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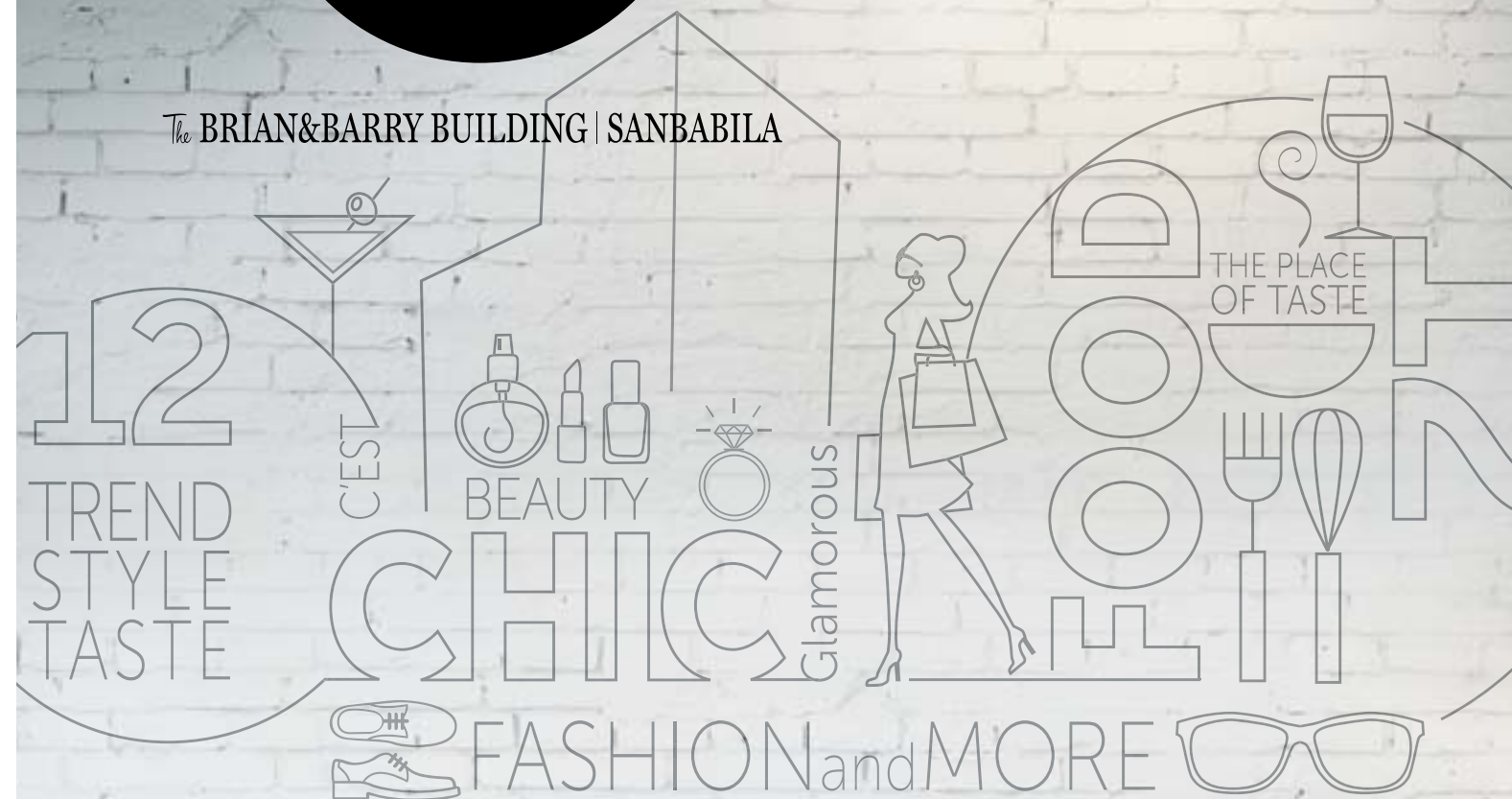

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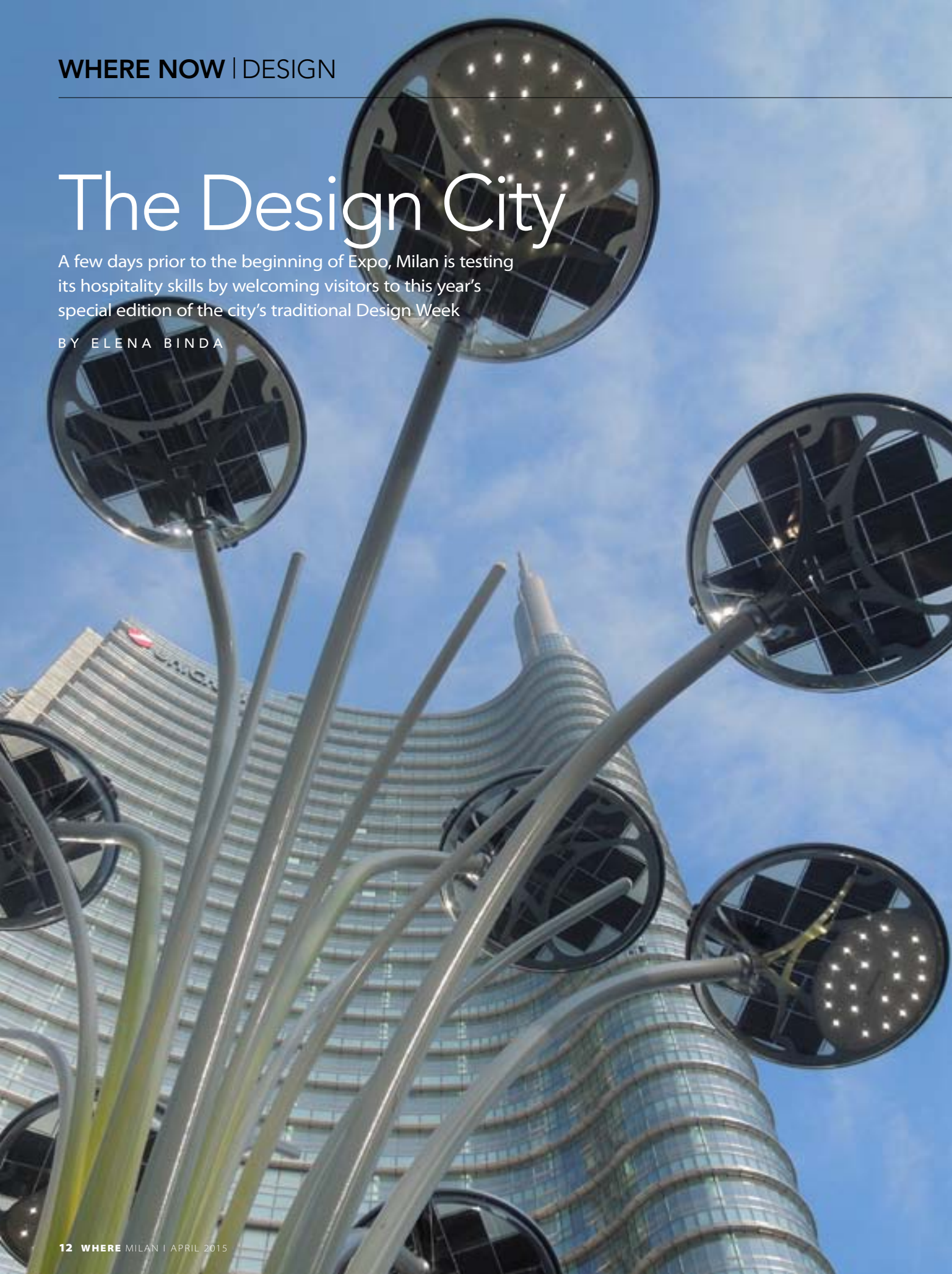

The Design City

A few days prior to the beginning of Expo, Milan is testing its hospitality skills by welcoming visitors to this year's special edition of the city's traditional Design Week

Boasting a longstanding history as a 'design city', starting in the 1900s when Milan led the industrialization process right up to the present time, Milan is a **world capital of design** year-round. Endless signs bear witness to its design heritage which can be seen in its myriad must-visit places – including its new districts such as, first and foremost, Porta Nuova –, at venues where you can admire and purchase objects in the style with which its public buildings and countless private houses are infused. However, it is during the month of April and, in particular, during the famed 'Salone del Mobile', that the city showcases its finest offerings. The city's annual 'design week' is the biggest and most important event in Milan, eagerly awaited by the Milanese and attended by visitors from all over the world.

THE 'SALONE'

The origins of Design Week lie in the roots of the Salone del Mobile: the 54th edition will be held at Fieramilano/Rho **from Tuesday 14 to Sunday 19 April**. Boasting more than 2,000 exhibitors, a display area of more than 200,000 square metres and thousands of new products premiered at the event, the Salone is the benchmark trade fair on an international level, attracting more than 300,000 visitors from as many as 160 countries.

Reserved for trade members every day from 9.30am to 6.30pm, the Salone is **open to the public on Saturday and Sunday**. The main event also encompasses the Salone del Complemento d'Arredo, the SaloneSatellite, Euroluce (at pavilions 9-11 and 13-15) and Workplace3.0 (at pavilions 22-24). But what innovations do this year hold? To celebrate the International Year of Light

proclaimed by Unesco for 2015, **Euroluce**, the lighting event, will feature a **special edition**. Its off-site event, promising to be one of the biggest draws, will be the installation entitled **'Favilla**. Ogni luce una voce' ('Favilla, to every light a voice') created for the city of Milan by architect Attilio Stocchi: a story and a study on the essence of light, which visitors will have a chance to admire in the heart of the city centre in **piazza San Fedele**.

The other exciting novelty of this edition concerns **Workplace3.0** which, this year, will replace the old 'SaloneUfficio' with an **innovative concept dedicated to workplace design** in the era of smart working, from furniture to interior design details, utilities and audio-visual technologies. Here too, another installation also likely to wow the crowds is **Michele de Lucchi's 'La Passeggiata'** ('The Walk'), a space (this time hosted inside the Workplace3.0 pavilions) where visitors can experience design ideas that showcase all the multi-faceted aspects of the workplace. Scheduled to be held in the same place is the event entitled "In Italy" curated by architect Dario Curatolo featuring 64 Italian manufacturers and a select group of designers who will tackle the theme of products, design and planning. This project includes a film which will explain the production process behind each object. Lastly, **SaloneSatellite** will be back in pavilions 22 and 24 – the same as Workplace3.0 – with free entry from Cargo 5. Now in its 18th edition,

this year, it is dedicated to the theme "Pianeta vita" as a tribute to the soon-to-open Expo: its protagonists are designers under the age of 35 who gather here to showcase their projects, and participate in the SaloneSatellite Award competition, which each year gives an award to the 3 best prototypes.

MUSEUMS

Design capital Milan has several fixed points, real museums that can be visited year-round which often renew their exhibits to coincide with the opening of Design Week. The first must-visit 'temple', a truly integral part of the

urban fabric, is the **Triennale Design Museum** in viale Alemagna (Cadorna area). Its new and 8th edition will debut on 9 April, at the same time as the opening of the Salone, and will run until 21 February 2016. Entitled '**Kitchens & Invaders**' it tells of the gradual and inexorable mutation of electrical appliances and kitchen utensils into machines and robots that have invaded our homes and changed our habits forever.

During the same period, the Triennale will also host the only thematic pavilion of Expo located in the centre of the city: entitled '**Arts & Foods – Rituals since 1851**', the pavilion will be inaugurated on 9 April. Scheduled to close on 31 October 2015, it will explore the multi-faceted relationship between design and food from the first



World Fair in London to the present time. In addition, last December saw the out-of-town opening of a permanent **Museum of Italian Design at the Belvedere of Villa Reale in Monza** featuring must-see pieces by Giò Ponti, Piero Fornasetti and Bruno Munari as well as works by young, emerging designers.

THE FUORISALONE

Providing a summary of the Fuorisalone events is an almost impossible task and one that is actually part of its charm: the blockbuster initiatives of big-name brands are mixed with those of smaller vendors, and scheduled events are alternated with impromptu happenings. For a more complete program featuring the 'hottest' dates, consult the **fuorisalone.it website**. In the meantime, here is a general overview.

Firstly, although the events are scattered throughout the city, the Fuorisalone recognizes eight main districts, where the majority of happenings are concentrated: **Brera, Tortona, Lambrate, San Babila, the "5 vie", Porta Venezia, San Gregorio and Sant'Ambrogio**.



This year, '**Superstudio**', the location that launched the Tortona district and the very concept of a design district in Milan, is celebrating its 15th anniversary with a special edition that will see the gathering, in 10,000 square metres of display space, of big-name brands, famous architects, new talents and designers 2.0. under the theme 'Open your mind', expressed through selected objects and various large and small happenings.

As usual, Lexus international will present a sense-based exhibit titled 'A journey of the senses' in the Tortona district, at the **Carrozzeria Torneria space**, from 14 to 19 April. The exhibit will feature internationally-acclaimed designer Philippe Nigro and starred chef Hajime Yoneda. Its aim: to offer an amazing experience combining the pleasures of travel, beauty and taste.

Just moments away, the winning entries of the 4th 'I recycle, you recycle' competition, dedicated to 'imperfect design', will be on display at the **NHow Hotel** in via Tortona 35, and in the magnificent frescoed hall of Palazzo Isimbardi, in corso Monforte.

In addition, several spaces across the city will



also be dedicated to the great schools of international design. In particular, the 'Berlin Design Selection' will present the best of contemporary German design in Brera while "Designjunction 2015" will display a selection of the best works by new British designers at **Casa dell'Opera** in via Mascagni (a recently restored building in the San Babila area).

Two historical locations, the **Università degli Studi** of Milan and the **Orto Botanico** have been chosen to host 'Energy for creatività', the new exhibition-event sponsored by Interni. These highly evocative settings will host two complimentary themes: 'A dream for Tomorrow',



set within the cloisters of the University, interprets the near future of the city, while 'The Garden of Wonders' explores the relationship between design and perfume at the Orto Botanico. The exhibition opens on 13 April and is scheduled to run until 24 May to coincide with the first month of the Universal Exposition. Finally, nature takes centre stage with special events and an installation, 'Un orto fra i cortili' designed by Studio Piurach and mounted on the rooftops of via Palermo (Brera district). The installation is a prime example of energy saving and landscape solutions. On the other hand, from 14 April to 3 May, **Cascina Cuccagna**

(via Muratori, Porta Romana district) will offer workshops dedicated to eco-design, amidst nature and technology, set against a magnificent backdrop that will take you back to an old-world Milan.

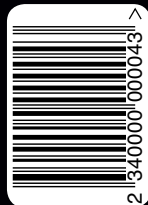

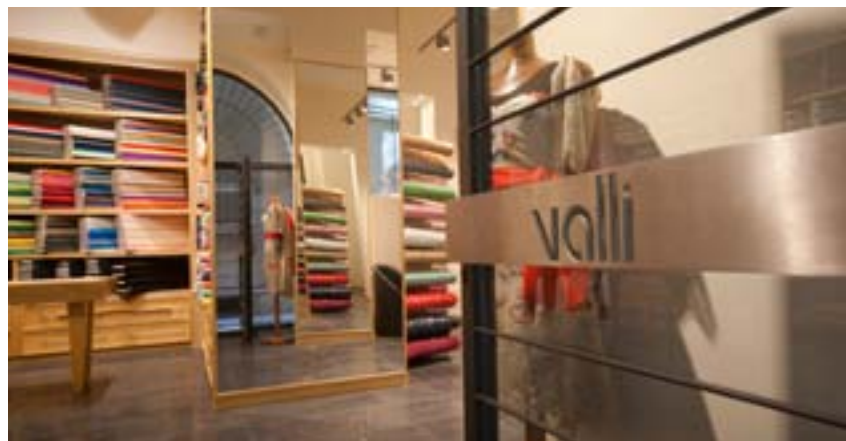

1906 World Fair



When Milan opened its doors to the world

The International Exposition of Milan was an epoch-making event that not only re-launched the potential of the Country but also one that enabled the city to carve out a position of note for itself on the international scene.

At the beginning of the year 1900, the idea of organizing a World Fair dedicated to water transportation, was launched. Subsequently, to celebrate completion of the Sempione Tunnel (the Simplon Tunnel), the idea of associating the Exposition with the **theme of transportation** in general, and extending it to participating countries, was launched. Although, initially, the Fair was scheduled to be held in 1905, delays in work on the Simplon Tunnel resulted in its being postponed to 1906. A special committee set up for the purpose identified the green space lying behind Castello Sforzesco as the one best-suited to an exposition site. The area was named **Parco Sempione** in honour of the Tunnel and a public appeal

was launched to raise the necessary funds. The **International Exposition of Milan was solemnly inaugurated on 28 May 1906**. The event saw the official participation of **40 countries** while **225 buildings**, designed by the era's most noteworthy architects, were erected at what we know today as Parco Sempione and the former Piazza d'Armi (which, starting from 1923, was used to host Milan's fairgrounds) and the two areas were connected by an **ultra-modern aerial railway** (see photo above). In April of the same year, the **Acquario Civico di Milano** which still, today, represents one of the maximum expressions of Italian Liberty-style architecture, was inaugurated inside the grounds of the International Exposition.



Exhibitors, hailing from all over the world, numbered as many as 35,000 and the overall surface area occupied by Expo totalled one million square metres. Additionally, the Milan World Fair was attended by some **5.5 million people**.

BEloved > The theme of love will be represented by Francesco Hayez's "The Kiss" (Pinacoteca di Brera).



JULY 2015

BElong > Raphael's "Marriage of the Virgin" (Pinacoteca di Brera) will serve as an emblem of belonging to the city as a place where people can share and socialize.



AUGUST 2015

BEside > The solidarity expressed by Milan and its volunteer associations will be represented by Michelangelo's "Pietà Rondanini" (Castello Sforzesco).



SEPTEMBER 2015

BEyond > With his "Spatial Concept" (Museo del Novecento), Lucio Fontana has transcended the definitions of painting, sculpture and poetry: in the same way that Milan, with EXPO 2015, is projected towards the future.



OCTOBER 2015

BElieve > As a gran finale, the city has chosen Leonardo da Vinci's "Last Supper", possibly the best-known work of art in the world.

Leonardo da Vinci 1452–1519

An unprecedented display dedicated to Leonardo artist, painter and designer. It is a route that uses drawings, manuscripts and documents to reconstruct the complexity of this genius from the Renaissance period.

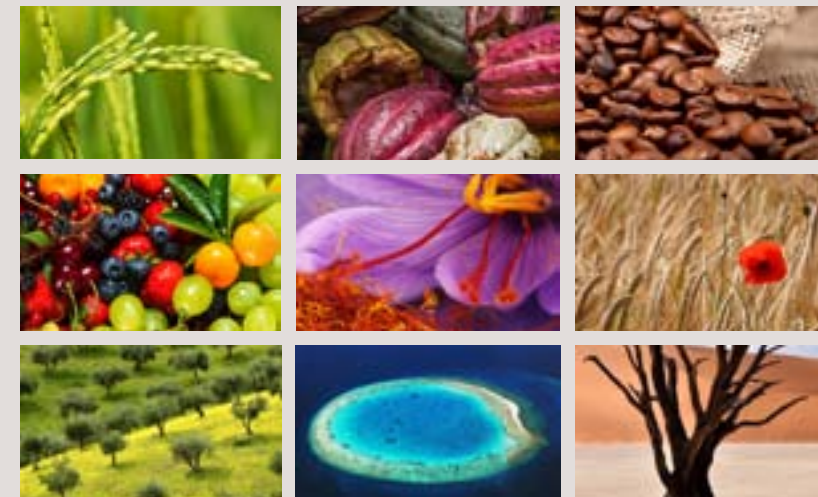

Clusters are one of the new attractions of **Expo Milano 2015**: for the first time pavilion communities are not grouped by geographical area but rather by a common theme and the food group to which they belong. Each country found in one of the clusters has an individual display space in which to develop its own personal interpretation of the theme of Expo Milano 2015.



RICE: ABUNDANCE AND SECURITY

A landscape that echoes the images of never-ending rice fields, evoking the colors and scents of a rural setting, greets each visitor. *Sierra Leone, Bangladesh, Cambodia, Laos People's Democratic Republic, Myanmar.*

BIO-MEDITERRANEUM

The image of the sea is conveyed by its flooring in myriad hues of blue, recalling all the colors of the sea that embraces the countries hosted in the Cluster. *Montenegro, Algeria, Serbia, Lebanon, Egypt, Croatia, San Marino, Tunisia, Greece, Libya, Malta, Albania.*

COCOA: THE FOOD OF GODS

The cocoa tree is grown in the tropical and subtropical plantations which serve as a source of inspiration for this Cluster. *Cameroon, Ghana, Gabon.*

COFFEE: THE ENGINE OF IDEAS

Inspiring this Cluster are the vast coffee plantations set in the shade of the tropical forests of Africa and Central America. *Kenya, Burundi, Yemen, Guatemala, El Salvador, Uganda, Costa Rica, Ethiopia, Rwanda.*

FRUITS AND LEGUMES

As a cultivated forest, the space accommodates small and large varieties of

fruit trees, creating a natural atmosphere. *Gambia, Guinea, Benin, Democratic Republic of the Congo, Zambia, Kyrgyzstan, Uzbekistan.*

SPICES: THE WORLD OF SPICES

A voyage along the spice route, featuring scents and colors evoking distant lands and seas, is the inspiration for this Cluster. *Afghanistan, United Republic of Tanzania, Vanuatu.*

CEREALS AND TUBERS

The colors and scents reminiscent of cereal and tuber crops are the conceptual basis for this pavilion. *Bolivia, Haiti, Mozambique, Togo, Democratic Republic of the Congo, Zimbabwe.*

ISLANDS, SEA AND FOOD

Here, the atmosphere is created by the sounds of rushing water, the crunch of gravel and the knocking of wood, to evoke these lands' sense of harmony. *Guinea Bissau.*

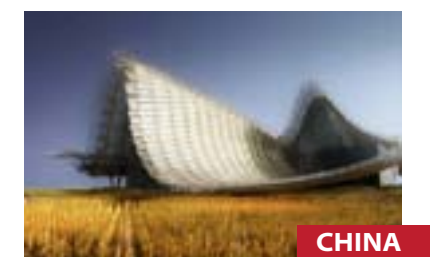
ARID ZONES

On entering the Cluster, visitors find themselves immersed in a desert sandstorm-like atmosphere, created by canes hanging from the ceiling. *Mauritania, Senegal, Palestine, Eritrea.*

Galleria Vittorio Emanuele II

In the run up to Expo, the city's historic Galleria Vittorio Emanuele II has been given a makeover! The splendid 'Living Room of Milan' is gradually rediscovering all of its former splendour, attracting locals and foreigners alike! By **Stefania Vida**

In perfect keeping with this general makeover, the highly central Galleria Vittorio Emanuele II, known to all as "the Living Room of Milan" on account of its elegance and versatility as a meeting place for the Milanese, has regained its former splendour, thanks to **important renovation works** which will also see the re-opening of its upper floors with new spaces for exhibitions, events, meetings, bars, cafés and eateries plus exclusive **panoramic walkways** extending over a surface area of 550 sq.m. The access route envisages entry from the courtyards of via Silvio Pellico 2/Piazza Duomo 21.

After ascending to the upper spaces via two lifts (currently under construction) and crossing a terrace, it will be possible to access the walkway. At the end of the visit, an external lift located in the courtyard will take visitors back down and out through the exit in via Silvio Pellico 8. In addition to being a stunning feat of architecture, the Galleria can realistically be considered the **oldest shopping arcade in the world**. Those crossing under its magnificent glass dome are treated to a one-of-a-kind shopping experience. The arcade is lined with several of the world's most famed and

fabled designer stores, workshops steeped in history, landmark restaurants and cafés plus several intriguing, well-stocked bookstores. Depending on the time of the day, you will either encounter hordes of tourists, hurried office workers, foreigners from all parts of the globe or the Milanese either on their way to the theatre or to one of the area's numerous museums or nearby attractions (the Duomo, Teatro alla Scala, Gallerie d'Italia, Palazzo Reale, Grande Museo del Duomo and the Museo del '900). Two key reference points designed to help tourists discover all that the city has to offer are **InfoMilano** and the **Urban Center**.

Ambrosiana, Picture Gallery and Library
CODEX ATLANTICUS The Ambrosiana picture gallery contains several exquisite works of art from the 15th through 17th centuries and includes "The musician", attributed to Leonardo, Raphael's cartoon for the "School of Athens" fresco and Caravaggio's "Basket of fruit". Duomo
Among one of the most important Gothic buildings in the world, the church, constructed on and off over a period of 450 years (begun 1386) is the symbol of Milan. Built in the shape of a Latin cross, the cathedral is divided by soaring pillars into five naves, the largest of which measures 45 metres in height and has 135 spires. The cathedral is open daily 7am-7pm. The recently renovated Grande Museo del Duomo (see listing at the MUSEUMS section) houses hundreds of works of art dating from the 15th century to the present day. **MAJESTIC TERRACES** To experience the Duomo at its most majestic you must ascend to the roof (either by elevator or by steps) where you will be surrounded by an outburst of pinnacles and the famed golden "Madonnina". www.duomomilano.it. Galleria Vittorio Emanuele II

The bijoux created by **Donatella Pellini** tell a fascinating story: tourmalines, aquamarines, white agate and topazes, combined with multi-faceted resins boasting an unmistakable **sense of colour**.

When was your business established and how has it changed over the years?

It all began in 1947, with the first pieces in Murano glass created by my grandmother, Emma. In 1964, my mother opened the first boutique in Milan, in via Morigi. In 1987, I began working with resins, experimenting with the 'inclusions' that subsequently became the hallmark feature of our brand.

Where does the inspiration for your resin jewellery come from?

The idea first originated when Romeo Gigli asked me to enrich his collections with

necklaces resembling amber and coral. I wasn't satisfied with the results obtained using synthetic materials so I started to experiment with resins. The result was surprising. We are still able to handcraft our items today because our atelier is an artisanal workshop.

What should we expect to find on entering a Pellini shop for the first time?

Unique pieces in resin, semi-precious stones, crystals, glass and metals. The display space also changes thanks to our original selection of bags and accessories that blend in perfectly with the surrounding objects.

Maybe you've just seen **Leonardo's Last Supper** and are in need of a relaxing walk to ward off the possible onset of Stendhal's syndrome. Maybe you've got just one hour before seeing a musical at **Teatro Nazionale** or maybe your hotel happens to be located in the neighbourhood. Or, maybe you simply wish to take a stroll through one of Milan's less touristy areas. In all of these cases, the **Vercelli-Belfiore district**, midway between the Conciliazione and Wagner metro stops, is a perfect itinerary: one of Milan's best-kept secrets – though not by chance home to **several of the world's best brands** – this area, though mainly residential and frequented during the day, is capable of surprising those visiting it, thanks, for example to an extremely wide, cosmopolitan offer of restaurants. One of the most characteristic and strategic tram routes in the city (from here trams run to Fieramilano City and its congress centre, the Expo district, but also the historic centre, where you can catch a glimpse of the spires of the Duomo as the tram trundles along), this district is definitely worth a visit, shopping bag in hand. In fact, its **carousel of shops** has few rivals.

At number 23 you can also find **Brian & Barry** (which, in spite of its name, is a 100% Italian brand, currently at the top of its form, as shown by its new, lavish megastore in San Babila) and **Boggi**, a surefire choice for men's clothing where you can take

On reaching piazza Wagner, you can make a small diversion in discovery of via Belfiore, even less touristy and, therefore, even more suggestive. 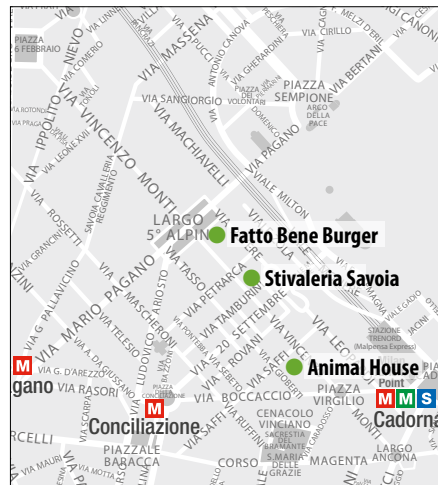

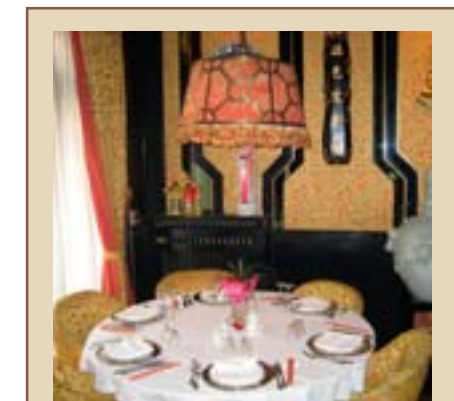

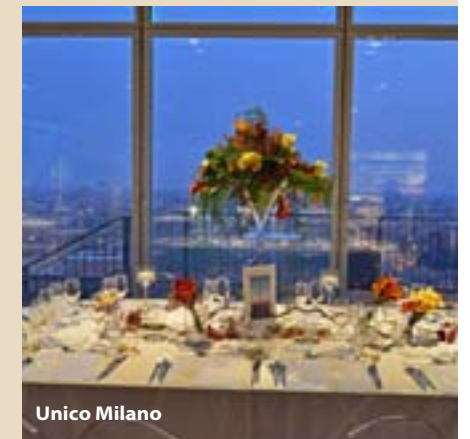

The art of nourishment

From 10 April to 1 November, the exhibition "Arts & Foods. Rituals since 1851" will explore the ritual of eating and dining at the Triennale di Milano, transformed into a Thematic Pavilion for Expo 2015. By **Elena Peverata**

Since time immemorial, the world of food, dining spaces and nourishment have been an integral part of the history of art. Since 1851, the year of the first World Fair, the theme has been debated and explored by all artistic avant-garde movements and expressive forms: from impressionism to Pop Art right up to the latest research. And, in fact, the multiform relationship between the arts and food is traced and analysed at the "Arts & Foods" Pavilion, **the only thematic area of Expo Milano 2015 set up in the city**, at the headquarters of the Triennale di Milano. Its aim? To serve as a means of creative reflection on the theme of the Universal Expo in Milan, namely "Feeding the Planet, Energy for Life", through the display of hundreds of works, objects and documents originating from museums, public and private institutions, collectors and artists from all over the world.

Serving as a trip through time, "Arts & Foods" covers the period from 1851 to the present time. Supported by data provided by artists, writers, film makers, graphic designers, musicians, photographers, architects and designers, it involves all types of media and art forms: from painting to sculpture, videos, installations, photography, advertising, design, architecture, movies, music and literature. This amazing journey takes spectators in discovery of environments dedicated to communal dining places and spaces – from the dining room to the kitchen, from cafes to picnic areas right up to aeroplanes – where furniture, objects, electrical appliances and works of art plus drawings and maquettes by architects, films, objects, documents, books, menus, record covers... allow the work to be placed within its own historic, sociological and anthropological context, creating a narrative

of enormous appeal and visual impact. Also starting on 10 April, always at the same location, don't miss the eighth edition of the **Triennale Design Museum** which, to mark the advent of Expo 2015, will also be staging a food-related exhibit entitled "Kitchen & Invaders", outlining the gradual but inexorable transformation of traditional kitchen utensils into machines and robots. The two exhibitions will also interact with the Salone del Mobile (Milan's Furniture Fair), the other major international Milan-based event open to the public also scheduled to commence on the same date.

GENOA AND THE AQUARIUM

Since time immemorial the charm of this city of sea and hills, a crossroads of different peoples and cultures, has attracted the attention of writers, poets and singers/songwriters who have described its beauty in their verses. The walls of this old maritime republic hide remarkable traces of its glorious past (from monuments to historic workshops right up to its picturesque "carruggi"), but also bold, modern works that have made it a sort of capital of modern Italian architecture. The jewel in its crown is the **Aquarium**, the largest in Italy and the second largest in Europe after Valencia's aquarium in Spain. Covering a surface area of as many as 9,700 sq.m, the exhibition takes visitors in discovery of the Aquarium's 71 tanks housing

an amazing array of fish and reptile species. Particularly worthy of note are its five large pools, viewable from both floors of the aquarium, housing dolphins, sharks, seals, manatees and turtles as well as countless other marine species.

VIGEVANO

Surrounded by the woods of the Ticino Park, Vigevano's main attraction is its famous **piazza Ducale**, described by revered composer Arturo Toscanini as a "a symphony on four sides". Designed by Bramante with the assistance of Leonardo da Vinci, piazza Ducale, one of the longest and most majestic in Europe, served as a stately forecourt to

the town's imposing Castle. A city of art but also of water, Vigevano is crossed by the Ticino river and by canals that offer views and natural oases of breathtaking beauty. However, the city is also renowned throughout the world as Italy's shoemaking capital (don't miss a visit to the International Footwear Museum).

an inside look at the fascinating current and past history of Ferrari, the **Museo di Maranello** also boasts a number of other attractions including a Screening Room featuring the ongoing screening of films, Formula 1 simulators, two semi-professional ones for adults and two real-life Formula 1 single-seaters modified into Junior simulators for kids and teenagers; the opportunity of tackling a real tyre change, mega-screens to view Grand Prix action, a large Ferrari store and a welcoming cafeteria.

The three enchanting Borromeo Islands are located on **Lake Maggiore**, in front of the elegant town of Stresa. The largest of the three is Isola Madre which will seduce you with its intimate, peaceful atmosphere: a garden brimming over with rare plants and exotic flowers where peacocks, parakeets and pheasants of all types roam freely, creating all the allure of a tropical oasis. **Isola Bella** is a place of unexpected delights thanks to its beautiful Italianate gardens and its inestimable art treasures, a truly unique spot. Lastly, **Isola dei Pescatori** (also known as Isola Superiore) is the only island of the archipelago that is inhabited year-round. In fact, it boasts a town centre, a cluster of ancient, picturesque fishermen's houses and a maze of narrow alleyways, all of which can only be visited on foot!

Permanent exhibition **Swissminiatur** is located in Melide, just a few kilometres from Lugano (Switzerland). Set within a vast park on the banks of **Lake Ceresio**, this open-air exhibition hosts miniature reproductions of Switzerland's most characteristic areas. While strolling along its paths you will thus have a chance to view several of Switzerland's most representative places, cities and monuments faithfully reproduced in a 1:25 scale. The entire miniature landscape is enhanced by the reproduction of a railway network that extends over a surface area of 3560 metres. On-site amenities include a self-service restaurant offering local, Chinese, Halal (on request) and Indian cuisine and a children's playground with a small pool on which children can ride using the rubber dinghies provided.

Discovering the lakes of Lombardy

Treat yourself to a day's relaxation by visiting the beautiful lakes of Lombardy, where some of the world's most breathtaking scenery and scenic views await you. By **Stefania Vida**

Little more than **30 minutes from Milan**, at all times of the year, heart-stoppingly beautiful **Lake Como** offers lush vegetation and some truly evocative scenery, credit for which also goes to the beautiful city of Como with its picturesque alleyways and gastronomic specialities just waiting to be sampled at any of its countless restaurants. Hop aboard one of the area's traditional ferries in order to reach the nearby town of **Bellagio**, visit the historic **Villa Melzi**, a Neo-classical-style residence surrounded by a botanical garden **Villa Serbelloni** and **Villa Carlotta**, an 18th century dwelling famed for its museum housing works of art and its gardens which chiefly owe their fame to the spring flowerings of azaleas and rhododendrons. Alternatively, head towards the other lake and visit the ancient **Cistercian Abbey of Piona**.

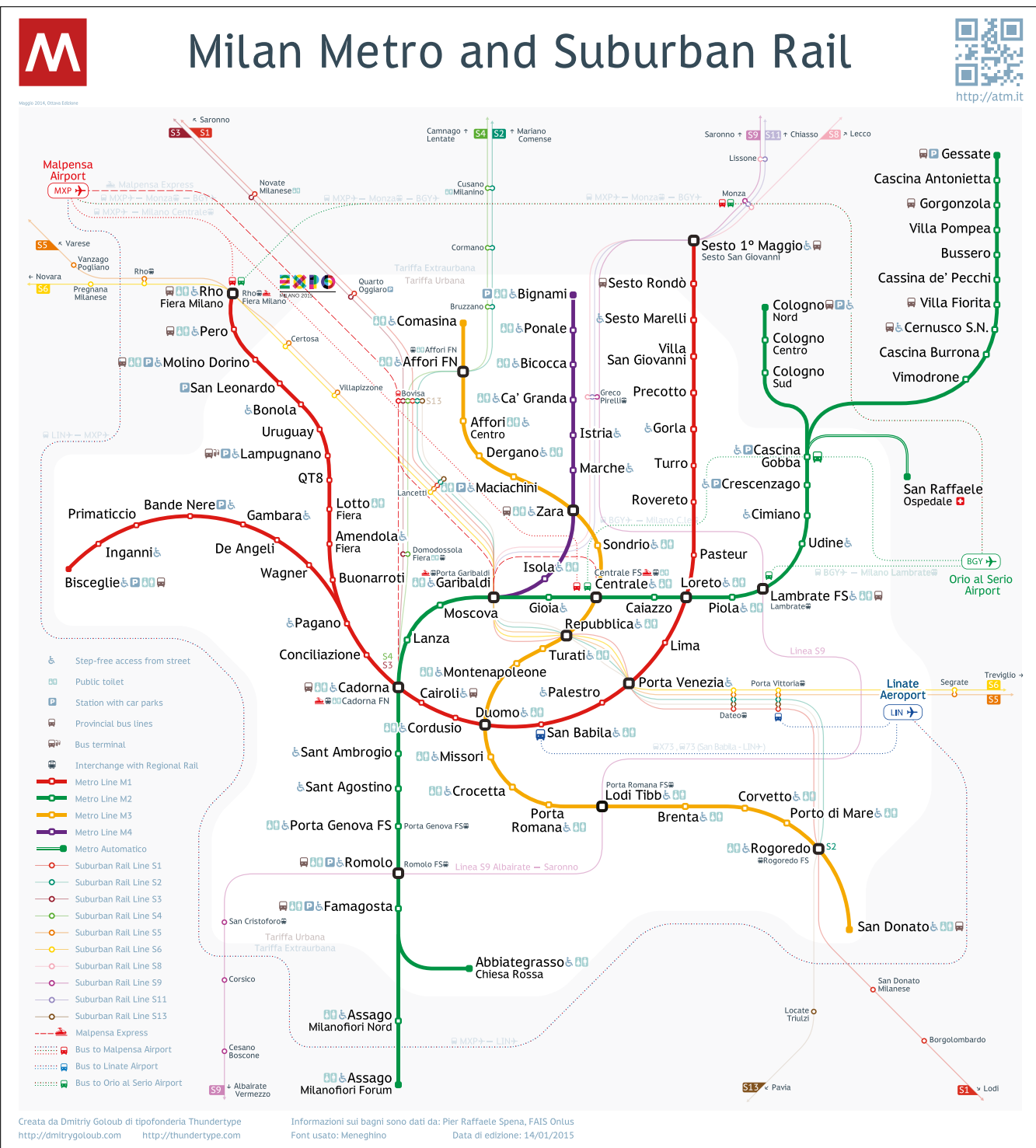
A little further on, but just as imposing, is **Lake Maggiore**, offering numerous cultural and naturalistic itineraries. Just near Stresa, for the more romantically inclined, we suggest a visit to the splendid **Borromean Islands: Isola Bella, Isola dei Pescatori and Isola Madre**. In just one day you can visit Isola Bella, home to Palazzo Borromeo and a terraced garden, the picturesque Isola dei Pescatori with its characteristic houses adorned with wooden balconies and Isola Madre, with its botanical garden featuring a number of rare species from all over the world. We also warmly recommend an excursion to the **botanical gardens of Villa Taranto**. Conversely, prior to your departure from Stresa, make sure to take off time to visit the **Eremo di S. Caterina**, an ancient 14th century monastery perched on the cliff overlooking the lake.
