Triennale Milano has revamped its cafeteria, creating an increasingly attractive and welcoming place to stop and meet, with a **cafeteria** and **kitchen** service. The restyling follows principles of **sustainability** and gives a central role to **greenery**, enhancing the perspective axis from the entrance to make the view of Parco Sempione more visible. **www.triennale.org** 





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#### **WELCOME** | PANORAMA

- Porta Nuova is a sprawling area, the result of a **project of urban and architectural redevelopment** involving the area that leads from the Porta Garibaldi railway station to Piazza della Repubblica, up to Palazzo Lombardia.
- In 2005, an architectural project curated by American real estate developer Hines focused on transforming the area into a **technological hub** comprising more than **twenty buildings** including skyscrapers, offices, cultural centres and urban residences
- Several of Milan and Italy's highest and most innovative skyscrapers, including the futuristic CityLife complex (visible in the background), are located in the Porta Nuova district. Among these, the **Torre UniCredit** –housed in the vibrant Piazza Gae Aulenti -, the **Torre Solaria** the highest residential skyscraper in Italy-, the **Torre Diamante** and the green complex of the **Bosco Verticale** featuring hanging gardens designed by Stefano Boeri.
- The large public park in the middle of the neighbourhood, known as the **BAM Biblioteca degli Alberi**, extending over an area of 90,000 sq.m., was designed to provide a vast number of interconnecting pedestrian paths and to create a real botanical library. The park features over **450 trees** and **90,000 different plant species**, plus recreational areas, themed circular forests, teaching paths and pedestrian and bike paths. In summer, the park is also used to host outdoor concerts and events.

#### **WELCOME** | PANORAMA

- After crossing the threshold of its 18th century façade in **Candoglia marble**, the interior of the Cathedral is revealed in all its majesty. One of the **most important Gothic buildings in the world**, the church, constructed over a period of 450 years (begun 1386), is the symbol of Milan. Built in the shape of a Latin cross, the cathedral is divided by soaring pillars into five naves, the largest of which measures 45 metres in height.
- The interior boasts an apse with a **large rose window**, stained glass windows decorated with episodes from the Bible, chapels and **high marble columns** with capitals featuring statues of saints.
- To experience the Duomo at its most majestic you must ascend to the roof (either by elevator or by steps) where you will be surrounded by an outburst of pinnacles, turrets and marble statuary and, naturally, the city's famed golden "Madonnina". Here you can wander among 135 spires and 3,400 statues.
- **Guided tours** for small groups help visitors learn about the secrets behind the Duomo's construction. The tour starts from the back of the choir which leads to the **Crypt** housing the tomb of San Carlo Borromeo, and then moves on to the **Archaeological Area** where you'll find the remains of the Battistero di San Giovanni alle Fonti, dating back to 397 A.D. This is where Sant'Ambrogio christened St. Augustine. Next is the old Basilica of Santa Tecla (4th century).
- Before accessing the Cathedral and its treasures, visit the nearby **Museo del Duomo**, located inside Palazzo Reale. The museum houses more than **150 masterpieces** from the 15th century to the present time, including statues, architectural models, plaster casts, terracottas and paintings.

On the occasion of Milano Design Week (6-12 June), the city's most popular event is back. Here are several of the most important Fuorisalone events to mark in your diary.

Milan is once again a key player on the international **design** scene: designers, companies and universities will present ideas and installations to try to imagine the future, sharing solutions that can innovate and anticipate the times.

The event takes place in conjunction with the **Salone del Mobile.Milano**, which this year celebrates its 60th edition, reflecting its commitment to the **ecological transition** of the furniture system.

This edition of Fuorisalone, entitled "**Tra Spazio e Tempo**" (Between Space and Time), is an invitation to **reflect on the changes** taking place in today's world needed to achieve the **sustainability** objectives that are essential for looking to the future.






>> Brera Design Week features a calendar of over 160 events including exhibitions, installations, group shows and new products. "Designing the present, choosing the future" is the theme proposed: finding solutions today to meet the challenges of tomorrow is also the task of design, a subject that is debated all year round and finds its climax during Design Week.

>> Tortona Rocks proposes for the week edition "MATERIA: New perspectives in design": a reflection on new design practices that use alternative materials. Highlight of the seventh edition is the installation by IQOS, a large-scale temporary public art intervention that continues the company's evolutionary path between art and technology.

>> BASE presents the second edition of "We Will Design": designers from all over the world, schools, universities, institutions and young students come together in an experimental laboratory of imagination and inclusion, in which design experiences become a tool to address the contradictions of the present.







### WELCOME | WHAT TO DO FUORISALONE IT













- >> Superstudio proposes the theme "Looking Ahead" to anticipate the Superdesign Show: a spontaneous "village", developing in areas of interest with "buildings" and site-specific installations in which to wander freely.
- >> Milano Durini Design offers new products and exclusive lifestyle settings to professionals and design lovers. It also presents a **new concept-district** aimed at underlining the importance of the showrooms belonging to the Association to enhance the district also in other periods of the year.
- >> **5VIE Design Week** returns for its ninth edition with the annual event dedicated to cross-disciplinary design practices, **collectibles** and **unique pieces**. This year it will take place around the fil rouge of the co-construction of perspectives of meaning and collective visions for the design of a shared future, in the name of creativity.
- >> The sixth edition of **Isola Design Festival** presents the theme "**Together As One**" and welcomes more than 250 international designers and design studios, in addition to local galleries and artisans, distributed among more than **30 locations** in one of Milan's liveliest neighbourhoods.
- >> Alcova, the exhibition project conceived by Joseph Grima of Space Caviar and Valentina Ciuffi of Studio Vedèt, is four years old and returns to the **Inganni area**, in the disused spaces of the military hospital in Baggio, creating synergies between emerging designers, artists, galleries and institutions.
- >> Design Variations, the traditional event curated by MoscaPartners, leaves Palazzo Litta to take place in two new historic locations: the Circolo Filologico Milanese, in the Brera Design District, and Palazzo Visconti, a stone's throw from Corso Monforte. The artist Olimpia Zagnoli will present a site-specific work aimed at enhancing the new venues of the collective







- >> Certosa Initiative is one of the novelties of the 2022 edition curated by Beyond Space and Organization in Design. It is an exhibition project that takes shape in a **post-industrial space** of over 10,000 square metres in which emerging talents and some of the most important brands in the sector interact.
- >> Baranzate Ateliers, for the second consecutive year at the Fuorisalone, proposes in the former Necchi factory, an icon of Italy's industrial heritage, an exhibition path dedicated to collectible design and experimental art that takes shape 3 thousand square metres.
- >> Masterly-The Dutch in Milan is the group show that, since 2016, brings together and brings to Italy a rich selection of Dutch design, craftsmanship and art, under the curatorship of its founder, Nicole Uniquole. The event takes place in Palazzo Turati, blending with the majesty of the neo-Renaissance building.





>> Rossana Orlandi returns with Ro Plastic Prize. In its four years of activity it has seen more than 1800 participants, with an average age of 35, from 60 different countries touching all 5 continents. The prize has three categories: Urban and Public Design, Educational Social Media, Innovative and Tech Projects.

>> Triennale Milano presents both permanent exhibitions, such as the Museum of Italian Design and Casa Lana by Ettore Sottsass, and a series of events during Milano Design Week. "Memphis Again", in collaboration with Memphis Milano, and "Ettore Sottsass. Struttura e colore" are two of the exhibition events available to the public.

>> "ID-Exe", a real widespread district, created by D.O.S (Design Open Spaces). in dozens of points in the city which, for the first time in the history of the Fuorisalone, hybridises the real world and the virtual world, creating new scenarios that come to life on smartphones and tablets, overcoming the limits of space and time.





#### SALONE DEL MOBILE.MILANO 60TH EDITION • 7-12 JUNE 2022

The Salone Internazionale del Mobile, the Salone Internazionale del Complemento d'Arredo and Workplace3.0 will offer numerous and varied aesthetic paths. At EuroCucina and Salone Internazionale del Bagno, cutting-edge solutions for optimising water and energy consumption will be on show. FTK (Technology For the Kitchen) will showcase the future, towards an efficient, effective and sustainable Smart Kitchen. **S.Project**, the exhibition dedicated to design products and decorative and technical solutions for interior design, will be back. The theme of the SaloneSatellite will be "Designing for our future selves / Progettare per i nostri domani". An edition that will invite us to reflect on design that "includes", promoting autonomy, comfort, movement, interaction and safety for all. www.salonemilano.it











#### THE SALONE IN SHORT

The 2022 events will bring together more than 2,000 exhibitors, including more than 600 young designers under 35. At the fair, the stands will welcome visitors to showcase the new collections and lifestyle concepts of the individual brands: an immersive visitor experience. Environmental and social wellbeing will be the theme of "Design with Nature", the installation designed by architect Mario Cucinella for the Salone's "birthday" and hosted in S.Project's pavilion 15: 1,400 square metres telling of a virtuous ecosystem that would ideally represent the future of living.

The 60th edition of the Salone del Mobile.Milano will also cross the borders of the Fair to arrive in the city: from 7 June, in the **Sala delle Cariatidi of Palazzo Reale**, a monumental **site-specific film installation** will be staged dedicated to 11 values that have always been imprinted in the DNA of the Exhibition. 11 art-house films by 11 great Italian directors will be screened.

The Show will open with a concert at the **Teatro alla Scala** by the Philharmonic Orchestra conducted by **Maestro Lorenzo Viotti** and will be followed by a ballet with **Roberto** Bolle as the extraordinary protagonist.





#### PALAZZO REALE, UNTIL 26 JUNE

#### **SOROLLA, PAINTER OF LIGHT**

**EXHIBITION** For the **first time in Italy**, a monographic exhibition traces the rich and successful artistic production of the **Spanish painter Joaquín Sorolla y Bastida** (1863-1923). Little known to the general public, Sorolla was one of the leading representatives of **modern Iberian painting** at the turn of the 19th and 20th centuries, making a decisive contribution to its renewal.

On display at **Palazzo Reale**, 60 works divided into 5 thematic sections retrace the extraordinary career of this Spanish painter who was among the most appreciated of his time. The works of Sorolla, a great **interpreter of "en plein air" painting**, lead visitors to encounter the **light of the Mediterranean**, to discover it as it passes through **gardens**, **landscapes and faces**.

#### LEONARDO3 MUSEUM -IL MONDO DI LEONARDO

The **Leonardo3 museum** in Piazza della Scala, at the Galleria Vittorio Emanuele II entrance, is a unique opportunity to **discover and learn more about Leonardo da Vinci**.

On display in the historic Sale del Re over 200 interactive 3D machines and working physical reconstructions, almost all of which have never been created before. From the analysis of the original manuscripts of the Tuscan genius by the Leonardo3 study centre, brand-new machines have been recreated: the Harpsichord-Viola, the Mechanical Lion, the Submarine, the Rapid-Fire Crossbow, the Great Kite and many others. The museum offer is constantly evolving with new content. Visitors have the opportunity to consult Leonardo's writings in digital format, interacting with his inventions through new and engaging ways such as interactive stations and virtual reality.

## FOUR DAYS OF MOTORS IN MILAN AND MONZA

## DIALOGUE BETWEEN CLASSIC AND CONTEMPORARY

**EXHIBITION Nicolas Party** has designed a body of **new works** in close dialogue with the masterpieces in the collection of the **Poldi Pezzoli Museum**. The Swiss artist has chosen a triptych as the guiding thread for his project, inspired by the work of the same name by Mariotto Albertinelli in the Museum's collection. 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





The Lombardy region is **one of the richest in attractions in Italy**. The area, between Switzerland and Emilia-Romagna, Veneto and Piedmont, offers countless **destinations for day trips** from Milan.

In addition to **Milan**, there are **11 main cities** that preserve traces of centuries of art and culture - Bergamo, Brescia, Como, Cremona, Lecco, Mantua, Monza and Brianza, Pavia, Sondrio and Varese - and hundreds of smaller villages with **art, history and traditions**. But Lombardy also has some unmissable natural beauty, such as the vast Po Valley, the parks and the Pre-Alps with the five largest lakes: Garda, Maggiore, Como, Iseo, Lugano and Ceresio.

With its 10 Unesco Sites, as well as 3 intangible heritages including the lutherie art of Cremona, Lombardy is the Italian region with the largest number of such sites: Valle Camonica's Rock Art, Santa Maria delle Grazie and the Cenacolo Vinciano, the Workers' Village of Crespi d'Adda, the Sacred Mountains of Piedmont and Lombardy, the Rhaetian Railway between Tirano and Saint Moritz, Mantua and Sabbioneta, Monte San Giorgio, the prehistoric pile-dwelling sites in the Alps, the Lombard monuments and the city walls of Bergamo.

For those who love **panoramic places**, a trip to Monte **Isola** is a must, with its breathtaking view of Lake Iseo; to the **Sacro Monte of Varese** with a view over the plain from the Alps to the Apennines; the **Brunate cable car** with an absolute view of Lake Como; the ascent to the **Torrazzo of Cremona**, the highest masonry tower in Europe; the **Terrazza del Brivido** in Tremosine overlooking Lake Garda at a height of 350 metres.

The symbol of **Milan**, the city of design, fashion and business, is the **Duomo**, close to which are the 18th-century Teatro alla Scala and the Galleria Vittorio Emanuele II: these are the most visited landmarks in the city. Not to be missed are the Sforza Castle, the Basilica of Sant'Ambrogio, the complex of the Church of Santa Maria delle Grazie and the Cenacolo Vinciano.



Two cities within a city, **Bergamo** ("Alta" and "Bassa") is linked by two funicular railways. Five kilometres of walls surround domes, towers and palaces, including the **Accademia Carrara**, the Piazza Vecchia, with its Civic Tower and the Palazzo del Podestà, the "perfect" square also loved by the architect Le Corbusier. Bergamo is also the birthplace of the **composer Gaetano Donizetti**, to whom the city dedicates a major opera festival every year. (50 km from Milan)





**Brescia** presents itself in its Renaissance guise with its marvellous salon squares, an embattled castle, two cathedrals, a theatre and the **Museum of Santa Giulia**, a Unesco World Heritage Site. The famous **1000 Miglia** race has been held here every year since 1927, and in September the world's best-loved **Opera Festival** transforms the city into a magical open-air theatre. (95 km from Milan)



**Como** is the city of water, light and silk, rich in history and culture. The **Volta Temple** is a small Pantheon on the banks of the Lario, built in memory of the physicist Alessandro Volta. Strolling within the medieval walls, among alleyways and old shops, the late **Gothic Cathedral** and the imposing **Broletto** from 1215 stand out. A dynamic and entrepreneurial town. *(50 km from Milan)* 





Known throughout the world as the "City of Art and Music", Cremona is the cradle of the violin, as is home to the Violin Museum. In the medieval Piazza del Comune you will find the Cathedral, the Torrazzo, the highest in Italy, the Baptistery and the Gothic Loggia dei Militi. Don't miss the magnificent Ponchielli Theatre, home to important musical seasons. (76 km from Milan)



In a natural setting of rare beauty lies the city of **Lecco**, where Alessandro Manzoni set his masterpiece "I Promessi Sposi" (The Betrothed), and where are monuments in **baroque** and neoclassical style. The Lecco branch of Lake Como is characterised by the S. Martino and Barro mountains, the Resegone and the Grigne. Lecco is the starting point for fantastic trips around the lake. (55 km from Milan)





**Lodi** is a small Lombard town in the **lower Po Valley**, rich in art and history with many green areas. Places to visit include the **neoclassical Palazzo Broletto**, the 15th-century Palazzo Vistarini, the Basilica della Vergine Assunta, a Romanesque cathedral, and the Tempio Civico dell'Incoronata, a masterpiece of the Lombard Renaissance in the style of Bramante. *(38 km from Milan)* 



**Mantua**, the tranquil and elegant city of the Gonzagas, is **surrounded on three sides by water** from which you can enjoy a fascinating city skyline. Sung about for its beauty by famous writers such as Virgil, Baudelaire and Dickens, the city is told through its many monuments, including the Rotonda di San Lorenzo, **Palazzo Te**, Palazzo Ducale and the Duomo. (185 km from Milan)





Over the course of history, the Romans, the Lombards and the Habsburg and Napoleonic dominations have passed through **Monza**, leaving precious legacies such as the **Villa Reale**, a sumptuous neoclassical palace with its famous park around, one of the largest in Europe. Every year Monza is ready to host the **Formula 1 Grand Prix** in September. (18 km from Milan)



Pavia is home to one of the oldest universities in the world. It preserves evidence of its culture in the Castello Visconteo. Of considerable historical and religious interest are San Pietro in Ciel d'Oro, where the remains of Saint Augustine are kept, and San Teodoro and San Michele Maggiore. Don't miss a walk on the romantic Ponte Vecchio, which connects the historical centre with the picturesque Borgo Ticino district. (45 km from Milan)






**Sondrio** is a town of Lombard origin in the heart of the **Valtellina**. The historical centre is characterised by stone houses typical of the most beautiful **mountain towns**. The precious architecture of the **Torre Ligariana** is remarkable. A stop at a crotto or a **typical restaurant** is a must in the area to savour the cuisine based on pizzoccheri and Sassella or Inferno wine. (135 km from Milan)



Varese, also known as a "garden city", enjoys a wealth of landscape, architecture and art that have been appreciated since the last century, when the city became a **holiday** destination with its prestigious Art Nouveau villas and hotels. An unmissable destination for contemporary art lovers is the 18th-century Villa Panza with its unique collection. (58 km from Milan)

The shores of **Lake Maggiore** wash up on the banks of Piedmont and Lombardy in Italy, while its more austere northern basin lies in the mountainous region of Switzerland. The most famous island, lying just off **Stresa** – a small, elegant town, rich in neoclassic and liberty buildings and a shopping mecca boasting a myriad of boutiques – is **Isola Bella**, anchored like a fantastic ship-garden and dominated by the majestic Palazzo Borromeo, built in the 17th century and rich in art treasures, including the private collection of Milan's most famous aristocratic family. The Borromeo clan also owned **Rocca di Angera**, an imposing fortress (12th-17th century) boasting opulent ambiences, of which the most famous is the Sala di Giustizia. The "Rocca" also has a medieval garden (www.isoleborromee.it).

**Lake Como** is the romantic and worldly older sister of Maggiore and Garda and takes its name from the city of Como. "Must-visit" sights include the Gothic **Duomo**, the Romanic

basilicas of San Fedele and Sant'Abbondio and the neoclassic Villa Olmo. Nestling on the banks of Lake Como in Lenno and currently owned by FAI – a private non-profit trust – Villa del **Balbianello** is a magnificent example of a perfectly preserved 18th century dwelling. Surrounded by a stunning, terraced panoramic garden, with a breathtaking view of the lake, the Villa is one of the area's most romantic retreats. Standing on the tip of a promontory overlooking the waters of the lake, the Villa was chosen by director George Lucas as one of the evocative settings for the famous "Star Wars" series. Lying just a stone's throw northwest of Como is Cernobbio, a small fashionable resort frequented by the wealthy of Europe because of its deluxe hotel Villa d'Este and Villa Erba where director Luchino Visconti spent his childhood (www.villaerba.it). Continuing North, we find Isola Comacina a jewel of art and nature, rich in Mediterranean vegetation and one of the most important archaeological sites of the dark ages in Northern Italy. In nearby Tremezzo, don't miss a visit to the Baroque-style Villa Carlotta,

featuring an Italian garden and sculptures by Canova. At the junction of the southern arm of the lake lies **Bellagio**, also referred to as the pearl of Como, set in a strategic position to soak up the panorama.

Don't miss a visit to the other lakes that are also easily accessible from Milan. These include **Lake Lugano**, where the enchanting towns of Morcote, Melide and Lugano offer many cultural attractions and charming itineraries; **Lake Iseo**, a gem of rare beauty nestled between the provinces of Bergamo and Brescia; **Lake Garda** attracing millions of visitors every year thanks to its mild climate, its old-fashioned atmosphere and its breathtaking scenery, including scenic roads along the coast, Renaissance villas, Romanesque hamlets and small villages.



**HEART OF THE CITY** 

Nowadays this is one of the liveliest areas of the city, still maintaining a characteristic athmosphere that summons its past, when the district was inhabited by artists and **bohemians**. Its narrow cobbled streets host a number of interesting chic antique shops, galleries, restaurants and bars. The area is expanding rapidly and its neighbouring streets, including Corso Garibaldi and Corso Como, are home to several of the trendiest addresses in the city. In fact, as you walk through this historic district, you will be struck by a treasure trove of small artists' workshops and quaint shops selling canvases and paints. This is one of Milan's most upmarket districts: a residential area, still inhabited by Milan's upper crust, it epitomizes the traditional soul of the city and is distinguished by its air of sophistication, elegance and stunning residential architecture. Here you will come across **several trendy shops** for all tastes, offering clothing, footwear, home décor and eateries. What's more the area is located just a stone's throw from one of Milan's most important attractions: the **Last Supper**, Leonardo da Vinci's masterpiece; the Parco Sempione and the Triennale Milano are also within easy walking distance, and, if you're feeling energetic, you can easily push onwards until you reach the Castello Sforzesco.







The oldest and biggest Chinese district in Italy is an interesting location for a quiet walk or to take a look at the typical products displayed on both sides of the road. This pedestrian district stretches over the central via Paolo Sarpi and reaches the nearby via Bramante, via Aleardi and via Niccolini, forming a real city within the city. Christmas, Chinese New Year and the Oriental Design Week create a lively atmosphere packed with events, during which you can admire the beautiful lanterns and decorative elements.

### Tax Free Refund Guide

According to the Italian law. non-EU resident travellers may be granted VAT relief/refund for goods intended for personal or family use purchased in Italy. This relief is surely an advantage for the foreign travellers: in fact, it allows to save from a minimum of 4% up to a maximum of 22% of the selling price of the goods purchased. Here is a **short** quide according to the Italian legislation to discover the common system of value added tax exclusively for non-EU resident travellers

- VAT (in Italian: IVA) is a value added tax on goods and services, and is part of the European Union's value added tax system.
- 2. In some cases, travellers may be granted a VAT refund. This refund does not cover the services supplied by hotels, restaurants, taxis or agencies.
- 3. You may be eligible for a VAT refund provided that:
- you are a non-EU resident;
- the goods purchased are intended for personal or

- **family use** only and are carried in your luggage;
- the overall value of the goods purchased exceeds 154,94
   Euro (VAT included);
- the purchase is certified by an invoice. This invoice should include a description of the goods purchased, your personal information as well as the details of your passport or any other equivalent document;
- the goods shall leave the EU territory by the **third month** following the date of issue of the invoice, as proved by the "customs stamp";
- from 1 September 2018, tax free invoices in Italy must be electronically transmitted by the national seller to OTELLO information system (Online Tax Refund at Exit: Light Lane Optimization) and their validation is digitally carried out.
- after the digital "customs stamp" is obtained, OTELLO will send a message to the retailer that all the requirements are met and, as a consequence, the retailer will reimburse the amount due or will settle the tax relief.



### Tax Free Refund Guide

- the invoice is returned to the Italian retailer within four months after the purchase was made. If the invoice is stamped by other EU countries, it needs to be brought to the shop retailer by the fourth month following that of the purchase.
- 4. The goods purchased and the relevant invoice must be shown at the customs exit point when leaving EU territory (if you intend to pack the purchased items into your check-in luggage, you must go to Customs BEFORE checking in).
- 5. After leaving EU territory, the traveller must return the original invoice, regularly endorsed by the customs office, to the Italian retailer. Said invoice must be returned within four months from the date when the document was issued.
- 6. The refund can be made directly by the Italian retailer (however, make sure that the shop you've chosen displays a "Tax Free Shopping" or "Euro Tax Free" sign in its window).

- 7. Several Tax-Free companies are able to offer immediate VAT cash refunds when the goods leave either Italian or EU territory (thus exonerating the passenger from having to return the invoice to the retailer). However, this procedure only applies at major international airports or main border crossings. Most major department stores have Tax Free Refund offices.
- 8. The services provided by Tax-Free companies imply the payment of a small administrative sum which is **directly deducted** from the amount of VAT refunded to the traveller.
- 9. In the event of a traveller not receiving a VAT refund within a reasonable period of time, he or she should re-contact the Italian retailer or one of the aforementioned companies.
- However, please note, VAT cannot be refunded directly by customs offices.

#### >> INSIDER TIPS



- Breakfast time in Italy can be from 6am to 11am, depending on what time you got up, and it usually includes a cappuccino, which is a morning drink, and "cornetto" or other sweet pastries.
- Lunchtime usually ranges from midday to 2pm (that is

why many of the shops of the shops close in these hours), **dinnertime** from 8pm to 10pm.

- Between 6pm and 9pm it's **aperitivo time**, an Italian tradition started in Milan. If you're feeling hungry between 3pm and 5pm then it's time for you to have a "merenda", a quick snack between the two main meals. Should you be hungry at late night, you can check several list of **latenight restaurants in Milan**.
- Never forget to check the restaurant's **weekly closing day**, which most of the time will be Monday.
- Reservations for most restaurants are strongly advised.
- In Italy, service is included in the price meaning that although **tipping is not compulsory** but it is obviously appreciated as a sign of satisfaction.
- Some menus include the word "coperto", a small surcharge corresponding to the cost of the service and bread (usually between 1 and 3 euros per person).
- If you want **tap water**, you should specify it to the waiting staff of the restaurant or bar, asking for a glass of "acqua di rubinetto".
- Although no dress code exists in Italy, **semiformal clothing** is usually considered de rigeur at restaurants.
- All restaurants and bars are non-smoking unless a separate smokers' area is specifically offered.



# Milanese tasting

Milan offers a cuisine featuring a number of truly unusual flavours. Here is a brief guide to make sure that you don't miss out on several of the city's best and most typical recipes.



#### **RISOTTO ALLO ZAFFERANO**

This is one of the few dishes boasting a specific "birth date". In fact, legend has it that, on 8 September 1574, master glassmaker Valerio di Fiandra was presented with a dish of saffron-coloured rice at his daughter's wedding feast after which time it became an iconic dish of Milanese cuisine. Master Chef Gualtiero Marchesi has transformed this delicacy into a real work of art, with the addition of a square of edible gold leaf! We also suggest trying its crunchier version: so-called "riso al salto". Try the creative dishes signed by Carlo Cracco at his restaurant in Galleria Vittorio Emanuele (www.ristorantecracco.it)



#### **COTOLETTA ALLA MILANESE**

Mentioned for the first time in1500 at the court of the Sforza, its "invention" was a source of contention with the Viennese who laid claim to its origin. According to the traditional recipe, the **veal slices** used should be at least as thick as a finger, **coated in egg and bread** crumbs and deep fried in butter. One of the best places to eat breaded veal cutlets in Milan is at "Da Giannino" (www.gianninoristorante.it) or at the "Al Garghet" restaurant (www.algarghet.it).

#### TRIPE (OR BUSECCA)

A hearty winter dish that will keep the cold out, its main ingredient is the **stomach lining of sheep or cows**. It was originally served to celebrate special occasions in the peasant world. Upgrades include the addition of oysters and caviar and can be sampled at Michelin-starred osteria, "Al Pont de Ferr" at the Navigli district (pontdeferr.it).

#### **CASSOEULA**

According to the history books, composer and conductor Arturo Toscanini was mad about this dish made from **pork** (sausages, pork rinds and spare ribs) and **cabbage**.

#### **MONDEGHILI**

Small **meat balls fried** in butter and oil and a signature dish of renowned chef Bruno Barbieri who has made them an art form. You can taste the traditional Milanese meat balls at "Al Matarel" (www.almatarel.it).

#### **PANETTONE**

Boasting 500 years of tradition, panettone is a type of large, **sweet bread**, leavened very slowly and enriched with **raisins and candied fruit**. Amidst history and legend, the theories as to the origins of panettone vary widely. One of the most romantic is the story linking its invention to Ugo, a young falconer employed by Prince Ludovico il Moro. Ugo yearned to conquer the heart of the daughter of a poor baker named Toni.



# **TASTING**

To win her over, the nobleman disquised himself as a baker and invented a rich bread in which he added to the flour and yeast, butter, eggs, dried raisins and candied lemon and orange peel. The fame of the bread spread far and wide and became known as "Pan del Toni" (Toni's bread). According to history, the tradition of panettone is documented by a manuscript conserved at the Biblioteca Ambrosiana dating back to the 15th century. Already at that time, on the night of 24 December, it was customary for the pater familias to place a huge log in the fireplace and to slice the large loaf of bread which he then distributed among those present. From a gastronomic point of view, the distinguishing feature of panettone is that it is leavened two or three times. Its golden colour derives from the skilful combination of butter and egg yokes, while its overall beauty is completed by the orange, green and brown notes resulting from the addition of candied fruit and raisins. The gourmet trick is to warm it for a few minutes in front of an open oven or on top of a radiator before serving it.

# Milan is the home of the Aperitivo

Aperitivo and Happy Hour in the city are most definitely a ritual which no Milanese is prepared to forego



The Aperitivo, the beloved Milanese tradition of predinner drinks, is accompanied by complimentary "stuzzichini" and an all-you-can-eat buffet. Spreads range from traditional olives, nuts, cheeses and potato chips to awesome pasta dishes, "bruschetta", cold cuts, crudités, raw fish and fruit salads. Generally, lasting for 3 hours from 6 to 9pm (though most people rarely get there until 7pm), the aperitivo scene has become an evening meeting for people of all ages. Cocktails - alcoholic or not - are expertly mixed and a Negroni, Negroni sbagliato

(a delicious mix of prosecco, red vermouth and Aperol instead of gin) or a Spritz are **Milanese specialities**. Favourite beverages consumed during this beloved tradition in Milan include also the city's renowned Martini, Prosecco or Campari, accompanied by an all-youcan-eat buffet.



t's one of the landmark locations frequented by Leonardo da Vinci, an unknown piece of history, imbued with mystery. To mark the opening of Expo 2015, researchers excavated the plot where Leonardo's vineyard once stood in the gardens of the Casa degli Atellani, a magnificent Renaissance dwelling situated in front of the Church of Santa Maria delle Grazie. The House and Vinevard museum tour is divided into seven designated areas (the courtyards of Piero Portaluppi, the Zodiac Hall, the Luini Hall, Ettore Conti's studio, the Staircase Hall, the Garden of Earthly Delights - the novellas of Matteo Bandello and Leonardo's Vineyard).









# Milan's Street of Art

The city of Milan is enriched by an art circuit

featuring the city's three main museum hubs: the **Pinacoteca di Brera**, the **Gallerie d'Italia** in piazza della Scala and the civic complex consisting of **Palazzo Reale** and the **Museo del Novecento**. An itinerary extending over **900 metres**, that can be crossed on foot in **just 15 minutes**, from via Brera to piazzetta Reale, cutting through piazza Scala and the Galleria Vittorio Emanuele II, which hosts an extraordinary part of our country's art history, thus making Milan a prestigious international art capital.



# DUOMO DI MILANO

Among one of the most important (and majestic) **Gothic buildings** in the world, the church, constructed on and off over a period of **450 years** (begun 1386) is the symbol of Milan. To experience the Duomo at its most majestic you must ascend to the **terraces** (either by elevator or by steps) where you will be surrounded by an outburst of pinnacles, turrets and marble statuary and, naturally, the city's famed golden "**Madonnina**".





# GALLERIA VITTORIO EMANUELE II

Sometimes known as the "living-room of the Milanese", this elegant, four-storey arcade, housing luxury cafés and famous designer shops, is covered by a glass barrel vault and a beautiful glass cupola and measures 196 metres in length. Tradition has it that placing your right heel on the bull, depicted in the mosaic on the floor, and then spinning around inside it, will bring good luck.








# **CASTELLO SFORZESCO**

The ancient seat of the ruling Visconti, the Castello Sforzesco was later rebuilt by Francesco Sforza and is now simply known by the Milanese as "Il Castello". Antique art, paintings, period furniture, sculptures and musical instruments are housed in its precious treasure trove. Today, it houses a number of interesting museums and libraries: don't miss the museum of the Michelangelo's masterpiece "Pietà Rondanini".






# **CENACOLO VINCIANO**

One of the most famous attractions in the world, "The Last Supper" or "Cenacolo" by Leonardo da Vinci is a large 15th century mural paintig representing the scene of the last supper of Jesus narrated in the Gospel. It can be found in the Refectory close to the church of Santa Maria delle Grazie.





# PALAZZO REALE

For many centuries it was the **seat of the government** of the city, of the Kingdom of Lombardy-Venetia and then a **royal residence** until 1919, when it was acquired by the State and became a **venue for exhibitions**. Today it has consolidated relations with museums all over the world and has become the exhibition heart of central Milan, with over **a million visitors** every year.






# **TEATRO ALLA SCALA**

Built at the behest of Empress Maria Teresa of Austria, Teatro alla Scala was **inaugurated in 1778** with an opera by Antonio Salieri. The Scala Opera House is **one of the most famous theatres in the world**. Lose yourselves in the magic of the theatre while admiring its magnificent auditorium. With a bit of luck, you might also have a chance to watch a rehearsal in progress.









# AMBROSIANA ART GALLERY AND LIBRARY

The Ambrosiana Picture Gallery contains several exquisite works of art from the 15th through 17th centuries and includes "The musician", attributed to Leonardo, Raphael's cartoon for the "School of Athens" and Caravaggio's "Basket of fruit". The Library boasts the largest collection of Leonardo's writings and drawings, the "Codice Atlantico" (Atlantic Codex).







# **PINACOTECA DI BRERA**

Magnificent Palazzo di Brera is clearly the artistic district's centre of gravity. The complex includes the Pinacoteca and the National Braidense Library, but also an important Academy of Fine Arts, a media library, a charming Botanical Garden and an Astronomical Observatory. The "Caffè Fernanda", designed as an integral part of the museum, and "Bottega Brera", the museum shop and bookstore, are part of the "Great Brera".







# MUSEO NAZIONALE SCIENZA E TECNOLOGIA

The most important museum of science and technology in Italy, it hosts the testimonies of **history of science**, technology and Italian industry dating from the 19th century to present times. Don't miss the **Enrico Toti** submarine, the 1:1 scale model of the first **Vega vector** and the "**Leonardo da Vinci Galleries**".







# TRIENNALE MILANO

One of the most vibrant, popular and **important exhibition centres** in the city. Since 1923, it is an international institution which organises exhibitions and events about design, architecture, visual arts and theatre: don't miss the **Museo del Design Italiano** in the spaces of the Curva on the ground floor. Triennale Milano has also a superb **media library** on design, art and architecture and the **garden** is home to great artists and designers.









### **GALLERIE D'ITALIA**



Two buildings host masterpieces of **19thcentury Italian art** from the collections of Fondazione Cariplo and Intesa Sanpaolo: Palazzo Anguissola and Palazzo Brentani. The palazzo housing Milan's historic Banca Commerciale features **20th century masterpieces**.



### **MUSEO DEL NOVECENTO**



The museum is located inside the **Palazzo dell'Arengario** in Piazza del Duomo and hosts a collection of over four thousand works that catalyze the development of **20th century Italian art**.





# BASILICA DI SANT'AMBROGIO P SEE MAP



One of the most ancient churches in Milan, it is a wonderful example of Romanesque style and the focal point is the Ciborium with the "Golden Altar" underneath, a masterpiece of Carolingian goldwork.



# **SAN MAURIZIO AL MONASTERO MAGGIORE**





On entering this 16th-century church, also dubbed the "Sistine Chapel of Milan" it is impossible not to be awestruck by the number and beauty of the paintings, stuccoes and frescoes.







### **STAZIONE CENTRALE**



A complex characterised by a mixture of **different architectural styles**: Neoclassical, Art Nouveau and Art Deco. In recent years it has undergone major **restoration and redevelopment** work, with the opening of new spaces and services.



### **PARCO SEMPIONE**



A green lung in the heart of the city, with **centuries-old trees** and **fitness trails**, this renowned park occupies a vast area linking the Arco della Pace to the Castello Sforzesco.





### **ORTO BOTANICO**



A small but delightful **Botanical Garden** in Brera. Dating to the **18th century**, it was reopened to the public a few years ago and offers a delightfully **peaceful setting** within Milan's densely urbanized historical centre.



# **NAVIGLI DISTRICT**





A widespread **network of canals** whose history is linked to the genius of **Leonardo da Vinci**. It boasts small **artisan workshops** and **painter's studios** reminiscent of those found on the left bank in Paris.





# MONTENAPOLEONE DISTRICT ( SEE MAP



The Quadrilatero della moda is set amidst four of Milan's most expensive and prestigious shopping streets. It is here that the most important fashion designers, of international repute, offer their luxurious creations.



# **BRERA DISTRICT**





Its narrow cobbled streets host a number of interesting chic antique shops, galleries, artisanal workshops and cafés. As a "district of Artistic Perfumery" it boasts delectable shops carrying only the most sought-after fragrances.







### **PORTA NUOVA DISTRICT**



This is a sprawling area, the result of a project of urban and architectural redevelopment. A **technological hub** comprising more than twenty buildings including **skyscrapers**, **offices and urban residences** with the scenic **Piazza Gae Aulenti**.




# **CITYLIFE DISTRICT**


