The Art of "Made-to-Measure"

Milan is not only the capital of fashion but also of style and the most time-honoured sartorial traditions. Below are a pick of must-visit places where gentlemen in the know can get suited and booted!

A Bespoke Outfit for an Impeccable Style

Larusmiani boasts a tradition handed down from generation to generation. Originally established as a small atelier in the heart of Milan in 1922, it focuses on immaculate tailoring rigorously handcrafted by experts who focus on precision of cut and details to achieve the apex of craftsmanship and luxury. The result is an authentic product that gradually takes shape, detail after detail and which, today, as then, remains faithful to the purest diktats of "Made-in-Italy" fashion (Via Montenapoleone 7).

—The Last Supper by Leonardo da Vinci

One of the most famous attractions in the world, "L'Ultima Cena" or "Cenacolo" by **Leonardo da Vinci** is a large 15th century mural painting representing the scene of the last supper of Jesus narrated in the Gospel. It can be found in the church of Santa Maria delle Grazie. Booking required: ask your concierge. www.cenacolovinciano.net. Piazza Santa Maria delle Grazie, 2. M1 Conciliazione.

—Duomo, the symbol of Milan

Among one of the most important (and majestic) Gothic buildings in the world, the **Duomo**, constructed on and off over a period of 450 years (begun 1386) is the symbol of Milan. To experience it at its most majestic you must ascend to the roof (either by elevator or by steps) where you will be surrounded by an outburst of pinnacles, turrets and marble statuary and, naturally, the city's famed golden Madonnina. The cathedral is open daily 8.30am-6.45pm. Admission free. www.duomomilano.it. Piazza Duomo. M1-M3 Duomo.

—"Il Castello"

The ancient seat of the ruling Visconti, the **Castello Sforzesco** was later rebuilt by Francesco Sforza and is now simply known by the Milanese as "Il Castello". Demolished and reconstructed several times from 1300 onwards, it has served as the backdrop for numerous historic events. Today, it houses a number of interesting museums and libraries. —Galleria, the "living room" of the Milanese

Sometimes known as "the living-room of the Milanese", **Galleria Vittorio Emanuele II** with its elegant, four-storey arcade, housing luxury cafés and famous designer shops, is covered by a glass barrel vault and a beautiful glass cupola and measures 196 metres in length. Tradition has it that placing your right heel on the bull, depicted in the mosaic on the floor, and then spinning around inside it, will bring good luck. Piazza Duomo-Piazza della Scala. —The Opera house

The world's premier opera house, built at the behest of Empress Maria Teresa of Austria and designed by Piermarini, the **Teatro alla Scala** was inaugurated in 1778 with an opera by Antonio Salieri. www.teatroallascala.org. Piazza della Scala. M1-M3 Duomo; M3 Montenapoleone.

—Ambrosiana, all about Leonardo

The **Ambrosiana picture gallery** contains several exquisite works of art from the 15th through 17th centuries and includes "The musician", attributed to Leonardo, Raphael's cartoon for the "School of Athens" fresco and Caravaggio's "Basket of fruit". The **Ambrosiana library** will be exhibiting Leonardo's entire **Codex Atlanticus** until 2015, 44 or 45 pages at a time for three months at a stretch. www.ambrosiana.it. Piazza Pio XI, 2. —Science and technology

The **Museo Nazionale della Scienza e della Tecnologia Leonardo da Vinci** is one of the most important museums of science and technology in the world. —Milan's Street of Art

Following the opening of "Cantiere del '900", a new section of the Gallerie di Piazza Scala, Milan has been enriched by a new art circuit featuring the city's three main museum hubs: the **Pinacoteca di Brera**, the **Gallerie d'Italia** in piazza della Scala and the civic complex consisting of **Palazzo Reale** and the **Museo del Novecento**. 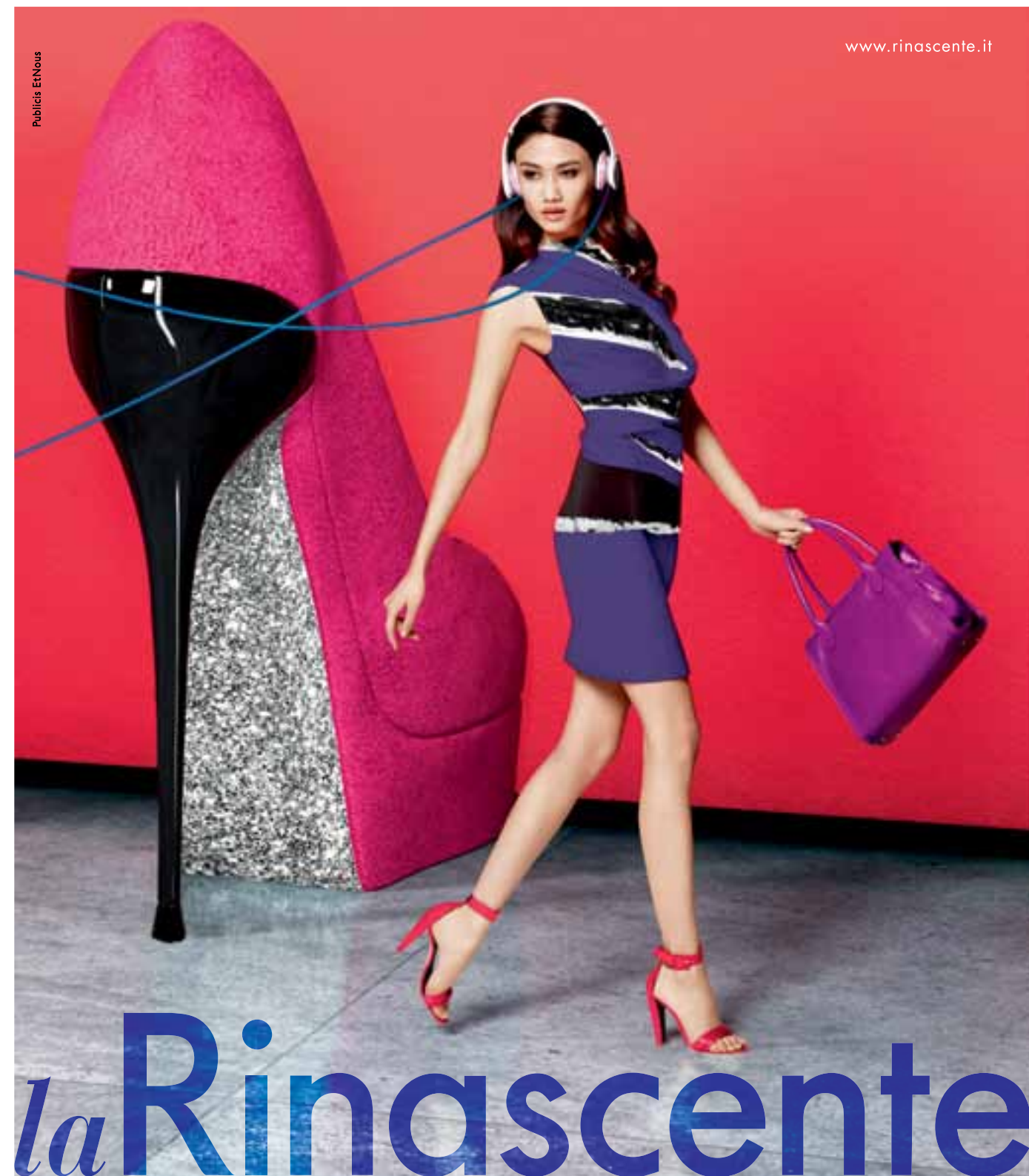

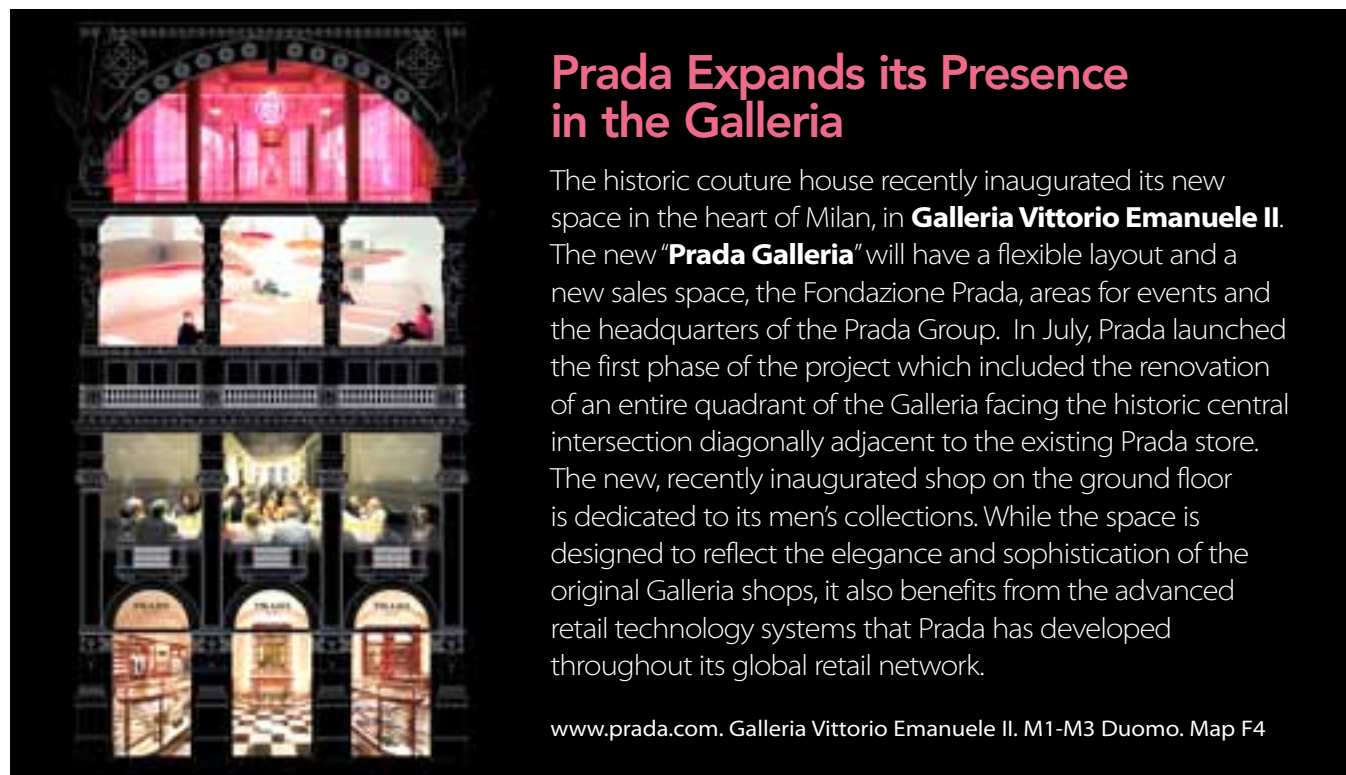

HOW TO REACH LUGANO

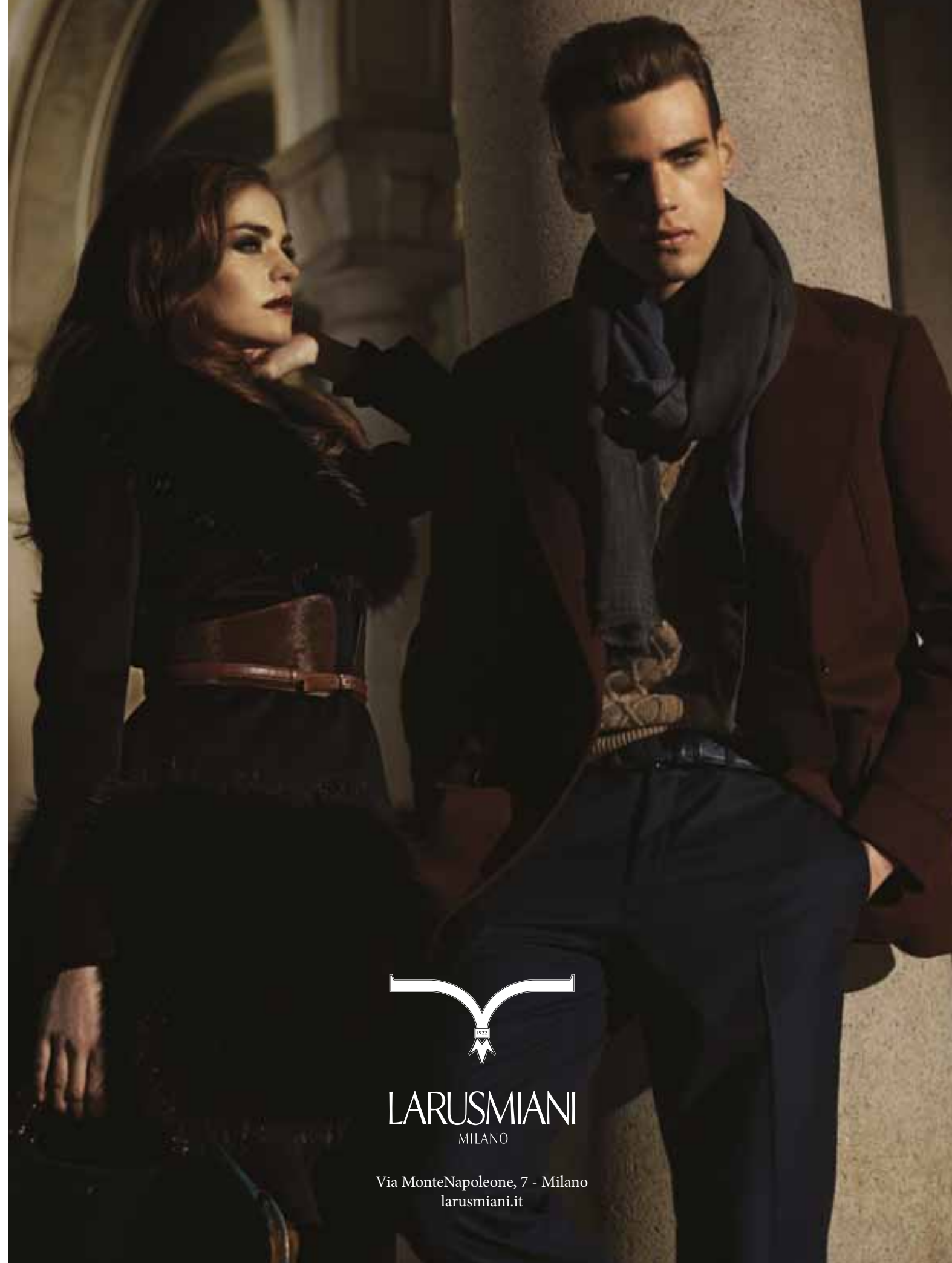

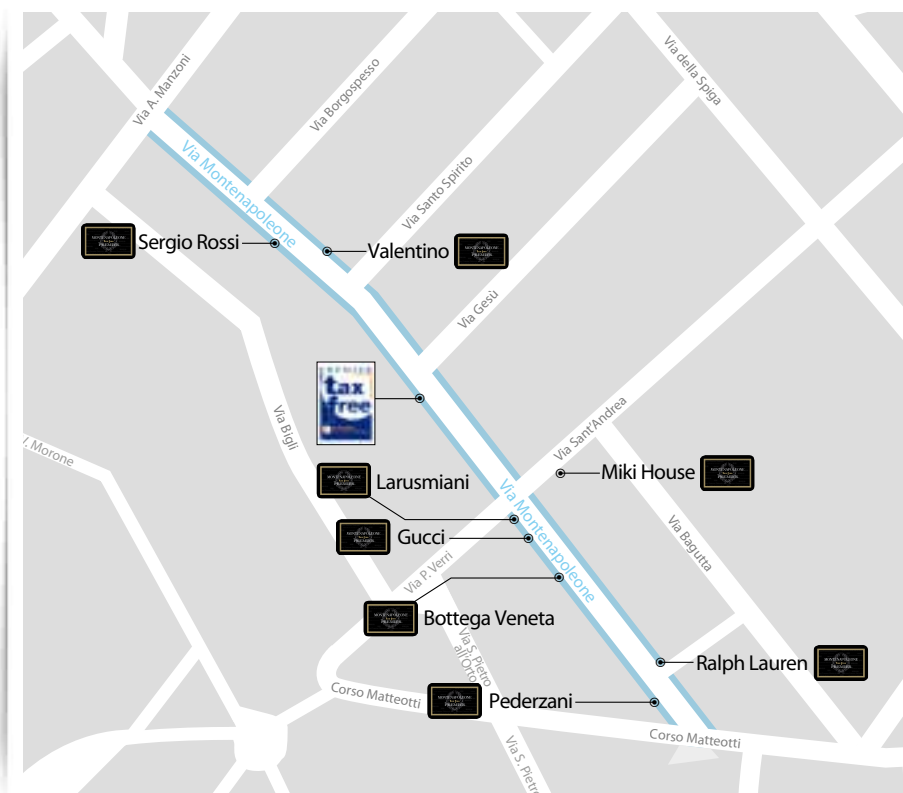

Named after the famous Milanese footballer Giuseppe Meazza, the **Giuseppe Meazza Stadium** (San Siro) is the largest stadium in Italy and the third in Europe. All seats are covered in this three-tiered structure which has a capacity of 79,341 and is the home stadium of two of the three most successful Italian Football League clubs: **A.C. Milan** and **F.C. Internazionale (Inter)**. It also has a **gift shop** (T: 02 4046430) and a museum (T: 02 4042432) displaying all kinds of historic items from both Milan's and Inter's past: old jerseys, photos, boots, tickets and a fabulous trophy case. However, even better than the **museum** is the guided stadium tour which gives you a chance to sit in VIP seats and visit each of the home teams' locker rooms. Milan is the home of the Aperitivo and it is most definitely a ritual which no Milanese is prepared to forego. Favourite beverages consumed during this beloved tradition include the city's renowned Martini, Prosecco or Campari, accompanied by an all-you-can-eat buffet. A myriad of venues, ranging from the smallest bars to larger, uber-chic locations situated in the heart of the city, organize this event.

There are 3 types of venues: **design bars** (Just Cavalli, Armani, Dolce&Gabbana Gold, Il Gattopardo Café), **traditional bars** (the places that have written Milan's history including Bar Zucca and Caffè Biffi in Galleria Vittorio Emanuele, Cova in via Montenapoleone and Bar Magenta for a younger crowd); and, the latest trend, all **luxury hotel bars**.

There are three main areas dedicated

to nighttime entertainment featuring a concentration of venues (see Map at pages 62-63):

- **Navigli District**: an area characterized by places offering live music, patronized by artists, models, musicians and university students. Must-try options are its boat bars and the area's old *osterie* where you can sample an array of wines, cold cuts and typical cheeses.
- **Brera District**: an historic area boasting a warren of characteristic venues offering live music and, believe it or not, fortune-tellers who are happy to predict your future for a small fee. ...
- **Garibaldi District & Corso Como**: this is Milan's most fashionable area by night, where, not only will you find a bevy of pizzerie, restaurants, pubs and discotheques, but also possibly chance upon showbiz celebs and sports heroes.

The most exclusive Clubs. First and foremost, **Armani Privé** in the Montenapoleone area, where you can club 'til dawn amidst VIPs, business magnates and Milanese jet-setters. And, then again, **Just Cavalli Restaurant & Club**, set against the backdrop of Parco Sempione, recently elected "The Best Club in The World" in Monte Carlo, featuring ultra-exclusive parties and international stars hailing from all parts of the globe. Also worth a visit is the highly unusual **Gattopardo Club**, a deconsecrated church often used for film shoots.

Another of my favourites is the recently opened, ultra-trendy **Club Byblos** which is already becoming a cult venue. And, finally landmark club, **Hollywood** (Corso Como), which stays open until the wee hours of the morning.

Monuments & Places of Interest

DUOMO CATHEDRAL—Among one of the most important (and majestic) Gothic buildings in the world, the church, constructed on and off over a period of 450 years (begun 1386) is the symbol of Milan. Built in the shape of a Latin cross, the cathedral is divided by soaring pillars into five naves, the largest of which measures 45 metres in height. It has 135 spires and its inside columns measure 3 and a half metres in diameter. To experience the Duomo at its most majestic you must ascend to the roof (either by elevator or by steps) where you will be surrounded by an outburst of pinnacles, turrets and marble statuary and, naturally, the city's famed golden Madonnina. BRERA—Home, since 1776, to an important Academy of Fine Arts, this is an artsy neighbourhood which really comes to life at night. In addition to several churches, the district also hosts a number of interesting galleries and

antique shops. One of the areas in the city is particularly known for its nightlife. Pubs, window displays, stalls and quaint fortune tellers meld with important places of culture. For museums in Brera, see "Entertainment" section. Via Brera and surrounding areas. M2 Lanza. Map F3

SCALA (LA)—The world's premier opera house, built at the behest of Empress Maria Teresa of Austria and designed by Piermarini, it was inaugurated in 1778 with an opera by Antonio Salieri. Museums

PINACOTECA AMBROSIANA—The Ambrosiana picture gallery contains several exquisite works of art from the 15th through 17th centuries and includes "The musician", attributed to Leonardo, Raphael's cartoon for the "School of Athens" fresco and Caravaggio's "Basket of fruit". The Ambrosiana will be exhibiting Leonardo's entire "Codice Atlantico" (Atlantic Codex) until 2015, 44 or 45 pages at a time for three months at a stretch – the longest the International archival norms will allow such documents to be exposed to light. Open Tues-Sun 9am-7pm. Admission fee €15, €10 for the adjacent Bramante Sacristy, €20 for group tickets.

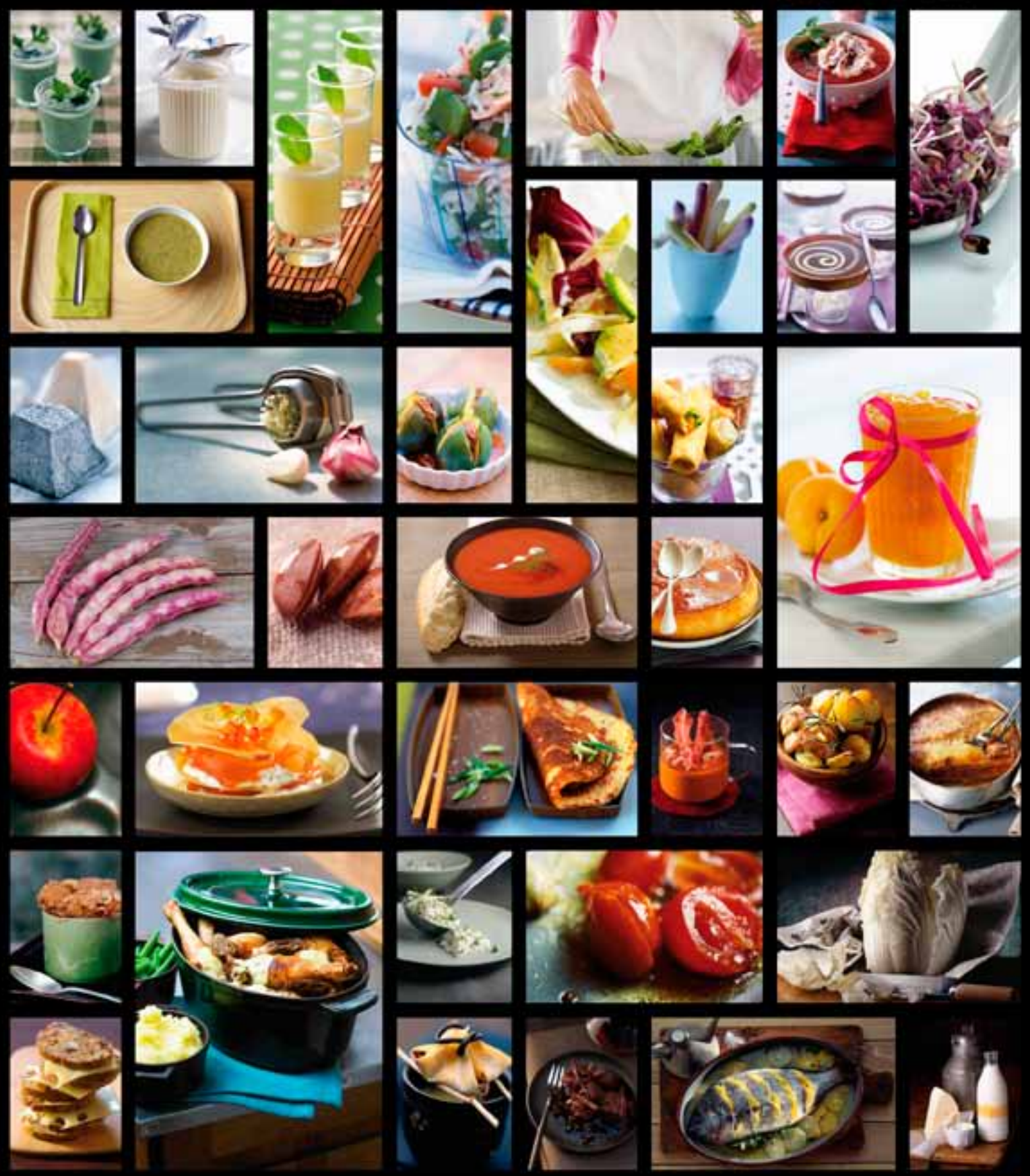
