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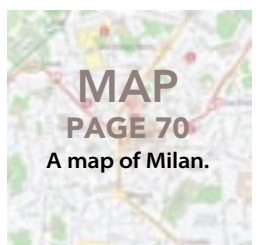

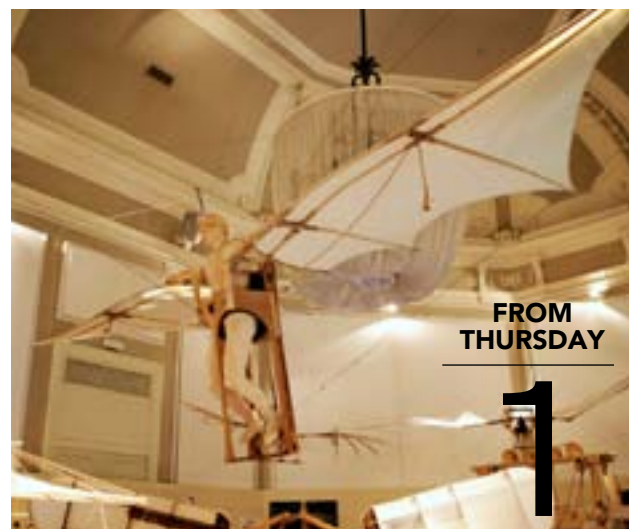

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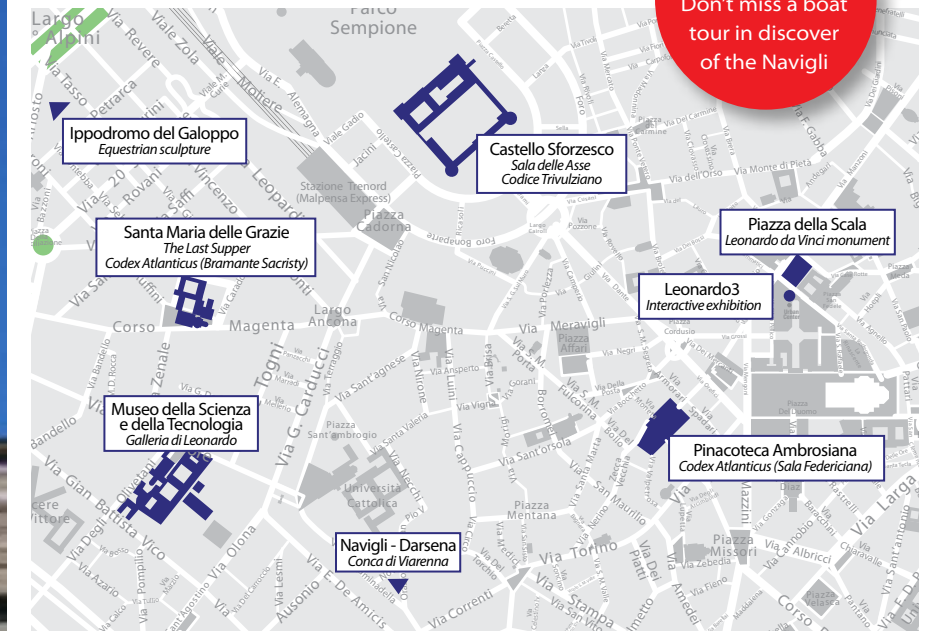

From the incomparable Last Supper to the precious pages of the Codex Atlanticus, an artistic itinerary that will take you back in time, through the streets of Milan, in discovery of the so-called "luoghi leonardeschi". An unmissable chance to follow the Leonardo trail and delve deeply into the ample examples left by painter, scientist, architect and Renaissance genius Leonardo da Vinci in this city so dear to his heart.

TRAVEL TIP!
Don't miss a boat tour in discover of the Navigli

A Latin inscription can also be read, granting a toll free passage to all boats from Lake Maggiore carrying marble for the building of the Duomo Cathedral (Via Conca del Naviglio M2 Sant'Agostino. Map E6-E6).

An overview of the ancient Navigli can be admired in the rooms of the **Museo del Naviglio**, in the neighbourhood of the Conca dell'Incoronata mentioned by Leonardo in his Codex Atlanticus (www.museodeinavigli.com, via S. Marco 40, M2 Moscova).

While following in the footsteps of Leonardo, make sure to visit the **Museo della Scienza e della Tecnologia Leonardo da Vinci**: found in a 16th century monastery, this is one of the most important museums of science and technology in the world. Its collections, featuring cars, aircraft, ships, scooters, trains, reconstructions of ancient workshops for metalworking, clock-making right through to electronics, textiles and astronomy, explore the relationship between men and machines starting from the ingenious inventions of Leonardo. Don't miss the magnificent reconstructions of machinery designed by the maestro in the "Galleria di Leonardo" (www.museoscienza.org, M2 Sant'Ambrogio. Map D5).

THE CITY'S TRIBUTES TO LEONARDO
Hosted inside the Castello Sforzesco, the **Trivulziana Library** can be accessed to examine incunabula and ancient documents from the 8th to the 18th century, parchments, records and prints. The library hosts the



Go Leonardo

The "Vitruvian Man" by Leonardo da Vinci (pen and ink on paper), exemplifies the blend of art and science during the Renaissance period and provides the perfect example of Leonardo's deep understanding of proportions.

At the end of the 15th century, the Tuscan genius created spectacular projects of art, architecture and military techniques in Milan. Don't miss a chance to rediscover masterpieces famed throughout the world.

MASTERPIECES OF ART

During the years in which Leonardo da Vinci lived in Milan, between 1482 and 1499, the maestro created masterpieces of art like the Last Supper or the innovative vegetable patterned decoration on the vault of the Sala delle Asse at the Castello Sforzesco (Map E3-E4).

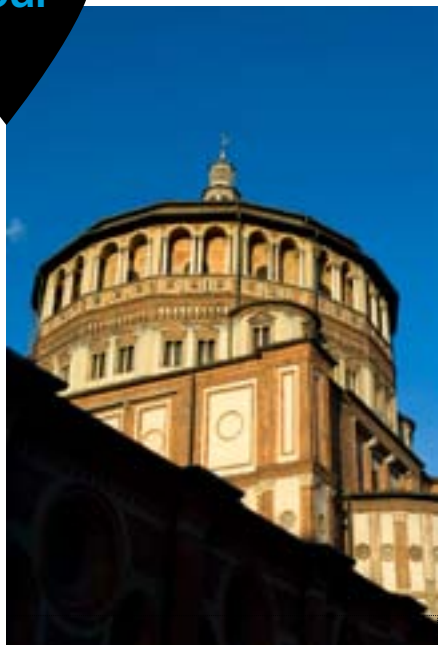
The Last Supper, initiated in 1494 and completed some two years later, is a large mural painting representing the scene of the last supper of Jesus narrated in the Gospel in the refectory of the Church of Santa Maria delle Grazie, currently a UNESCO world heritage site and one of the most famous attractions in the world. Leonardo created the painting using a special tempera that he himself had invented and which still, today, presents a challenge to the best restoration techniques. Unfortunately because of the medium used, the work began to deteriorate some twenty years after it was painted, and so over the years numerous restoration attempts have been made to restore and preserve it

WONDERS OF TECHNOLOGY

An artist and an engineer, during his time in Milan Leonardo found fertile ground for his dual genius: in fact, not only did he study the **Navigli** - the sophisticated system of navigable canals to ferry people and merchandise to Milan, to irrigate the fields and to defend the city - that made Milan a real "city of water", but also developed projects for machinery and civil and military architectural works (see the Codex Atlanticus box). The so-called "Conca di Viarenna" is what remains

today of one of the 5 canal locks used to navigate through Milan from the Darsena to the Naviglio Martesana, north of Milan. The basin of the Darsena, the old mercantile port of the city and a node of the vast fluvial system of Navigli canals now almost entirely covered, extends between viale Gabriele D'Annunzio and viale Gorizia (Map E6). Since the beginning of 2013, the area has been subjected to in-depth redevelopment work as the city gets ready to host Expo 2015. The Conca di Viarenna was closed to navigation and covered over in the '30s. At one end, a 1497 plaque displaying the coats of arms of the House of Sforza, commemorates the duke Ludovico il Moro and his wife Beatrice d'Este.

so-called "Codice Trivulziano", an autographic manuscript by Leonardo containing studies on military and religious architecture and a curious collection of real and imaginary portraits. A digital reproduction of the entire codex will enable visitors to leaf through the codex, page by page, magnifying the original up to 20 times.

› In 1484 Ludovico il Moro commissioned Leonardo to design an enormous **equestrian sculpture** as part of a monument. A clay model of a horse which was to be used as

part of the design was completed in 1492 but the statue was never built. In 1999 the horse alone was cast from Leonardo's original designs in bronze and placed in Milan outside the racetrack of Ippodromo del Galoppo (Via Ippodromo, 10, www.ippodromimilano.it. Map A2).

› **Piazza della Scala**, the elegant square surrounded by important palaces such as Teatro alla Scala, one of the greatest opera houses in the world, Palazzo Marino (Milan City Hall) and the Gallerie d'Italia art museum, hosts the Leonardo da Vinci monument by Pietro Magni, 1872 (See page 8, Piazza della Scala. M1-M3 Duomo; M3 Montenapoleone. Map F4).

Leonardo3, "the" interactive exhibition



"Leonardo3 - Il Mondo di Leonardo" at the Sala del Re in Galleria Vittorio Emanuele II hosts more than 200 interactive models of Leonardo's machinery, featuring several world

premieres including the *Macchina volante di Milano*, the *Grande Nibbio*, the *Clavi-Viola*, an innovative musical instrument, the first functioning prototype of the incredible "car" designed by Leonardo, his famous *Leone Meccanico*, a digital restoration of the Last Supper as well as a number of avant-garde interactive **multi-media experiences**. Thanks to state-of-the-art touch screens visitors can "turn the pages" of digital reproductions of the maestro's manuscripts, including the complete

edition of the famous *Codex Atlanticus*, as well as tapping into fully interactive 3D experiences such as "Leonardo a Milano" and "Il Monumento Sforza", dedicated to the equestrian monument project. Also well worth a visit are the digital restorations of the Last Supper and the Mona Lisa. **"Leonardo3-Il Mondo di Leonardo". CODEX ATLANTICUS

The extraordinary ancient manuscript

The Pinacoteca Ambrosiana will be exhibiting Leonardo's entire "Codex Atlanticus" until 2015: 1750 drawings on 1119 pages (44 or 45 pages at a time for three months at a stretch), the largest and most amazing collection of Leonardo's manuscripts.

The Codex is on show in two different locations: **Sala Federiciana** M1 Cordusio. T: 02.806921.

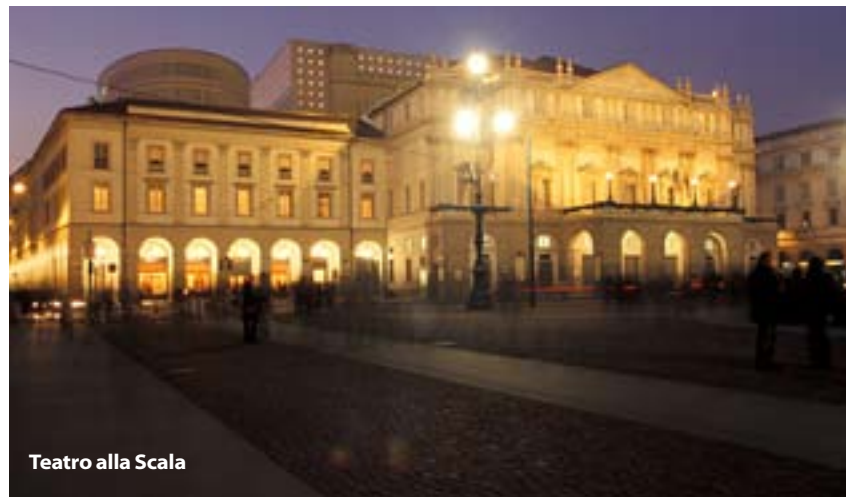
Landmarks

> Duomo, the symbol of Milan

Among one of the most important (and majestic) Gothic buildings in the world, the **Duomo**, constructed on and off over a period of 450 years (begun 1386) is the symbol of Milan. To experience it at its most majestic you must ascend to the roof where you will be surrounded by an outburst of pinnacles, turrets and marble statuary and, naturally, the city's famed golden Madonnina. Open daily 8.30am-6.45pm. Don't miss the new Grande Museo recently refurbished.

Teatro alla Scala

> Galleria, the "living room" of the Milanese

Galleria Vittorio Emanuele II with its elegant, four-storey arcade, housing over 55 luxury cafés and famous designer shops, is covered by a glass barrel vault and a beautiful glass cupola and measures 196 metres in length. Tradition has it that placing your right heel on the bull, depicted in the mosaic on the floor, and then spinning around inside it, will bring good luck. *Piazza Duomo-Piazza della Scala. > The Last Supper by Leonardo

One of the most famous attractions in the world, "**L'Ultima Cena**" or "**Cenacolo**" by **Leonardo da Vinci** is a large 15th century mural painting representing the scene of the last supper of Jesus narrated in the Gospel. It can be found in the church of Santa Maria delle Grazie. Booking required: ask your concierge.

> The Navigli, one of the most vibrant districts

The Navigli are a widespread **network of canals** whose history is linked to the genius of Leonardo da Vinci (XV century). It boasts several small artisan workshops and painter's studios reminiscent of those found on the left bank in Paris. The area is also home to hundreds of trendy venues for either an aperitivo or a relaxing after-dinner drink.

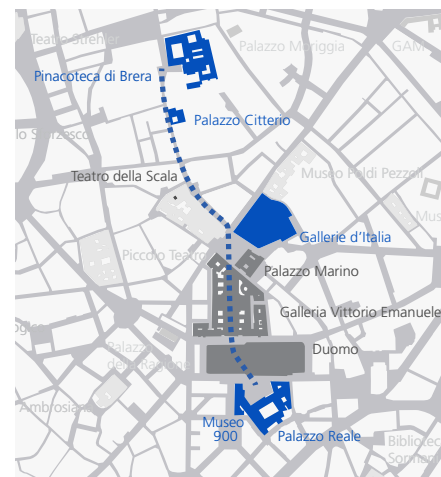

> "Il Castello"

The ancient seat of the ruling Visconti, the **Castello Sforzesco** was later rebuilt by Francesco Sforza and is now simply known by the Milanese as "Il Castello". It houses a number of interesting museums and libraries. Its park is a favourite with old and young alike.

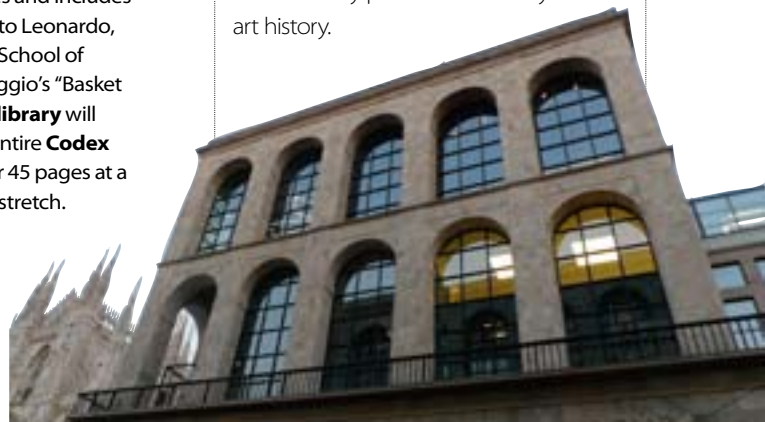

Milan's Street of Art

Following the opening of "Cantiere del '900", a new section of the Gallerie d'Italia-Piazza Scala, Milan has been enriched by a new art circuit featuring the city's three main museum hubs: the Pinacoteca di Brera, the Gallerie d'Italia and the civic complex consisting of Palazzo Reale and the Museo del Novecento. An itinerary extending over 900 metres, that can be crossed on foot in just 15 minutes, from via Brera to piazzetta Reale, cutting through piazza Scala and the Galleria, which hosts an extraordinary part of our country's art history.

A Day Trip to Pavia

JUST A 40 MINUTE DRIVE FROM MILAN

Pavia is a real gem of architecture. Ease of transportation and its small size make it an ideal day trip

Certosa di Pavia

» The province of Pavia is crossed by “Via Francigena”, an ideal connection between Rome and Europe and a meeting point of three Christian pilgrimages (Rome, Santiago and Jerusalem).

SIGHTSEEING. A city once famed for its 100 towers, today Pavia still retains the charms of its ancient past thanks to its numerous historic monuments including its renowned **University**. The city is, in fact, the seat of one of the oldest academic institutions in Europe (founded in 1361). In fact, at all times, visitors are likely to find themselves caught up in the midst of the chattering throngs of students who crowd its streets and nearby bars. Pavia retains a number of well-preserved medieval and early Renaissance buildings and churches, picturesque alleyways and ancient squares. The historic centre and the Borgo Ticino, on the opposite banks of the Ticino river, are connected by the scenic **Ponte Coperto**, also known as the **Ponte Vecchio** (left page). Pavia is also famous for its **Certosa**, considered one of the most unique buildings in Lombardy. Located 8 km north of Pavia, this historic complex was founded as an ex voto at the end of the 15th century and encompasses a monastery, a sanctuary and beautiful gardens. While in Pavia, also make sure to visit the Church of San Michele, the basilica of San Pietro in Ciel d'Oro, the **Duomo** and the **Castello Visconteo**, home to the **Musei Civici**, whose collections includes works dating from medieval times to the 20th century.

SHOPPING. In Pavia, shopping enthusiasts can stroll through the city's countless narrow medieval streets brimming over with artisan workshops and high-end boutiques including famed furrier Annabella. Its main shopping streets are **Corso Cavour**, **Corso Strada Nuova** and **Corso Garibaldi**. Whilst browsing their wares or doing some window shopping you will also have a chance to discover several of the city's most beautiful views.

TASTING. Foodies will be enraptured by Pavia's countless **food specialities**, a blend of outstanding quality and delectable regional dishes, including "zuppa pavese", "ravioli allo stufato", "risotto alle rane" (risotto with frogs legs) and "risotto alla certosina", created by the monks of the Certosa di Pavia. Other standouts include braised beef steeped in local red wine, boiled meat served with a peperoni or green sauce as well as a rich selection of cold cuts. Must-try addresses to savour these specialities include the **Antica Osteria del Previ** and **Al Cassinino**, as well as the unmissable **Pasticceria Vigoni**, the oldest pastry shop in Pavia. Located right in front of the University, it was here that Italy's renowned Torta Paradiso (Cake of Paradise) was first invented.

HOW TO REACH PAVIA

By car. Take the A7 Milano-Genova motorway in the direction of Genova as far as the Bereguardo-Pavia Nord exit. Continue on the A53 in the direction of Pavia and exit at the Pavia-Via Riviera exit.
By train. Trains run daily from Milan's Stazione Centrale to Pavia (www.trenitalia.com).

At the **Scuderie del Castello Visconteo until 2 June** make sure to visit the exhibition dedicated to renowned impressionist **Camille Pissarro** featuring works originating from all over the world.
Visual Poetry. L'avanguardia delle neoavanguardie: more than 1,000 works by late 20th century artists. Two exhibit sites: Palazzo Broletto (15 February-2 March), Castello Visconteo (15 February-23 March).
L'Antico sotto la Cupola: an historic antiques market held underneath the Cupola Arnaboldi, in corso Strada Nuova. The market

is held on the first Sunday of every month (excluding January and August) with exhibitors from all over Italy showcasing antique furniture, collectables and objet d'art. This month's event will be held on 2 March from 8.30am onwards.
Mercatino dell'antiquariato e delle curiosità: Sunday 2 March from 8.30am to 9.00pm (and the first Sunday of every month, excluding January). Here you'll find furniture, paintings and all kinds of objet d'art: from toys to flatware, from collector's items to bric-a-brac. (viale XI Febbraio).

Chef Andrea Berton has recently opened his new, own-name restaurant in the futuristic Porta Nuova Varesine district, the new urban project serving as an emblem of the “new metropolitan Milan”.

The ultra-modern aspects of its context, the attention to environmental sustainability and the rigorous, linear aesthetics of its buildings, mirror the foundations of his minimalist, elegant cuisine featuring instantly recognizable, prime ingredients where the creative choice focuses on the evolution rather than the uprooting of tradition.

The choice made by Berton is by no means random! Even the interiors of the restaurant reflect the chef’s personality and

philosophy. The stark architectural ambience of the location has been softened and tweaked with the addition of several touches apparent in the use of materials (paper, wood, cement and metal), structural shapes and the venue’s colour scheme (featuring muted dove grey tones) which convey a strict sense of elegance and discipline, to create a warm, intimate atmosphere which though focusing on a “no-frills” concept nevertheless holds a scenic surprise in store for those crossing its threshold.

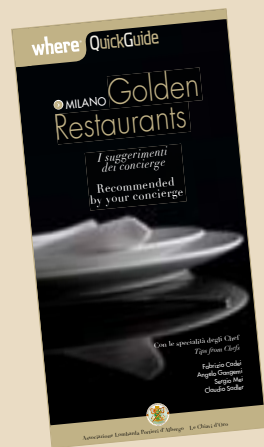

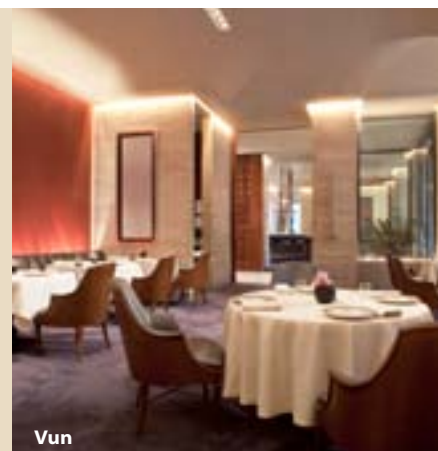

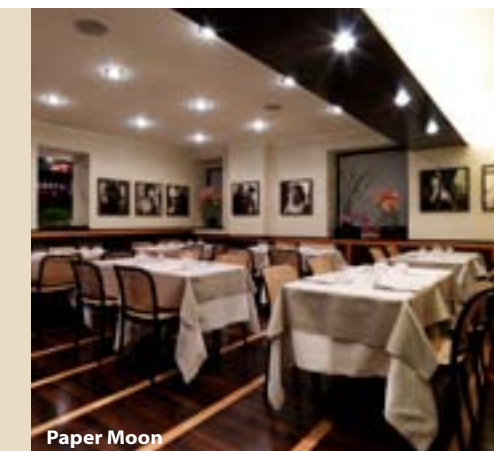

Two Special Spring Days

In March, Lombardy will once again be celebrating the eagerly-awaited annual FAI Spring Days, a unique opportunity to discover hidden treasures across Lombardy. By **Stefania Vida**

The 22nd edition of Spring Days (Giornate di Primavera) organized by FAI (Italian Environmental Foundation) will be held on Saturday 22 and Sunday 23. An impressive celebration that, since its first edition to-date, has involved more than 7,000,000 visitors and which, this year, will see the extraordinary opening of more than 700 locations across regions in Italy. A not-to-be-missed event featuring hundreds of unusual heritage sites that are not generally accessible and which, to mark the occasion, FAI will open to the public during the weekend of Giornate FAI.

In Lombardy, as a special exception, for just two days the following locations will be opened for public viewing: Villa Necchi Campiglio in Milan, Villa and Collezione Panza in Varese (see photo, 40 min. from Milan),

Villa del Balbianello in Lenno-Como (70 min. from Milan), Monastero di Torba in Gornate Olona-Varese (50 min. from Milan), Villa Della Porta Bozzolo in Casalzuigno-Varese (75 min. from Milan) and Villa Fogazzaro Roi in Oria Valsolda-Como (75 min. from Milan).

Conversely, in Milan, novelties at this year's edition will include the opening (from 10am to 5pm) of the historic RAI headquarters in corso Sempione, designed by architect Giò Ponti and Nino Bertolaia in 1939, and the former Palazzo delle Poste - Ferrante Aporti, designed between 1926 and 1931 by architect Ulisse Stacchini, who also designed Milan's monumental Stazione Centrale.

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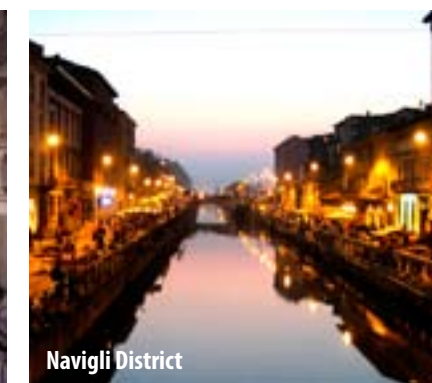

New, exclusive cultural hub MUBA, the Children's Museum in Milan, recently opened its doors at the Rotonda in via Besana, a beautiful circular Baroque structure in Milan, consisting of a former church surrounded by a peaceful garden and enclosed by a long arcade.

1,200 sq.m divided up among a bookshop, an exhibition space, workshop areas and a "Happy Popping" corner where mothers can breastfeed and change their children, open seven days a week, year-round.

A permanent centre of cultural and artistic projects dedicated to early learning and a location open to innovation that gathers together the best of national and international culture, education, science and the arts, to promote the development of creative thinking and creative design concepts.

Throughout the year, it offers a variety of interactive play-oriented exhibitions consisting of installations created thanks to the contribution of artists. These experiences are targeted at stimulating creative thought, giving children a chance to learn and experiment through play, enabling them to interact directly with the key themes of the exhibitions on show. Children are accompanied by specialized educators who not only facilitate and nurture a new generation of creative and global citizens but also encourage the cognitive processes that are activated during the play experience.
