FOCUS MILAN BETWEEN HISTORY AND SCIENCE

The capital of business, fashion and design is also known for its longstanding scientific tradition and its commitment to research, innovation and experimentation



Between the 15th and the 16th century, the city of Milan hosted Leonardo da Vinci who had been invited to work on several engineering initiatives, including the **Navigli** and a project for the Duomo. Today, the city is still known for several of the world's best universities including the Politecnico di Milano (one of whose first students was Albert Einstein). In fact, it was at this seat of learning that numerous inventions, destined to change the world, first took place including, for example, the invention of plastic or the chip which allows our smartphones to recognize movement.

ON LEONARDO'S TRAIL The Museo Nazionale della Scienza e della Tecnologia Leonardo da Vinci-MUST (Leonardo da Vinci National Museum of Science and Technology) is one of the most important of its kind in the world boasting an influx of as many as 400,000 visitors per year. Its collection includes 15,000 items which testify to the development of science and techniques, both in Italy and throughout the world, from the 19th century to presentday times. The main body of the complex, a 6th century monastery, houses the Galleria Leonardo da Vinci, dedicated to "engineering" projects developed by the Tuscan genius (see box). Its large rail pavilion traces the evolution of rail transport, from horse-driven trams to gleaming locomotives. A real legend of oldworld Milan is the "Gamba de legn", a steam tram built in 1879, which connected the city to outlying areas. Conversely, the nearby naval-air **pavilion** tells the story of flight, from the first trail-blazing models to jet planes, as well as that of navigation, with a section hosting a real 1/1 scale model of a transatlantic liner, featuring assault boats, nautical instruments and models of sailing ships. Once outside, visitors can also

LEONARDO'S MACHINES

MUST hosts the "Galleria Leonardo", the largest collection of machines built and based on sketches and projects found in manuscripts penned by Leonardo da Vinci: war machines, aircraft and ships for civil use and architectural models. Leonardo worked on all aspects of engineering, experimenting with new ideas and, at times, coming up with daring solutions (www.museoscienza.org/leonardo).

Claudio Giorgione, curator of the "Leonardo Arte&Scienza" department at MUST, enlightened us about these amazing models.

Tell us about the relationship between Leonardo's drawings and the reconstructions of his machines. It's important to remember that, first and foremost, these models are like 3D representations of Leonardo's drawings, not "reconstructions"; in fact, at that time, most of Leonardo's ideas remained on paper.

To which period in time do the first machines date?

Was Leonardo the exponent of two cultures of his times, i.e. art and science? The museum explores the unexpected ways that art and science connect. Our visitors can choose from among two types of educational experiences at our laboratory: a program dedicated to machines and a program devoted to artistic techniques.



The first models were built by engineers in the army in 1952, as a prelude to the inauguration of the museum. For the most part, their construction involved the use of the same materials that Leonardo would have been able to use at that time, namely, wood, metal and rope.

Additionally, the latest contemporary technology can be experienced firsthand at the complex's laboratories dedicated to robotics, genetics and biotechnologies.

FROM LEONARDO TO THE STARS

In addition to the MUST, several other scientific institutions had marked the history of Milan as a city of science.

At the Osservatorio Astronomico di Brera (Astronomical Observatory), founded in 1762, you can visit the historic domes and a collection of old astronomical instruments (for info and reservations visit www.mi.astro.it. T: 02 72320300. Via Brera, 28. M2 Lanza). Just near Porta Venezia, inside its beautiful Public Gardens, you can find the **Planetario di** Milano "Ulrico Hoepli" (Planetarium). Discover the joys of stargazing, thanks to its spectacular screenings animated by a number of cuttingedge technologies (screening times: Tues, Thurs. 9pm; Sat, Sun 3pm and 4.30 pm. For info visit www.comune.milano.it. T: 02 88463340. Corso Venezia, 57. M1 Palestro, M1 Porta Venezia).

Not far from the Planetarium, you can admire the characteristic Neo-Romanesque profile of the Museo Civico di Storia Naturale (Natural History Museum), which offers a fascinating display of rare minerals, splendid examples of zoology, reconstructions of the first environments inhabited by man and large fossil skeletons of prehistoric animals (Open Tues-Sun 9am-5.30pm. Full price ticket 3 euros. Free admission on Friday afternoon. www.comune.milano.it. T: 02 88463280. Corso Venezia, 55. M1 Palestro).

Alternatively, in Parco Sempione, the city's other green lung, you will find the unique, Liberty-style **Acquario Civico** (Civic Acquarium). The only surviving building of those constructed for the world Expo of 1906 in Milan, dedicated to the technology of transport. It houses 36 tanks filled with more than 100 species of fish, living in recreated environments from the Amazon to the Mediterranean, with particular emphasis on Italian seabeds. DUOMO CATHEDRAL—Among one of the most important (and majestic) Gothic buildings in the world, the church, constructed on and off over a period of 450 years (begun 1386) is the symbol of Milan. Built in the shape of a Latin cross, the cathedral is divided by soaring pillars into five naves, the largest of which measures 45 metres in height. It has 135 spires and its inside columns measure 3 and a half metres in diameter. To experience the Duomo at its most majestic you must ascend to the roof (either by elevator or by steps) where you will be surrounded by an outburst of pinnacles, turrets and marble statuary and, naturally, the city's famed golden Madonnina.
