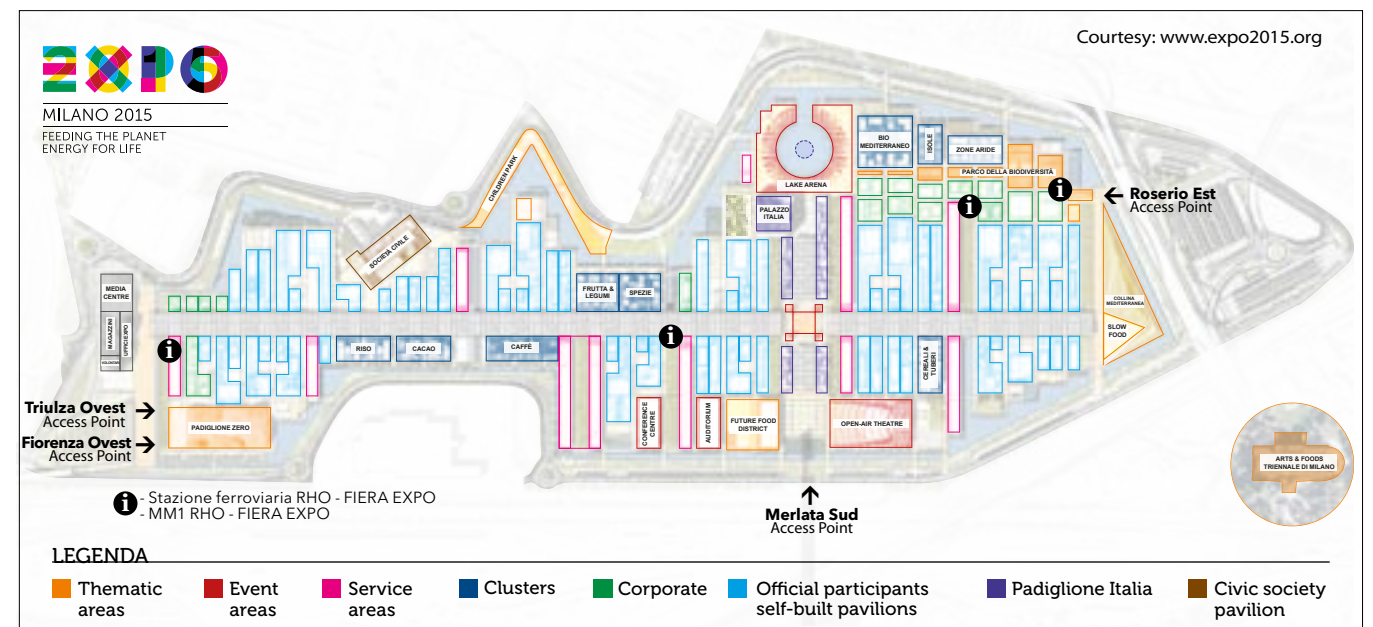

The Expo Site



How to reach the Expo site

Extending over approximately **one million square meters**, the Exposition site is located just **north-west of Milan** (a few kilometers from the center of the city), affording easy access to the city's **three airports** (Milano Malpensa, Milano Linate and Orio al Serio), as well as to the city's **main public transportation network**. Three transport links provide easy access to the Expo site:

- Trains** (Rho Fiera Milano station - roughly 20 minutes from Stazione Centrale and from Stazione Garibaldi). Visitors arriving by High-Speed trains can access the Exposition site via a new station at Porta Ovest, also served by suburban lines and two regional lines, connected in turn to the subway system.
- Taxis and Shuttle Buses** (entrance from Roserio Est access point with direct access on foot to the Expo Site);
- Metro M1 red line** (roughly 25 minutes from piazza Duomo, 2.5€ extra-urban ticket). The **Rho Fiera Expo Milano 2015** subway station is directly connected to the site via the **Fiorenza Ovest** access point.



Different types of cumulative and integrated tickets are available: a **5€ return ticket** offers visitors access to the Rho Fiera station either on the M1 line, or Trenord (railway) networks; a **daily 8€ ticket** valid for unlimited travel on both the ATM (Milan public transport) and Trenord networks and on the extra-urban subway (M1) and rail (S5 and S6) networks to and from Rho Fiera is also available. Furthermore, to avoid misunderstandings, ATM has issued a new urban ticket (1.50€) clearly marked with the wording **'Non valido per Rho Fiera/Not Valid for Rho Fiera'**. Finally, more **sports-oriented visitors can access the site by bicycle**. Expected travel time from the Duomo, Porta Venezia or Cadorna is about 45 minutes along the via Gallarate route.

In addition to the option of online purchase at www.expo2015.org and via the **Expo Milano 2015 Official App** (available from the Apple Store and Google Play), Expo tickets can also be purchased at the Expo Gate in via Beltrami, at the Milan Visitor Center (largo Cairoli corner of via Cusani), and on the www.zaniviaggi.it/expo2015 website. Check out the **various types of ticket options** available at www.expo2015.org. Each ticket is valid for one visit, for the entire day. The gates are **open from 10am until 11pm**. Various price options are available, depending on type of visitor, length of the visit and day (depending on whether you purchase an open or fixed-date ticket). Additionally, special packages for families with children, reduced price tickets for visitors over the age of 65, a Seasonal Pass, discounts for group visits and special prices for schools and the disabled are also available.

The Expo Gate

The Expo Gate is situated in Milan in the highly central via Beltrami and is strategically located **between the Castello Sforzesco and via Dante** (Map E4). Open daily from **10am to 8pm**, besides serving as an info and ticket point where visitors can obtain information about the event, purchase merchandise and buy tickets, it is also a meeting place hosting a rich program of events focused on promoting and developing international cultural synergies.

For the second time running (the first was in 1906 with 'only' 40 countries) Milan is embarking upon an adventure of international scope, bringing the world-at-large a totally innovative, one-of-a-kind event. Not simply an exhibition but a major event involving numerous players focusing on one singular theme: **'Feeding the Planet, Energy for Life'**. Based on their individual cultures and traditions, each country will be asked to examine its own position and offer solutions regarding the major challenges related to the future of food. A real journey in discovery of tastes. Visitors involved in this one-of-a-kind experience related to the complex topic of nutrition will have a chance to take **a real trip around the world** in discovery of the flavours and traditions of people from across the globe. Expo Milano 2015 will be the first Exposition in history to be remembered not only for its products but, above all, for its contribution to the ongoing education and debate on **nutrition, food** and the **planet's resources**. www.expo2015.org

THE EXPOSITION SITE

The design of the Expo site is inspired by the plan of a Roman 'castrum', shaped like a cross, with two large perpendicular streets, known as the **Cardo** and the **Decumano**.

The Exhibition site is located just a few kilometres from the centre of Milan, in an area boasting a well-developed infrastructure, and is easily accessible thanks to direct connections to the city's three airports (Linate, Malpensa and Orio al Serio) and highly efficient public transportation networks: Metropolitana Linea 1; autostrade A4 Torino-Milano-Venezia, A8/A9 Milano-Como-Chiasso and Milano-Varese, and Tangenziale ovest; and a high-speed rail connection in correspondence to the West gate. Simple and intuitive, the project will help visitors find their way around the area hosting events and exhibitions where they can sample the traditional enogastronomic specialities of people from all over the world. Expo's large main square, **Piazza Italia**, a symbolic place where Italy will meet the world, is situated at the intersection between the two streets.

The **Mediterranean Hill, Expo Centre**, the **Lake Arena** and the **Open Air Theatre**, a large space dedicated to open-air events, designed to accommodate approximately 11,000 people on its lawn and tiered seating,

during concerts, performances and official ceremonies, are situated at the four ends of the Cardo and Decumano. Solar panels have been installed in the structure covering the stage so that the energy required to generate power for performances can be recovered, if necessary even from renewable sources.

TO EACH THEME A ROUTE

The central theme 'Feeding the Planet, Energy for Life' encompasses **five thematic routes** that connect the areas and spaces within the Exhibition site: 'The Story of Mankind, stories of food'; 'Feast and famine: a contemporary paradox'; 'The future of food'; 'Sustainable food = an equitable world'; 'Taste is knowledge'.

Additionally, **five Thematic Areas** interpret the leitmotif of Expo with themed exhibition spaces designed to involve old and young alike, serving as both an educational and sensorial experience. Developed by prestigious international curators, they are located at the main entrances and other key points of the Expo site: Pavilion Zero, Future Food District, Children Park, Biodiversity Park and Arts & Foods.

» **WHO IS FOODY?** He is the whimsical mascot of Expo Milano 2015 who embodies the key themes of the event in a positive, original and empathetic manner. Foody represents the community, diversity and food in the broadest sense of the term, a source of life and energy. It comprises a family of eleven different elements, acting as real characters in their own right which, by being expressed as a single face, represent an ideal synergy between countries of the world.

EXPO AMBASSADORS

Who are Expo Ambassadors? They are the **spokespeople elected to relay the message of the event.** Each Ambassador has interpreted what the global theme of Expo means to either him or her: they have made Expo their own in a bid to embrace, share and transfer their knowledge. Writers, athletes, philosophers, entertainers, actors, creatives, architects, designers, chefs, musicians, singers and directors from all over the world have embraced this role and accepted the challenge of endorsing the event. INTERNATIONAL PAVILIONS

More than 150,000 square metres of the Exhibition site are devoted to countries who have decided to set up and build their own **Pavilions** (i.e. self-built pavilions) **along the main road known as World Avenue.** A layout designed to offer maximum exposure featuring futuristic architecture and a skyline of self-built pavilions set against a unique backdrop. Entitled **Identità Expo**, it is a large event within an event featuring distinctive haute cuisine. Once a week, starred Italian and international chefs will take turns to offer their creations at an exclusive, stylish location with a view over the Decumano. Always in the Decumano, colossus **Eataly** will set up a space dedicated to 20 regional restaurants. Designed to accommodate more than 1,500 diners, several of our country's best restaurants will interpret Italian gastronomy.

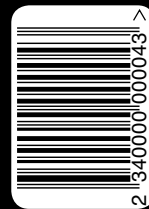

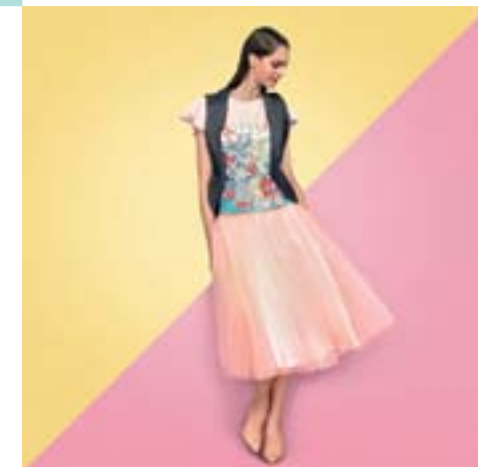

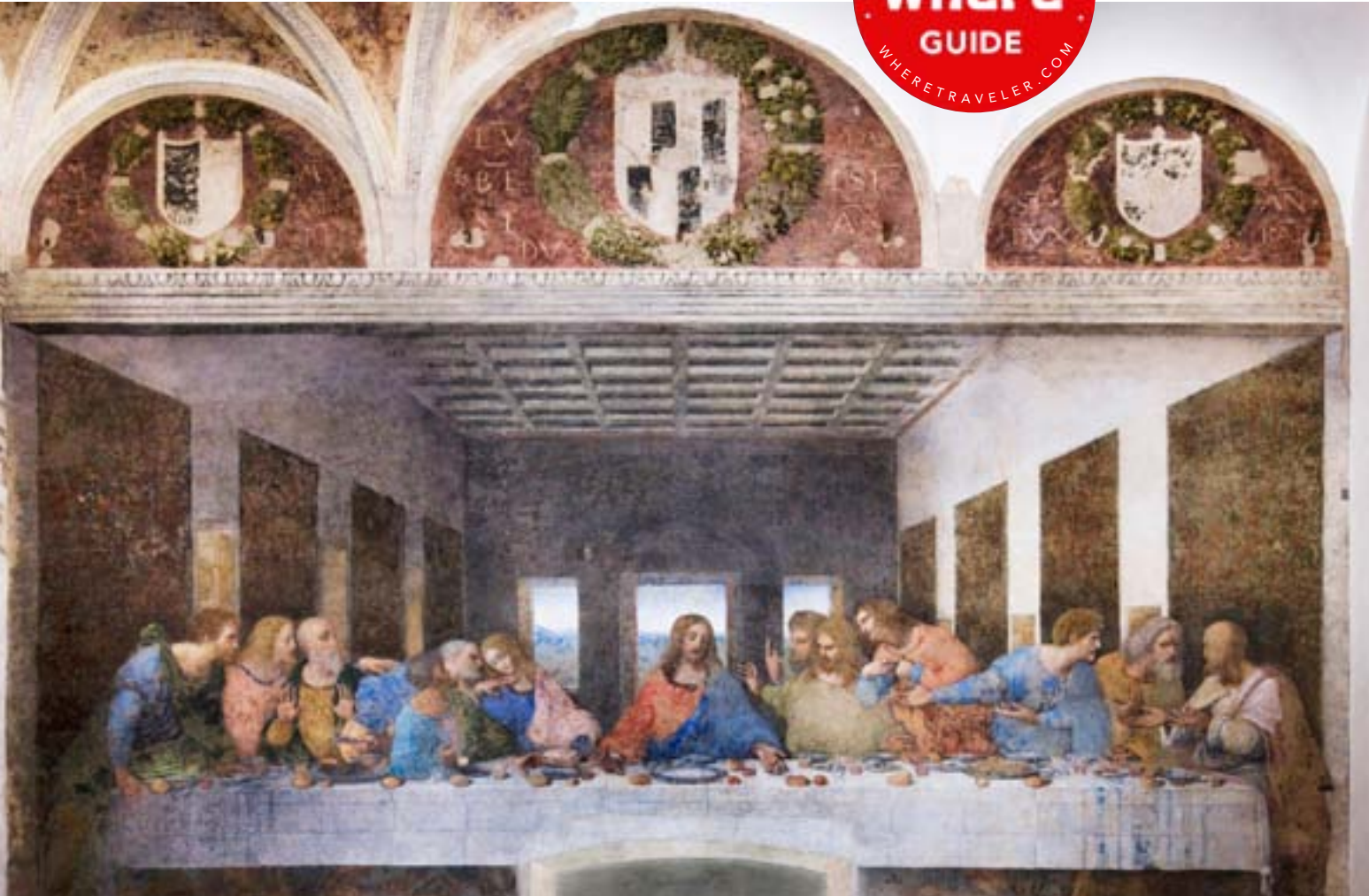

The Last Supper

The convent of Santa Maria delle Grazie hosts one of the most famous attractions in the world: Leonardo da Vinci's *Last Supper*. By **Diana Orlando**

Among the most famous masterpieces of **Renaissance art in Italy**, this is a large mural painting in which Christ announces that he will be betrayed by one of his apostles.

At the end of the 15th century, Ludovico il Moro, at that time Duke of Milan, commissioned Leonardo with the painting. Leonardo began work on the Last Supper in 1496 and completed it in 1498. The somewhat lengthy time spent on the painting reflects the meticulous attention that he dedicated to his works.

In fact, he experimented with an **innovative pictorial technique**. Rather than hastily applying a mixture of colours and water to fresh plaster, the usual technique for frescoes, he used a medium with oil and tempera which allowed him to paint not

only more slowly but also **directly on the wall**. Unfortunately, his chosen medium doomed the painting to fade and peel, thus compromising its state of conservation.

NEW OPENINGS. Duomo
Among one of the most important Gothic buildings in the world, the church, constructed on and off over a period of 450 years (begun 1386) is the symbol of Milan. Built in the shape of a Latin cross, the cathedral is divided by soaring pillars into five naves, the largest of which measures 45 metres in height and has 135 spires. The cathedral is open daily 7am-7pm. The recently renovated Grande Museo del Duomo (see listing at the MUSEUMS section) houses hundreds of works of art dating from the 15th century to the present day.

Montenapoleone District

Teatro alla Scala

DramaTram, the city takes to the stage

Milan now boasts a new form of tourism, art and entertainment, where the tram becomes a stage on which to showcase the history of the city. From the EXPO of 1906 to that of 2015, passing through two World Wars, revolutions, bombings and rebirths. The next stop: the early years of the twentieth century, featuring a totally different city from Milan as we know it today. 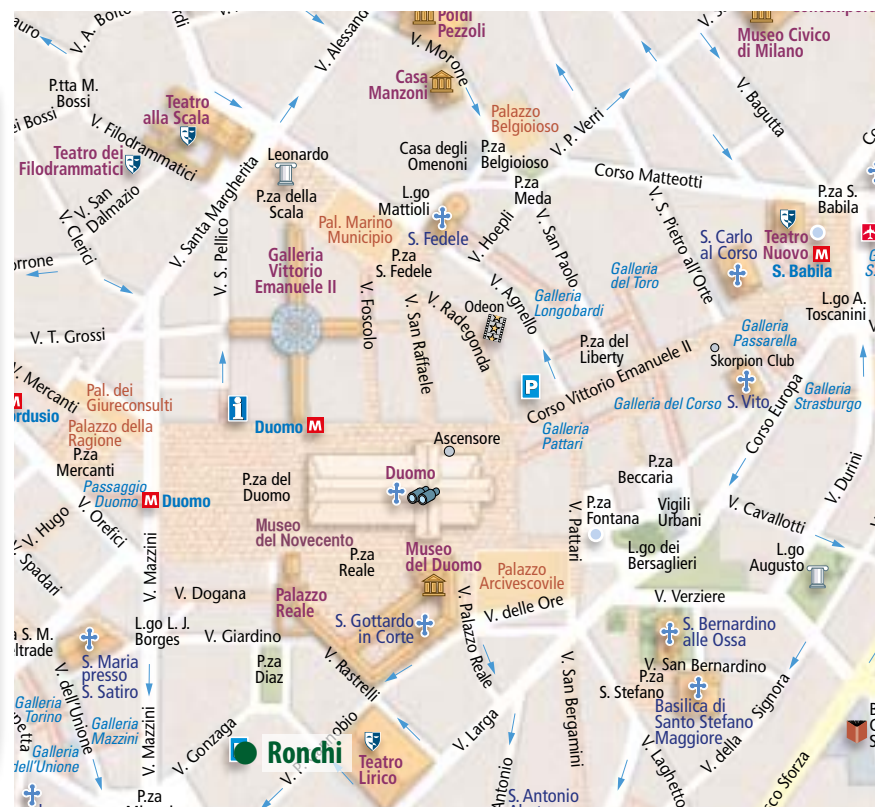

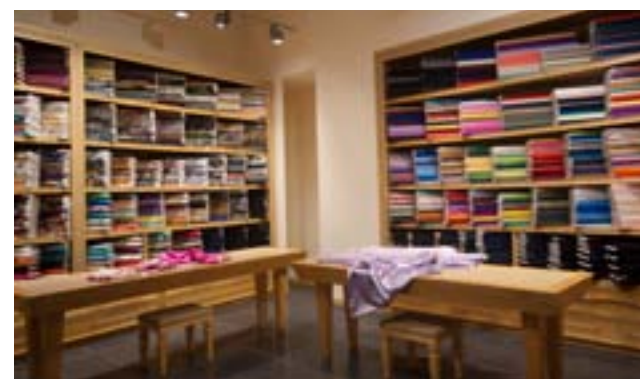

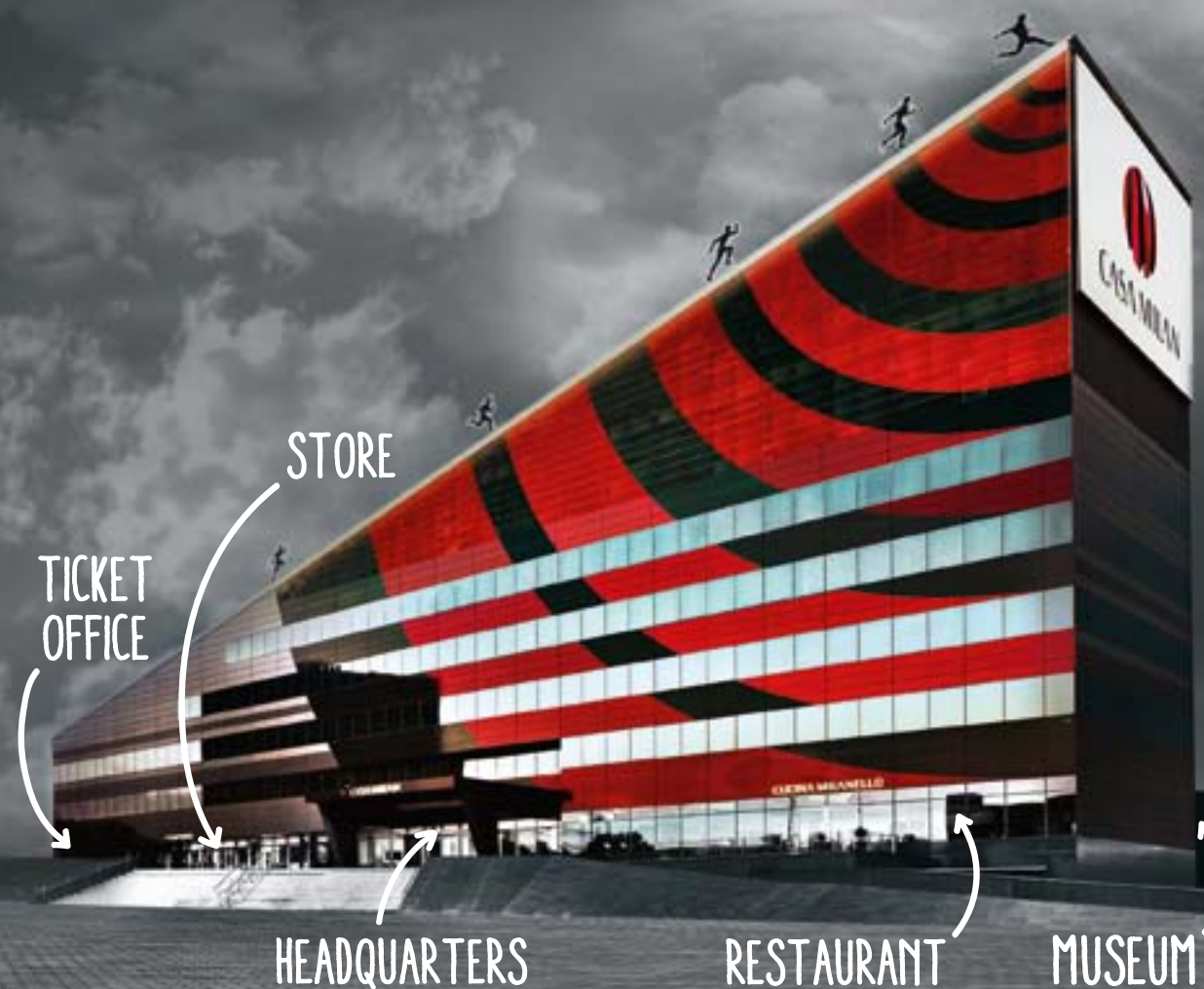

Maybe you've just seen **Leonardo's Last Supper** and are in need of a relaxing walk to ward off the possible onset of Stendhal's syndrome. Maybe you've got just one hour before seeing a musical at **Teatro Nazionale** or maybe your hotel happens to be located in the neighbourhood. Or, maybe you simply wish to take a stroll through one of Milan's less touristic areas. Finally, walking towards Sant'Ambrogio, don't miss a visit to the famed Belgian chocolate atelier **Neuhaus**.

Milan's double life

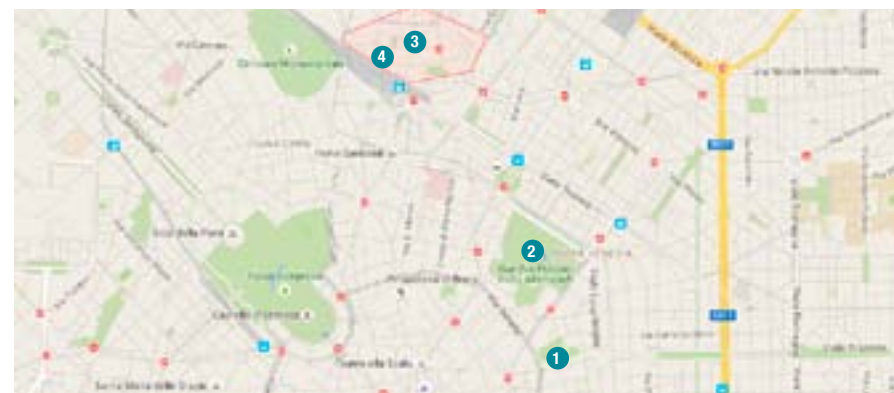
Or in discovery of courtyards and gardens hidden behind entry doors. By **Federica Raggio**

If you enjoy discovering the unexpected, if you're curious, if you love glamour but also all things bucolic, if you're a city dweller but also a lover of the countryside, then Milan is the place to be. This is a city of fabulous contradictions. In just one weekend, while strolling through the streets brimming over with stunning gems of architecture and chic shops, you can discover hidden oases of peace denoting the parallel life of the city.

Marvellous courtyards in all neighbourhoods reveal the other side of the city: in corso Venezia, the gardens of aristocratic palaces such as **Palazzo Isimbardi** and **Casa Fontana Silvestri (1)**, right up to the **Gardens of Porta Venezia (2)**; along the **Cinque Vie** and in **Brera**, the workshops of artisans and antique dealers and prêt-à-porter, on the **Naviglio Grande** the ateliers of artists and in **Corso San Gottardo**, the remains of old factories. The **Isola district (3)** and the area of **via Tortona** are home to creative design spaces such as, for example, the workshop of **Costanza Algranti (4)** while Lambrate boasts an unexpected array of art galleries.

Courtyards, however, are no longer simply used as work spaces or decorative elements. Nowadays, you can even dine in some of them, possibly while taking shelter from the heat in the shade of a flowering tree. Though not easy to track down, for an unmissable wholly local experience, head to the southern outskirts of the city. Formerly home to farmhouses and fields, abbeys and monasteries, they now house several of the city's most picturesque restaurants: **Erba Brusca**, **Shambala** and

4Cento. However, the oldest and the one most closely associated with the history of Milan is undoubtedly **Al Garghet**: a DOC Milanese trattoria whose building dates back to the 13th century. For those who prefer the amenities of the more conveniently located city centre, the chaotic **Piazzale of the Station of Porta Genova** holds a number of surprises in store. Although the district offers hundreds of alternatives, the best of them all is to be found at number 3.

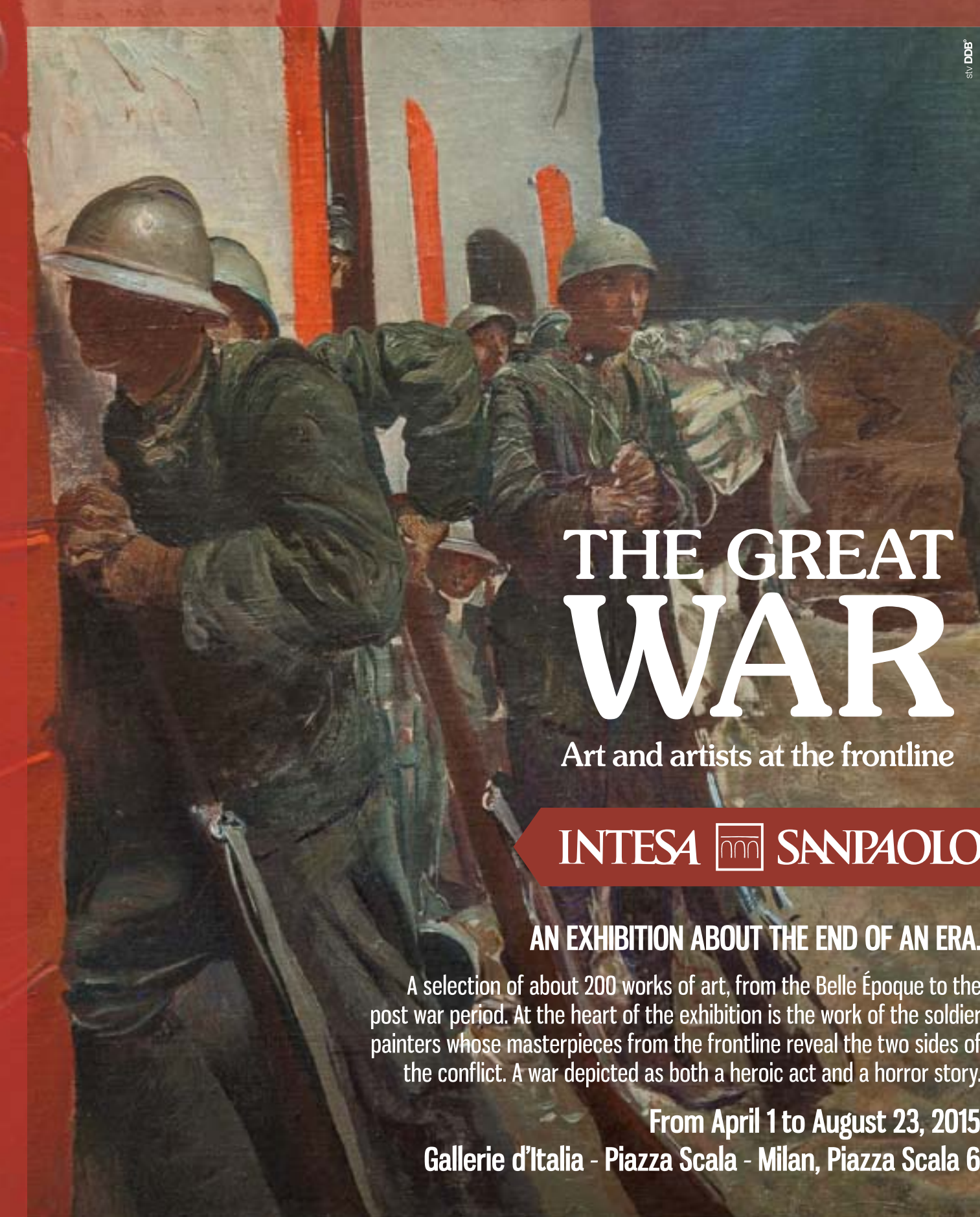

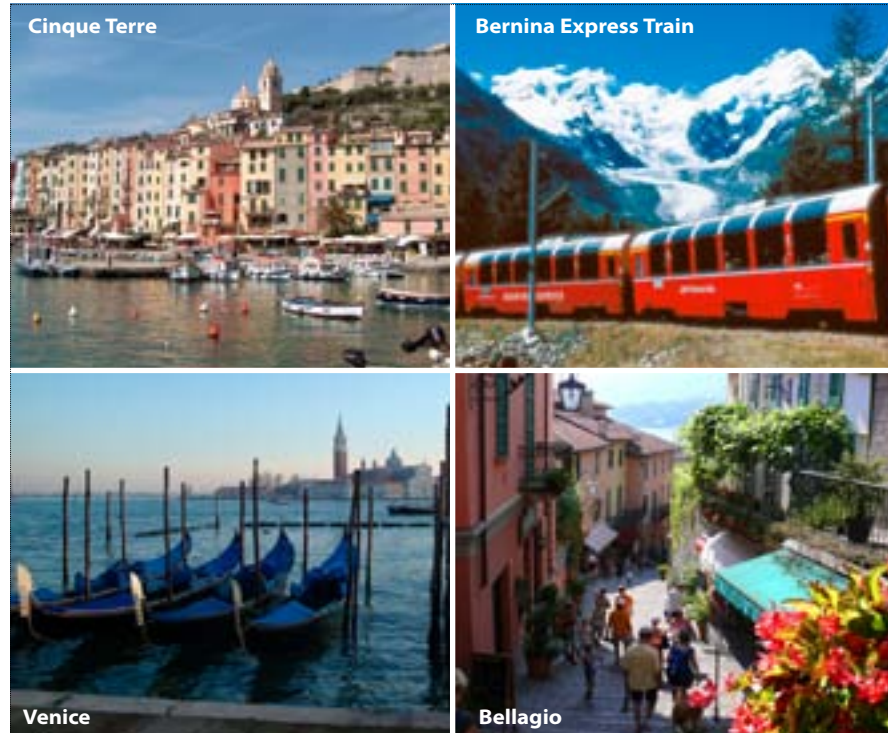

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Tasting wine is getting to know its story

Wine is the perfect companion to many nice moments of our life. It can be a toast for a wedding, it can be a refreshing white for a summer picnic, it can be a nice glass of red while relaxing on the sofa. Choosing the right wines will make us live our experiences to the fullest. The basics of tasting can help in our choice.

Sharing emotions through wine

I enjoy looking at wine through different eyes. They are the eyes of people who come to Italy from all over the world to taste our special 'flavor'.

My work is a constant discovery. During a tasting, while deciding with which wine to start, an American client of mine gave her simple solution "Let's start from the best one", explaining that usually, at her home, she offers the best wine first so people get drunk and then they do not understand that the other ones are not as good. I thought I had to deal with questions like "What wine can I match with my favorite food?" "Where can I store my wines at home?"... Instead I was asked: "In which phase of the production is the strawberry fragrance added into the wine?" The stranger the questions, the more I understood that

consumers are different every time and that their curiosity toward the nectar of Bacchus is sincere and total. In my conversations with new clients, I often get the impression that for them wine is a wonderful alchemy, which always maintains an aura of mystery as if it were a magical potion. And this is because there is nobody who really takes time to explain to them what wine is. They say that I invented a new profession: I am a Personal Wine Shopper. What do I do? I support people in the purchases of wine, I organize wine trips and tailor-made food and wine experiences. I create events in which people can learn and share their emotions about wine. I assist

them in finding the right selections for dinners and weddings. Have I invented this? I would say that it came naturally to my mind ... This profession was born from my passion for wine and the joy of sharing it with others, from my sunny personality and from the observation that there are only two things that I can't resist buying: books and wine. Why am I doing it? Because it's who I am. Because I want to share with people a more lively and healthy lifestyle using Italian wine and food as emotional companions of our life so that everybody can enjoy spending time together enriching their cultural knowledge and pleasing their palates.

I consider myself cosmopolitan: I was born in Veneto, I moved to Tuscany to further develop my wine expertise. Now I live between Italy and New York by choice of the heart. I studied Marketing and Management for the wine sector at the University of Florence. Since then, I have been working for various wineries getting to know many different aspects of my field from hospitality to sales and communication. I founded Personal Wine Shopper in 2012 to guide wine lovers in discovery of the amazing wines of Italy, its producers and its hidden pearls, i.e. its small villages and landscapes. I always say that wine is lived, not learned. With this I mean that wine has to be enjoyed and not looked upon as a mysterious potion to be studied. It is just wine! Tasting is a subjective moment. It is influenced by our own experience. People have a different sense of smell, more or less refined, but usually, at the first sniff, we all perceive the strongest scents and the ones that we can associate with something. Olfactory memory is very powerful but every person has his/her own. So it can be possible that you won't recognize the scent that your partner is smelling in the same wine! So why learn how to taste? What is the purpose? Tasting a wine has also an objective part and this can really be useful. Analyzing the wine with the senses can tell you if the wine is correct (meaning without faults) and what its characteristics are. Understanding what we are drinking can help us make decisions about the most suitable pairings with food and, why not, also to evaluate whether the price is fair or if there are discrepancies between the quality and what we are paying for.

But, most important, tasting a wine will tell us its story: where it comes from, which grapes have been used, how the weather in that vintage was, how the winemaker decided to produce it. The standard tasting has 5 steps which involve the sense of sight, smell, taste, and somehow even touch. To make them easier to remember, they are often called "the 5 S's".

See
Hold the glass up in front of your eyes, and tilt it slightly. The color of the wine can tell you something about its age, where it comes from, and its concentration. Wines from northern, cooler climates tend to be lighter in color (color not as intense) as wines from warmer, southern climates.

Swirl
Swirling the wine in your glass aerates it, bringing oxygen into the wine and allowing it to release its aroma. Reminder: it's best not to completely fill the glass, so you'll have room to swirl the wine around.

Smell
Smelling is one of the key moments of wine tasting. Flaws usually can be identified immediately: the wine will smell dull and stale. Take a sniff and try to name the scents: they can be flowers, fruits, spices and vegetables. They can even be associated with animals, leather, tobacco or stones. The list of possible fragrances is really long! The combination of the aromas is called bouquet or nose of the wine.

Sip
Sip in order to bring out the full flavor of the wine to the palate. Be sure to move the wine around in your mouth to cover all of your taste buds. You'll be able to taste the fruit and varietal characteristics, the acidity, the tannins, and the aftertaste. A long, pleasing aftertaste, or finish, is a sign of a quality wine.

Swallow (or spit)
Professional tasters usually spit, especially if they have many wine glasses in front of them. But swallowing is the perfect conclusion to savoring the taste of the wine and having the whole experience.

» START TASTING WITH...

When tasting white wines, start from dry to sweet. On the other hand, if you're into reds, make sure to progress from light to full-bodied. Some of the best Italian white wines come from Friuli Venezia Giulia, a region in the north-east of Italy. **Attems** is a winery in the heart of Friuli, the quality and personality of whose wines serve as a true expression of this area. Its astute selection of whites and reds make for a good start when practising with tastings.

For example, allow yourself to be seduced by the beauty of the colour of Pinot Grigio Ramato. Its name derives from the ancient documents of the Republic of Venice, in which the term 'ramato' referred to Pinot Grigio in contracts. Its magnificent colour stems from a special wine-making process in which the juice spends extended time (in this case, 12 hours) on the skins, to give the wine its distinctive coppery hue. Boasting an intense, fruity bouquet, Ramato is a rich, crisp wine.

Wine to collect

Which is the right investment to give more value to your money? Gold? Diamonds? Art? I find it really interesting to invest in wines: in the worst case scenario, you can enjoy it with your loved ones! Your goal is to "buy low, sell high". So, looking for luxury bottles, keep in mind which factors can affect the price.

- > **Limited Quantity** - Most of the best wines are produced by a single vineyard, from the few, most prized hectares of the estate. Only a few thousand bottles are produced for distribution all over the world. Therefore, you cannot but be really proud of being one of the owners of these rarities.
- > **Vintages** - Vintages with favorable harvest conditions (or whose wines have developed well over time) almost always attract higher prices.
- > **Ageing potential** - Old doesn't automatically mean expensive, but the ageing capacity is taken into consideration when assessing the overall value of the wine.

TOP QUALITY. Luxury has many subjective definitions, not always linked to price. Italy produces many exceptional wines, well known all over the world. Here are my suggestions for some iconic wines, the ones I had the luck to taste!



TENUTE LUCE DELLA VITE

Luce > The radiant sun on the label represents the Divine Light, the most powerful strength that gives life. Luce is an outsider from the famous area of Montalcino, a blend that mixes the Tuscan Sangiovese with the international Merlot. A wine and a story to discover.

TUA RITA

Redigaffi > This 100% Merlot is a friend that I met on the Tuscan Coast and that has never left my heart; a great wine from a small family winery that remains humble and passionate about their land. A wine that speaks to the soul.



GIACOMO CONTERNO

Monfortino Riserva > Nebbiolo, the grape of this Barolo, is a mysterious and charming storyteller of the hills in Piedmont. Conterno chooses to craft his "normale" Monfortino with only best years and his Monfortino Riserva even more rarely. A wine expression of the territory.



FRATELLI LUNELLI

Giulio Ferrari Riserva > Luxury sparkling wines usually originate from Champagne. I think this is a good example of what Italians can achieve. Available in a limited edition, it has a perfect perlage, a wonderful nose and an excellent quality/price ratio: for me, this is luxury.



Wine to drink

A wine doesn't have to be expensive to be good. Italy offers a really wide "shelf" from which you can choose delicious labels within a fair price range. What do you need to have a basic but complete private cellar?

- > First of all, **some bubbles!** Sparkling wines are versatile and everybody loves them. You can keep them in your storage area and chill them in the fridge or in a bucket of ice before serving them. Some Italian labels to try: Franciacorta, Oltrepo Pavese, Trento DOC, Prosecco.
- > Then, a few **white wines.** I suggest buying and drinking them as soon as possible, don't keep a large quantity, most of the time they are meant to be drunk young. Choose from among Gavi, Vermentino, Soave and many others besides.
- > **Light reds** are good for many meals. Barbera, Dolcetto, Valpolicella, Montepulciano are some names you could look for. Store them horizontally in a cool place.
- > You should buy also **some reds with a good ageing potential.** However, keep in mind that they require special attention otherwise you might run the risk of waiting many years before actually tasting a wonderful wine only to discover that, in the meantime, it has lost its flavour. Although these important reds often cost more than € 20, they are worth the outlay! Ask for Chianti Riserva, Brunello di Montalcino, Barolo and Amarone. One trick to check how well they age is to buy several bottles of the same kind and taste one of them every year.
- > Insofar as **sweet wines** are concerned, I suggest keeping just few bottles and drinking them when you need to treat yourself.

BEST VALUES. There are so many good wines in Italy that it is difficult to choose! The whole magazine won't have enough space to present them all. Here some ideas to start to know a little about Italian wines, without emptying your wallet.



BERTE & CORDINI

Cruasé > Oltrepo Pavese is an emerging area and some sparkling wines are really a kick! This Rosé is 100% Pinot noir and mixes nuances of yeasts and crusty bread together with fragrances of strawberry and wild berry. € 16



AGRICOLE VALLONE

Vigna Flaminio Riserva > Negroamaro is now a very popular varietal from the South. This one comes from Brindisi, the heart of Salento, on the heel of Italy. It is blended with Montepulciano: it's an explosion of fruity and spicy notes. € 11



POGGIO VENTOSO

Poetico > The Tuscan Coast deserves a tour: this wonderful white, produced close to the sea, will treat you with intense notes of citrus fruits, elderberry flowers, as well as smoky and mineral tones. € 13



BOSCO DEL MERLO

Prosecco Millesimato > Prosecco is really trendy now. It's refreshing, easy to drink, fun! This one will always surprise you with notes of apple, pear and flowery hints. This millesimato is wonderful as aperitif. € 15

TORRE ROSAZZA

Ribolla Gialla DOC > Ribolla Gialla is one of the most ancient native vines of Friuli. Fresh and elegant, its clean floral scents suggest melon and a light hint of citrus. Excellent as aperitif and with starters in general. € 12,50 €

Nuragus I fiori > Sardinia has good food, wild natural surroundings and breathtaking seascapes! Nuragus is one of the most ancient grape of the island. This one by Pala will enchant you with its delicately fruity perfume. € 9

GENOA AND THE AQUARIUM

Since time immemorial the charm of this city of sea and hills, a crossroads of different peoples and cultures, has attracted the attention of writers, poets and singers/songwriters who have described its beauty in their verses. The walls of this old maritime republic hide remarkable traces of its glorious past (from monuments to historic workshops right up to its picturesque "carruggi"), but also bold, modern works that have made it a sort of capital of modern Italian architecture. The jewel in its crown is the **Aquarium**, the largest in Italy and the second largest in Europe after Valencia's aquarium in Spain. Covering a surface area of as many as 9,700 sq.m, the exhibition takes visitors in discovery of the Aquarium's 71 tanks housing an amazing array of fish and reptile species. Particularly worthy

of note are its five large pools, viewable from both floors of the aquarium, housing dolphins, sharks, seals, manatees and turtles as well as countless other marine species.

VIGEVANO

Surrounded by the woods of the Ticino Park, Vigevano's main attraction is its famous **piazza Ducale**, described by revered composer Arturo Toscanini as a "a symphony on four sides". Designed by Bramante with the assistance of Leonardo da Vinci, piazza Ducale, one of the longest and most majestic in Europe, served as a stately forecourt to the town's imposing Castle. A city of art but also of water, Vigevano is crossed by the Ticino river and by canals that offer views and natural

oases of breathtaking beauty. However, the city is also renowned throughout the world as Italy's shoemaking capital (don't miss a visit to the International Footwear Museum).

THE "NEW" EGYPTIAN MUSEUM IN TURIN

The second most important Egyptian museum in the world after the one in Cairo, the Museum in Turin is slated to become one of the most important attractions in the world. Completely renovated in anticipation of Expo, following three-and-a-half years of in-depth restoration works, the exhibition spaces have been nearly doubled and the new displays show items in chronological order including magnificent installations curated by Italian set designer Dante Ferretti. Spread out over four floors at the historic Palazzo dell'Accademia delle Scienze, the ultra-modern displays cover a period of more than 4,000 years, from the 4th century BC to the 3rd century AD. The museum hosts more than 30,000 artefacts, from the Paleolithic to the Coptic era. Innovative features include the option of browsing the rooms with tablet or smartphone devices to translate the inscriptions in hieroglyphics in real time.
