» FOCUS The Sweet Side of Milan

Chocolate is an irresistible temptation which it is hard to resist. To enjoy it in all of its different shapes and varieties, below, you will find a brief overview of the best places to buy chocolate in the city, from the most historic venues to the more innovative, unusual ones.

FROM HISTORIC ADDRESSES ...

In Milan, the famous school of Belgium chocolate, boasts one of its most famous brands: Neuhaus (via San Vittore 6, Map D5). The shop is a small treasure trove where pralines – more than 100 varieties that arrive fresh, each week, from Belgium - are displayed in cases like precious jewels, alongside bars with dried fruits, characteristic letters of the alphabet and greeting cards, all made exclusively from chocolate! A reference point in the "Quadrilatero della Moda", Pasticceria Cova (via Montenapoleone 8, Map G4) has been titillating the taste buds of the Milanese with its specialities since 1817. It is almost impossible not to stop in front of its sparkling window displays showcasing

gourmand delights for all occasions.

When talking about confectionery, one

instantly thinks of Marchesi which, since 1824,

has been dedicating itself to producing the most delectable sweet treats, specializing in chocolate and offering an astute selection of premium-quality cocoas. (via S. Maria alla Porta 11/a, Map E4).

A famous name of Piedmont tradition is Venchi (via Mengoni 1 corner of via Tommaso Grossi, Map F4) which turns out more than 250 products, including classic chocolate cakes, truffle cigars, traditional chocolates and jars of "Chocaviar" – extra-bitter 90 per cent cocoa granules right up to chocolate butter for cooking purposes. In via Montello 25 (Map E2) Cabosse is the Milanese outpost of worldrenowned "Cioccolato di BruCo", an historic artisanal company located in the province of Ancona. A destination of distinction for lovers of unique delicacies including white figs covered in dark chocolate, classic dragées, spreadable gianduja cream and chocolate bars.

Finally, don't miss a visit to **Peck** in via Spadari (Map F5), the ultimate haven of taste for more than 120 years where you can find several of the most sought-after gastronomic products, including pralines, truffles, spreadable creams and chocolates of all shapes and sizes. Take their beautifully wrapped parcels of biscuits and chocolates home as a gift.





Milan's Hangar Bicocca is the place to go if you want to get tangled up in three levels of thin, clear film hanging 20 metres off the ground, transporting visitors into a new dimension. This incredible installation called "On Space Time Foam" is the brainchild of Argentinian artist, Tomás Saraceno and is scheduled to run at Hangar Bicocca until 3 February. This 1,200 square metre construction will make visitors lose their spatial coordination, leaving them scrambling between the floor and the ceiling known as "earth" and "sky" and giving them the feeling of walking on air. www.hangarbicocca.org

Open-air markets are an excellent opportunity not only to make purchases but also to acquaint visitors with the folklore of the city or indulge in VIP watching. For this reason, we have listed them here rather than under "Shopping". All details are correct at the time of going to press but times can, and do, change. Aperitivo & Nightlife

Each month PR Manager Gaetano Lopez will give readers of Where Milan suggestions to discover the city by night. Ending with a tip: to help you make the most of what's new on the nightlife scene and to book that special evening... ask your Concierge!

Milan is the home of the Aperitivo

and it is most definitely a ritual which no Milanese is prepared to forego. Favourite beverages consumed during this beloved tradition include the city's renowned Martini, Prosecco or Campari, accompanied by an all-you-can-eat buffet. A myriad of venues, ranging from the smallest bars to larger, uberchic locations situated in the heart of the city, organize this event. There are 3 types of venues: **design bars** (Just Cavalli, Armani, Dolce&Gabbana Gold, II Gattopardo Café), traditional bars (the places that have written Milan's history including Bar Zucca and Caffè Biffi in Galleria Vittorio Emanuele, Cova in via Montenapoleone and Bar Magenta for a younger crowd); and, the latest trend, all luxury hotel bars.

In fact, during aperitivo hour, people start thinking about where to go for **dinner**, in a city boasting a highly eclectic offer. There are three main areas dedicated to nighttime entertainment featuring a concentration of venues:

• Navigli District: an area characterized by places offering live music, patronized by artists, models, musicians and university students. Must-try options are its boat bars and the area's old osterie where you can sample an array of wines, cold cuts and typical cheeses.

• Brera District: an historic area boasting a warren of characteristic venues offering live music and, believe it or not, fortunetellers who are happy to predict your future for a small fee.

• Garibaldi District & Corso Como: this is Milan's most fashionable area by night, where, not only will you find a bevy of pizzerie, restaurants, pubs and discotheques, but also possibly chance upon showbiz celebs and sports heroes.

San Siro, **Temple of Football**

Named after the famous Milanese footballer Giuseppe Meazza, the **Giuseppe Meazza** Stadium (San Siro) is the largest stadium in Italy and the third in Europe. All seats are covered in this three-tiered structure which has a capacity of 80,074 and is the home stadium of two of the three most successful Italian Football League clubs: A.C. Milan and F.C. Internazionale (Inter). It also has a gift shop (T: 02 4046430) and a **museum** (T: 02 4042432) displaying all kinds of historic items from both Milan's and Inter's past: old jerseys, photos, boots, tickets and a fabulous trophy case. DUOMO CATHEDRAL—Among one of the most important (and majestic) Gothic buildings in the world, the church, constructed on and off over a period of 450 years (begun 1386) is the symbol of Milan. Built in the shape of a Latin cross, the cathedral is divided by soaring pillars into five naves, the largest of which measures 45 metres in height. It has 135 spires and its inside columns measure 3 and a half metres in diameter. To experience the Duomo at its most majestic you must ascend to the roof (either by elevator or by steps) where you will be surrounded by an outburst of pinnacles, turrets and marble statuary and, naturally, the city's famed golden Madonnina.
