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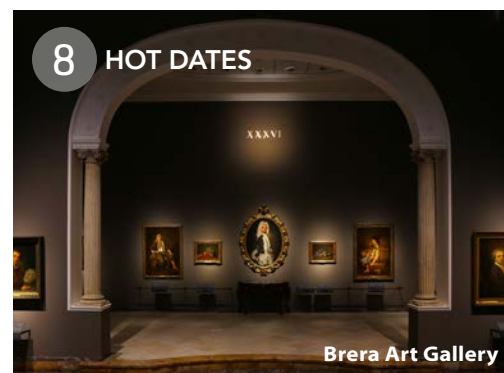

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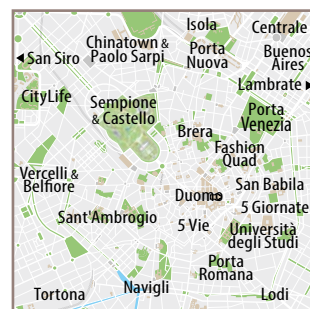

DIALOGUING WITH ART IN BRERA

In April, the **Pinacoteca di Brera** will once again be a star player on the Milanese cultural scene. An annual highlight of Milan's Design Week, this month, the Pinacoteca will be staging an extraordinary **new dialogue** between two historical masterpieces. The 'dialogues with art' event compares in-house paintings with related, on-loan works, maintaining a tradition started by James M. Bradburne, the director of the Pinacoteca di Brera and the Biblioteca Braidense. The public can enjoy the **sixth stage of the restructuring of the Pinacoteca's collections and Napoleonic rooms** with new explanatory texts, more explicit captions, newly painted walls and a totally revamped lighting system that portrays the works of art in brilliant colours. Until 1 July, visitors will have a chance to admire the dialogue '**Around Loves. Camillo Boccaccino Sacred and Profane**'.

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Salone del Mobile.Milano Spotlighting design

The Salone del Mobile.Milano and the Fuorisalone endorse their status as a winning duo at this year's edition of Milan Design Week. Held from 17 to 22 April, this event boasts a strong international flavour but is faithful to its Milanese roots, and will transform the city into a creative, open-air workshop.

Ever more Milanese, ever more international. These words best describe the new manifesto of the Salone del Mobile.Milano. Scheduled to be held from **17 to 22 April** at the Rho

Fairgrounds, the 'Salone's mission will highlight the elements that link the event to the city of Milan, strengthening the process of globalization that has been undertaken by them. This manifesto, a declaration of intent, aims to channel all the creative energy that floods Milan during the 'Salone'. More than three hundred thousand individuals, including designers, architects, journalists, collectors and design enthusiasts, flock to the city each year to attend **Milan Design Week**. These international visitors are welcomed by both the system of cultural sharing (the event is attended by visitors from more than **160 countries**, testifying to the Salone's international mission) and the spaces, in an **ongoing dialogue with the city** which increases every year. The event is like a widespread macro fair extending from the centre of the city to the outlying areas. Featuring an action-packed program of projects and events, this **57th edition** promises to be a memorable one. Figures for the event are astounding: 205,000 net square meters of exhibition space, more than 2,000 exhibitors and a 22% attendance rate by foreign companies. Five events will be held simultaneously at the Rho Fairgrounds. These will be open to industry members throughout the week from 9.30am to 6.30pm, and to the public on Saturday and Sunday. The *Salone Internazionale del Mobile* and the *International Furnishing Accessories Exhibition* are divided into 3 stylistic categories, *Design*, *xLux* and *Classic: Tradition in the Future*. This year, *EuroCucina* doubles its presence with a complementary event titled FTK (Technology For the Kitchen). The *International Bathroom Exhibition* will focus on a space that now transcends functionalism to embrace wellness, while the *SaloneSatellite*, dedicated to young designers under the age of 35, encourages participants to work on the theme of the relationship between craftsmanship and state-of-the art, with a focus on African and South American art.

IN DIALOGUE WITH THE CITY

The Salone del Mobile.Milano and the Fuorisalone unite to define Milan Design Week, one of the world's most important design events in the world. A series of **fringe events**, that run parallel to the 'Salone', are organized

by the **Fuorisalone.it** across the city and held in **different districts**, including Brera Design District, Ventura Centrale, Ventura Future, Tortona Design Week, 5VIE Art+Design, Zona Sant'Ambrogio, Triennale di Milano, IN/Bovisa, Porta Venezia In Design, Università degli Studi di Milano.

During the Fuorisalone, a location often becomes a co-protagonist of the event, and sometimes may even steal the show from the products or items presented or displayed. Former industrial spaces, historic buildings usually closed to the public, hidden courtyards, artisan workshops and fashion showrooms transcend the concept of background and interact with their contents, becoming an

installation within an installation. Standouts among this year's must-visit venues include those chosen by **Ventura Projects**, whose two projects Ventura Future and Ventura Centrale aim to pave the way for creativity and experimentation, with a particular emphasis on the developments of contemporary design, exhibition spaces and their distinctive features. The first edition of **Ventura Future** will present 'The Future Panorama of Design' which will be held in three different locations. The 'Loft', a typical feature of Milanese residential areas, in via Donatello 36, the Futurdome, in via Paisiello 6, an independent museum housed in an Art Decò building that was formerly a meeting place for Futurist artists, and lastly, the old building that once

housed the Faculty of Pharmacy, in viale Abruzzi 42. The aim of Ventura Future is to demonstrate the proactive role played by the design world in shaping the future. In a rapidly evolving world, facing environmental, political and social challenges on a daily basis, the brilliance of designers lies in their ability to 'think outside the box' and achieve radical, innovative solutions. Particularly noteworthy among those exhibitors dedicated to studying our perception of technological processes and their impact on our daily lives, is American design studio **UM Project** whose 'Patch' project envisages the future of smart houses and cities. They explain this saying: "like the furniture in our homes, networks are becoming more familiar and friendly –

a sort of silent partner, a welcome embrace, a reassuring blanket". A type of good-natured big brother takes centre stage in the exhibition project developed by the former alumni of the **Design Academy**, with a new interactive installation that traces and follows the viewer by tracking his eye movements. Ventura Future also features two projects by **Patricia Urquiola**, plus others by Mingone, Federica Biasi, Denis Guidone, Mae Engelgeer and Valerio Sommella. Following the overwhelming success of last year's experiment, the second edition of **Ventura Centrale** will be held under the industrial vaults of the old warehouses located under the rail tracks of the Central Station, in via Ferrante Aporti (Map H1). Here, visitors will be treated to an **eclectic mixture of contemporary design** by emerging designers and well-established firms including Nitto (see opening page), Asahi Glass and Eileen Fisher with DesignWork, curated by Li Edelkoort, and 'Paradigma', an exhibition/installation by Fabrica. To celebrate its 25th anniversary, the American magazine *Surface* is teaming up with celebrated architect David Rockwell to create 'The Diner', a contemporary reinterpretation of typical American restaurants which, in addition to serving food, will also host events, conferences and parties until late at night (www.venturaprojects.com).

Alternately, visitors will have a chance to experience a completely different type of atmosphere in the **5VIE Art+Design** district. Formerly the old heart of Milan, the events and presentations featured here will be held at historic 'Palazzi' (including Palazzo Turati and Palazzo Litta), in small artisan workshops or hidden ateliers. The area will act as a backdrop for a series of presentations ranging from product design to experimental research and the **renaissance of ancient artisanal skills**, having ethnic and social implications. Focusing on the re-use of abandoned urban spaces since 2014, the 5VIE has concentrated on re-opening and giving new life to abandoned historical places, by using them for pop-up events. This year, the spotlight will be trained on the spaces of the old Meazza hardware store – an iconic



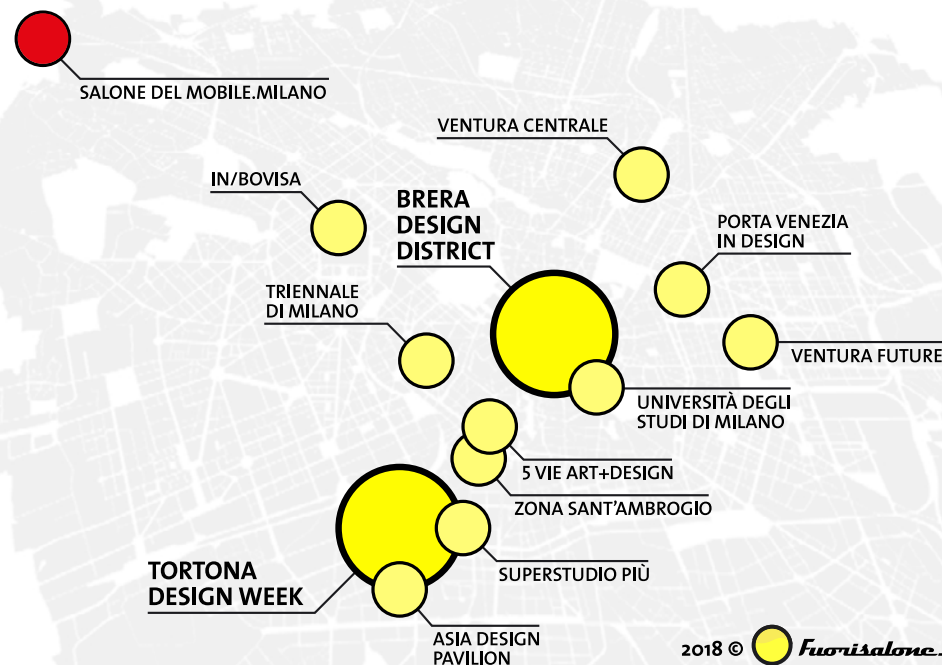

symbol of post-war Milan, which closed down two years ago. The space will host various projects, including a tribute to the work of Nanda Vigo. The items displayed will include her 2005 'Goral' totems, fitted with neon light signals representing the elementary signs of the cosmogenic alphabet and a wall display of her luminous tree sculptures titled 'Light Trees'. In vicolo Bagnera, renowned for being Milan's narrowest, most mysterious street, Portuguese artist Xena will pay tribute to Italy's rich cultural heritage, and stage a show of light and shadows, narrative and reality, inspired by the work of Caravaggio (www.5vie.it).

The bourgeois apartments in the **Brera Design District** are a must-visit location. They are a symbolic area of the city, characterized by a precise, coherent identity. The **Brera Design Apartment** is an exhibition space located in **via Palermo 1** that has been designed to host events, exhibitions, shootings, presentations and business dinners. This year, these authentic design residences, equipped with all the essential mod cons, will host an exhibition organized by Raffaella Guidobono. This exhibition, featuring creations in soapstone, blown glass, Limoges porcelain, brass and solid, hand-cut wood, will explore light design and superior craftsmanship. At the same time,

12 designers have been invited to create an innovative item for the launch of '**Souvenir Milan**', a collection of mementoes symbolizing Milan, including a Last Supper-themed brooch, sequined porcelain fridge magnets and a saffron container in honour of Milan's traditional yellow rice. All of the items mentioned can be purchased on-site. As is customary, the **Lago apartment** (via Brera 30), another renowned cultural and residential experiment, will host events and meetings. To mark the occasion, it will be redecorated with 40 different elements including patterns, furnishings and upholstery created by the same number of young Italian talents (www.breradesigndistrict.it).



Lavazza Tiny Bar

On the occasion of the Fuorisalone, **Italian coffee company Lavazza** has teamed up with irreverent art magazine **Toiletpaper** to offer customers a special **pop-up bar** featuring an unconventional, pop atmosphere inspired by the new Tiny espresso machine.

At the **Mediatica Santa Teresa** in Brera (via della Moscova, 28), you can visit the playful, whimsical installation cum cafeteria where the new **Lavazza Tiny** machines take centre stage.

MILANO GREEN

Milan's 57th Design Week will feature numerous projects dedicated to re-greening the city. Although the installations will be temporary, the idea is to put a little greenery back into urban spaces, exploring whether it's possible to use natural resources sustainably to create user-friendly spaces and houses.

► To highlight the special relationship with the city, this year, Salone del Mobile.Milano will spread beyond the confines of the Fair to explore the relationship between nature and living spaces with '**Living Nature. The Nature of Living**', an installation located in piazza Duomo, in front of Palazzo Reale. From 17 to 29 April, a 500sq.m. pavilion designed by international architecture firm Carlo Ratti Associati and conceived using energy saving criteria, will house four natural, climatic microcosms allowing visitors to pass from one season to another in an instant. The aim is to offer **green solutions** that are genuinely applicable, and capable of taking advantage

of existing technological innovations intelligently. While air conditioning is often associated with excessive energy consumption, this project aims to demonstrate the feasibility of a technology for sustainable climate control, based on the use of solar panel and energy accumulators (www.salonemilano.it/manifestazioni).

► Eataly Milano Smeraldo and LiveinSlums Onlus will present **MI-ORTO**, a project dedicated to Urban Agriculture and ecological design, established to bring agriculture closer to the city. Regenerated vegetable gardens, benches and flowerbeds will transform **piazza XXV Aprile** into a playful/experiential installation (www.eataly.net).

► '**Hidden Garden**', an evocative project by Pierattelli Architetture, will involve the creation of an enchanted, secret garden, populated with hundreds of trees and plants.



On display from 16 to 22 April, it will offer the public a space to enjoy and interact with nature. Situated in **piazza Gae Aulenti**, the garden covers a surface area of 140sq.m. and is protected by mirror-covered panels. The mirrors are oriented in different directions to create a fascinating play of reflections that seem to increase the space *ad infinitum*.

► Lastly, at the **Milan Design Market**, hosted at the Gianni Rizzotti Photographic Studio in via Pastrengo 14, Plantui Italia will present a lamp (see photo) that enables you to grow aromatic herbs and salad without soil (www.milandesignmarket.com).

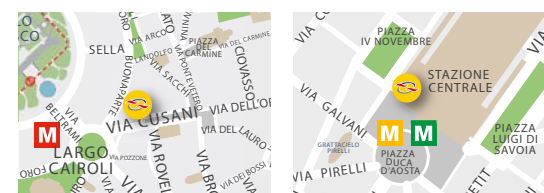

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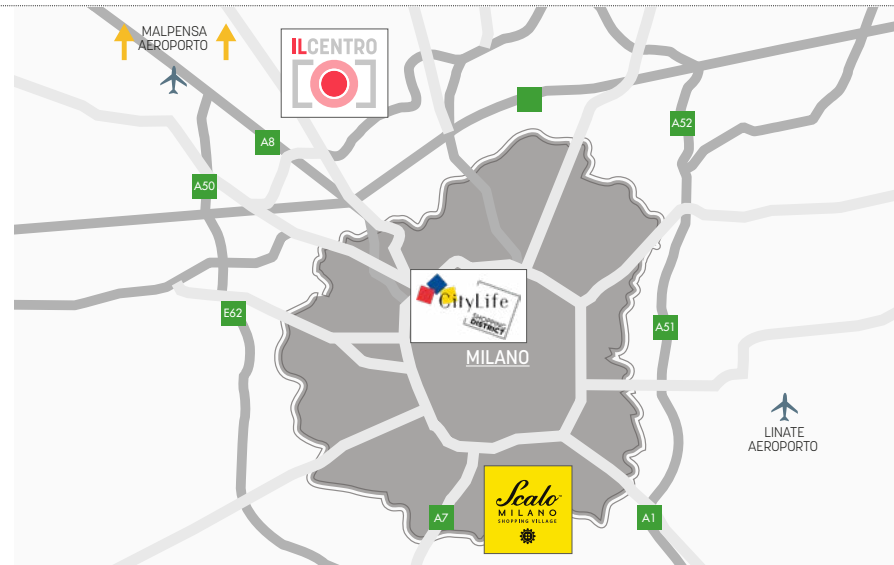

Although no dress code exists in Italy, semiformal clothing is usually considered de rigueur at restaurants. All restaurants and bars are non-smoking unless a separate smokers' area is specifically offered. Set meals: prices are per person and usually refer to a 3-course meal (beverages excluded).

MAJOR SHOPPING DISTRICTS

Galleria Vittorio Emanuele II

Located in the heart of the city, and known by the locals as the 'Living Room of the Milanese', the Galleria is considered the oldest shopping arcade in the world. This stunning feat of architecture is lined with some of the world's most famous fashion and designer stores (including Prada, Gucci, Louis Vuitton and Versace), landmark restaurants and cafés. Other innovative additions include a hotel and the 'Highline Galleria', a new highline walkway giving access to the Galleria's rooftops. **Map F4**

Duomo

Quadrilatero della Moda

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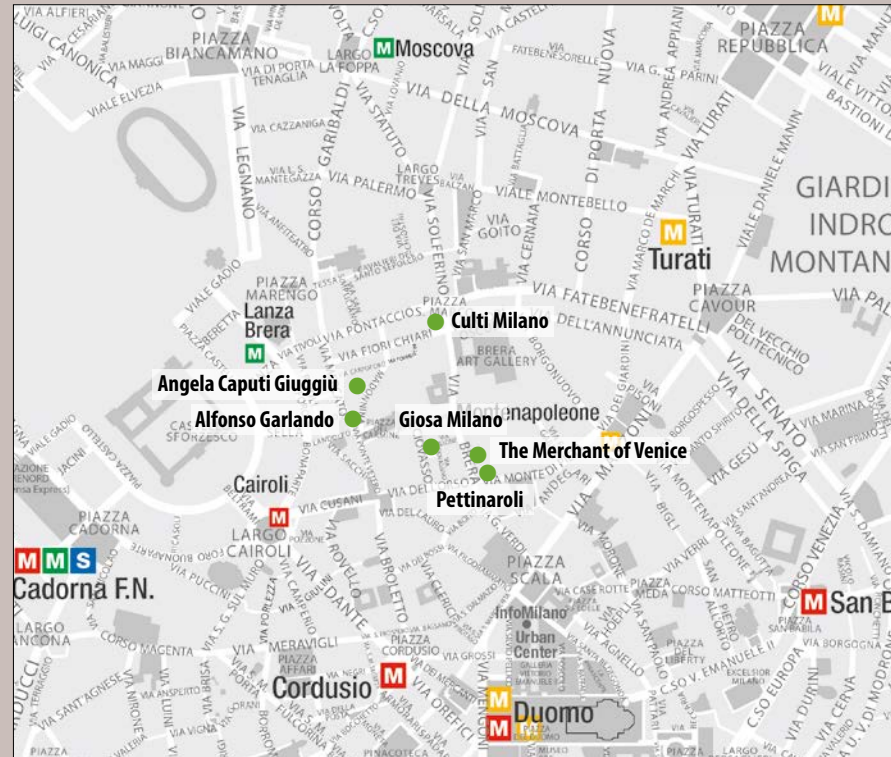




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BRERA DISTRICT

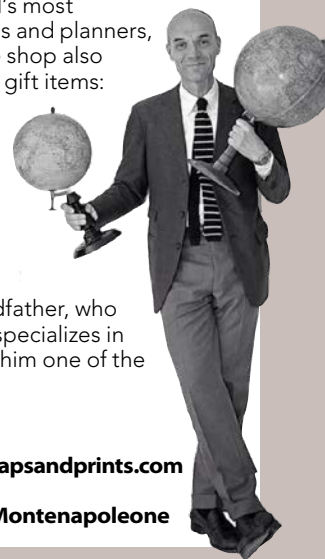

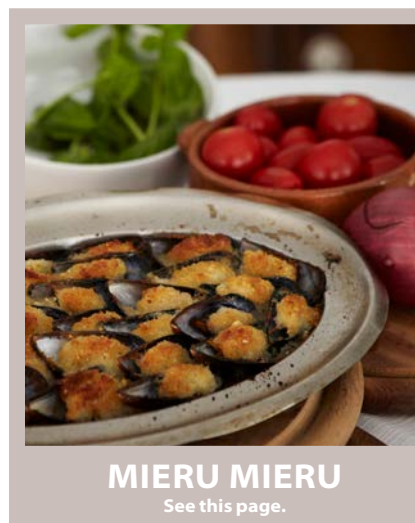

The world of Leonardo in the Galleria

The multi-media exhibition Leonardo3-Il Mondo di Leonardo is celebrating its fifth anniversary with the presentation of five new world premiere exhibits. By **Giulia Minero**

Located in the spaces of the Sala del Re, in the heart of the Galleria Vittorio Emanuele, multi-media exhibition Leonardo3 will be extending its scope with the addition of new exhibits and interactive devices. To mark the **fifth anniversary of the opening** of the exhibition which is aiming to become a real museum – the Leonardo3 study centre has unearthed several of **Leonardo da Vinci's projects** which have been studied for years but have never actually been recreated. A new gallery now hosts a series of machines illustrating the foundry processes, winches and structures that were designed for the creation of Leonardo da Vinci's horse; a **towering equestrian statue** commissioned by Ludovico Sforza in the 1490s, whose complete reconstruction (a world premiere) can now be viewed by the public. In addition to the latter, a section dedicated to cultural entertainment has enhanced the

exhibition. In a new room, especially set up for the purpose, four sketches of Leonardo's **'Grotesque Heads'** come to life (see photo at right), thanks to the use of modeling techniques and 3D animation, and offer visitors a unique **interactive experience**. The Leonardo3 exhibition also shows the avant-garde technology of Leonardo's military engineering studies in the first-ever creation of the **Triple Tier Machine Gun** equipped with a mechanism designed to hit a moving target at almost the same speed as a modern machine gun. The quest to highlight the maestro's longstanding activity as a set designer has resulted in a reproduction of his **'Ocel della Comedia'** (A Bird for a Comedy), a special model of a mechanical bird that was designed to fly across the stage and flap its wings via a mechanism that was activated as it descended down a cable. The exhibition's **collection of musical instruments**

has also been revamped. The focus is now on a single thematic nucleus that has been enhanced with a fully functional **giant trumpet**.

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MONZA

The beauty of its 14th century Torre dell'Arengario, its **glam shopping streets** and its Gothic-style Duomo, featuring marvellous frescoes depicting the life of Queen Theodelinda, make the centre of Monza (20 km from Milan) well worth a visit. However, Monza's **real jewel** in the crown is its famous **Villa Reale**, a magnificent 18th century dwelling designed by Francesco Piermarini, the architect who also designed the La Scala Opera House in Milan. Don't miss Italy's annual **Formula 1 Grand Prix** held in September at the racetrack lying behind its park. www.villarealedimonza.it

LAKES OF LOMBARDY

Each year the lakes of Lombardy attract millions of visitors thanks to their mild climate, breathtaking scenery, natural beauties and

historic and artistic treasures. The shores of **Lake Maggiore** (90 km from Milan) wash up on the banks of Piedmont and Lombardy, while its northern basin lies in the mountainous region of Switzerland. The most famous island is Isola Bella, anchored like a fantastic ship-garden and dominated by the majestic **Palazzo Borromeo** (www.isoleborromeo.it). **Lake Como** must-visits include the Gothic Duomo, the Romanesque basilicas of San Fedele and Sant'Abbondio, the neoclassical Villa Olmo and, in Cernobbio, the deluxe Villa d'Este and Villa Erba (75 km from Milan). VENICE

The major attractions of Venice (275 km from Milan), such as the awe-inspiring **Basilica of**

St. Mark, the Bell Tower and Palazzo Ducale, are all situated just nearby **St. Mark's Square**. Just a few steps from the square, well worth a visit are the historic **Teatro della Fenice** and, burdened with legend, the Bridge of Sighs, one of Venice's most characteristic bridges together with the **Ponte Rialto**. In terms of uniqueness, Venice tops all other cities with its canals – which can be navigated aboard one of the city's famous gondolas – and **Murano, Torcello** and **Burano**, three charming, small islands rich in history and tradition.

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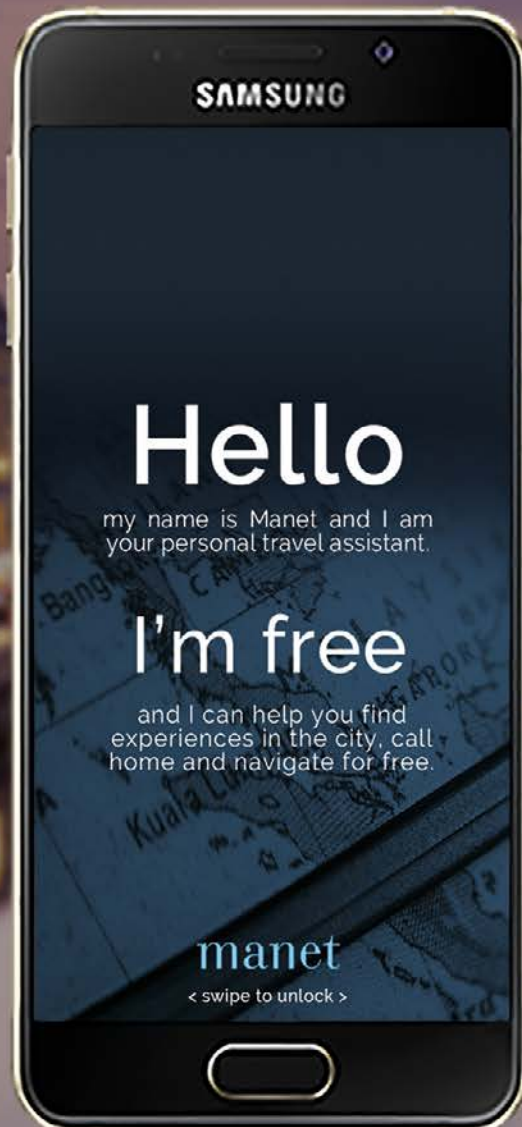
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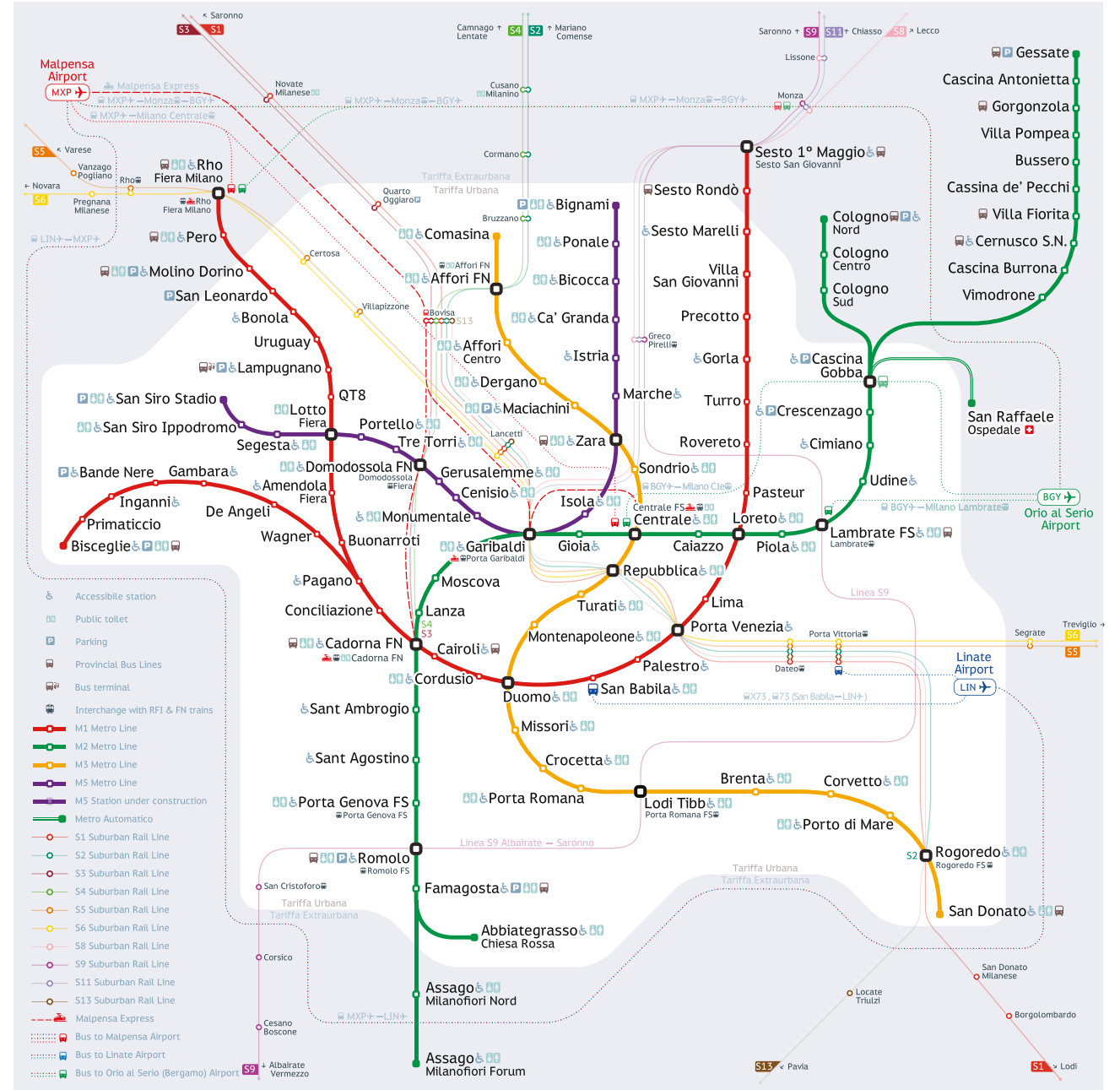

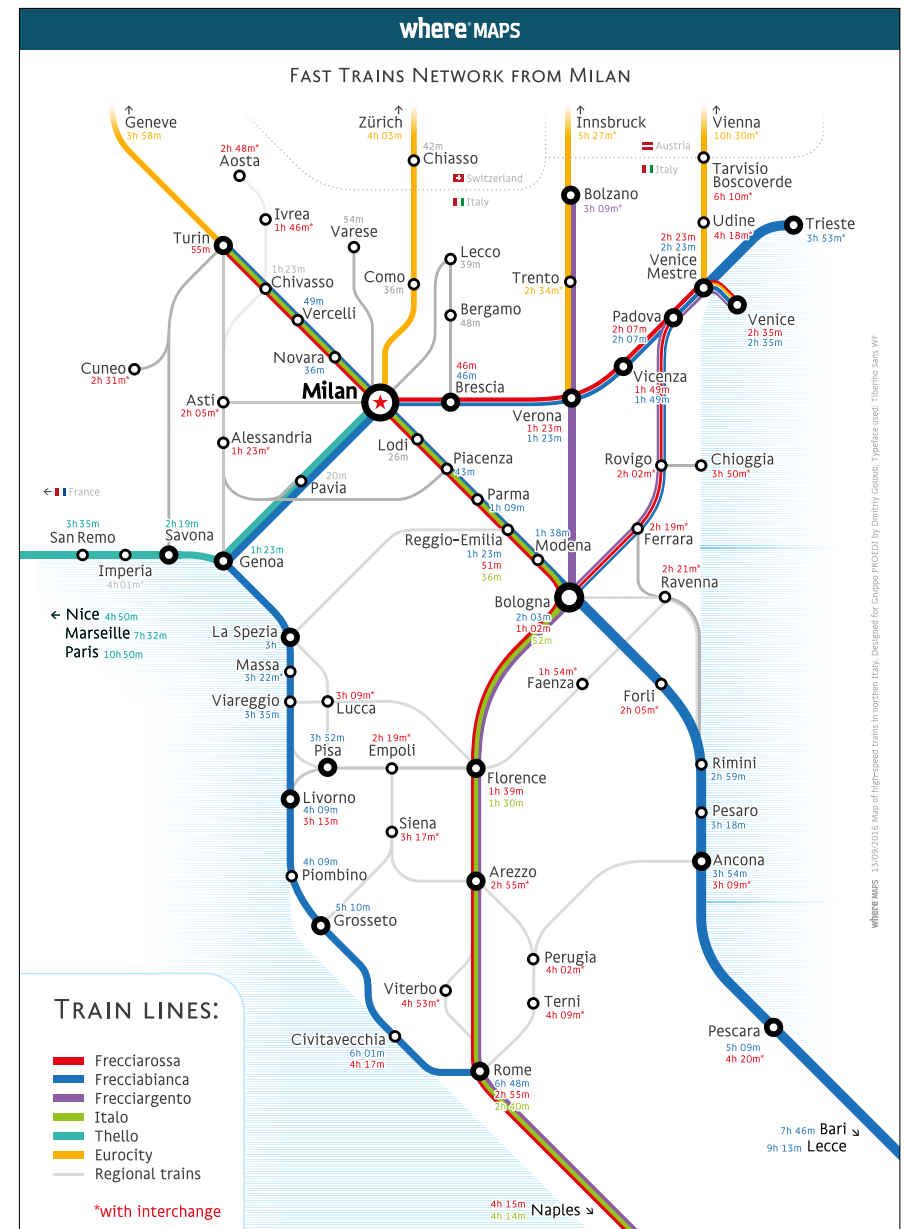
