
But today, a friend convinced me (friends and shopping are an irresistible chick magnet) to go to Vicolungo The Style Outlets. We left on a luxury branded coach

at 10.30am from the city centre; from the square that for six months – with its iron and crystal gates – served as the gateway to Expo. Between chatting and answering some emails (we chose a weekday to avoid the shopping crowds) the time flew by and, before I knew it, we had arrived. Vicolungo has the advantage of being the **nearest** outlet to Milan

As you know, before tackling any kind of task, we Italians always drink an espresso: the luminous Botega Caffé Cacao offers a titillating selection including those flavoured with pistachio nuts, chestnuts or amaretto. Re-energized, we devoted ourselves to shopping in peace and quiet. I tried on an Armani jacket and was thrilled to notice that it was discounted by 50%. What a fantastic surprise! No way could I let this one slip through my fingers! My luck held when I



visited Guardiani where I found a stunning pair of shoes. They were the last pair in stock, in my size and had been marked down to less than half of their original price!

AN UPSCALE FOOD EXPERIENCE Then it was time for lunch and, once again, Vicolungo The Style Outlets surprised us. Undecided whether to eat at the restaurant serving traditional cuisine, emphasizing regional flavours and local, strictly seasonal specialities or at the Fish Bistro, boasting a sought-after seafood menu, we opted for the former. In 1964, my mother opened our first boutique in Milan, in via Morigi. In 1987, I began working with resins, experimenting with the inclusions that became our trademark.

straordinaria

Where does the inspiration for your resin jewellery come from?

It all began when Romeo Gigli asked me to enrich his collection with necklaces that looked as though they were made from amber and coral. I wasn't satisfied with the results obtained with synthetic materials, so I began experimenting with resins. The result was astonishing. Luckily, even today we can use this technique because we have an artisanal workshop

What should we expect to find on visiting the Pellini boutique for the first time?

Unique pieces in resin, semi-precious stones, crystals, glass and metals. The look of our shop also changes regularly thanks to our continuing search for original bags and accessories that blend in seamlessly with the surrounding decor.

Wine "on the road"

Italy has 20 regions and every one of them has amazing landscapes, delicious food and interesting wines. Start by discovering several picturesque areas of Tuscany: enjoy the trip... and the sips!



CHIANTI CLASSICO

A history of more than 600 years awaits you in Chianti Classico, one of the best-known wine-growing areas in Italy lying between the provinces of Florence and Siena. The first document mentioning this wine dates back to 1398 and exports to England began as early as the 1600s. Chianti Classico is the most historical part of a wider region known as Chianti, often associated with other small sub-areas such as, for example, Rufina or Pomino. Two thirds of the area is occupied by woods that open almost unexpectedly to reveal vast stretches of vineyards and olive groves. Its landscape and temperate climate are renowned for their beauty and health benefits which probably explains why

foreigners from all over the world have fallen in love with it and decided to settle here. I believe that a lot of it has to do with its food and its splendid wine: the king of Chianti Classico is Sangiovese (boasting a minimum ratio of 80% in each bottle) which has now also befriended the international Cabernet and Merlot cultivars, used in a maximum percentage of 20%.

SAN GIMIGNANO

San Gimignano is a small hilltop town whose pristine charm is complemented by an unexpectedly rich artistic heritage. It is located on the road leading from Florence to Siena, on the via Francigena route, one of the main communication routes in the Middle Ages.

At that time, thanks to this road, the town was well-known, serving as an important point of reference for numerous merchants and travelers but, above all, for the countless faithful travelling on pilgrimages to Rome. San Gimigniano is famous for its towers. In 1200 it was endowed with as many as seventy of which now only fourteen remain, giving the town its unique, recognizable appearance even when seen from a distance. On arrival, you can relax with a glass of Vernaccio, the main wine of this area. It is a white DOCG whose name derives from the grape variety with which it is made. This wine boasts an incredibly long history: Dante mentions it in his 'Purgatorio', the second part of his Divine Comedy, and, before him, one of its greatest admirers was Lorenzo the Magnificent, who had flasks of it sent regularly to him at his 'palazzo' in Florence so that he could enjoy it with his meals.

MONTALCINO

Brunello is one of the best-known wines in the world, boasting a rich flavour and a powerful, sophisticated structure. It is a monovarietal Sangiovese requiring a minimum ageing process of 5 years, 2 of which should be spent in oak barrels. The labour-intensive and expensive elaboration of the wine has made Brunello di Montalcino one of Italy's most exclusive and most expensive wines. It was invented by Ferruccio Biondi Santi in 1888 when he hit upon the idea of eliminating the cultivars of the traditional Chianti recipe, such as Canaiolo and Colorino, using only the Sangiovese variety. While Brunello has made the town of Montalcino famous, the village itself is worth a visit. Its streets with their stone pavements are truly enchanting and the village



is a wonderful place to stroll around among the labyrinth of charming arts and crafts shops, cafés, restaurants and wine bars. The historical centre is dominated by the imposing Fortress. Built in 1361, the views from its ramparts are truly spectacular. You will literally be awestruck by its vast expanse of vineyards and olive groves and, just a little further on, its famous 'Crete Senesi' (Sienese Clay Hills). This area is characterized by its hills which are composed of New Moon, the sequel to the Twilight vampire a grey-light blue clay, giving the landscape an odd moon-like appearance.

MONTEPULCIANO

Although all of you have heard about it, it tends to arouse a lot of confusion. There is actually a wine called Montepulciano d'Abruzzo, but it comes from another region and is guite distinct from Vino Nobile di

Montepulciano, made from a grape variety known as Prugnolo Gentile, a particular clone of Sangiovese. The town of Montepulciano is located at the southernmost part of Tuscany bordering on Lazio and is crossed by the Chiana river from which the famous breed of cattle, the 'Chianina', takes its name. if you happen to visit Montepulciano, its square wil seem familiar: it's where the Italian scenes for saga, were shot. If you're a nature lover, the village's lake is a fabulous nature reserve for birdwatching. Not only will its surrounding landscapes seduce you but you'll also be enchanted by its delicious food (make sure to try the cheese of Pienza) and, while you're about take a break and pamper yourself by spending a relaxing day at the nearby Chianciano Thermal Baths.

Milan-based restaurant Terraferma combines class and sophistication with a contemporary, welcoming ambience. Its success is also owed to the high quality of its gastronomic offerings, a must-visit destination for discerning palates. By Monica Volta

f you're a connoisseur in search of a superb meat or fish dish, then look no further, Terraferma (opened in 2010 by brothers Massimo and Franco Gallo and by Chef Giovanni Solimando) is the place for you! Dishes featured on the menu, though varying according to the season, all have one thing in common: the **quality of their ingredients**. Infused with a touch of flair and inspired by Lucanian-Calabrian influences, its chef Giovanni offers a truly sublime surf and turf menu, enhanced by an array of totally **delicious pizzas** baked in a wood-fired oven. His most popular antipasti include a salad of prawns and squid with poached vegetables, sautéed shrimp and porcini mushrooms with toasted bread, baby octopus topped with fresh tomato fillets and polenta, a raw fish platter, a Mediterranean dish and specialities from Calabria. First course standouts include 'tagliolini with sea urchins', 'scialatielli alla

'nduja', 'spaghetti alla Giovanni and gnocchi in a porcini cream sauce'. Alternately the main course menu offers dishes such as the restaurant's Fiorentina, 'costata all'antica' and the restaurant's highly sought-after chateaubriand cooked on a lava stone with a side of vegetables. Its desserts are equally enticing with must-trys including an Aspic of mixed wild berries, a blissfully sinful chocolate dessert, hot apple strudel topped with vanilla ice cream and 'salame al cioccolato'. 



MUDEC gets down to serious business!

Milan's fabulous Museum of Cultures has finally opened its doors to present its Permanent Collection to the city, giving life to a rich offer of must-see exhibitions. By Elena Peverata

pened for the first time in March, to coincide with the opening of Expo 2015, MUDEC has finally revealed its true vocation as an interdisciplinary museum. The focal point of the Museum of Cultures, the Permanent Collection will feature more than 200 works of art including everyday objects, fabrics, musical instruments and precious memorabilia of cultures from all over the world, several of which have not only been completely restored but are now available for public viewing for the first time. A carefully chosen selection of around 8,000 items from the municipal collections of ethnographic material can be viewed, by appointment only, at the museum's archives.

The official inauguration of the museum will be further enhanced by an extensive array of exhibitions, focus retrospectives, in-depth reviews, research programs, workshops and courses dedicated to all the cultures of the

world and to the different languages that represent the essence of the myriad souls of this unusual, vibrant museum. The official events program kicked off on 28 October with the following exhibitions: "Gauguin. Tales from **Paradise**" (an exhibit of 70 works, on loan from 12 museums and private collections); "Barbie. The Icon", dedicated to the doll who over the past 56 years has transcended all linguistic, cultural and social and anthropological barriers and "A Beautiful Confluence", dedicated to Anni and Josef Albers, featuring the life-work of two artists considered the pioneers of 20th century Modernism. Moreover, at the museum's 'Spazio delle Culture', visitors will be treated to a photographic exhibition by Alan Maglio and Medhin Paolos dedicated to Milan's Eritrean/ Ethiopian community, many of whose members have resided here for more than half a century. Addionally, MUDEC has already announced its exhibition program for 2016.

In fact, starting from next year, the museum will be offering a number of projects devoted to several of the world's greatest artists, including Joan Mirò, Jean-Michel Basquiat and Frida Kahlo to mention but a few, who have made the dialogue and confrontation with other cultures the keystone of their stylistic and artistic works. Stay tuned!




