

The month's top entertainment, dining and arts



At the end of the 15th century, the Tuscan genius created spectacular projects of art, architecture and military techniques in Milan. The new exhibition "Leonardo 3" is an opportunity to gain insight into never-seen-before inventions and to rediscover masterpieces that are famed throughout the world

MASTERPIECES OF ART AND TECHNOLOGY

During the years in which Leonardo da Vinci lived in Milan, between 1482 and 1499, the maestro created masterpieces of art like the Last Supper at the Church of Santa Maria delle Grazie, currently a UNESCO world heritage site (Map D4), or the innovative vegetablepatterned decoration on the vault of the Sala delle Asse at the Castello Sforzesco (Map E3-E4). An artist and an engineer, during his time in Milan, Leonardo found fertile ground for his dual genius: in fact, not only did he study the **Navigli**, the sophisticated system of navigable canals that made Milan a real "city of water" but also developed projects for machinery and civil and military architectural works (see listings page 57: Cenacolo, Castello Sforzesco, Navigli). Ludovico il Moro commissioned Leonardo to design an enormous equestrian sculpture as part of a monument. A clay model of a horse which was to be used as part of the design was completed in 1492 - but the statue was never built. In 1999 the horse alone was cast from Leonardo's original designs in bronze and placed in Milan outside the racetrack of Ippodromo

While following in the footsteps of Leonardo, make sure to visit the Museo della Scienza e della Tecnologia Leonardo da Vinci, one of the largest of its kind in Europe, featuring a magnificent collection of reconstructions of machinery designed by Leonardo in the Galleria di Leonardo (www.museoscienza.org, M2 Sant'Ambrogio. Map D5).

INTERACTIVE EXHIBITION LEONARDO 3


On 1 March, "Leonardo3 - Il Mondo di Leonardo", an interactive exhibition sponsored by AVIVA will open in the Sale del Re of Galleria Vittorio Emanuele II and will bring visitors closer to understanding the real workshop of Leonardo: his mind. More than 200 interactive models of Leonardo's machinery, featuring several world premieres including his Mechanical Submarine, his Time Machine and his Flying Machine of Milan as well as a number of avant-garde interactive multi-media experiences. Thanks to state-of-the art touch screens visitors can "turn the pages" of digital reproductions of the maestro's manuscripts, including the complete edition of the famous Codex Atlanticus, housed in the Biblioteca Ambrosiana (see pages 10 and 56) as well as tapping into fully interactive 3D experiences such as "Leonardo a Milano" and "Il Monumento Sforza", dedicated to the equestrian monument project. Also well worth a visit are the digital restorations of the Last Supper and the Mona Lisa.

Fashion Tips

Milan's extraordinary textile heritage is currently being showcased at **Palazzo Morando** with a collection of precious garments and accessories from Castello Sforzesco's Applied Arts Collection. The first floor of the 18th century palazzo hosts two permanent exhibitions: the Pinacoteca featuring a collection of sculptures and works on paper as well as an exhibition, housed in the reception rooms of this noble dwelling, testifying to urban and social development in Milan between the second half of the 17th century and the end of the 19th century. The first floor is used as a space for temporary exhibitions, events and meetings.

Monuments & Places of Interest

DUOMO CATHEDRAL—Among one of the most important (and majestic) Gothic buildings in the world, the church, constructed on and off over a period of 450 years (begun 1386) is the symbol of Milan. Built in the shape of a Latin cross, the cathedral is divided by soaring pillars into five naves, the largest of which measures 45 metres in height. It has 135 spires and its inside columns measure 3 and a half metres in diameter. To experience the Duomo at its most maiestic you must ascend to the roof (either by elevator or by steps) where you will be surrounded by an outburst of pinnacles, turrets and marble statuary and, naturally, the city's famed golden Madonnina. 


