



Luca Gardini, ambassador of Made in Italy Wine and current title holder of Best Sommelier in the World, shares the secrets of the world of wine for a perfect tasting experience Thanks to its vibrant cultural and cosmopolitan atmosphere, Milan is the ideal place in which to experiment the gastronomic wealth and wine-producing heritage not only of the Lombardy region but also of the whole of Northern Italy, mirrored in the cuisine of several of the most prestigious Italian restaurants which are located right here, in the capital of fashion and design.

THE PHILOSOPHY OF PAIRING

Rather than dictating actual rules regarding correct food and wine pairing, I think that it would be more appropriate to talk about the philosophy of pairing. Generally speaking, where food pairing is in question, the final aim is to exalt the characteristics of the dish and accompanying beverage, in a search of perfect harmony. Several general criteria exist, for example, light wines should be served with delicately-flavoured dishes while more structured, full-bodied wines should be paired with dishes boasting an intense flavour. However, should you choose to taste more than one wine during the course of a meal, it might be advisable to start with a classic method sparkling wine, either as an "aperitivo"

or an accompaniment to an entrée and then continue with a light wine, a more structured white wine, a young red or a more full-bodied red wine. Wines should be served at the right temperature; sparkling wines or champagnes should be served cold, white wines should be pleasantly chilled and red wines should be served at room temperature. Desserts are generally paired with a chilled sweet wine which should be chosen according to the basic ingredients of the dessert in question. In any case, my advice is to always order what you fancy, without worrying too much about rules and regulations and, often, in my experience, this means placing your choice of wine before your choice of dessert. As a rule of thumb, I would suggest asking for the wine list with the menu and, remember, in the words of Goethe, "life is too short to drink inferior

PRESTIGIOUS LABELS

Among the many wine producers using the classic method, two, in particular, stand out on account of the indisputable value of their most prestigious sparkling wines: the Ferrari



wine estates, located in the Trentino region, produce the sublime "Giulio Ferrari Riserva del Fondatore" while the Lombardy-based winery Ca' del Bosco achieves excellence with its "Cuvée Annamaria Clementi", either in the white or rosé version.

Alto Adige is also an area known for its white wines, in particular, those produced by Cantina Terlano, such as, for example, "Nova Domus", a skilful blend of different white grape varietals. Conversely, in Piedmont, the multiaward-winning wine estate Gaja produces their totally delicious "Gaja e Rey" using only chardonnay grapes.

Among the countless reds that are the pride and joy of our country, worthy of particular note are Barolo Monprivato "Cà d'Morissio" produced by the Mascarello Giuseppe e Figlio wine estate or Giacomo Conterno's Barolo "Monfortino". Always in the Piedmont region, the Barbaresco Riserva produced by Bruno Giacosa is truly one of the greats, while in the Veneto region, two producers - Giuseppe Quintarelli and Romano Dal Forno - are renowned for their production of "Amarone della Valpolicella". Moving on to Tuscany, I feel that it is incumbent upon me to mention the historic Brunello di Montalcino Biondi-Santi wine estate with its Riserva "Tenuta Greppo"; always in the Montalcino area, the Gianfranco Soldera's winery is also renowned worldwide for its Brunello "Riserva Case Basse". Last but not least, several of the most famous Super-Tuscan-wines in the world include "Masseto" and "Ornellaia"

- both produced by Tenuta

dell'Ornellaia - and "Sassicaia",

produced by Tenuta San Guido.

LOCATIONS OF EXCELLENCE

As an expert wine-taster, after many years of work and experimentation in the haute cuisine sector, I would like to suggest a few "must-visit" addresses which, to my mind, are real temples of modern gastronomy. Set against the charming backdrop of the Naviglio Pavese, "Sadler" is named after internationally renowned chef and owner Claudio Sadler. His elegant Milanese "osteria" specializes in modern Italian cuisine, boasting only the most authentic flavours. Another "not-to-be-missed" destination is "Il Luogo di Aimo e Nadia". Set within a sophisticated, elegant ambience, it offers unadulterated, minimalist haute cuisine conceived and prepared by chefs Fabio Pisani and Alessandro Negrini. Located in one of the most exclusive, unique areas of downtown Milan, "Trussardi alla Scala" is the perfect place for a business lunch or a romantic dinner, embodying outstanding interior design and top-rate cuisine. Always in the centre, just minutes away from the Duomo, is "Cracco", run by eponymous chef and owner Carlo Cracco, with the help of talented souschef Matteo Baronetto. Finally, I would also like to bring your attention to three prestigious restaurants located inside several of the city's best hotels: at the Park Hyatt Hotel, management of the restaurant "Vun" has been entrusted to the flair and talent of chef Andrea Aprea; the Bulgari Hotel features all the creativity of young chef Andrea Ferrero while, at the Principe di Savoia Hotel, the dishes served at the "Acanto" restaurant carry the signature of executive chef Fabrizio Cadei. At each of these restaurants, you will have a chance to delight in a selection of some of the world's finest wines including several of the best labels on the Italian wine scene.

•where else Exploring Milan and surrounding areas The Wine Route A trip in discovery of Gavi and its highly sought-after wine cellars

Situated about one hour out of Milan, the wine-growing area of Gavi - set against the lush green, rolling hills of Piedmont, in the comune of Alessandria - is a great place for an out-of-town visit. The white wines produced in the village of Gavi in Piedmont have been dubbed the Chablis of Italy, due to their straw yellow colour and dry, pleasant aroma. A region rich in history and flavours, which can be discovered by possibly taking a wine tour along one of the itineraries of the so-called "Via del Gavi", long sections of which overlap with Via Francigena, crossed in Medieval times by pilgrims on their way to Rome.

Although it goes without saying that the reference point on this route is the town of Gavi, the whole area of Novese, featuring 3 characteristic itineraries, is also well worth a visit. In fact, this area takes in **Novi Ligure** and its surrounding towns, Gavi and the Val Lemme and, last but not least, Valle Scrivia and Val Borbera.

Historic places of significant interest include a visit to the old Fort of Gavi, an imposing edifice from whose walls visitors can enjoy a breathtaking view over the hills and the archaeological excavations of Libarna, an important site during late Roman-Imperial times.

Conversely, cycling enthusiasts should definitely make time to visit

Novi Ligure's **Museo dei Campionissimi**, the largest bicycle museum in Europe, boasting numerous memorabilia that trace the careers of those champions whose cycling feats have gone down in the annals of history (www.museodeicampionissimi.it).

Gavi is also renowned for its innumerable historic villas housing famous wine cellars. A highly evocative, well-preserved location where, between one visit and the next, you can take a pit-stop to taste one of the estate's fabulous wines, possibly after a day's shopping spree in the nearby Serravalle Designer Outlet-McArthurGlen.

Worthy of particular note, among it's priceless historic manor houses dating back to the 17th or 18th centuries, are Villa La Lomellina (T: 0143 642994), La Scolca (www.scolca.it), Villa La Giustiniana (www.lagiustiniana.it), Villa La Centuriona (T: 0143 648880) and Villa La Toledana (www.latoledana.it). Other sites of significant interest in the area include a number of prestigious wineries, not only known for their production of Gavi DOC but also characterized by ultra-modern complexes boasting open-view spaces and cutting-edge equipment. Two such examples are **Tenuta Nuova Ca' da Meo** (www.magdapedrini.it) and the **Tenuta Morgassi** (www.morgassisuperiore.it).

Described by the shop owners as "a journey through shopping of the future", I warmly suggest visiting floors 2-5, designed by Antonia exclusively for fashion lovers. DUOMO CATHEDRAL—Among one of the most important (and majestic) Gothic buildings in the world, the church, constructed on and off over a period of 450 years (begun 1386) is the symbol of Milan, Built in the shape of a Latin cross, the cathedral is divided by soaring pillars into five naves, the largest of which measures 45 metres in height. It has 135 spires and its inside columns measure 3 and a half metres in diameter. To experience the Duomo at its most majestic you must ascend to the roof (either by elevator or by steps) where you will be surrounded by an outburst of pinnacles, turrets and marble statuary and, naturally, the city's famed golden Madonnina. 




