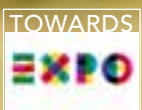

Have you always dreamt about visiting a museum and having real-time access to all the information about the works displayed? Well, from today, this is possible and, what's more, free of charge, thanks to Where Milan and Milano Loves You!

Milan's **Pinacoteca Ambrosiana** (www.ambrosiana.eu) is the first Italian museum to use NFC (Near Field Communication) to involve users and visitors. Thanks to NFC technology which provides short range wireless connectivity, thereby enabling the almost real-time exchange of any type of file, the Pinacoteca Ambrosiana and the Bramante Sacristy at S. Maria delle Grazie will be offering an even richer and more interactive tour format: by simply holding the Samsung Galaxy S III smartphone to the works of art that interest you most, you can view all the information related to that particular painting. On arrival, the Smartphone can be collected free-of-charge from the ticket office simply by presenting this month's copy of Where Milan. Furthermore, always via NFC, you will be offered additional options including, for example, that of purchasing prints of the works themselves which can be collected directly from the Pinacoteca's store at the end of your visit.

Get an insider's view of Milan with your Milano Loves You Passport

This is the last month to see **Leonardo 3**, the extraordinary exhibition dedicated to models of machinery invented by Leonardo da Vinci. A truly unmissable experience, the exhibition is hosted in Galleria Vittorio Emanuele II, between the Duomo and La Scala (see page 12).

However, in Milan, there is certainly no dirt of other marvels created by this genius who, some 500 years ago, spent most of his creative life in the city. Bearing this in mind, make sure not to miss a visit to the **Ambrosiana Art Gallery and Library**, situated just moments away from the Duomo and the centre of the old city, the capital of the Roman Empire for several centuries: the best way to gain insight into the richest collection in the world of Leonardo's works, starting from the **Codex Atlanticus** comprising 1,750 drawings on 1,119 pages. Although guided tours are available, for those of you who have limited time, by signing up for the "Guests of Milano Loves You" program and showing this month's issue of Where Milan at the ticket office, you will be entitled to rent a next generation NFC-enabled smartphone featuring a multimedia guide to the main masterpieces (see page 1).

Naturally, a trip to Milan would not be complete without a visit to **The Last Supper**, whose tickets, subject to a fixed quota in a bid to preserve this masterpiece for future generations, are available either from the **Zani Viaggi** travel agency in Foro Bonaparte, 76 or from your concierge.

Finally, the most environmentally-friendly way to visit the Leonardo venues is the **new Leonardo Tour by Segway** (www.segwaytourmilan.com), a 4-hour tour, with specialized English and French-speaking guides, including the Sala delle Asse at Castello Sforzesco, Santa Maria delle Grazie, the statue of Leonardo in piazza della Scala and via San Marco with the "Chiuse di Leonardo" ("Leonardo's Locks"). Discover the top in town

— The Last Supper by Leonardo da Vinci

One of the most famous attractions in the world, "L'Ultima Cena" or "Cenacolo" by Leonardo da Vinci is a large 15th century mural painting representing the scene of the last supper of Jesus narrated in the Gospel. It can be found in the church of Santa Maria delle Grazie. Booking required: ask your concierge. www.cenacolovinciano.net

— Duomo, the symbol of Milan

Among one of the most important (and majestic) Gothic buildings in the world, the Duomo, constructed on and off over a period of 450 years (begun 1386) is the symbol of Milan. To experience it at its most majestic you must ascend to the roof (either by elevator or by steps) where you will be surrounded by an outburst of pinnacles, turrets and marble statuary and, naturally, the city's famed golden Madonnina. The cathedral is open daily 8.30am-6.45pm. Admission free. www.duomomilano.it. Piazza Duomo. M1-M3 Duomo.

— "Il Castello"

The ancient seat of the ruling Visconti, the Castello Sforzesco was later rebuilt by Francesco Sforza and is now simply known by the Milanese as "Il Castello". Demolished and reconstructed several times from 1300 onwards, it has served as the backdrop for numerous historic events. Today, it houses a number of interesting museums and libraries. Its park is a favourite with old and young alike. Open daily 7am-6pm. Free admission. M1-M2 Cadorna FN; M1 Cairoli; M2 Lanza.

— Galleria, the "living room" of the Milanese

Sometimes known as "the living-room of the Milanese", Galleria Vittorio Emanuele II with its elegant, four-storey arcade, housing luxury cafés and famous designer shops, is covered by a glass barrel vault and a beautiful glass cupola and measures 196 metres in length. Tradition has it that placing your right heel on the bull, depicted in the mosaic on the floor, and then spinning around inside it, will bring good luck. Piazza Duomo-Piazza della Scala. — The Opera house

The world's premier opera house, built at the behest of Empress Maria Teresa of Austria and designed by Piermarini, the Teatro alla Scala was inaugurated in 1778 with an opera by Antonio Salieri. www.teatroallascala.org. Piazza della Scala. M1-M3 Duomo; M3 Montenapoleone.

— Ambrosiana, all about Leonardo

The Ambrosiana picture gallery contains several exquisite works of art from the 15th through 17th centuries and includes "The musician", attributed to Leonardo, Raphael's cartoon for the "School of Athens" fresco and Caravaggio's "Basket of fruit". The Ambrosiana library will be exhibiting Leonardo's entire Codex Atlanticus until 2015, 44 or 45 pages at a time for three months at a stretch – the longest the international archival norms will allow such documents to be exposed to light. www.ambrosiana.it. Piazza Pio XI, 2. M1-M3 Duomo, M1 Cordusio.

— 20th Century art

One of the youngest museums in the city, lying adjacent to the Duomo, the Museo del Novecento hosts more than 400 20th century masterpieces of Italian and international art – ranging from Fontana to Picasso – at the recently refurbished Palazzo dell'Arengario. A building where works of art interact with the city, engaging with the past while looking towards the future. www.museodelnovecento.org. Piazza Duomo. M1-M3 Duomo.

— Masterpieces of science and technology

Found in a 16th century monastery, the Museo Nazionale della Scienza e della Tecnologia Leonardo da Vinci is one of the most important museums of science and technology in the world. Its collections, featuring cars, aircraft, ships, scooters, trains, reconstructions of ancient workshops for metalworking, explore the relationship between men and machines starting from Leonardo da Vinci. Milan** and **F.C. Internazionale (Inter)**. It also has a gift shop (T: 02 4046430) and a **museum** (T: 02 4042432) displaying all kinds of historic items from both Milan's and Inter's past: old jerseys, photos, boots, tickets and a fabulous trophy case. However, even better than the museum is the **guided stadium tour** which gives you a chance to sit in VIP seats and visit each of the home teams' locker rooms. Each month PR Manager Gaetano Lopez will give readers of Where Milan suggestions to discover the city by night. Ending with a tip: to help you make the most of what's new on the nightlife scene and to book that special evening... ask your Concierge!

Milan is the home of the Aperitivo and it is most definitely a ritual which no Milanese is prepared to forego. Favourite beverages consumed during this beloved tradition include the city's renowned Martini, Prosecco or Campari, accompanied by an all-you-can-eat buffet. A myriad of venues, ranging from the smallest bars to larger, uber-chic locations situated in the heart of the city, organize this event. There are 3 types of venues: **design bars** (Just Cavalli, Armani, Dolce&Gabbana Gold, Il Gattopardo Café), **traditional bars** (the places that have written Milan's history including Bar Zucca and Caffè Biffi in Galleria Vittorio Emanuele, Cova in via Montenapoleone and Bar Magenta for a younger crowd); and, the latest trend, all **luxury hotel bars**.

In fact, during aperitivo hour, people start thinking about where to go for dinner, in a city boasting a highly eclectic offer. There are three main areas dedicated to nighttime entertainment featuring a concentration of venues:

- **Navigli District:** an area characterized by places offering live music, patronized by artists, models, musicians and university students. Must-try options are its boat bars and the area's old osterie where you can sample an array of wines, cold cuts and typical cheeses.
- **Brera District:** an historic area boasting a warren of characteristic venues offering live music and, believe it or not, fortune-tellers who are happy to predict your future for a small fee....
- **Garibaldi District & Corso Como:** this is Milan's most fashionable area by night, where, not only will you find a bevy of pizzerie, restaurants, pubs and discotheques, but also possibly chance upon showbiz celebs and sports heroes.

The most exclusive Clubs. First and foremost, **Armani Privé** in the Montenapoleone area, where you can club 'til dawn amidst VIPs, business magnates and Milanese jet-setters. And, then again, **Just Cavalli Restaurant & Club**, set against the backdrop of Parco Sempione, recently elected "The Best Club in The World" in Monte Carlo,

featuring ultra-exclusive parties and international stars hailing from all parts of the globe. Also worth a visit is the highly unusual **Gattopardo Club**, a deconsecrated church often used for film shoots.

Another of my favourites is the recently opened, ultra-trendy **Club Byblos** which is already becoming a cult venue. And, finally landmark club, **Hollywood** (Corso Como), which stays open until the wee hours of the morning.

Monuments & Places of Interest

DUOMO CATHEDRAL—Among one of the most important (and majestic) Gothic buildings in the world, the church, constructed on and off over a period of 450 years (begun 1386) is the symbol of Milan. Built in the shape of a Latin cross, the cathedral is divided by soaring pillars into five naves, the largest of which measures 45 metres in height. It has 135 spires and its inside columns measure 3 and a half metres in diameter. To experience the Duomo at its most majestic you must ascend to the roof (either by elevator or by steps) where you will be surrounded by an outburst of pinnacles, turrets and marble statuary and, naturally, the city’s famed golden Madonnina. BRERA—Home, since 1776, to an important Academy of Fine Arts, this is an artsy neighbourhood which really comes to life at night. The Church of San Lorenzo in Monluè

Built in 1267, it features an imposing square-shaped bell tower, embellished by cornices and suspended arches. Its interior boasts a single nave dominated by a 16th century coffered ceiling ending in a rectangular apse based on Cistercian models. In summer, its rural courtyard is used as a setting for concerts and shows. Just near the River Lambro, the hamlet is surrounded by a park of fields and woods traversed by cycling tracks and pedestrian paths.

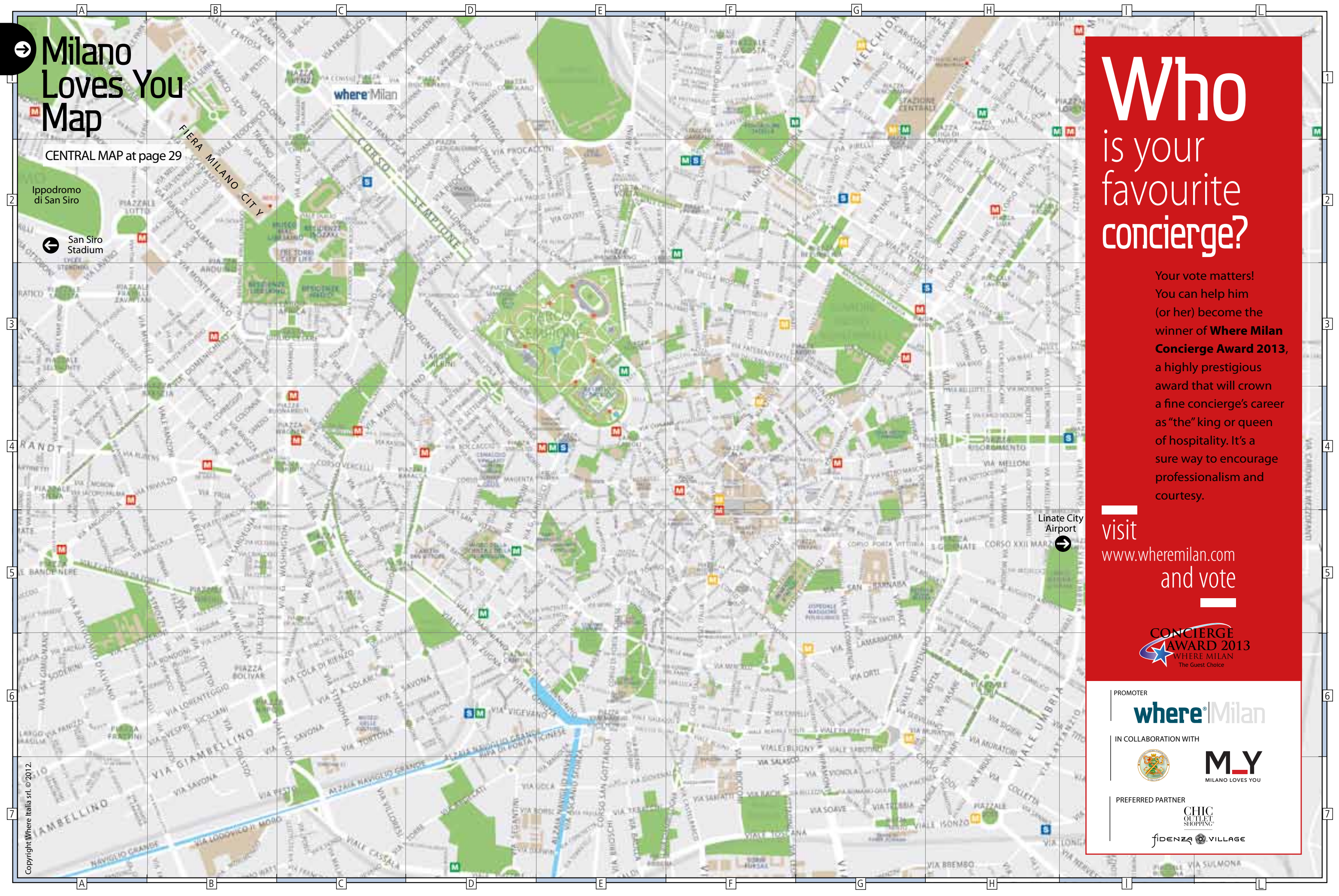
