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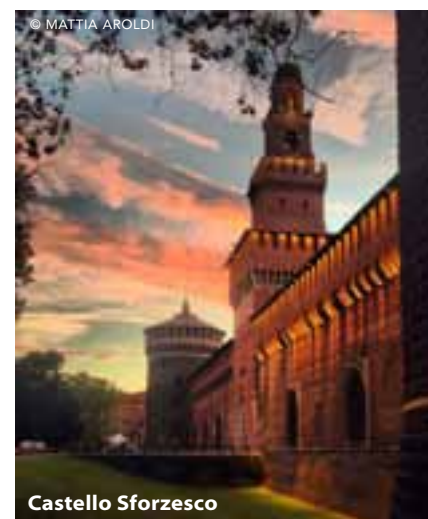

Traces of Giotto's artistic heritage are still visible both in Milan and throughout the rest of Lombardy, including San Gottardo al Palazzo, Chiaravalle, Viboldone, Sant'Abbondio in Como. While in Milan, besides ogling the glittering window displays of designer boutiques, fashion lovers can also visit the numerous restaurants and venues owned by big-name brands. Find out which ones!

Be it a quick business lunch, an aperitivo in the company of friends or a romantic dinner, Milan truly has lots to offer. Upscale Italian cuisine can, in fact, be found at numerous locations renowned for their style, elegance and originality. Often, what makes them even more special is the fact that they are owned by big-name fashion brands. Discover which ones!

FOOTSTEPS AWAY FROM THE GOLDEN TRIANGLE

As many know, multi-talented designer Giorgio Armani has not limited himself to expressing his creativity solely in fashion. In fact, at number 31 via Manzoni, it is impossible not to notice his elegant Armani/Hotel which mirrors the minimalist style typical of the brand to perfection. Inside, you will find the **Armani/Bamboo Bar** and the sought-after **Armani/Ristorante**, which not only offers an unparalleled view over the glittering window displays of the Quadrilatero but also authentic Italian

cuisine upgraded with an international twist. Standouts include the restaurant's special menu dedicated to truffles, skillfully interpreted by the venue's Executive Chef. (milan.armanihotels.com). Lying next door is the designer's sophisticated Japanese restaurant **Nobu Milan**. Opened in 2000 and located within the Emporio Armani Store, it faces onto the peaceful and aristocratic neighborhood of via Pisoni. Chef/owner Nobu Matsuhisa draws upon his classical training from sushi bars in Tokyo and his travels around the world to bring discerning diners a whole new trend in Japanese cuisine (www.noburestaurants.com). But that's not all! Armani's portfolio of hospitality venues also includes the **Emporio Armani Caffè** (overlooking piazzetta Croce Rossa) and **Armani/Dolci** (via Manzoni 31,

www.armanidolci.com), a boutique dedicated to only the finest Italian confectionery. Just a short distance from the 'Armani neighbourhood,' **Bulgari**, another fashion giant, boasts one of Milan's most luxurious five-star hotels, located in a private street between via Montenapoleone and via della Spiga. Those in search of a trendy aperitivo should make sure to head to its beautifully manicured private garden, a rejuvenating oasis of peace and relaxation set within the heart of vibrant Milan. Alternately, at its restaurant you will find a creative re-interpretation of Italian cuisine, characterized by a harmonious blend of well-balanced yet contrasting flavours, infused with a touch of divertissement and aesthetic research by its new Executive Chef Roberto Di Pinto (www.bulgarihotels.com).

Also located in the centre of the city, the food space of the iconic 'greyhound brand' can be found at **Il Ristorante Trussardi alla Scala**, overlooking piazza della Scala, just footsteps away from the famed Opera House. Boasting a meld of elegance, style and taste, it goes without saying that this is the perfect dining place for fashionable gourmets! The location was, in fact, chosen as the only showcase in Italy for several iconic 'sakes' produced by 5 Japanese companies of the 'Japan Rice and Rice Industry Export Promotion Association' which were not only featured on the restaurant's wine list but also offered as an aperitivo or on a 'by the glass' basis (www.trussardiallascala.com). Just a little further on, in via Manzoni, we find **Larte**, a project inspired by Fondazione Altagamma: a café, a chocolate shop and a gourmet restaurant but also an art gallery, where customers can feast their eyes on designer furniture and artworks, all unique pieces, from Castiglioni to Molino, that can either be admired or purchased... not only a gourmet destination but also an upscale concept store (www.lartemilano.com). Last but not least, irreverent fashion brand **Dolce & Gabbana** has partnered with Martini to bring us its stunning **Bar Martini and Martini Bistrot**. Boasting an atmosphere reminiscent of Milanese restaurants of the '50s, it features Baroque details, Damask wallpaper and red velvet chairs. Above all, the Martini bistrot serves international cuisine infused with authentic Sicilian flavors that will delight even the most discerning palates. (corso Venezia 15, www.dolcegabbana.it/martini).

NEW LOCATIONS IN VIA MONTENAPOLEONE

Two new taste locations recently opened their doors in the heart of the city's glossiest fashion street. The first is **Pasticceria Marchesi** (Prada Group), which chose to open its new outpost here, the second addition to its historic venue in corso Magenta. In addition to the traditional Marchesi selection, the new shop has now enlarged its offer which nevertheless remains true to its style and impeccable quality: 38 luminous display cases lined with crystal shelves and elegant cherry wood counters accentuate its exquisite creations in an aesthetically-pleasing pastel-coloured ambience (www.pasticceriamarchesi.it). Footsteps away from Marchesi is the LVMH Moët Hennessy Louis Vuitton-owned **Cova Pasticceria**, another legendary city haunt. Thanks to its strategic position in the heart of the Golden Triangle, this venue is a true Milanese classic. Established as a pasticceria, it also offers a house aperitivo: an infusion of herbs and flowers based on a secret recipe (<http://pasticceriacova.it>). The other new kid on the block (at number 19)



Il Ristorante Trussardi alla Scala

is the **Doriani Montenapoleone Café Restaurant**, the brand's third address in the Quadrilatero after its other two boutiques. The philosophy of the new restaurant is based on a combination of gourmet cuisine and sophisticated service in a refined, relaxing atmosphere. The menus, different for lunch and dinner, are centred around colour and pay tribute to Mediterranean cuisine (www.doriani.it).

GLAMOROUS INNOVATIONS

The irreverent 'twins of fashion' Dean and Dan Caten, the founders of Dsquared2, are the latest designers to have joined the fashion-restaurant trend with their **Ceresio 7** venue (which takes its name from the eponymous address). Its plus points include a spectacular view from its rooftop pool club over the futuristic Varesine complex and the UniCredit building, its glamorous interior design and, last but not least, the superb cuisine of chef Elio Sironi (www.ceresio7.com). In the innovative piazza Gae Aulenti **The Stage** is the name of the restaurant housed inside multi-experience store Replay. Here, taste after taste, diners have the impression of being on a luxury yacht: at its sushi bar, at its wine bar with champagne lounge, in its VIP room or at the counter of its Octavius Bar (www.replaythestage.com). Inside parco Sempione, at the foot of the Branca Tower, you will find designer Roberto Cavalli's famous **Just Cavalli**, a cult address on the Milanese nightlife scene. This luxe restaurant mirrors the designer's inimitable style with leopard-print cushions, black furnishings and crystal walls. (milano.cavalliclub.com).

An aperitivo with a view

Terrazza 12 (at The Brian&Barry Building in San Babila), the new reference point for entertainment in the city, dominates the beating heart of Milan with a spectacular view over the Madonnina and the new skyline. A must-visit stopover for those visiting Milan is **la Rinascente**, on whose 7th floor, in addition to countless other options, you can sip an array of inebriating aperitivi while enjoying a one-of-a-kind view over the spires of the Duomo. The ideal spot to enjoy an indulgent pause from shopping, a great place to meet friends or organize an unusual event. Just a little further on, the **Duomo 21 Terrace, Restaurant & Lounge** awaits you. Its menu includes everything from casual pub fare to fine dining entrees, a vast array of the finest cocktails and a great selection of international wines and beers. Lastly, the new **Terrazza** on the top floor of the **Excelsior Hotel Gallia**, offers a selection of trendy new cocktails created by a team of professional mixologists, accompanied by a series of tantalizing nibbles, serving as a prelude to what you will find on the hotel's menu later on in the evening.

The capital of fashion, design and innovation, Milan offers the very best in entertainment. To experience the city like a real Milanese it's essential to have tried the Aperitivo tradition with a capital 'A' at least once. Fortunately Milan boasts an exploding Aperitivo scene meaning that you'll have no difficulty when it comes to choosing the one best-suited to your tastes. Walk through the streets of the city centre in the shadow of the **Duomo** or its quainter districts including **Brera**, **Porta Nuova**, the **Arco della Pace** or the **Navigli**, now further enhanced by the recently revamped **Darsena**. 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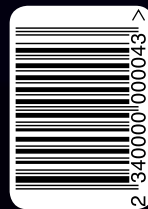

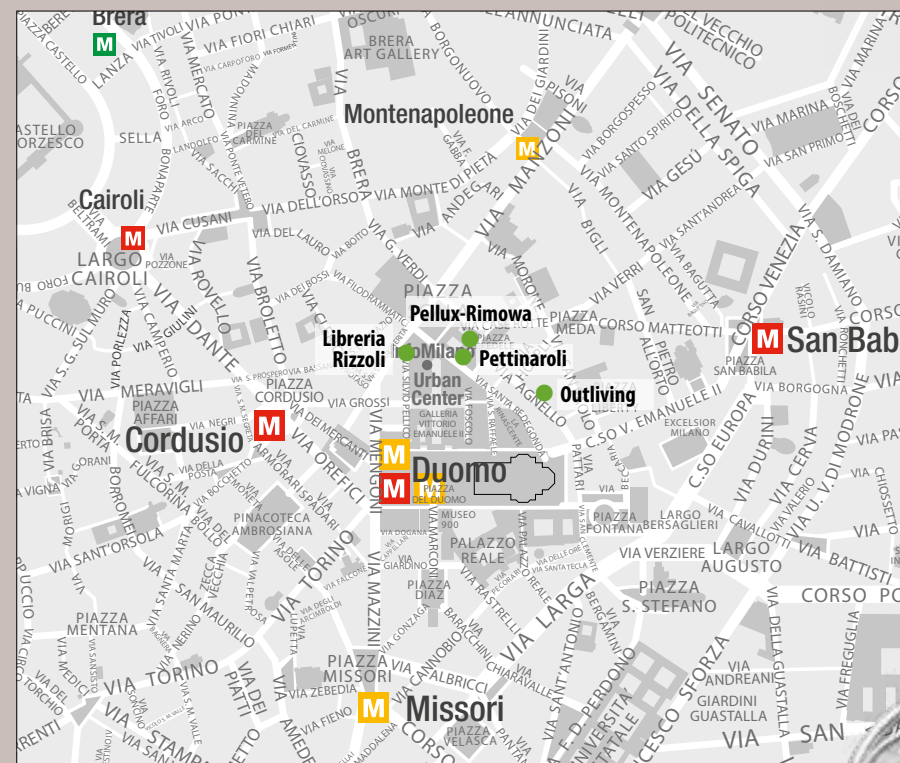

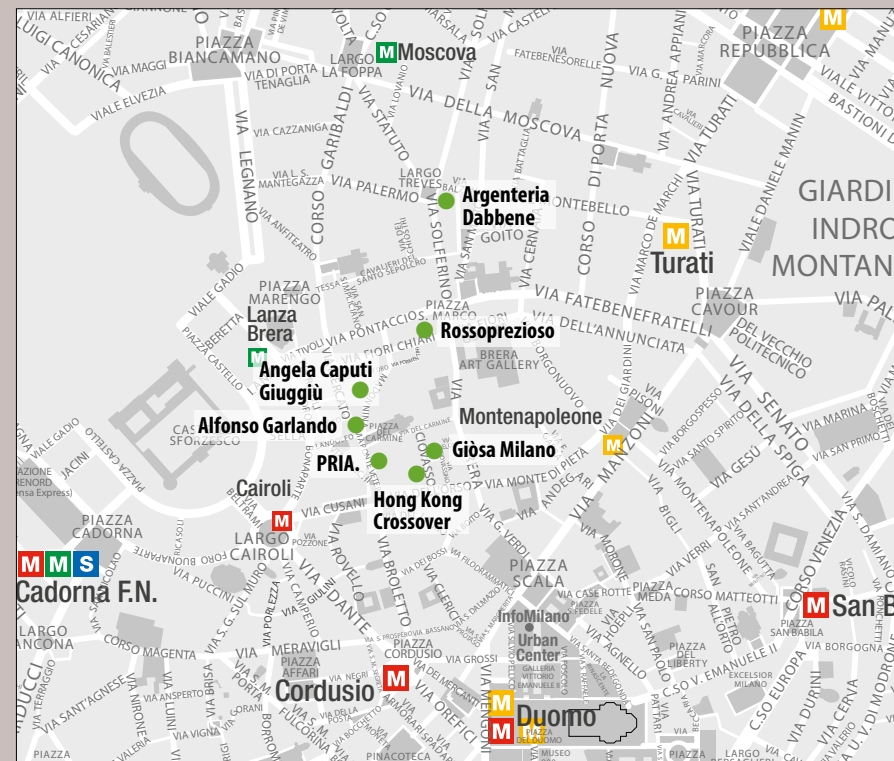

To start your sightseeing tour on the right foot, we suggest stopping for a cup of coffee at **Princi**, not just an ordinary bakery, but a meeting point where, amidst the

heady scents of "brioches" and "cappuccino", you will have a chance to begin your day on a high note. A reference point for antique lovers, Brera boasts a large number of antique shops and art galleries: don't miss a visit to **Lorenzo Vatalaro** in piazza San Simpliciano 7, focused on antique sculptures, paintings and artworks, where a few modern, contemporary items are also represented.

As an aside, those interested in bargains or bric à brac should definitely make time to visit the **Mercatino di antiquariato e brocantage**, held on the third Sunday of each month. Conversely, for design aficionados, we suggest a visit to the **Calligaris** flagship store, after which you will have a chance to lose yourself amidst the thousands of furnishing ideas offered by **Cargo&Hi-Tech**.

TASTING SUGGESTIONS

Between visiting one shop and another, you might be surprised to suddenly discover that it's time for lunch. Try the typical Parma-based charcuterie specialties at **Parma & Co**, where you can also enjoy a Sunday brunch or the famed sandwiches sold by **Panino Giusto**. The afternoon is likely to pass by in a flash until you suddenly realize that it's aperitivo time: you are definitely likely to be seduced by the purely Art Déco-style atmosphere of **El Tombon de San Marc** or the trendier atmosphere of **Fashion Café** in via San Marco; other options are heady wine tasting sessions in the informal ambience of either **N'Ombra de Vin** or **Moscatelli**.

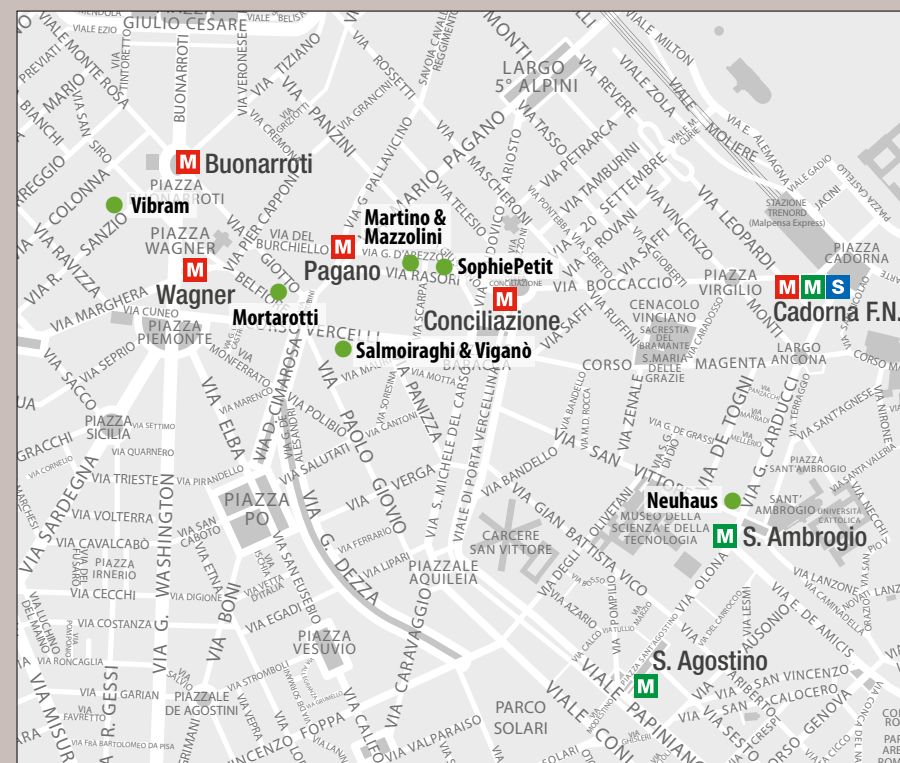

Finally, walking towards Sant'Ambrogio, don't miss a visit to the famed Belgian chocolate atelier **Neuhaus**.

I enjoy looking at wine through different eyes. They are the eyes of people who come to Italy from all over the world to taste our special 'flavor'.

My work is a constant discovery. During a tasting, while deciding with which wine to start, an American client of mine gave her simple solution "Let's start from the best one", explaining that usually, at her home, she offers the best wine first so people get drunk and then they do not understand that the other ones are not as good. I thought I had to deal with questions like "What wine can I match with my favorite food?" "Where can I store my wines at home?"... Instead I was asked: "In which phase of the production is the strawberry fragrance added into the wine?" The stranger the questions, the more I understood that

consumers are different every time and that their curiosity toward the nectar of Bacchus is sincere and total. In my conversations with new clients, I often get the impression that for them wine is a wonderful alchemy, which always maintains an aura of mystery as if it were a magical potion. And this is because there is nobody who really takes time to explain to them what wine is. They say that I invented a new profession: I am a Personal Wine Shopper. What do I do? I support people in the purchases of wine, I organize wine trips and tailor-made food and wine experiences. I create events in which people can learn and share their emotions about wine. I assist

them in finding the right selections for dinners and weddings. Have I invented this? I would say that it came naturally to my mind... This profession was born from my passion for wine and the joy of sharing it with others, from my sunny personality and from the observation that there are only two things that I can't resist buying: books and wine. Why am I doing it? Because it's who I am. Because I want to share with people a more lively and healthy lifestyle using Italian wine and food as emotional companions of our life so that everybody can enjoy spending time together enriching their cultural knowledge and pleasing their palates.

A glass for each meal

In Italy the most important moments happen around the table. Every dish has its perfect partner in the wine. Here are some pairings to try.



▲ PIZZA

Everybody loves pizza! The Margherita is one of the symbols of Italian cuisine throughout the world. Invented in June 1889 by Neapolitan pizza maker Raffaele Esposito in honor of Queen Margherita of Savoy, it is adorned simply in the colors of the Italian flag: red tomato, white mozzarella and green basil. Simplicity is part of its appeal and it's so tasty too! Don't drink soda or beer while eating pizza, try instead to pair it with some Italian wines: you can choose from among some fruity, light reds like Sangiovese or Barbera or go for white wines like Friuliano or Vernaccia.



▲ LASAGNE

Lasagna is theoretically a dish with many layers of pasta alternated with sauces and various other ingredients. But in reality lasagna is, to me and to Italians, the love of the moms who cook the entire Sunday morning to please their family. It's the smell of ragù, of parmigiano and besciamella (not often used outside Italy, it is a cream of butter, flour and milk). Ah, I can smell it if I close my eyes, so delicious!! Lasagna goes well with young, smooth red wines, not too tannic; good example are Morellino di Scansano or some Pinot noir from Oltre Pò Pavese.

▼ RISOTTO AL TARTUFO

I wish you could go truffle hunting in Italy... You will find yourself in the quiet of a wood, with dogs trained all their lives to find the precious tubers...or with pigs, yes, they have an exceptional sense of smell! Truffles grow underground and can be found by just following their scent. On the risotto the truffle is usually shaved raw, just before eating. As Piedmont is very famous for truffles I would suggest the pairing with local wines such as Dolcetto or Nebbiolo. Be careful not to cover the taste of this black gold and if you are open to different taste try a white wine, floral and mineral.



► TIRAMISÙ

I think that Tiramisù is truly the best-known Italian dessert around the world... If you haven't tasted it at least once, please go for it but be sure that it is homemade. There are many other Italian desserts, I personally like including apple strudel, pastiera napoletana, cannoli, frittelle... Ok, I admit, I like sweets. It has been said that there is no wine pairing with tiramisù. I say "follow your taste!" Choose something sweet like, for example, a Passito or a Picolit or even try a sweet sparkling wine. No doubt about it, any occasion serves as a good one to celebrate with some bubbles!



▲ COTOLETTA ALLA MILANESE

Cotoletta alla Milanese may look like a simple veal cutlet, something you may also be used to eating in your country. Well, have a bite of a Cotoletta (please no ketchup!) and you will notice the difference: it's a unique flavor especially driven by the clarified butter in which the breaded meat is fried. The traditional cotoletta is cooked "bone-in" but there is a modern version without a bone which is often tenderized to make it thinner and larger. To balance the fattiness of this recipe, you should ask for "Bollicine", it's the Italian word for sparkling wines.



Tasting wine is getting to know its story

Wine is the perfect companion to many nice moments of our life. It can be a toast for a wedding, it can be a refreshing white for a summer picnic, it can be a nice glass of red while relaxing on the sofa. Choosing the right wines will make us live our experiences to the fullest. The basics of tasting can help in our choice.

I always say that wine is lived, not learned. With this I mean that wine has to be enjoyed and not looked upon as a mysterious potion to be studied. It is just wine! Tasting is a subjective moment. It is influenced by our own experience. People have a different sense of smell, more or less refined, but usually, at the first sniff, we all perceive the strongest scents and the ones that we can associate with something. Olfactory memory is very powerful but every person has his/her own. So it can be possible that you won't recognize the scent that your partner is smelling in the same wine! So why learn how to taste? What is the purpose? Tasting a wine has also an objective part and this can really be useful. Analyzing the wine with the senses can tell you if the wine is correct (meaning without faults) and what its characteristics are. Understanding what we are drinking can help us make decisions about the most suitable pairings with food and, why not, also to evaluate whether the price is fair or if there are discrepancies between the quality and what we are paying for.

But, most important, tasting a wine will tell us its story: where it comes from, which grapes have been used, how the weather in that vintage was, how the winemaker decided to produce it. The standard tasting has 5 steps which involve the sense of sight, smell, taste, and somehow even touch. To make them easier to remember, they are often called "the 5 S's".

See
Hold the glass up in front of your eyes, and tilt it slightly. The color of the wine can tell you something about its age, where it comes from, and its concentration. Wines from northern, cooler climates tend to be lighter in color (color not as intense) as wines from warmer, southern climates.

Swirl
Swirling the wine in your glass aerates it, bringing oxygen into the wine and allowing it to release its aroma. Reminder: it's best not to completely fill the glass, so you'll have room to swirl the wine around.

Smell
Smelling is one of the key moments of wine tasting. Flaws usually can be identified immediately: the wine will smell dull and stale. Take a sniff and try to name the scents: they can be flowers, fruits, spices and vegetables. They can even be associated with animals, leather, tobacco or stones. The list of possible fragrances is really long! The combination of the aromas is called bouquet or nose of the wine.

Sip
Sip in order to bring out the full flavor of the wine to the palate. Be sure to move the wine around in your mouth to cover all of your taste buds. You'll be able to taste the fruit and varietal characteristics, the acidity, the tannins, and the aftertaste. A long, pleasing aftertaste, or finish, is a sign of a quality wine.

Swallow (or spit)
Professional tasters usually spit, especially if they have many wine glasses in front of them. But swallowing is the perfect conclusion to savoring the taste of the wine and having the whole experience.

» DRINKING...WITHOUT GETTING DRUNK

Feeling 'woozy' and confused after you've been drinking is inevitable. The alcohol contained in wine enters your bloodstream and travels throughout your body. It's important to limit your intake and respect the alcohol-related laws adopted by each country for public safety, especially those pertaining to drinking and driving. However, by following these tips you can enjoy the tasting experience.

- Keep an eye on alcohol content. Typically wines are drunk starting from those having

the lowest alcohol content. As the meal progresses, gradually move upwards, from light whites to more mature reds, ending with either a dessert or sweeter wine. Don't mix the order because your stomach will have a hard time metabolizing the alcohol.

- Drink on a full stomach
- Drink water between sips. It is essential to keep well hydrated to give your body a chance to rebalance itself and to clean your palate. What's more, when you're dehydrated your nasal passages become congested and you

miss out on the pleasure of savouring the fragrances of the wine.

- Concentrate on what you're drinking. If you're concentrated, you'll find yourself sipping the wine, rather than just drinking it, thus allowing you to better appreciate what's in your glass. Your mind remains active and thinks less about the alcohol per se, with the result that you're likely to drink less.



Wine to drink

A wine doesn't have to be expensive to be good. Italy offers a really wide "shelf" from which you can choose delicious labels within a fair price range. What do you need to have a basic but complete private cellar?

> First of all, **some bubbles!** Sparkling wines are versatile and everybody loves them. You can keep them in your storage area and chill them in the fridge or in a bucket of ice before serving them. Some Italian labels to try: Franciacorta, Oltrepo Pavese, Trento DOC, Prosecco.

> Then, a few **white wines.** I suggest buying and drinking them as soon as possible, don't keep a large quantity, most of the time they are meant to be drunk young. Choose from among Gavi, Vermentino, Soave and many others besides.

> **Light reds** are good for many meals. Barbera, Dolcetto, Valpolicella, Montepulciano are some names you could look for. Store them horizontally in a cool place.

> You should buy also **some reds with a good ageing potential.**

However, keep in mind that they require special attention otherwise you might run the risk of waiting many years before actually tasting a wonderful wine only to discover that, in the meantime, it has lost its flavour. Although these important reds often cost more than € 20, they are worth the outlay! Ask for Chianti Riserva, Brunello di Montalcino, Barolo and Amarone. One trick to check how well they age is to buy several bottles of the same kind and taste one of them every year.

> Insofar as **sweet wines** are concerned, I suggest keeping just few bottles and drinking them when you need to treat yourself.

BEST VALUES. There are so many good wines in Italy that it is difficult to choose! The whole magazine won't have enough space to present them all. Here some ideas to start to know a little about Italian wines, without emptying your wallet.

CAMPO ALLA SUGHERA



Adeo > Bolgheri is famous for Cabernet Sauvignon and Merlot wines. Adeo is a true expression of this terroir blending nuances of mature black and red fruit with sweet spices, liquorice and vanilla. € 20

AGRICOLE VALLONE



Vigna Flaminio Riserva > Negroamaro is now a very popular varietal from the South. This one comes from Brindisi, the heart of Salento, on the heel of Italy. It is blended with Montepulciano: it's an explosion of fruity and spicy notes. € 11

POGGIO VENTOSO



Poetico > The Tuscan Coast deserves a tour: this wonderful white, produced close to the sea, will treat you with intense notes of citrus fruits, elderberry flowers, as well as smoky and mineral tones. € 13

BOSCO DEL MERLO



Prosecco Millesimato > Prosecco is really trendy now. It's refreshing, easy to drink, fun! This one will always surprise you with notes of apple, pear and flowery hints. This millesimato is wonderful as aperitif. € 15

TORRE ROSAZZA



Ribolla Gialla DOC > Ribolla Gialla is one of the most ancient native vines of Friuli. Fresh and elegant, its clean floral scents suggest melon and a light hint of citrus. Excellent as aperitif and with starters in general. € 12,50 €

PALA



Nuragus I fiori > Sardinia has good food, wild natural surroundings and breathtaking seascapes! Nuragus is one of the most ancient grape of the island. This one by Pala will enchant you with its delicately fruity perfume. € 9

Wine to collect

Which is the right investment to give more value to your money? Gold? Diamonds? Art? I find it really interesting to invest in wines: in the worst case scenario, you can enjoy it with your loved ones! Your goal is to "buy low, sell high". So, looking for luxury bottles, keep in mind which factors can affect the price.

> **Limited Quantity** - Most of the best wines are produced by a single vineyard, from the few, most prized hectares of the estate. Only a few thousand bottles are produced for distribution all over the world. Therefore, you cannot but be really proud of being one of the owners of these rarities.

> **Vintages** - Vintages with favorable harvest conditions (or whose wines have developed well over time) almost always attract higher prices.

> **Ageing potential** - Old doesn't automatically mean expensive, but the ageing capacity is taken into consideration when assessing the overall value of the wine.

TOP QUALITY. Luxury has many subjective definitions, not always linked to price. Italy produces many exceptional wines, well known all over the world. Here are my suggestions for some Iconic wines, the ones I had the luck to taste!

TENUTE LUCE DELLA VITE



Luce > The radiant sun on the label represents the Divine Light, the most powerful strength that gives life. Luce is an outsider from the famous area of Montalcino, a blend that mixes the Tuscan Sangiovese with the international Merlot. A wine and a story to discover.

GIACOMO CONTERNO



Monfortino Riserva > Nebbiolo, the grape of this Barolo, is a mysterious and charming storyteller of the hills in Piedmont. Conterno chooses to craft his "normale" Monfortino with only best years and his Monfortino Riserva even more rarely. A wine expression of the territory.

TUA RITA



Redigaffi > This 100% Merlot is a friend that I met on the Tuscan Coast and that has never left my heart; a great wine from a small family winery that remains humble and passionate about their land. A wine that speaks to the soul.

FRATELLI LUNELLI



Giulio Ferrari Riserva > Luxury sparkling wines usually originate from Champagne. I think this is a good example of what Italians can achieve. Available in a limited edition, it has a perfect perlage, a wonderful nose and an excellent quality/price ratio: for me, this is luxury.

Duomo

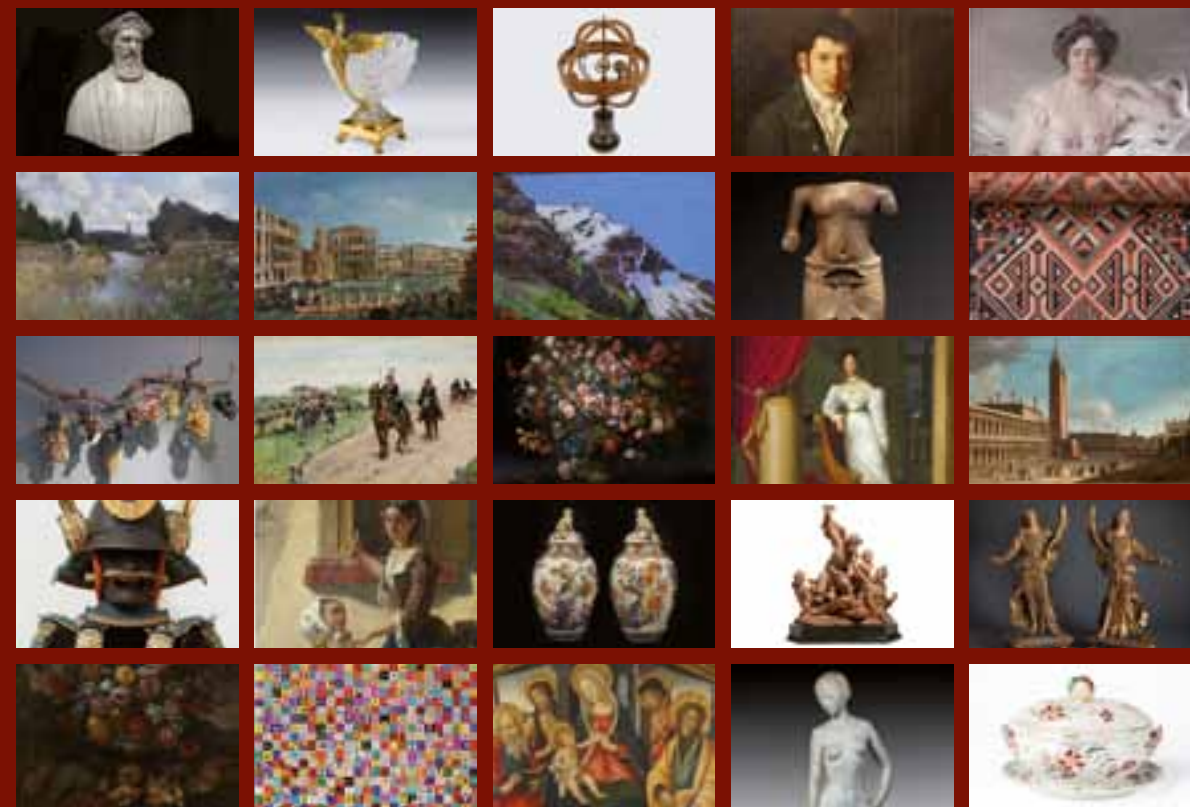

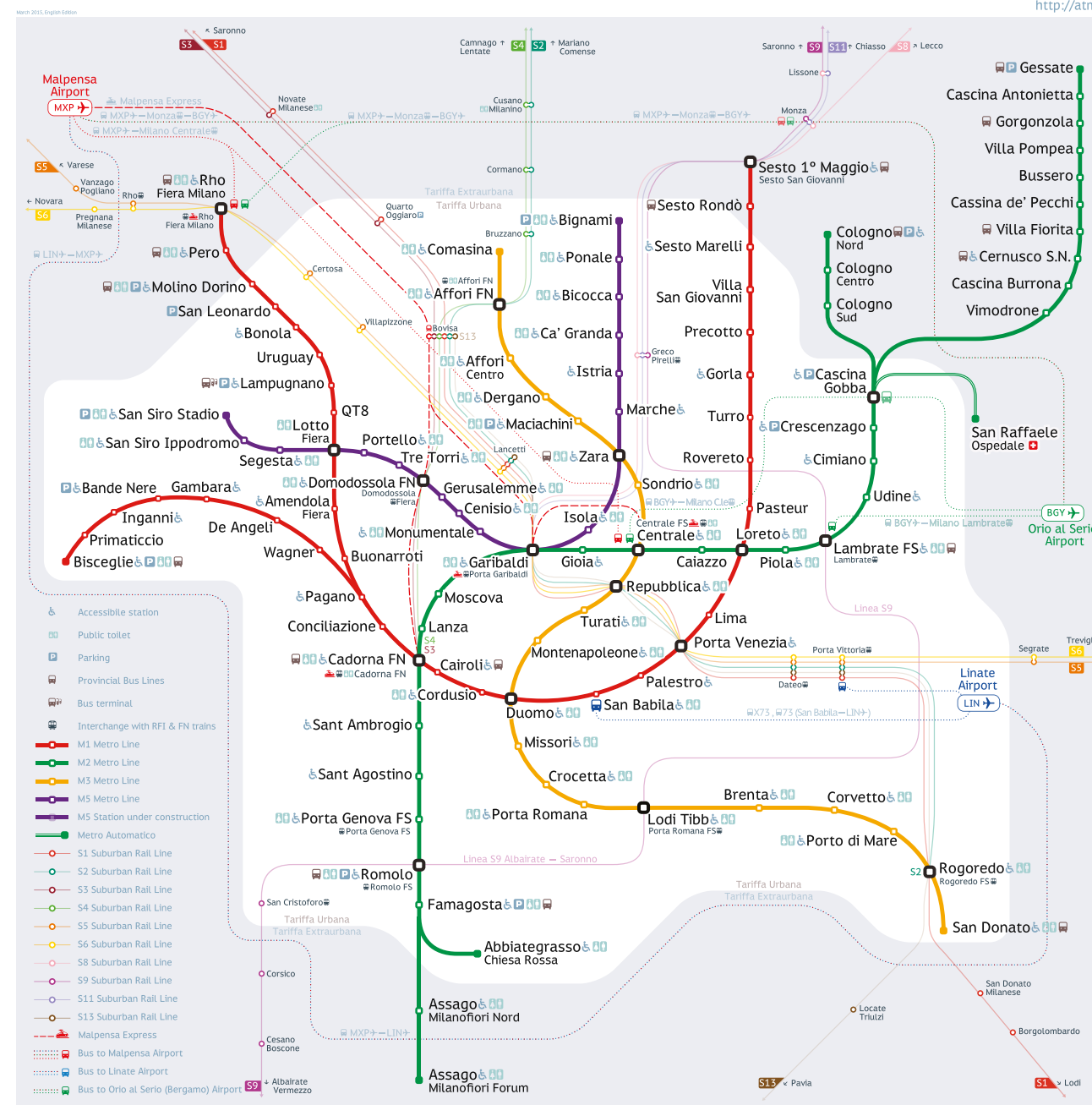

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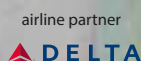
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
