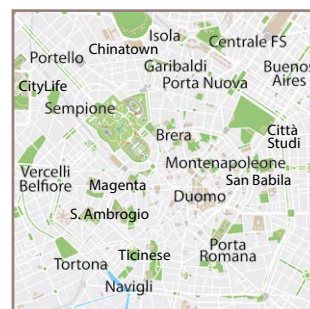

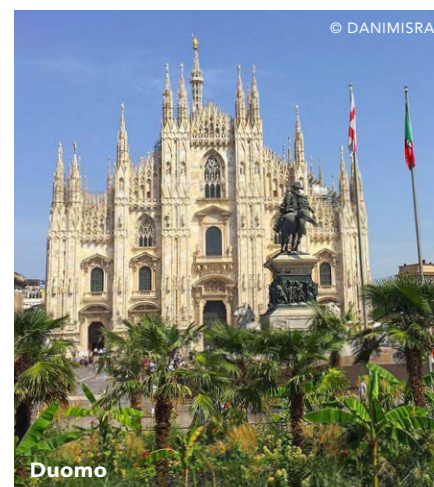

**28** BLOCKBUSTER EXHIBITIONS  
AT PALAZZO REALE

**JANUARY** The fabulous exhibition-event dedicated to **Caravaggio** ends today at Palazzo Reale.

A unique opportunity to see twenty of the master's key masterpieces gathered together for the first time and displayed alongside diagnostic analyses performed on the works to reveal the artist's creative process. Thanks to the use of innovative multi-media equipment, visitors will have a chance to explore what lies beneath the surface of the painting and gain insight into the changes that the artist made between draft and final work. The exhibition showcasing an entire century's worth of costumes from the city's historic **La Scala** opera house also ends today. The costumes, meticulously selected and restored for the occasion, are all examples of the work of some of the most famous designers in the history of theatre.

Until 4 February, Palazzo Reale's magnificent **Sala delle Cariatidi** is currently hosting an exhibit featuring sketches, costumes, videos and fashion plates referencing the work of famous Italian director **Giorgio Strehler** on the occasion of the 20th anniversary of his death.

Until 18 February, an inspiring monographic exhibition dedicated to **Henri de Toulouse-Lautrec**, an aristocratic witness of Paris's lowlife and brothels, explores the artist's stylistic evolution with a display of 250 of his works. Lastly, but certainly not least, the exhibition featuring the most significant works of renowned American photojournalist and war photographer **James Nachtwey**, universally considered the successor of Robert Capa, will run until 4 March.

**17 DECEMBER 2017** | **13 JANUARY 2018** **THE MAGIC OF LA SCALA**

The 2017-2018 Ballet Season at the La Scala Opera House opened in the middle of December with John Neumeier's production of **'La Dame aux camélias'** based on the work of novelist Alexandre Dumas (fils) with music by Frederic Chopin. The production, brought to life by Neumeier's intense and refined choreographic language, is one of the most important new narrative ballets of the last fifty years. The ballet's magnificent stage sets are further highlighted by Chopin's ravishing music. On stage, for the last two performances in January, **Roberto Bolle** (see photo) and **Svetlana Zakharova**, making her first appearance at La Scala in this role.

▼ Every year, on 27 January, Milan celebrates the liberation of Auschwitz-Birkenau (1945), the largest Nazi death camps. the place where the horror of the Holocaust began in Milan in 1943, the Shoah Memorial of Milan is the only site, of all the places in Europe involved in the deportations, that is still intact. A commemorative place and a haven of study, research and contemplation to honour the dead and pave the way for a better future.

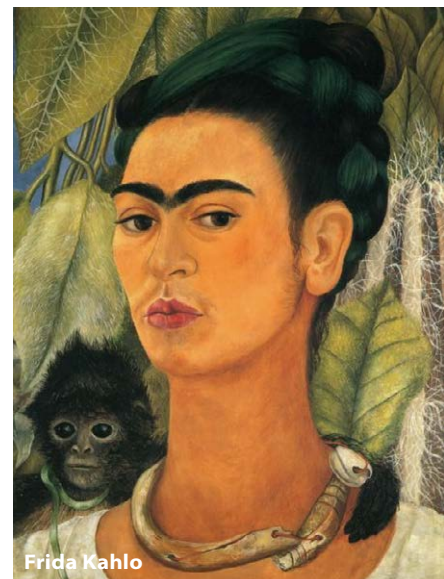

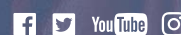

# 20 reasons to visit Milan in winter

Insider tips to enjoy the city when temperatures plummet!

**H**ave you been told that Italy is the 'Country of sun' only to find that it's damp and freezing? Cheer up, things are better than they look! Although Milan is not blessed with the temperate climate of Sicily, it makes up for its cold temperatures with an unrivalled offer of things to do, see and enjoy. Thanks to its plethora of cultural activities, superb food and wine, and fabulous shopping, you'll find plenty of things to keep you

entertained. There's so much to see and do that you'll be making excuses to return in April, just to see the difference. Here's your guide to experiencing the marvels of winter like a local.

**1. Indulge in a special breakfast.** A great way to kick-start your day! If you're staying at the **Milano Scala**, don't miss the hotel's buffet accompanied by the soothing sounds of live classical music (8am-10am, [www.hotelmilanoscala.it](http://www.hotelmilanoscala.it)). Otherwise follow the enticing aroma of coffee emanating from one

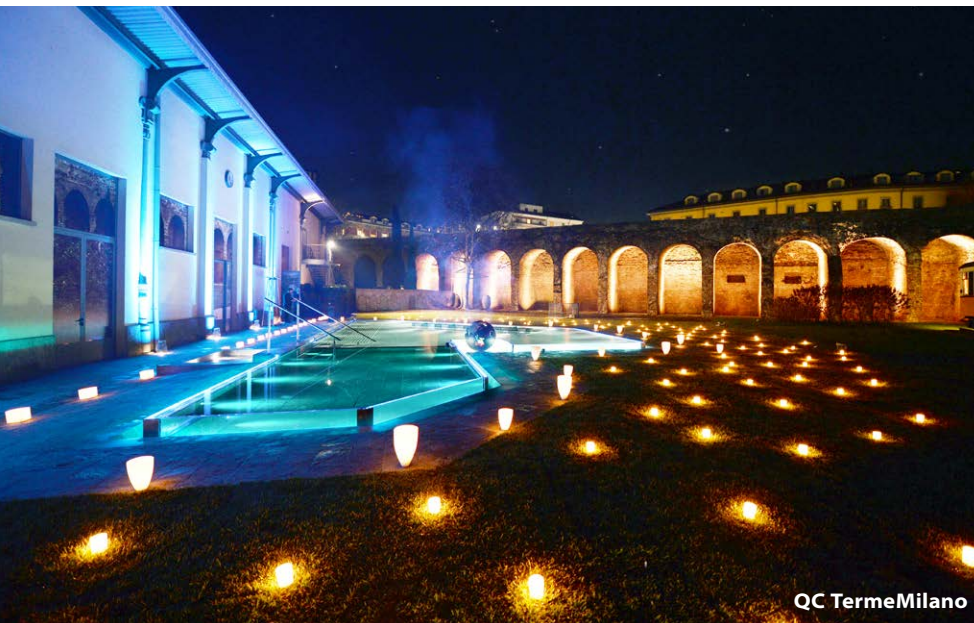
of the city's innumerable bars. Located just steps from the Duomo, historic Italian coffee house Lavazza has opened its flagship store in piazza San Fedele, a space where coffee lovers can sample an authentic espresso.

**2. Cover up!** If you're ill-equipped to face the rigours of winter, don't panic! This is Milan, where you can ward off the cold with a touch of high-octane glamour. The latest, coolest address is Woolrich, which opened its 700 square metre flagship in San Babila in November ([www.woolrich.eu](http://www.woolrich.eu), see page 18).

Its main attraction is the 'Extreme Weather Experience Room', a space featuring insulated walls where customers can experience first-hand the comfort and protection offered by Woolrich parkas at below zero temperatures. Another option is the multi-level store of the Italian luxury brand, Moncler. to the K-Way flagship store located just steps from the Galleria. Cucinelli or Falconeri's luxurious cashmere creations are the ideal must-haves to wear under your jacket. These items can be purchased at Rinascente, and at the brands' boutiques in the centre ([www.brunellocucinelli.com](http://www.brunellocucinelli.com); [www.falconeri.com](http://www.falconeri.com)).

**3. (Continue) shopping.** Now that you're warmly wrapped up, you can continue to browse the streets of the centre, the Galleria Vittorio Emanuele and the 'Quadrilatero della moda' without worrying that you'll freeze to death. January is sale time in Milan, so you might be lucky enough to bag a bargain. If you're in search of a haven far removed

from the snow and the rain, remember that Rinascente, one of the world's most luxurious department stores, offers seven floors of upscale shopping, showcasing all of the world's most coveted fashion and design brands under one roof.

**4. Hop on sightseeing bus** and tour the city: if it's biting cold, you can sit inside and shelter from the cold, while enjoying a panoramic tour of the city. to see Caravaggio or Toulouse-Lautrec ([www.palazzorealemilano.it](http://www.palazzorealemilano.it)); Salgado's photos ([www.formafoto.it](http://www.formafoto.it)), the Egypt of Pharaoh Amenhotep II ([www.mudec.it](http://www.mudec.it)), Titian's altarpiece on show at Palazzo Marino until 14 January, and the exhibition dedicated to Bill Viola in the crypt of San Sepolchro or Perugino's *Adoration of the Magi* on loan at the Museo Diocesano ([www.chiostrisanteustorgio.it](http://www.chiostrisanteustorgio.it)).

**6. Visit a house museum.** Poldi Pezzoli, Bagatti Valsecchi, Boschi Di Stefano and Necchi Campiglio. The network ([www.casemuseo.it](http://www.casemuseo.it)) includes four houses embodying almost two centuries of history. The houses, decorated with original period furnishings and art

collections, were bequeathed to the city by their owners. In addition to their enormous architectural value, these buildings offer visitors insight into the personal lives and stories of their owners, serving as a reflection of the transformations that took place in Milanese society during the 19th and early 20th centuries.

**7. Take time to explore the interiors of a church.** With their stunning facades, ranging from the Romanesque to the Baroque eras, the city boasts a wealth of Christian churches. Enter any one at your leisure but be prepared for some surprises. The Duomo, but also Sant'Ambrogio, San Satiro, Santa Maria delle Grazie, Sant'Eustorgio or San Maurizio are not only magnificent repositories of art but also living testimonies to the city's historic past.

**8. Eat!** Since the cold weather is likely to help you burn more calories, now is the perfect time to indulge in a hearty lunch. Opt for a Tyrol-style setting at the 'Rifugio' in via Lomazzo ([www.ristorante-rifugio.com](http://www.ristorante-rifugio.com)) or head to a place that reminds you of a ski-lodge in Valtellina. We warmly recommend 'l'Valtellina' near the Linate airport ([www.ivalentellina.it](http://www.ivalentellina.it)), or 'Sciatt à porter' near Corso Como ([www.sciattaporter.it](http://www.sciattaporter.it)). Alternately, enjoy a heady mixture of authentic Italian food and design at the brand new Garage Italia ([www.garageitaliacustoms.it](http://www.garageitaliacustoms.it)). If you love street food, remember that Nyx, Milan's latest design hotel, offers a great indoor version ([www.nyx-hotels.it](http://www.nyx-hotels.it)).

**9. Indulge in a food shopping experience.** Although you'll be hard put to taste all the flavours of Italy at just one sitting, you can make a start by exploring the huge selection

of delicacies showcased at Eataly Smeraldo, in piazza XXV Aprile. Otherwise, if you haven't yet left Rinascente, remember that you'll find an entire floor here dedicated to gourmet specialties.

**10. Go skating.** Rather than hibernating, get out and make the most of the city's wintertime activities! Besides, skating on ice is not only fun and good exercise, but a great way to discover some of the city's picturesque, hidden gems. Temporary ice rinks can be found in piazza Gae Aulenti, in the Montanelli Gardens, in piazza Beccaria or against the scenic backdrop of the Bagni Misteriosi ([www.bagnimisteriosi.com](http://www.bagnimisteriosi.com)).

**11. Take refuge at a Spa.** If skating isn't your thing, treat yourself to a sauna in a beautiful setting. Milan boasts a fabulous choice of must-visit places. Our pick of the bunch include the Grand Spa with natural light at Palazzo Parigi ([www.palazzoparigi.com](http://www.palazzoparigi.com)), the Spa at the Four Seasons designed by Patricia Urquiola ([www.fourseasons.com/it/milan/spa](http://www.fourseasons.com/it/milan/spa)), the Shiseido Spa at the Hotel Gallia ([www.shiseidospamilan.com](http://www.shiseidospamilan.com)), the Spa at the Bulgari hotel featuring a pool inlaid with pure gold tiles, the Gentleman's retreat at the Mandarin Oriental ([www.mandarinoriental.it](http://www.mandarinoriental.it)) or the sumptuous Club 10 Spa on the top floor of the hotel Principe di Savoia ([www.dorchestercollection.com](http://www.dorchestercollection.com)).

**12. Play golf.** If you're looking for an indoor experience, the Shiseido Spa offers one of the most spectacular virtual golf facilities in Europe (guests staying at the Excelsior Hotel Gallia get in for free). If, on the other hand, you're determined to brave the cold weather just to hit that ball, the 'go-to' place for the Milanese is

## Must-visit addresses for a cultural break

If you've braved the cold and are now looking for somewhere special to take a break, remember that numerous cultural venues offer eateries or bookstores, or both that can be accessed without a ticket. The **Caffè Letterario** - a great place to enjoy a cup of coffee, a light meal or a post-prandial drink - is located in the 15th century cloisters of Palazzo Carmagnola alongside **Abook**, a goldmine for publications associated with the theatre. For lovers of the genre, the **Triennale Design Cafè** is a cult address which also encompasses the **Triennale Store**, a bookstore featuring a rich selection of books dedicated to architecture, design and modern and contemporary art. Alternately, the **Mudec Museum of Cultures** in via Tortona offers an array of high-quality services. Highlights include a bistro, a starred restaurant and design store flanked by pop-up bookshops selling literature associated with the exhibitions.

In Gae Aulenti, **Feltrinelli Red** offers books and refreshments with a view over one of Milan's newest and most beautiful squares, while a selection of ingenious, fun objects await you at the **Museo della Scienza's Must Shop**. However, the city's latest, go-to address is the **new Bottega Brera bookshop** at the **Pinacoteca di Brera**, where the revolution undertaken by its director James Bradburne continues to make waves. Items on sale include postcards, guidebooks and books, but also unique objet d'arts like the limited edition dish designed specifically for the Pinacoteca by Fornasetti, a former student of the Brera Academy. Other projects in the pipeline include a café scheduled to open at the end of spring 2018.

**14. Fly!** A 'post-Expo' attraction, Aero Gravity Indoor Skydiving is the largest vertical tunnel in the world designed to simulate a free fall from 4,500 metres. Adrenaline, sport and safety, even for children. Booking required. [www.aerogravity.it](http://www.aerogravity.it)

**15... Eat again!** You're in Italy! Where better to indulge your palate than the 'Bel Paese'? If it's teatime, treat yourself to a hot chocolate or a sweet treat at a traditional pasticceria. Although you'll be spoiled for choice, our pick of the city's best and most historic places include Cova ([www.covamilano.com](http://www.covamilano.com)), Marchesi 1824 ([www.pasticceriamarchesi.com](http://www.pasticceriamarchesi.com)) and obviously Peck (which is not just a pasticceria but also a cult gastronomic destination, [www.peck.it](http://www.peck.it)).

**16. Take a lesson.** Numerous chefs and institutions offer cookery classes, often directly in your hotel: ask your concierge for more information!

**17. Attend a performance at La Scala:** since performances are not held daily, it's advisable to get detailed information ([www.teatroallascala.org](http://www.teatroallascala.org)). And, if possible, don't miss the thrill of attending an opera or a ballet at this temple of music!

**18. Attend a performance... but not at La Scala.** There's no lack of high-quality performances: check out the programmes at the Arcimboldi ([www.teatroarcimboldi.it](http://www.teatroarcimboldi.it)) and the Piccolo Teatro ([www.piccoloteatro.org](http://www.piccoloteatro.org)), as well as those featured at less well-known places like the Palazzina Liberty in Largo Marinai d'Italia ([www.palazzinalibertyinmusica.it](http://www.palazzinalibertyinmusica.it)). There are also lots of others, so be on the look out!

**19. Watch a basketball match:** Olimpia Milano, the city's home team boasts a longstanding tradition and is owned by none other than Giorgio Armani... another reason to root for the team! Check out the calendar at [www.olimpiamilano.com](http://www.olimpiamilano.com).

**20. Climb to the rooftop terraces of the Duomo.** Don't underestimate this experience. If it's cold but clear, you'll have a bird's eye view of the city. The place is both spiritual and romantic. Try it, and you'll bring home an unforgettable picture postcard image of Milan.

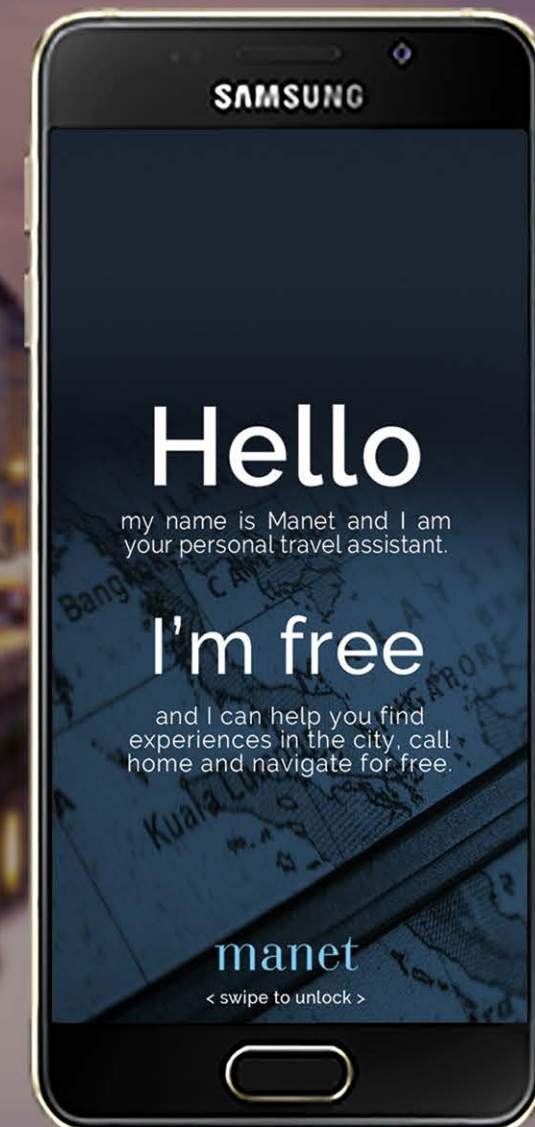

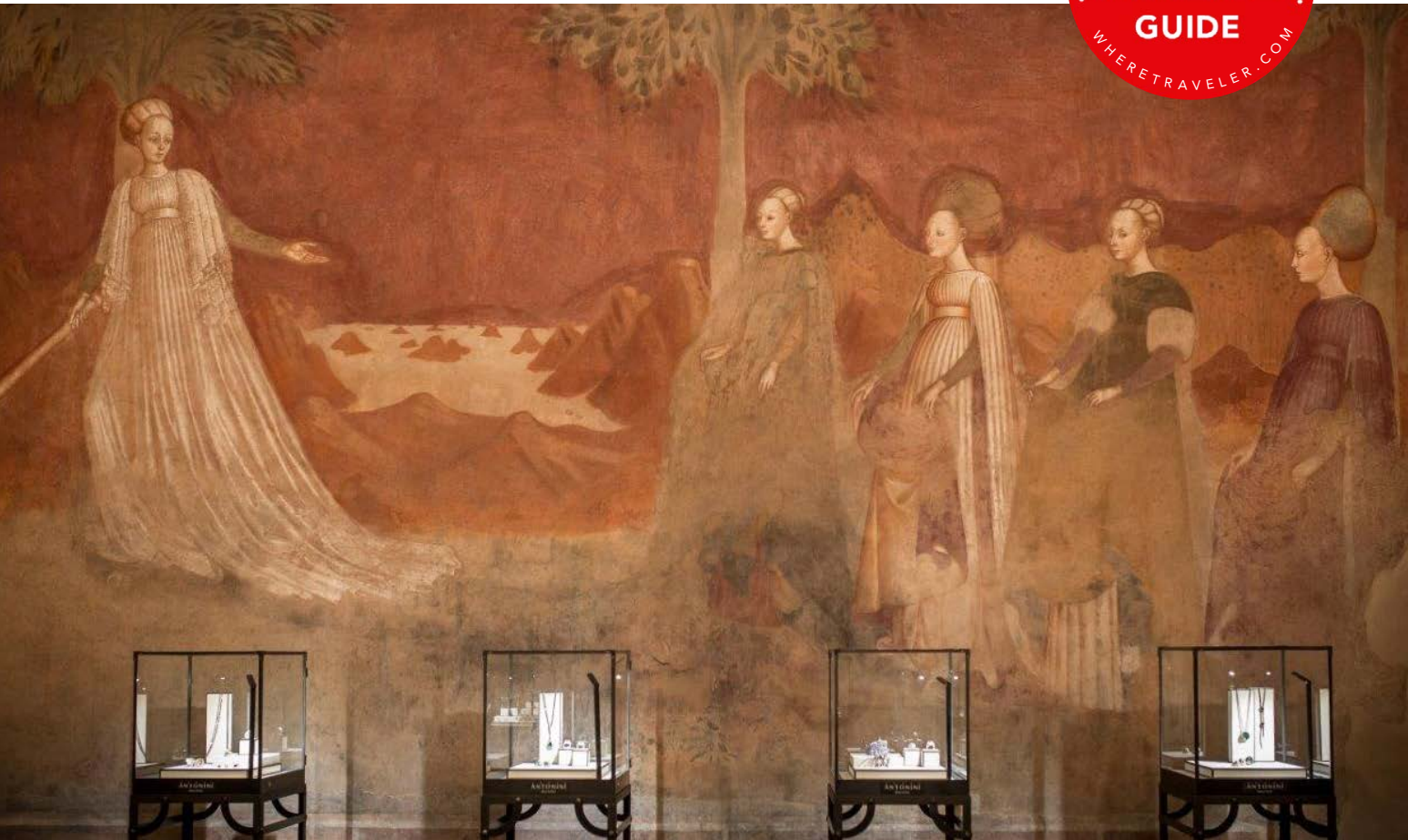

The renowned jeweler's elegant showroom is located in Milan's prestigious **Palazzo Borromeo**, overlooking the eponymous square. Two art forms – that of the goldsmith and frescoing – blend harmoniously in an evocative environment further highlighting the inestimable value of Antonini's creations. All these creations are handmade in Milan, where this brand of haute joaillerie was founded in 1919. Entire collections, unique pieces featuring an innovative design and numbered, certified **haute couture jewelry** – designed ad hoc, beginning with the stone chosen for the setting. The brand's creative director Sergio Antonini gives life to surprising creations that

have garnered him international recognition. These include his Anniversary necklace, chosen for the Brilliant exhibition at the 21st International Triennale, or the Siracusa collection, which won the Andrea Palladio International Jewellery Awards for 'The Best Italian Jewellery Brand Collection'. His jewelry is a hot favourite with showbiz celebrities, including Selena Gomez, Halle Berry, Anne Hathaway, Jennifer Lopez, Gigi Hadid and Taylor Swift. #### TAX-FREE SHOPPING

By law, **non-EU** residents are entitled to **reclaim the VAT** paid on **items purchased and exported from the EU**: before finalizing a purchase, they should ask the shop assistant whether they are eligible for a tax refund.

Shopping hours are generally from 10am to 7pm; less centrally located shops still take the traditional lunch break. Most shops are closed on Sundays (except those located in central Milan) and on Monday mornings. Ask your Concierge.

UnionPay is a global payment network originated from China, responsible for the inter-bank payment via UnionPay system worldwide. By March 2017, over 450,000 merchants in Italy accept UnionPay card for payment, among which 120,000 merchants are located in Milan. This allows hundred of thousands of affluent Chinese customers to shop with their favourite cards. #### ENTERTAINMENT

Several venues offering food are included in the Entertainment section, because they are considered as meeting places.

#### DINING

Reservations for most restaurants are strongly advised. In Italy, service is included in the price meaning that although tipping is not compulsory, it is obviously appreciated as a sign of satisfaction. Some menus include the word "coperto", a small surcharge corresponding to the cost of the service and bread. Although no dress code exists in Italy, semiformal clothing is usually considered de rigueur at restaurants. All restaurants and bars are non-smoking unless a separate smokers' area is specifically offered. Set meals: prices are per person and usually refer to a 3-course meal (beverages excluded).

### MAJOR SHOPPING DISTRICTS

#### Galleria Vittorio Emanuele II

Located in the heart of the city, and known by the locals as the 'Living Room of the Milanese', the Galleria is considered the oldest shopping arcade in the world. This stunning feat of architecture is lined with some of the world's most famous fashion and designer stores (including Prada, Gucci, Louis Vuitton and Versace), landmark restaurants and cafés. Other innovative additions include a hotel and the 'Highline Galleria', a new highline walkway giving access to the Galleria's rooftops. **Map F4**

#### Duomo

One of Milan's most well-trodden shopping routes starts at the Piazza del Duomo with the renowned department store Rinascente, offering wide range of fashion items under one roof, and continues onto Corso Vittorio Emanuele II, the pedestrian street lined with the most popular brand-name stores. **Map F4**

#### Quadrilatero della Moda

An exclusive destination for luxury shopping, the Quadrilatero is situated just a short distance on foot from the Duomo. This quaintly cobbled quadrangle of streets is bounded by via Montenapoleone, via della Spiga, via Gesù, via Borgospesso, via Santo Spirito, via Sant'Andrea and via Manzoni. The Quadrilatero is a reference point for the most prestigious Italian and international fashion stores, where all the big designer names and most luxurious stores in the world converge. **Map F4**

#### Brera

The heart of the Milanese 'movida', Brera is synonymous with the artistic heart of the city. One of the city's most picturesque areas, its streets are lined with studios, stores selling canvases and paints, antique shops, art galleries and window displays showcasing fashion items, accessories, jewelry and design objects. Today it is a hub of 'haute parfumerie', populated with big-name brand boutiques and artisanal manufacturers who create customized fragrances. **Map F3-F4**

#### Porta Nuova

Located around Stazione Garibaldi, Porta Nuova is Milan's trendiest, most avant-garde district. Its focal point is piazza Gae Aulenti a masterpiece of contemporary architecture and design. Stretching from piazza XXV Aprile and Corso Como to the Isola district, it offers an array of shops, locales and new openings. **Map F2**

#### Cordusio

Young, more affordable brands can be found in via Torino (**Map F5**), one of Milan's oldest streets which connects the Duomo to corso di Porta Ticinese and the Navigli (canals). Formerly home to the workshops of goldsmiths and artisans, it is now lined with numerous shop windows showcasing young, trendy clothing. The "Svie Art+Design" district, home to historic artisanal workshops, arty concept ateliers, showrooms and art galleries is within close proximity. Via Dante (**Map E4**), a pedestrian street lined with shops and bars where you can sample an aperitivo or eat lunch while sitting outside, runs between piazza Duomo and the Castello Sforzesco.

## Tax Free Refund Guide

- VAT (in Italian: IVA) is a **value added tax** on goods and services, and is part of the European Union's value added tax system.
- In some cases, travellers may be granted a **VAT refund**. This refund does not cover the services supplied by hotels, restaurants, taxis or agencies.
- You may be eligible for a VAT refund provided that:
  - you are a **non EU resident**;
  - the goods purchased are intended for **personal or family use** only and are carried in your luggage;
  - the overall value of the goods purchased exceeds **154,94 Euro** (VAT included);
  - the purchase is certified by an **invoice**. This invoice should include a description of the goods purchased, your personal information as well as the details of your passport or any other equivalent document;
  - the goods leave EU territory by the end of the **third month** after the month that you bought them;
  - several specific customs formalities are complied with;
  - the invoice is **returned to the Italian retailer** within four months after the purchase was made.
- The goods purchased and the relevant invoice must be **shown at the customs** exit point when leaving EU territory (if you intend to pack the purchased items into your check-in luggage, you must go to Customs **BEFORE checking in**).
- After leaving EU territory, the traveller must **return the original invoice**, regularly endorsed by the customs office, to the Italian retailer. Said invoice must be returned within four months from the date when the document was issued.
- The refund can be made **directly by the Italian retailer** (however, make sure that the shop you've chosen displays a "Tax Free Shopping" or "Euro Tax Free" sign in its window).
- Several **Tax-Free companies are able to offer immediate VAT cash refunds** when the goods leave either Italian or EU territory (thus exonerating the passenger from having to return the invoice to the retailer). However, this procedure only applies at major international airports or main border crossings. **Most major department stores have Tax Free Refund offices.**
- The services provided by Tax-Free companies imply the payment of a small administrative sum which is **directly deducted** from the amount of VAT refunded to the traveller.
- In the event of a traveller not receiving a VAT refund within a reasonable period of time, he or she should re-contact the Italian retailer or one of the aforementioned companies.
- However, please note, VAT cannot be refunded directly by customs offices.

## Light and space according to Fontana

Since its opening three months ago, *Ambienti/Environments* has been a big hit with contemporary art aficionados and newbies alike. By **Elena Peverata**

Although Lucio Fontana is considered to be one of the most influential Italian artists of the mid-twentieth century, his experimental works entitled **Spatial Environments** are not very well-known. By bringing together elements of painting, sculpture, and architecture, Fontana challenges the idea that art is something static and gives viewers the opportunity to explore the space. 'Ambienti/Environments' showcase nine 'Spatial Environments' and two 'Environmental Interventions' created between 1949 and 1968. This is the **first time** that these pieces have been ever displayed together. The installations are characterized by the constants of Fontana's unconventional use of elements: an altered perception of space, monochrome colours, neon or Wood light (black light), corridors and labyrinthine spaces. The exhibition is housed at **Fondazione Pirelli HangarBicocca**, a former

industrial complex for the construction of locomotives. Its 15,000 square metres encompass three exhibition spaces, the 'Shed', the 'Navate' and the 'Cubo', which are mainly used to host temporary exhibitions. Until 14 January, visitors will also have a chance to visit 'Take Me (I'm Yours)', an unusual collective exhibition offering the public a rare opportunity to touch, use, test, take away or modify the objects exhibited. In addition to temporary shows, the Navate exhibition space also houses a permanent installation by Anselm Kiefer titled 'The Seven Heavenly Palaces 2004-2015' (right), whose imposing concrete-and-lead towers have become true icons of contemporary art in Milan.

**Shoah Memorial of Milan**



The Shoah Memorial of Milan is located in an area under the railway tracks of the Central Station, where mail was loaded and offloaded. This was the place where, between 1943 and 1945, sheltered from preying eyes, thousands of Jews and political deportees were loaded onto freight cars, via an elevator platform that was used to lift such cars up to the main platform. These transports were then connected to convoys leaving for Auschwitz-Birkenau and other German camps, or Italian camps such as Fossoli and Bolzano. Among all the places used as deportation sites in Europe, the Memorial is the only one that has remained intact. Today it is a commemorative place that honours the victims of the mass extermination, and also represents a 'living, educational memorial' where people can actively experience the

tragedy of the Shoah. More than 100,000 visitors, including 60,000 students, have had a chance to experience and gain insight into this place of enormous existential and emotional significance.
